Mariners will use rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus...Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims and Mike Blowers will work nearly all games...today Rizzs, Ken Wilson and Dan Wilson will call the action on the Mariners Radio Network.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue the final road series of the season with the second (0-1) of three at Oakland...trip began with three games in Los Angeles (1-2)...will close out the season with a three-game "homestand" vs. the Angels Oct. 1-3...today's game will not be televised on ROOT Sports in HD and but will be broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...lost yest. and have split last 2 games...are 3-4 in last 7 but have lost 8 of last 11, including a 4-game losing streak, and 10 of last 14 games...3-8 in last 11 games at Safeco Field, after winning 17 of 20 from July 26-Sept. 3...season-high 8-game win streak Aug. 14-22; longest win streak since 2007...won 12 of last 21 series...are 9-15 in Sept. after posting back-to-back winning months in August (15-12) and July (15-11)...37-33 (.529) post All-Star break.

- Head West -- Finished 10-19 (.345) when playing in the Eastern Time Zone this season.
- Thefts -- Successful in 24 of last 30 SB attempts (80.0%), 2nd-highest pct. in MLB since Aug. 14.
- Close Games -- 106 of 157 games decided by 3 or less runs, combining to go 52-54; 1-Run: 25-28, 2-Run: 13-16; 3-Run: 14-10...most 1-run games (53) among all AL teams...won 7 of last 14 1-run G. **2012 WINS --** With 73 wins, Mariners have passed their win total from 2011 (67) & 2010 (61).
- Gold Gloves -- Mariners are 2nd in Majors with .988 FLD%...played error-free in 96 of 157 games.
- Tom Wilhelmsen has recorded a save in 8 of the Mariners 9 wins this month (29-for-33 in '12).
- Pinch Hitting -- John Jaso (.353/6x17, 4 RBI) is 2nd in the AL with 6 pinch hits (Ibañez, 7).
- Left on Left -- LH Charlie Furbush has held LH batters to a .149 batting average (11x74).

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...today is the 18th of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2012... the Mariners trail the season series 7-10, going 3-6 in SEA, 3-3 in OAK and 1-1 in Tokyo...the Mariners went 10-9 against the A's last season, but were 4-5 at the Coliseum...Seattle is 60-52 vs. Oakland since 2007...Seattle trails the all-time series 224-302, including a 96-167 (.365) mark here in the Coliseum.

NOT 2 MUCH LATELY...Kyle Seager is T4th in the Majors with 43 two-out RBI, but he hasn't collected one in over a month...his last 2-out RBI -- actually, his last 2 -- were Aug. 28 at MIN...after collecting 43 2-out RBI among his first 75 total RBI, his last 7 RBI have all been with 0 or 1 outs.

STILL TIME...Michael Saunders collected his 18th HR last night, to go with 20 steals...the Mariners have not had a 20-20 guy since 2002 (Mike Cameron, 25 HR, 31 SB) and its only been done 9 times (by five different players) in franchise history: Rodriguez, 3x; Cameron, 2x; Griffey, 2x; R. Jones; P. Bradley.

UN-USUAL...Blake Beavan allowed an unearned run in the 5th last night; it was the first unearned run he's allowed this season (76 runs, 75 E) and the first he's allowed in his career (122 runs, 121 ER).

JOLTIN' JASO ... John Jaso hit his 10th homer of the season Thursday at LA...he now has 10 longballs in 104 games (347 PA) this season...entering 2012 he had 10 HR in his career in 203 games (687 PA).

D-FICIENT...the Mariners have committed an uncharacteristic 12 errors in their last 13 games (4-9), a .977 fielding percentage, and have posted just 3 errorless games...in the season's first 144 games, Seattle committed just 57 errors, a .989 fielding percentage, and had 96 errorless games.

HOMER HAPPY...Mariners have homered in 17 straight games (see chart in box at left), collecting 23 total HR during streak...it's the longest streak this season (prev: 11, Aug. 17-28) for Seattle...the last season the Mariners had 2 streaks of 11+ consecutive games w/a HR was 1997 (14, 8/19-9/1 and 13 8/5-8/17).

SMOAKIN'...Justin Smoak is batting .343 (24x70) with 10 runs, 4 doubles, 5 HR and 9 RBI in 21 games in September, including 20-for-his-last-48 (.417) since Sept. 13 (13 G); counting his 7 walks during that stretch, he's reached base safely in 27 of his last 55 plate appearances (.491 OBP, .792 SLG, 1.283 OPS).

MISPING IN ACTION...the Mariners were 0-for-6 with Men In Scoring Position yest. and are now 7-fortheir-last-71 (.099) over their previous 8 games...that stretch included an 0-for-17 Sept. 18 (see page 9).

20 VISION...Justin Smoak hammered his career-high 19th homer Wednesday, his third in two games, and needs just one more for his first 20 homer season...Seattle has not had a 20-homer guy since 2009, when Russell Branyan (31) and Jose Lopez (25) each turned the trick...2010 and 2011 were the first seasons since 1983 (when Pat Putnam led w/19) that Seattle has failed to have at least one player reach 20 homers.

1 FOR THE MONEY...Seattle has played 53 one-run games this season, posting a 25-28 mark... since the start of the 2008 season, Seattle has played 259 one-run games, the (tied) most in the Majors...Seattle and Minnesota are tied with 259 games, tops among all MLB teams, and ahead of TOR (250), KC (244) & TB (239) among AL teams...OAK is 26th in MLB at 217.

CLOSING IT OUT...Tom Wilhelmsen has not allowed a run in his last 12.1 innings in relief...since Sept. 3, he has limited opponents to a .116 average (5x43) with 3 walks and 11 strikeouts, while recording 7 saves in 10 relief appearances... Wilhelmsen is 1 save away from becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 30 saves in a single season, while his 76.2 innings pitched are the most by a Mariners reliever in a season since Brandon League tossed 79.0 innings in 2010.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DINGERS...Seattle has 7 players with at least 10 HR this season...Justin Smoak (19), Kyle Seager (18), Michael Saunders (18), Jesus Montero (15), Dustin Ackley (12), Miguel Olivo (12) and John Jaso (10)...marks the first time since 2000 the Mariners have had 7 players with doubledigits in home runs (Rodriguez/Martinez/Buhner/Cameron/Olerud/Bell/Oliver)... Casper Wells has 8, and if he reaches 10 HR, will be first time since 1997 (9 players) that 8 or more players hit 10+ HR...2012 is also the first time with 4 players with 15+ home runs since 2009 (Branyan/Griffey Jr./Gutierrez/Lopez).

AS YOU KNOW...today's starter Jason Vargas has tossed 210.1 innings this season and Felix Hernandez has 226.2 IP, but DID YOU KNOW?...that if Vargas tosses 4.2 (or more) innings today it will give the Mariners two pitchers with 215.0+ innings pitched for the first time in a decade?...Freddy Garcia (223.2) and Jamie Moyer (230.2) were the last pair of Mariners teammates to both toss over 215.0 innings when they combined in 2002...the club record is three pitchers in 1986 & 1990.

ABOUT VARGAS...prounounced VAHR-gus.

- 29-year-old lefty is making his career-high-tying 33rd start of the season today; his 130th career start (appearance #150).
- Acquired from the Mets in 3-team, 12-player trade 12/10/08.
- Selected by Marlins in 2nd round, 68th overall in '04 draft.
- Made ML debut w/1.0 shutout inning of relief 7/14/05 at PHI (with FLA)...first ML start 7/18/05 at Arizona (5.0,4,3,2,4,3).
- Did not pitch during 2008 season, spending year recovering from surgery to repair the labrum in left hip...had surgery March 17, 2008 & spent summer rehabbing at Mets minor league facility in Port St. Lucie, FL.
- Played in college at LSU (2002), Cypress JC (2003) and Long Beach State (2004)...as junior at LBSU, went 7-4, 4.14 on mound & hit .354 with 14 doubles, 5 home runs as the DH...college teammates with Jered Weaver (LAA), Troy Tulowitski (COL) and Cesar Ramos (TB).

LAST START...recorded loss in Mariners 3-2 loss to Rangers at home on Sept. 23...allowed all three runs in the fourth inning on a Mike Napoli solo HR and a Geovany Soto 2-run HR...was his 21st quality start of the seasons (T4th in AL)... had career-high 21 quality starts in 2010.

DURABLE LEFTY...**Jason Vargas** has tossed 604.0 innings over the last three seasons (2010-12), including back-to-back 200.0 inning campaigns...just four American League left-handers have tossed more innings in that span including **CC Sabathia** (667.0), **David Price** (637.0), **C.J. Wilson** (623.1) and **Ricky Romero** (613.0).

I HAVE 14, DO I HEAR 15?...is the first Mariners left-hander to win 14 or more games in a season since Jamie Moyer (21) in 2003, and is one of only 6 pitchers - right or left-handed - to win 14 or more overall since 2003: **Felix Hernandez, 3x,** (19 in '09, 14 in '07 & '11); Moyer ('03); Miguel Potisto (16 in (07)), lead Binging (16 in (07)). Batista (16 in '07); Joel Pineiro (16 in '03); Gil Meche (15 in '03).

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS ... is 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA in 14 starts at Safeco Field this season (9-6, 5.00 in 18 road GS)...over the course of his career is 25-23 with a 3.49 ERA (162 ER, 418.0 IP) in 73 G/64 GS at home, and 17-27 with a 5.29 ERA in 76 G/65 GS on the road...in his career as a Mariner (since '09), is 21-20, 3.38 (136 ER, 361.2 IP) at Safeco Field, and 15-22, 4.90 (182 ER, 334.0 IP) on the road.

JULY PITCHER OF THE MONTH ... named AL Pitcher of the Month for July...compiled a perfect 5-0 record with 1 CG, 1.64 ERA, 13 walks and 26 strikeouts in 44.0 innings pitched over 6 starts while opponents batted just .206...among qualifying starters, finished 1st in the AL in ERA, and was 2nd in wins and innings pitched...Vargas tied the Mariners monthly club record for wins (20th time), and is the 14th pitcher in club history to go 5-0 in any month, and first since Felix Hernandez in September 2009...Felix followed Jason by winning the August AL Pitcher of the Month award.

THE TREND...after going 5-0 in the month of July, has had an uphill battle to the end of the season...gone 2-4 with a 4.55 ERA (29 ER, 57.1 IP) in 9 starts since the beginning of August...after going 1-2, 5.12 ERA in 5 August starts, is 1-2, 3.86 ERA in 4 starts this month.

THE STOPPER...Vargas has taken the mound following a Mariners loss in 17 of his 32 starts this season, and had great success...the left-hander has posted an 10-4 record with a 2.87 ERA (39 ER, 115.1 IP) in his 17 starts following a team loss.

LONGBALL DATA...leads the team and ranks 2nd in the American League allowing 35 home runs this season...allowed 10 home runs over his last 12 starts, after allowing 18 home runs in 11 starts between May 14-July 7... gave up 11 home runs in month of June to match the club record, joining

Gaylord Perry (May, 1982), Scott Bankhead (May, 1987) & Jamie Moyer (May, 2004) as one of only Mariners to allow 11 HR in a calendar month... set a club record allowing at least one HR in 12 consecutive starts May 14-July 16.

2012 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- With 9 road wins, and one more scheduled start away from Safeco Field, is looking to become just the 7th pitcher in club history to record 10 road wins in a season...Mark Langston (12, 1987), Erik Hanson (11, 1990), Randy Johnson (11, 1997), Jeff Fassero (10, 1997), Dave Fleming (10, 1992) and Felix Hernandez (10, 2009)...only Gio Gonzalez (11), David Price (11), R.A. Dickey (10) and Matt Harrison (10) have more road wins in 2012
- Recorded 5 starts allowing 1 or fewer runs in at least 8.0 innings pitched (last: 7/26 vs. KC)...Felix Hernandez has recorded 12 such starts to lead the Majors...Jason is one of 10 pitchers this season with 5 or more starts of 8.0 IP and 1 or fewer runs allowed.
- Career-high 5-game win streak July 7-31, going 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA (7 ER, 36.0 IP) during the streak.

 Tossed 6th career CG July 7 at Oakland (9.0,7,1,1,1,6,HR)...induced 4 GIDP to tie club record by a starter (9th time).
- Tied career-high with 10 K's June 26 vs. Oakland (ND, 6.2,3,2,2,10,HR)...struck out career-high 5 consecutive batters in the 1st-2nd innings.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB...Kyle Seager (82 RBI) is just the 4th player in Mariners history to record 80 or more RBI in either of the first two seasons of a Major League career...he joins Alvin Davis (116 in 1984 - rookie), Jim Presley (84 in 1985 - 2nd year) and Ken Griffey Jr. (80 in 1990 - 2nd year)...since 2008, Seager is one of just 5 AL players with an 80+ RBI season in the first two years of a career, joining Mark Trumbo (2011), Evan Longoria (2008-09) and Josh Hamilton (2008).

AFFILIATES UPDATE... the Mariners 9 minor league affiliates put together the best season in club history, combining for a 496-406 (.550) record...all but three of the Mariners affiliates qualified for the postseason in 2012...the organization led all Major League farm systems in wins (496) and winning percentage (.550).

LET'S ALL START "FELIXING"...Felix Hernandez was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August...Hernandez compiled a perfect 4-0 record with a 1.08 ERA (5 ER, 41.2 IP) and 3 shutouts in 5 starts...all three shutouts were by 1-0 score, becoming the third pitcher in Major League history with three 1-0 shutouts in a calendar month...threw the 23rd Perfect Game in MLB history Aug. 15 vs. Tampa Bay in a 1-0 victory...the monthly award was the 3rd of Felix's career (also: June & Sept, 2009)...combined with Jason Vargas to become only the second set of Mariners teammates to receive back-to-back Pitcher of the Month Awards (also: Felix and Jarrod Washburn in June and July, 2009).

<u>O-for-17 MISP...</u>Seattle was 0-for-17 with runners in scoring position Sept. 18; that marked the most hitless at-bats with runners in scoring position in a single game since Boston went 0-for-19 in a 12-inning, 3-2 win over the Yankees on April 24, 2004 (according to Baseball-Reference.com).

ROAD WARRIOR...Kyle Seager has recorded 58 of his team-leading 82 RBI this season on the road...ranks T1st in the AL and T4th in the Majors in road RBI...Seager is batting .295 (89x302) with 14 of his 18 HR in 74 games on the road...ranks 6th in the AL with 36 extra base hits on the road (16 at home).

SWING AND A MISS...Seattle matched an MLB record (and their own club-record) with 20 strikeouts Tuesday at LAA (Seattle also

struck out 20 times vs. Roger Clemens in '86)...it marked the 6th time in club history (including extra inning games) that Seattle has struck out 18 or more times; the club did it twice in 1986 and have done it twice this season.

STILL GOLDEN...Franklin

Gutierrez made an error Sept. 11 at Toronto, his first since Aug. 20, 2009...Guti went 301 consecutive games in the outfield (293 starts) without an error, with an American League record 846 consecutive chances between fielding miscues...the previous AL record was 723 consecutive errorless chances by Darin Erstad, and fell short of the MLB record of 938 by Darren Lewis.

THE SECRET TO SUCCESS....the Mariners are 53-19 (.736) when scoring 4+ runs, compared to 20-65 (.235) when scoring 3 or less... scored 3 or fewer in 18 of last 25 G, going 9-16 during stretch.

JUMPING AHEAD...the Mariners have scored first in 87 of their 157 games this season, ranking 2nd in the Majors behind the Angels (95 of 157)...the Mariners are 57-30 (.655) when scoring first, and 28-20 (.583) when scoring in the first inning.

HR BOTH SIDES OF PLATE...Tuesday, Justin Smoak became just the fourth player in Mariners history to homer from both sides of the plate, joining Larry Milbourne (7/15/78); Donnie Scott (4/29/85) and David Segui (4/1/98).

HITTING CATCHERS...John Jaso (38 GS) and Jesus Montero (53 GS) have combined to start 91 of the Mariners 157 games...each is batting over .295 when playing catcher, with Montero ranking 2nd among AL catchers (.311/64x206) and Jaso 3rd (.296/37x125) -- min. 35 G as catcher...Montero (10 HR), Miguel Olivo (11 HR) and Jaso (5 HR) have combined for a club-record 26 home runs by catchers (old record was 22 in 2000)...overall, Mariners backstops rank 2nd in AL batting .276 (163x591), trailing the Twins (.307).

STINGY LEFTY...Lucas Luetge, the Mariners 2012 Rule 5 pick, has stranded 42 of the 50 runners he's inherited this season.

FIVE SPOT...Felix Hernandez recorded his 5th shutout of the Aug. 27 at Minnesota...the 5 shutouts are a Mariners single-season record, and tied for the most in a season by American
