#### A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have won the season series as they lead 11-7 entering the final game...have won each of the last six games, which is the A's second longest winning streak against Seattle over the last 20 year (15, April 7-August 16, 2006)...went 6-3 in Seattle, 1-1 in Tokyo and are 4-3 in Oakland...over the last seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011)...the A's are 70-62 against Seattle since 2006...are batting .215 (131 for 609) compared to .211 (130 for 617) by the Mariners...the A's lowest single season batting average against Seattle is .219 in 2003...the pitching staff has a 2.36 ERA (44 er in 168.0 ip), which is their lowest since 1981 (2.00)...all-time, the A's are 303-224 (.575) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 167-95 in Oakland, 135-128 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brandon Moss hit his second career "walk-off" home run yesterday...it was his 21<sup>st</sup> home run of the season and it came in his 80<sup>th</sup> game...that is tied for third most in AL history by a player with fewer than 90 games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-4 A's win at Seattle...he was 5 for 5 against the pilots earlier in the season...in 1987 Dave Stewart becomes the A's first 20-game winner in seven years when he picks up the decision in the A's 4-3 victory over Cleveland...in 1995 Dennis Eckersley becomes the ninth major leaguer to pitch 900 games in his career when he tossed one inning at California...in 2000 the A's set Oakland records with 23 runs scored and a 21-run margin of victory in a 23-2 win over Texas...Adam Piatt has four hits and Miguel Tejada has five RBI.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and four of the last five games after losing six of the previous eight contests...won their 90<sup>th</sup> game of the season yesterday, the 16<sup>th</sup> time in Oakland history the A's have won 90 or more games...only the Yankees (23) and Braves (16) have as many as 16 seasons with 90 or more wins since 1968...are 90-68 (.570), which is the fourth best record in the American League...won just 74 games last year and the 16-win improvement is third largest in Oakland history...had a 29-win turnaround from 1979 (54-108) to 1980 (83-79) and a 23-win improvement from 1987 (81-81) to 1988 (104-58)...this is the A's first winning season since 2006 (93-69)...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by 2½ games...are in sole possession of the second Wild Card slot, one game behind first place Baltimore/New York and 2½ games ahead of third place Los Angeles...have held at least a share of a playoff spot each of the last 39 days (since August 22) and 59 of the last 71 (since July 21)...have the best record in the majors since the start of July (53-26) and since June 2 (68-38), the date the A's snapped their season-high nine game losing streak...have the best record in the AL since the All-Star Break (47-25)...in the West, have spent one day tied for first this year, 90 days in second, 11 days tied for second, 54 days in third, eight days tied for third and 11 days in fourth.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's trail Texas by 2½ games in the American League West and their magic number for elimination in the division race is three...have a 2½-game lead over Los Angeles and a three-game lead over Tampa Bay in the Wild Card race...the magic number for eliminating the Angels is three and the Rays is two...in the event a tie-breaker is needed for a playoff game or home field advantage in the Wild Card, the A's won the season series from Baltimore, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay and split the season series with New York...the second tiebreaker for a two-team tie with the Yankees would be intradivision games...the A's are 29-24 (.547) against the West and New York is 37-31 (.544) against the East...the A's season series with the Rangers is even at eight games each with three games remaining.

WALK-OFF WINS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Brandon Moss hit the A's sixth "walk-off" home run of the season yesterday, which ties the Oakland record set in 2004...it was the A's Major League leading 14<sup>th</sup> "walk-off" win overall, which is one short of the Oakland record of 15 set in 2004...11 different players have delivered a game-ending RBI...are now 22-14 in games decided in the last at bat...the 22 last at bat wins are second most in the American League to Baltimore (24)...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games, which is the second best record in the AL...have the second most extra inning games...are 28-26 in games decided in the seventh inning or later...have won 16 of their last 22 one-run games and are 24-18 (.571) for the season, which is the third best record in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 18 home runs in the last eight games and a Major League leading 108 since the All-Star Break (Baltimore, 102)...now have 191 home runs for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League and seventh in the majors...it is eighth most in Athletics history (7<sup>th</sup> is 197 in 1997)...hit just 114 home runs last year, an increase of 67.5%...have eight players with 10 or more home runs, which is tied for second most in Athletics history (nine in 2000)...the A's are 75-38 (.664) when they homer, including 39-14 (.736) with two or more home runs.

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's have set an American League record with 1358 strikeouts...broke the previous mark of 1324 set by Tampa Bay in 2007...the strikeouts are fifth most in Major League history (Arizona 1529 in 2010, Milwaukee 1399 in 2001, Florida 1375 in 2010, Florida 1371 in 2008).

**ROOKIES:** The A's currently have 15 rookies on the roster...have used 19 rookies overall, which is second most in the majors to the Cubs (20) and second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...12 of the 19 have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers set in 2009...all five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation are rookies (see page 2 for more info)...A's rookies have combined for 50 wins and 54 home runs...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are just the second team in Major League history to have rookies combine for at least 50 wins and 50 home runs in the same season (2006 Marlins).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have pitched fewer than five innings in eight of the last 13 games...the A's are 6-7 over that stretch and the starters are 2-4 with a 5.37 ERA (36 er in 60.1 ip) and .296 (71 for 240) opponents batting average...have issued 29 walks in 60.1 innings (4.33 per nine innings) in the 13 games after walking three batters or fewer in each of the previous 44 contests (47 bb in 267.1 ip, 1.58 per nine innings)...starters have a 3.78 ERA (394 er in 938.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have issued the fewest walks (247) and have the second fewest home runs (100).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.95 ERA (66 er in 120.0 ip) over the last 13 games but have a 3.51 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.56 was in 1990 (3.18)...lead the AL in pickoffs (23), have allowed the second fewest home runs (145), rank second in opponents slugging percentage (.378) and on-base percentage (.307) and third in batting average (.246) and shutouts (13).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .237, which is second lowest in the American League...it is one point above the Oakland record for lowest batting average (.236 in 1982)...have the third lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.310) but the fourth most walks (535)...lead the AL in runs scored since the All-Star Break with 370 (72 games, 5.14 per game)...were last in the AL in runs before the break (319, 3.71 per game)...have been shut out 16 times, which is second most in the majors (Miami, 17)...it is also the third highest total in Oakland history and the most since 1979 (17)...the record is 19 in 1978.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 12 errors in the last eight games, which has led to six unearned runs...have 108 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 44 unearned runs, which is fourth fewest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-0 on the final homestand of the season against Seattle (2-0) and Texas (three games)...are 46-31 (.597) at home, which is the fourth best home record in the AL...it is second best by an A's team over the last six years (47-34 in 2010)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Detroit (1-2), New York (1-2) and Texas (2-2)...finished the season 44-37 (.543) on the road, which was the A's first winning road record since 2006 when they also went 44-37...currently have the third best road record in the AL.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make start of the season...the A's are 19-11 (.633) in his starting assignments and his teams are 24-11 (.686) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 21 of his 30 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 17 times and walked two batters or fewer 26 times.

OAKLAND ROOKIE BESTS: Has set an Oakland rookie record with 13 wins. breaking the previous mark of 12 held by Chris Codiroli (1983) and Joe Blanton (2005)...his wins are the most by an A's rookie since Harry Byrd won 15 for the 1952 Philadelphia A's en route to rookie of the year honors...has 134 strikeouts, which is tied for third most in Oakland history and tied for fifth in Athletics history...is making his 31<sup>st</sup> start today, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history by a rookie...his 185.1 innings pitched are eighth best and are 5.0 innings short of the Oakland rookie record for a left-hander (Greg Smith, 2008; 190.1 ip)...his 24 home runs are tied for second most in Oakland history and are three short of the record of 27 by Trevor Cahill (2009).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among Major League rookies in complete games (1)...ranks second among American League rookies in wins (13) and innings pitched (185.1), third in games started (30) and tied for fourth in strikeouts

RECENTLY: Is 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA (6 er in 23.0 ip) over his last four starts, the sixth time in his career he has won two straight decisions...has never had a three-game winning streak...is now 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA (12 er in 40.0 ip) over his last seven starts after going 0-3 with a 7.50 ERA over his previous four starts...the three-game losing streak was the longest of his career.

DON'T WALK: Has walked just 36 batters in 185.1 innings, an average of 1.75 per nine innings...that ranks second in the American League and fifth in Oakland history...has walked one batter or fewer in 22 of his 30 starts, including an Oakland record tying 14 consecutive starts from June 20 to September 9 (also Gil Heredia, May 29-August 11, 1999)...has walked 15 of the 209 left-handed batters he has faced but just 21 of the 561 righthanders...has 134 strikeouts and his strikeout to walk ratio of 3.72 ranks seventh in the AL and fourth in Athletics history.

ON THE BASES: Has six pickoffs, which is tied for third in the American League...opponents have been successful in just 8 of 18 (44.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL

HOME AND AWAY: Is 7-4 with a 2.68 ERA (28 er in 94.0 ip) and .229 (80 for 350) opponents average in 14 starts at home compared to 6-6 with a 4.83 ERA (49 er in 91.1 ip) and .316 (118 for 374) opponents batting average in 16 starts on the road...has the seventh lowest home ERA in the

American League and the ninth highest road ERA...has allowed 18 of his 24 home runs on the road. NIGHT AND DAY: Is 10-5 with a 3.14 ERA (46 er in 132.0 ip) in 21 starts at night compared to 3-5 with a 5.23 ERA (31 er in 53.1 ip) in nine starts during the day...is tied for ninth in the American League in wins at night and tied for eighth in losses during the day.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 16 of his 30 starts and is 4-8 with a 3.15 ERA (35 er in 100.0 ip) in those games...is 9-2 with a 4.43 ERA (42 er in 85.1 ip) in 14 starts with run support of three runs or more.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Has 13 wins and Parker has 12...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are just the second team over the last 28 years to have two rookies win 12 or more games...the other was the , 2006 Marlins (Josh Johnson, Scott Olsen)...the last American League team to do it is the 1980 White Sox (Britt Burns, Rich Dotson)...this is the second time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 10 or more wins (Anderson and Cahill, 2009)...is one of two A's rookies with at least 20 games started (Parker, 28), marking the third time in Oakland history the A's have two rookies with 20 or more starts (Keough and Johnson, 1978; Cahill and Anderson, 2009)...the A's have five rookies in the starting rotation...today will mark the 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive game the A's have started a rookie, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 15 from August 1 to 16, 2009...is scheduled to make the 98<sup>th</sup> start by an A's rookie, which is second most in Oakland history (116 in 2009)...A's rookie pitchers have combined for an Oakland record 50 wins...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are just the third team over the last 100 years to get 50 or more wins from rookie pitchers...the others are the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers (51) and the 2006 Florida Marlins (50)...rookies have also set Oakland records for appearances (306), innings pitched (822.1) and strikeouts (662)...according to Elias, the 1952 Dodgers hold the record for most starts (69) and innings pitched (720.1) by rookies on a team that reached the postseason.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Texas last Tuesday...did not allow an earned run in 6.0 innings...was charged with two unearned runs in the first inning...the Rangers started the game with three consecutive singles but a Moss error on the third single by Hamilton allowed two runs to score...shutout the Rangers on three hits the rest of the way.

MILONE vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-1 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0 ip, 25 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in four career starts, all this year...the loss came in his first outing, a 4-0 decision at Seattle April 14...allowed a solo home run to Montero in the second and three more runs in the sixth...Noesi and League combined to shutout the A's on five hits...then combined with Balfour and Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Seattle June 25...tossed seven innings and allowed all seven of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-1, 11-inning win July 6 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Seager in the first inning but then shutout the Mariners on three hits and a walk over his final six innings...his second win came in the A's 4-2 win at Seattle September 9...matched his career high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (12-8, 3.44 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season...has 12 wins, which is tied for the second best total by a rookie in Oakland history (Milone has 13)...is 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the three-game winning streak matches the longest of his career...is now 5-1 with a 2.83 ERA over his last eight starts...has allowed an average of 0.46 home runs per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-3 A's win at Texas last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 8 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA in two career starts against Texas, both this year
