## A's vs. MARINERS

The A's lead the season series 9went 6-3 in Seattle, 1-1 in kyo and are 2-3 in Tokyo Oakland...need one more win to clinch the season series...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011)...the A's are 68-62 2009, 2011)...the A's are 68-62 against Seattle since 2006...are batting .212 (114 for 539) against the Mariners...the A's lowest single season average against Seattle is .219 in 2003...the pitching staff has a 2.36 ERA (39 er in 149.0 ip), which is their lowest since 1981 (2.00)...have a ..216 (119 for 550) opponents average...all-time, the A's are 301-224 (573) against Seattle 301-224 (.573) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 165-95 in Oakland, 135-128 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history as they defeat the Royals 2-1 in 1 hour and 35 minutes...the two teams combine for just six hits and four walks...in **1972** the A's score six times in the final three innings to defeat Minnesota 8-7 and clinch their second consecutive AL West their second consecutive AL West title...in **1975** Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to no-hit the California Angels, 5-0...it is the first four-pitcher no-hitter in Major League history...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley breaks his own club record when he saves his 46th arme of the season be would no game of the season...he would go game of the season...in would go on to save 48 games...in **1995** Terry Steinbach collects his 1000th career hit at California, a seventh inning single off Mark Langston...he becomes the seventh Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **1996**, in his final at bat as an Athletic, Terry Steinbach hits his 35th home run of the season...it is his 34th as a catcher which breaks Carlton Fisk's American League record for home runs by a catcher...he also homered in his first at bat as an Athletic

### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last five games but have lost seven of the last 11...are 88-68 (.564) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...won just 74 games last year and the 14-win improvement is third largest in Oakland history...had a 29-win turnaround from 1979 (54-108) to 1980 (83-79) and a 23-win improvement from 1987 (81-81) to 1988 (104-58)...this is the A's first winning season since 2006 (93-69)...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by four games...are in sole possession of the second Wild Card slot, one game behind first place Baltimore and two games ahead of third place Los Angeles and Tampa Bay...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 37 days (since August 22) and 57 of the last 69 (since July 21)...have the best record in the majors since the start of July (51-26) and since June 2 (66-38), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...have the best record in the AL since the All-Star Break (45-25)...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 88 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's trail Texas by four games in the American League West and their magic number for elimination in the division race is three...have a two-game lead over Los Angeles and Tampa Bay in the Wild Card race and the magic number for clinching a playoff spot is five...one more A's win or White Sox loss would eliminate Chicago from the Wild Card...in the event a tie-breaker is needed for a playoff game or home field advantage in the Wild Card, the A's won the season series from Baltimore, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay and split the season series with New York...the second tiebreaker for a two-team tie with the Yankees would be intradivision games...New York is 36-30 (.545) against the East and the A's are 27-24 (.529) against the West.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high tying five home runs yesterday (also August 31 vs. Boston) but lost...it marked the sixth time in Athletics franchise history the A's lost a game when hitting five or more home runs...the last time was also at Texas on May 5, 2000 in a 17-16 loss...Brandon Moss hit his 20<sup>th</sup> home run of the season yesterday and is the third Athletic to reach the 20 plateau (Reddick 31, Céspedes 22)...the last time the A's had three players with 20 or more home runs was 2006 (Chavez, Swisher, Thomas)...have hit 14 home runs in the last six games and a **Major League leading** 104 since the All-Star Break...now have 187 home runs for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League and seventh in the majors...it is ninth most in Athletics history (8<sup>th</sup> is 189 in 2004, 7<sup>th</sup> is 197 in 1997)...hit just 114 home runs last year, an increase of 64.0%...the A's are 73-38 (.658) when they homer, including 37-14 (.725) with two or more home runs

STRIKEOUTS: The A's have set an American League record with 1340 strikeouts...broke the previous mark of 1324 set by Tampa Bay in 2007...the strikeouts are fifth most in Major League history (Arizona 1529 in 2010, Milwaukee 1399 in 2001, Florida 1375 in 2010, Florida 1371 in 2008).

ROOKIES: The A's currently have 15 rookies on the roster...have used 19 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20) and second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...12 of the 19 have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers set in 2009...all five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation are rookies (see page 2 for more info)...A's rookies have combined for 49 wins and 53 home runs...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are just the third team in Major League history to have rookies combine for at least 40 wins and 40 home runs in the same season...the others are the 1986 Rangers (46 wins, 47 homers) and the 2006 Marlins (50 wins, 112 home runs).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have pitched fewer than five innings in seven of the last 11 games...the A's are 4-7 over that stretch and the starters are 1-4 with a 5.54 ERA (31 er in 50.1 ip) and .309 (63 for 204) opponents batting average...have issued 23 walks in 50.1 innings (4.11 per nine innings) in the 11 games after walking three batters or fewer in each of the previous 44 contests (47 bb in 267.1 ip, 1.58 per nine innings)...starters have a 3.77 ERA (389 er in 928.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have issued the fewest walks (241) and have the second fewest home runs (97)...starters are averaging 2.34 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark by A's starters since at least 1921 (2.36 in 1974).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.35 ERA (60 er in 101.0 ip) over the last 11 games but have a 3.52 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...lead the AL in pickoffs (23), have allowed the second fewest home runs (141), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.378), third in batting average (.246) and shutouts (13) and fourth in on-base percentage (.308).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .237, which is the second lowest in the American League... it is one point above the Oakland record for lowest batting average (.236 in 1982)...have the third lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.309) but the fourth most walks (527)...have scored the second most runs in the AL since the All-Star Break with 355 (70 games, 5.07 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is second most in the majors (Miami, 17)...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with 13 "walk-off" wins... are 21-14 in games decided in the last at bat...the 21 last at bat wins are second most in the American League to Baltimore (24)...have won 16 of their last 22 one-run games and are 24-18 (.571) for the season, which is the third best record in the AL...are 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games, which is also the third best record in the AL...have the second most extra inning games...are 27-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in a season-high six consecutive games (11 errors total), including four games with two or more...have 107 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the final homestand of the season tonight against Seattle (three games) and Texas (three games)...are 44-31 (.587) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL...it is second best by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-2), New York (1-2) and Texas (2-2)...finished the season 44-37 (.543) on the road, which was the A's first winning road record since 2006 when they also went 44-37...currently have the third best road record in the AL

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 14<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career, his sixth since being reinstated from the disabled list September 1...the A's are 10-3 (.769) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in nine of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

**LAST TWO STARTS:** Has tossed fewer than five innings in each of his last two starts and is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (9 er in 9.0 ip) and .375 opponents batting average over that span...went 6-0 with a 1.94 ERA and .202 opponents average over his first 11 starts.

**IN SEPTEMBER:** Is 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts in September...has walked just five batters in 29.1 innings while striking out 25...is tied for second in the American League in wins in September.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 14 for 74 (.189) with three walks (.221 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .210 (39 for 186) average with the bases empty compared to .290 (9 for 31) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .353 (12 for 34) batting average to the opponents number three hitter compared to .209 (51 for 244) against everyone else.

**DON'T WALK:** Walked three batters in his last start, snapping a career-opening streak of 12 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer...that is the longest streak to start a career by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1918...has walked just 15 batters in 74.0 innings, an average of 1.82 per nine innings...has 60 strikeouts for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.00.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 4-1 with a 3.54 ERA (11 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more

**BRIEFLY:** Is 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list September 1...was placed on the 15-day DL August 5 with right shoulder tightness...went 1-0 with a 4.90 ERA (7.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 7 so) in two rehab starts with Sacramento on August 22 against Salt Lake and August 27 at Colorado Springs...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 after combining for a 6-3 record and a 2.66 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...made his Major League debut and went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA in eight starts before going on the DL.

**ROOKIE STARTERS:** The A's have five rookies in the starting rotation (Blackley, Milone, Parker and Straily)...today will mark the ninth consecutive game the A's have started a rookie, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 15 from August 1 to 16, 2009...is scheduled to make the 96<sup>th</sup> start by an A's rookie, which is second most in Oakland history (116 in 2009)...rookies have set Oakland records for wins (49), appearances (299), innings pitched (806.1) and strikeouts (650)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers hold the record for most starts (69) and innings pitched (720.1) by rookies on a team that reached the postseason.

**CAREER OPENERS:** Went 6-0 with a 1.94 ERA over his first 11 starts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL), he is just the second pitcher to be undefeated in at least his first 11 Major League appearances, all starts, while maintaining an ERA under 2.00...the other is Jered Weaver, who went 9-0 with a 1.95 ERA over his first 12 starts with the Angels in 2006...he is the first pitcher in Oakland history to start his career 6-0...since 1927, the only Athletics pitcher to begin his career at least 6-0 is Jim Nash, who went 7-0 over his first nine career starts in 1966...is the only ML pitcher since at least 1918 to allow three runs or fewer and walk two batters or fewer in each of his first 11 career starts...the previous best was eight by Brian Holton, who did it from September 7, 1986-June 9, 1989 (had 112 relief appearances during that stretch)...is the first Athletics pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings and allow three runs or fewer in each of his first starts...the previous best was eight by Brian Holton, who did it from September 7, 1986-June 9, 1989 (had 112 relief appearances during that stretch)...is the first Athletics pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings and allow three runs or fewer in each of his first seven starts...the previous high was five by John Henry Johnson (1978) and Dave Hamilton (1972)...is the second Major Leaguer to do it over the last 18 years...the other is Jered Weaver, who had nine straight with Los Angeles (AL) in 2006... is just the sixth pitcher since 1918 to begin his career with three consecutive outings of six or more innings and four hits or fewer (last: Jeremy Hellickson, TB, August 2-15, 2010)...is one of two Athletics since 1918 to begin his career with three consecutive no decisions, all as a starting pitcher (Willie Adams, June 11-July 31, 1996).

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at New York last Sunday...walked a career-high three batters in 4.1 innings...it was his second consecutive start with fewer than five innings pitched...the A's scored a run in the first and two in the second and he blanked the Yankees on a hit and two walks over the first three innings...then allowed four runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Swisher, an RBI double by Ibanez and a RBI ground out by Nunez...the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth and he was relieved by Blevins with one out and runners on first and second in the fifth...the A's scored a run in the sixth for the win.

**GRIFFIN vs. SEATTLE:** Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 6-1 win at Seattle September 7...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Ryan in the second inning...that was the only run he would allow in 5.1 innings as he retired 11 of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored three times in the fourth and twice in the fifth for the win.

**MINORS:** Combined for a 7-3 record and a 2.82 ERA (102.0 ip, 79 h, 39 r, 32 er, 18 bb, 91 so, 7 hr) in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...began the year at Midland and was 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA in seven starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento May 11...went 3-2 with a 2.81 ERA in eight starts with the River Cats before he was promoted to Oakland June 24...was 4-2 with a 3.07 ERA in 10 starts overall with Sacramento...issued 18 walks in 102.0 innings, an average of 1.59 per nine innings...struck out 91 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.06...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .181 (33 for 182) against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (46 for 193) against right-handers...surrendered just seven home runs in 102.0 innings, an average of 0.62 per nine innings.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Dan Straily (2-1, 3.60 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...was originally selected from Triple-A Sacramento August 3 and went 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA in three starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento August 20 when Brett Anderson was reinstated from the DL...returned September 7 and is 1-1 with a 4.00 ERA in three starts since his return...opponents are 3 for 25 (.120) with runners in scoring position...has surrendered nine home runs over his first six starts and 35.0 innings pitched (1.54 per nine innings)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at Texas on Monday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...has never faced the Mariners...combined for a 9-7 record and a 2.78 ERA in 25 starts with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...struck out 190 batters in 152.0 innings, an average of 11.25 per nine innings...led all of Minor League Baseball in strikeouts...the strikeout total was fourth best by a minor leaguer in Oakland history and the most since 1971 when Chris Floethe had 225 for Double-A Birmingham and Glenn Abbott had 195 for Single-A Burlington.

- Homered in the fifth inning April 17 at Los Angeles to snap a career-high 76-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since Oct. 1, 2010 against Seattle...the home run also snapped a 72-game homerless streak as a first baseman, which was second longest in Oakland history...the record is 75 by Mike Hegan from July 6, 1971 to Aug. 16, 1973.
- Was batting .198 with one home run and four RBI in 37 games when he was optioned to Sacramento June 2.

#### JERRY BLEVINS

- Had his career-high 10.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to last season snapped April 7 against Seattle when Saunders homered in the sixth inning.
- Made his 200th career appearance Aug. 29 at Cleveland.

#### DALLAS BRADEN

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 as he continues his recovery from left shoulder surgery.
- Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 22.

#### ANDREW CARIGNAN

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 6.23 ERA in five relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Recalled for a second time May 11 and allowed two runs in 2.0 innings over two outings before he was sent back to Sacramento May 16.
- Joined the A's for a third time May 27 and did not allow a run in four games (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) before he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 6 with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 9.
- Had reconstructive surgery to the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow June 19...the surgery
  was performed in New York City by Dr. David Altchek, medical director of the New York Mets.

#### CHRIS CARTER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 29 after batting .279 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI in 72 games with the River Cats.
- Homered in each of his first two games with the A's and three of his first four...including July 6
  against Seattle when he hit the pinch-hit game-ending home run in the 11th inning...is the first
  rookie in Athletics history with a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run and the 10th player in Oakland
  history with a pinch-hit game-ending home run...he is the first Athletic with a pinch-hit "walk-off"
  home run in extra innings since Paul Lehner on April 22, 1950 against Boston.
- Had his career-high tying six-game hitting streak snapped August 2 against Toronto (7 for 22, .318).
- Had his first career three hit game August 11 at Chicago and matched that August 28 at Cleveland.
- Struck out a career-high four times September 8 at Seattle.

#### YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his Major League debut March 28 against Seattle in Tokyo with a start in center field... doubled off Felix Hernandez to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning for his first ML hit.
- Hit his first ML home run in the seventh inning March 29 against Seattle in Tokyo, a two-run shot off Shawn Kelley.
- Homered in three consecutive games from March 29 to April 7...became the third player since 1918 to homer in three of his first four Major League games (Trent Oeltjen, ARI 2009 and Mike Jacobs, NYM 2005)...is the ninth player with at least three home runs in his first four games (Jacobs had 4)...the previous fastest an Oakland Athletic reached three career home runs was seven games by Kurt Abbott in 1993 and Mitchell Page in 1977.
- Had multiple RBI games in each of those contests...since 1918, he is the first Athletic and ninth Major Leaguer with three multiple RBI games over his first four career games (last: Wladimir Balentien, 2006-07).
- Struck out at least once in each of his first eight games, which is an Oakland record to start a career... the previous mark was six (Chris Carter, 2010; Brooks Conrad, 2008; Travis Buck, 2007)...matched the longest streak by an Athletic since 1918 (Troy Herriage, 1956; Norm Bass, 1961).
- Hit his fourth home run April 18 at Los Angeles in his 12th game...since 1918, that is the fastest a player has reached four career home runs in Athletics history...the previous best was by Brian Lesher, who did it in 14 games in 1996.
- Did not have a putout April 25 against Chicago, becoming the first A's outfielder without a putout in a game of 14 or more innings since Stan Javier on May 30, 1988 against New York.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 12 retroactive to May 7 with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) on a three-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from May 28 to 30 and was reinstated from the DL June 1.
- Had his first career game-ending hit June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), a three-run "walk-off" home run.
- Had the first two four-hit games of his career July 15 at Minnesota and July 20 against New York.
- Was named American League Player of the Week July 16 for the week ending July 15 after going 8 for 14 (.571) with five runs, a double, two home runs and six RBI in the three-game series at Minnesota.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from July 8 to 21...was 19 for 33 (.576) with two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, eight runs scored, six multiple hit games and a 1.000 slugging percentage during the streak.
- Batted .344 in July after hitting .343 in June...tied for sixth in the AL in batting and hits (33) in July, ranked eighth in slugging (.573) and tied for eighth in RBI (19).
- Walked three times August 2 against Toronto, the first multi-walk game of his career.
- His home run August 16 at Kansas City snapped a career-high streak of 14 consecutive games without an extra base hit.
- Had a career-high 21-game homerless streak from August 19 to September 10.
- Stole two bases September 1 against Boston, the first multi-steal game of his career.

#### BARTOLO COLÓN

- Was on his 13th career Opening Day roster and is in his 15th season in the majors.
- Made each of his first three starts against Seattle to become the first pitcher in Oakland history to make three consecutive starts against one team in the same season without missing a turn in the rotation.
- Threw 38 consecutive strikes at one point during the A's 6-0 win at Los Angeles April 18...that was the longest such streak since pitch count data is first available in 1988...the previous best was 30 by Tim Wakefield in 1998.
- Was 1-3 with a 7.92 ERA and .386 opponents batting average in five starts in May...based on a minimum of 25.0 innings, he had the highest opponents batting average in the majors in May and the third highest ERA...the opponents average was the highest single-month mark of his career and the ERA was third highest (7.99 in June, 2004; 7.94 in September, 1998).
- Left his start June 17 against San Diego with no outs in the third inning with a strained right oblique...was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 retroactive to June 18 with the injury... was reinstated July 3.

#### RYAN COOK

- Became the third pitcher in Athletics franchise history to record four strikeouts in an inning April 27 at Baltimore (Blake Stein, 1998; Erik Hiljus, 2001).
- Did not allow a run over his first 21 games and 23.0 innings...that was the longest season-opening
  scoreless streak by a player on the Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1918...the previous
  high was 21.0 innings by Alex Kellner in 1953...had a career-high 24.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to September 28, 2011.
- Was the only A's player named to the American League All-Star team and pitched a perfect seventh inning, striking out Harper and Wright...it was his first career All-Star selection...he is the seventh Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team, along with Wayne Gross (1977), Matt Keough (1978), Jose Canseco (1986), Mark McGwire (1987), Ben Grieve (1998) and Andrew Bailey (2009).

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0 for 4 with three walks in three games before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 17.
- Was recalled by Oakland May 11
- Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 5 (13 for 31, .419).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 23 with a sprained left ankle...began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton July 9 and went 1 for 8 (.125) in two games before he was transferred to Sacramento July 12...went 3 for 18 (.167) with a RBI in four games with the River Cats before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 17.

#### COCO CRISP

- Was the A's 13th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 13 years...had 203 career starts in left entering the season, but none since October 2, 2005.
- Committed his first error since April 25, 2011 on April 7 against Seattle, snapping a 116-game errorless streak...that streak was seventh longest by an outfielder in Oakland history.
- Stole three bases June 19 against Los Angeles (NL)...it was his fifth career game of three or more steals, his fourth with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (45) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more three-steal games.
- Was caught stealing after being picked off in the first inning June 21 against Los Angeles (NL), his first caught stealing since July 10, 2011 at Texas...that ended his Athletics record streak of 36 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing (caught stealing became an official stat in 1920)... broke the previous mark of 28 set by Stan Javier (May 31-October 1, 1995).
- Finished the game July 3 with a "walk-off" sacrifice fly...it was the 21st game-ending sacrifice fly in Oakland history, the first since Dan Johnson on May 15, 2007 against Kansas City...is the first Athletic with a leadoff home run and walk-off RBI in the same game since Rickey Henderson on August 12, 1992 against Chicago.
- · Had the game-ending RBI single July 22 agianst New York.
- Had his third career two-homer game July 25 at Toronto.
- Batted .342 in July, which is his best single-month batting average since hitting .375 in September, 2008...it ranked eighth in the AL.
- Had his second game-ending sacrifice fly of the season August 3 against Toronto (July 3 vs. Boston)...is the second player in Oakland history with two "walk-off" sacrifice flies in one season (Rickey Henderson, 1992)...it was his third game-ending RBI of the season and the fifth of his career.
- Had a career-high tying five RBI August 19 against Cleveland...it was his fifth career five RBI game.
- Tied for second in the AL in doubles in August (11), ranked fourth in stolen bases (9) and tied for sixth in runs (21)...the 11 doubles tied for the second best August total in Oakland history and fell one short of the record of 12 set by Jason Giambi in 1999.
- Led off the game with a home run September 1 against Boston...it was his third leadoff home run this year (June 27 at Seattle and July 3 against Boston) and the seventh of his career...it was his fifth leadoff home run as an Athletic, which is tied with Mark Kotsay for third most in Oakland history... only Rickey Henderson (43) and Bert Campaneris (10) have more.

#### FAUTINO DE LOS SANTOS

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 3.00 ERA in six relief appearances before he was
  optioned to Sacramento, April 25.
- Did not retire a batter over his final three outings before his option (5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb).
- Was traded to Milwaukee July 29 for George Kottaras.

#### JOEY DEVINE

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 28 retroactive to March 24...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow April 10... Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery in Pensacola, Fla., which included an ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction, an ulnar nerve transposition and a debridement of the flexor tendon...also had "Tommy John" surgery on the same elbow April 21, 2009.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 15.

#### JOSH DONALDSON

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster but hit just .094 in nine games before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento April 23.
- Made nine starts, all at third base, during his first stint...his Major League experience prior to this season included seven games at catcher and two at first base.
- Was recalled May 12 and snapped a career-high tying 0 for 17 streak with his eighth inning double May 14 at Los Angeles (also May 1-13, 2010).
- Went 3 for 4 with two doubles, a home run and five RBI May 18 at San Francisco...the doubles and RBI were a career highs.
- Drew his first walk of the season June 13 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 30 consecutive games without a walk dating back to September 22, 2010...that was the longest streak by an Athletic since Scott Hemond had a 31-game streak from May 3 to July 2, 1994...it was his first walk since September 19, 2010 at Minnesota.
- Was batting .182 in 19 games during his second stint with the A's when he was optioned to Sacramento June 21.
- Recalled Aug. 14.
- · Went 4-for-4 August 17 against Cleveland, his first career four-hit game.
- Homered in three straight games from August 29-31, the first time he has homered in consecutive games in his career

#### SEAN DOOLITTLE

• Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 4 and made his Major League debut June 5 against Texas (1.1 ip, 3 so)...struck out the first three batters he faced...the last A's pitcher to strike out the first three batters he faced in his career was Blake Stein on May 10, 1998 against Chicago.

#### STEPHEN DREW

- · Was acquired from Arizona Aug. 20 for minor league infielder Sean Jamieson.
- Singled in the fourth inning Aug. 23 at Tampa Bay for his first hit as an Athletic...that snapped a career-high 0-for-22 streak (previous: 20, twice, last: May 27-June 2, 2010).

#### PEDRO FIGUEROA

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 21 and made his Major League debut that night against Cleveland...tossed a scoreless ninth and his only base runner (Cunningham walk) was erased on a double play.
- Was optioned to Sacramento May 22 after posting a 2.00 ERA with nine walks in 9.0 innings in eight games.
- Returned to Oakland June 17 and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings that day against San Diego before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 21.
- Was recalled a third time July 13 when Jim Miller went on the paternity list but was optioned back to Sacramento July 16 without appearing in a game.
- Returned to Oakland for his fourth stint Aug. 5 and did not allow a run over two appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 3 so) before he was sent back to Sacramento Aug. 7.

#### **BRIAN FUENTES**

- Recorded his 200th career save May 2 at Boston to become the sixth left-handed reliever in Major League history to reach the 200 plateau (Franco, Wagner, Myers, Righetti, Lyle).
- Had a 2.84 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his first 19 appearances through May 27... then went 0-2 with a save, two blown saves, a 19.50 ERA and .452 opponents batting average over his final seven outings.
- Was designated for assignment on July 3 and released July 11.

## **GRAHAM GODFREY**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA in three starts before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 21.
- Recalled May 22 and went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in two games, one start, before he was sent back to Sacramento May 27.

#### JONNY GOMES

- Was hit by a Jonathan Braxton pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning April 11 against Kansas City to force in the winning run in the A's 5-4 victory...it was his second career walk-off hit by pitch (August 21, 2011 vs. Philadelphia)...it was his fifth career walk-off RBI (two home runs, one walk)...it was the third walk-off hit by pitch in Oakland history (Mike Bordick, August 4, 1993 vs. Seattle and Olmedo Saenz, July 20, 2002 vs. Texas).
- Singled in the eighth inning April 19 at Los Angeles after homering for each of his first three hits for the season...is the first player in Oakland history whose first three hits in a season were all home runs.
- Hit the game-winning pinch-hit two-run home run in the seventh inning June 16 against San Diego, his third career pinch hit home run (last: June 28, 2008 at Pittsburgh)...it snapped a 0 for 34 streak as a pinch hitter and was his first pinch hit since August 29, 2010 against Chicago (NL).
- Hit his third career grand slam July 13 at Minnesota, his first since August 7, 2007 at Detroit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning to finish with five RBI...it was his third career game of five or more RBI, his first since June 12, 2010 against Kansas City when he had a career-high six.
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, the seventh time he has reached the 10-home run plateau in his career.
- Homered in three consecutive games from August 7-12, the second time he has done that in his career (April 22-25, 2006).
- Struck out in a career-high 16 consecutive games from July 28 to September 1.

## A.J. GRIFFIN

• Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 24 and made his Major League debut that day with a start against San Francisco.

#### **BRANDON HICKS**

- Was claimed off waivers from Atlanta March 13 and was optioned to Sacramento March 15.
- Recalled by Oakland June 23 after batting .272 with 13 home runs and 48 RBI in 65 games with the River Cats... was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in hit by pitches (7) at the time of his promotion...also ranked second in strikeouts (76), fifth in extra base hits (37), tied for sixth in doubles (21), eighth in home runs (13), ninth in runs (49) and 10th in RBI (48) and slugging (.548).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts July 13 at Minnesota ... it was the first four strikeout game of his career.
- Hit his first Major League home run July 18 against Texas, a "walk-off" shot off Michael Kirkman in the bottom of the ninth inning...became the fourth player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run, the second this year (Derek Norris, June 24)...the other two are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 2.

## LUKE HUGHES

• Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota April 22 and went 1 for 13 (.077) in four games with the A's before he was designated for assignment April 30...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Sacramento May 2.

#### **BRANDON INGE**

- Agreed to terms with the A's on a one-year contract April 30 after he was released by Detroit April 26.
- Had four four-RBI game over a five-game span from May 6 to 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the other is Lou Gehrig in 1931...now has 14 career games with four or more RBI...drove in 16 runs over that five-game stretch...since 1970, the only other Athletic to drive in 16 runs over a five-game span is Damian Miller (June 6-11, 2004).
- Had the game-ending grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning May 8 against Toronto...it was his seventh career "walk-off" home run and his 10th "walk-off plate appearance (two singles, one sacrifice fly)...it was the sixth "walk-off" grand slam in Oakland history (Tenace, 1973; Armas, 1980; McGwire, 1990 and 1995; Ellis, 2008).
- Added another grand slam May 10 against Detroit...is just the second player in Athletics history to hit two grand slams over a three-game span...the other is Jimmie Foxx (September 22 and 24, 1932)...now has seven career grand slams.
- Had 17 RBI in his first 10 games with the A's...those are the most in Oakland history by a player in his first 10 games with the A's...the previous best was 15 by Mitchell Page (1977) and Jack Cust (2007).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 17 retroactive to May 13 with a strained right groin... it is his second stint on the disabled list this year as he began the season on Detroit's DL with a strained left groin.
- Went 5 for 5 with three runs, two doubles, two home runs (including a grand slam) and seven RBI in a start at third base for Triple-A Sacramento May 26 against Reno in the second game of his two-game rehab assignment.
- Was reinstated from the DL May 29.
- Struck out four times July 30 against Tampa Bay, matching his career high (June 21, 2006 at Milwaukee and August 14, 2007 at Cleveland).
- Had a career-high tying 13-game hitting streak from July 20 to August 3...hit.263 (15 for 57), which was the lowest batting average during a hitting streak of 12 or more games in Oakland history.

## KILA KA'AIHUE

- Matched his career high with three hits April 15 at Seattle (third time, last: Sept. 28, 2010 vs. Minnesota).
- Had the game-winning RBI single in the 14th inning April 25 against Chicago, his second career walk-off hit (home run, April 1, 2011 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Was batting .234 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 39 games when he was designated for assignment June 6...cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Sacramento June 16.

## GEORGE KOTTARAS

- Was acquired from Milwaukee July 29 for right-handed pitcher Fautino De Los Santos.
- Was tied for the National League lead with five pinch walks at the time of the trade.
- Hit his first home run as an Athletic August 8 against Los Angeles, snapping a career-high 46-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on April 13 at Atlanta.
- · Had career highs August 31 against Boston with two home runs, five RBI and three runs scored.
- Homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his career (June 16-18, 2011) Sept. 7 and 8 at Seattle

## **BRANDON MCCARTHY**

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 against Seattle and had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 11-inning loss...allowed just one run on six hits and no walks in 7.0 innings.
- Also started the third game of the season, April 6 against Seattle, to become the second pitcher in Oakland history to start two of the A's first three games...the other is Joe Blanton who did it in 2008, the other time the A's opened the season in Japan...also started three of the first seven games, joining Blanton as the only Oakland pitchers to do that since 1977.

## JIM MILLER

- Picked up his first Major League win April 25 against Chicago...allowed two inherited runners to score in the top of the 14th inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the inning.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento May 11 after posting a 1.93 ERA in six relief appearances with the A's.
- Returned to Oakland May 20.
- Was placed on the paternity list July 13 and reinstated July 16.
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3.

# TOMMY MILONE

- Combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout of Kansas City April 9 in Oakland in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to toss eight or more shutout innings in his Oakland debut (Mike Norris, complete game shutout, April 10, 1975 against Chicago)...did not strikeout a batter to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and not strikeout a batter (Matt Keough, July 27, 1980 against Detroit; Catfish Hunter, May 25, 1973 against Detroit).
- Combined with Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout of Chicago April 24 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...according to the Elias Sports Bureau he is just the second Oakland rookie over the last 75 years to have two wins while pitching at least eight scoreless innings and allowing three or fewer hits in a season (Vida Blue, 1970).
- Was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Los Angeles May 21 in Oakland...became the first pitcher in Oakland history to win each of his first four starts at the Coliseum.

## **BRANDON MOSS**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after batting .286 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 51 games with the River Cats...the home runs were tied for second in the Pacific Coast League and tied for sixth in all of minor league baseball at the time of his promotion.
- Started at first base June 6 against Texas...prior to that he had not started at first base since June 24, 2008 and had just two career appearances at first.
- Homered June 7 against Texas, his first since September 2, 2009 at Cincinnati...it snapped a careerhigh 49-game homerless streak.
- Had his first career two-homer game June 12 at Colorado.
- Homered in all three games of the Colorado series June 12-14 and had four home runs total...is the first Athletic to hit four home runs in a three-game series since Geronimo Berroa against Minnesota, August 12-14, 1996.
- Homered in four consecutive games June 12-15...it was the 20th time in Oakland history a player homered in at least four straight games...hit five home runs during the stretch to become the second Athletic since 2000 to hit five home runs over a four-game span (Jack Cust, May 10-13, 2007).
- Became the second player in Athletics history to hit six home runs in his first nine games with the club (Jack Cust, 2007).
- Hit six home runs in interleague play, which tied for fifth in the majors and matched the Oakland interleague record set by Miguel Tejada in 2000.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 11-17...batted .348 with three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI and seven runs scored in six games...it was his first Player of the Week award.
- Committed three errors in the sixth inning June 23 against San Francisco, tying the Major League
  record for most errors by a first baseman in an inning...it was the seventh time, the first since Jack
  Clark did it for St. Louis on May 25, 1987...since 1984, the only other Athletic to commit three errors in an inning is Kurt Abbott on May 10, 1998 vs. Chicago at shortstop.
- The three errors set an Oakland record for errors in a game by a first baseman...is the first Athletics first baseman to commit three errors in a game since Lou Limmer on August 19, 1954 vs. New York.
- Tied for eighth in the AL with seven home runs in June.
- Hit his 10th home run in his 24th game on July 4 at Boston...in Athletics history, only Dave Kingman reached 10 home runs in fewer than his first 24 games with the club (19 in 1984).
- Had the game-ending single in the bottom of the ninth inning July 20 against New York, his third career walk-off hit (last: July 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee).
- Had a career-high tying seven-game hitting streak from Aug. 15 to 28 (9 for 28, .321).

• Had career highs August 31 against Boston with four hits, four RBI and four runs scored and matched his career high with two doubles...became the 12th player in Oakland history with at least four hits, four RBI and four runs scored in a game.

#### JORDAN NORBERTO

- Retired the final two batters May 1 at Boston for his first Major League save...he saved Jarrod Parker's first ML win, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 4 retroactive to May 31 with a strained left shoulder... made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento June 19 and was reinstated June 21.
- Recorded his first Major League win July 6 against Seattle when he struck out the side in the 11th inning of the A's 4-1 win.

## DEREK NORRIS

- Was recalled from Sacramento June 21 after batting .273 with eight home runs and 36 RBI in 55 games in his Triple-A debut...made his Major League debut with a start at catcher that day against Los Angeles (NL) and went 0 for 3.
- Singled off Madison Bumgarner in the fifth inning June 23 against San Francisco for his first Major League hit...added a RBI single in the ninth inning for his first RBI and first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run June 24 against San Francisco, a three-run "walk-off" shot in the bottom of the ninth off Santiago Casilla...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third player in Athletics history to hit a game-ending home run for his first ML home run...the other two are Dee Miles (September 14, 1939) and George Hendrick (May 28, 1972).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 30 streak July 22 against New York (AL).
- Was optioned to Sacramento July 30 when George Kottaras reported to Oakland but returned Aug. 3
  when Kurt Suzuki was traded to Washington.
- Hit safely in each of his first eight games following his return (8 for 32, .250), which was the longest hitting streak of his career.

#### JARROD PARKER

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 25 and had a no decision in his A's debut, a 5-4, 14-inning win over Chicago April 25 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walks over
  the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...Balfour allowed a
  run in the ninth inning for the blown save.
- Earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas.

#### CLIFF PENNINGTON

- Doubled in the second inning June 4 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 29 streak (previous: 0 for 27, May 22-June 1, 2010).
- Went 3 for 3 June 15, his 28th birthday... is 6 for 12 (.500) with one double, one triple, four RBI and four runs scored in three career games on his birthday.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 20 with left elbow tendinitis...had the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.282) and the second lowest batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.259) when he went on the DL.
- Went 5 for 11 (.455) on a three-game rehab assignment with Sacramento from Aug. 4-6 and was reinstated from the DL Aug. 7.
- Played in the 500th game of his career September 1 against Boston.
- Went 4 for 4 September 7 at Seattle, his fourth career four-hit game (last: September 1, 2011 at Cleveland)...all four have come on the road.

## ANTHONY RECKER

• Was on the A's Opening Day roster and hit .129 in 13 games as the back-up to Kurt Suzuki before he was optioned to Sacramento May 28.

#### JOSH REDDICK

- Was the A's fifth different Opening Day starter in right field in the last five years.
- Had career highs May 11 against Detroit with four runs, four hits (tied), two home runs and five RBI...is the eighth player in Oakland history with at least four runs, four hits, two home runs and five RBI in a game...the last was Matt Holliday (July 20, 2009 vs. Minnesota).
- Hit 10 home runs in May, which tied for third in the AL...is the first Athletic to hit 10 home runs in a month since Frank Thomas had 10 in September, 2006...also tied for fourth in the AL in runs in May (20) and tied for fifth in walks (17).
- Matched his career-high with four strikeouts June 19 against Los Angeles (NL).
- Had the game-ending RBI double July 8 against Seattle, his second career "walk-off" hit...the other was a single on August 7, 2011 against New York.
- Went 0 for 7 with four strikeouts July 30 against Tampa Bay...is one of 15 players in Oakland history to go hitless in a game with at least seven at bats (last: Matt Holliday, May 3, 2009)...it was his second four-strikeout game of the season (June 19 vs. LAD) and third of his career (August 4, 2009 at Tampa Bay).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak with a first inning single August 2 against Toronto (previous: 20, September 19, 2009-April 20, 2010).
- Hit his first career grand slam August 31 against Boston.
- Ranked fifth in the AL with 23 RBI in August...the RBI are his most in a month (previous: 18 in May, 2012).
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week ending September 2, his first career weekly honor... went 12 for 31 (.387) with six runs, two doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI in seven games last week.

## ADAM ROSALES

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and appeared in one game against Seattle in Japan before he was
  optioned to Sacramento April 2.
- · Returned to Oakland May 17 but was optioned back to Sacramento June 16.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint Aug. 2.
- His double in the seventh inning Aug. 5 against Toronto was his first since July 10, 2010, snapping a 48-game streak without a double...that was the second longest streak by an Athletic since 1993 (58, Frank Menechino from April 30, 2003 to May 9, 2004).

#### **TYSON ROSS**

- Began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 17.
- Went 2-6 with a 6.51 ERA in nine starts with the A's before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 31.
- Returned on June 16 to start against San Diego and allowed two runs on one hit and four walks in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.
- Returned to Oakland for a third stint June 23 and went 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 29.

## **EVAN SCRIBNER**

- Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 6 after posting a 3.31 ERA and six saves in 23 relief appearances with the River Cats.
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 15 against San Diego and recorded his first Major League save in the A's 10-2 win.
- Was optioned to Sacramento June 16 but returned to Oakland June 24.
- Was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 3 but returned again Aug. 5.

## SCOTT SIZEMORE

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 3 after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in the team's first full-squad workout Feb. 27 in Phoenix...underwent successful reconstructive surgery March 21...the surgery was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg of the Arizona Sports Medicine Center of Scottsdale...will miss the entire 2012 season.

## SETH SMITH

- Was the A's eighth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last eight years.
- Hit his first home run of the season April 22 against Cleveland, a two-run shot off Masterson in the fourth inning, to snap a career-high 45-game homerless streak...his previous high was 35 (June 22-July 31, 2011)...it was his first home run since Aug. 23, 2011 against Houston.
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts April 30 at Boston, the first four-strikeout game of his career.
- Went 4 for 5 on June 4 against Texas, his second career four-hit game (also September 4, 2009 vs. Arizona).
- Hit his 10th home run of the season July 15 at Minnesota, his fourth consecutive season with double figures in home runs.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI July 27 at Baltimore, despite not entering the game until the sixth inning...became the third player in Oakland history to drive in five runs off the bench (Mickey Tettleton, August 24, 1986 and Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 3 with a strained left hamstring.

#### ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high three RBI, April 15 at Seattle.
