John Jaso hit his 10th homer of the season Thursday at LA...he now has 10 longballs in 105 games (351 PA) this season...entering 2012 he had 10 HR in his career in 203 games (687 PA).

ON THE AIR

Mariners will use rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus...Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims and Mike Blowers will work nearly all games...today **Ken Wilson** & **Blowers** will call the game on ROOT Sports, with Rizzs and **Dan Wilson** calling the action on the Mariners Radio Network.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude their final road series of the season with the third (0-2) of three at Oakland...trip began with three games in Los Angeles (1-2)...will close out the season with a three-game "homestand" vs. the Angels beginning tomorrow...today's game will be televised on ROOT Sports in HD and will be broadcast live on 770 KTTH Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS ... lost 2 straight and 2 of last 3 games ... are 3-5 in last 8 and have lost 9 of last 12, including a 4-game losing streak, and 11 of last 15 games...3-8 in last 11 games at Safeco Field, after winning 17 of 20 from July 26-Sept. 3...season-high 8-game win streak Aug. 14-22; longest win streak since 2007...won 12 of last 22 series...are 9-16 in Sept. after posting back-to-back winning months in August (15-12) and July (15-11)...37-34 (.521) post All-Star break.

- Head West -- Finished 10-19 (.345) when playing in the Eastern Time Zone this season.
- Thefts -- Successful in 26 of last 32 SB attempts (81.3%), 2nd-highest pct. in MLB since Aug. 14.
- Close Games -- 107 of 158 games decided by 3 or less runs, combining to go 52-55; 1-Run: 25-28, 2-Run: 13-16; 3-Run: 14-11...most 1-run games (53) among all AL teams...won 7 of last 14 1-run G. **2012 WINS --** With 73 wins, Mariners have passed their win total from 2011 (67) & 2010 (61).
- Gold Gloves -- Mariners are 2nd in Majors with .988 FLD%...played error-free in 97 of 158 games.
- Tom Wilhelmsen has recorded a save in 8 of the Mariners 9 wins this month (29-for-34 in '12).
- Pinch Hitting -- John Jaso (.353/6x17, 4 RBI) is 2nd in the AL with 6 pinch hits (Ibañez, 7).
- Left on Left -- LH Charlie Furbush has held LH batters to a .149 batting average (11x74).

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...today is the 19th and final game between the Mariners and A's in 2012 the Mariners trail the season series 7-11, going 3-6 in SEA, 3-4 in OAK and 1-1 in Tokyo...the Mariners went 10-9 against the A's last season, but were 4-5 at the Coliseum...Seattle is 60-53 vs. Oakland since 2007...Seattle trails the all-time series 224-303, including a 96-168 (.364) mark here.

20-20-20 VISION...Michael Saunders & Kyle Seager collected their 19th homers of the season yesterday, and Justin Smoak hammered his 19th Wednesday (it's a career high for all 3 players)... Seattle has not had a 20-homer guy since 2009, when Russell Branyan (31) and Jose Lopez (25) each turned the trick...2010 and 2011 were the first seasons since 1983 (when Pat Putnam led w/19) that Seattle has failed to have at least one player reach 20 homers...Mariners have not had three or more 20 HR guys since 2007, when Seattle had four guys reach 20+ (Beltre, Guillen, Ibanez, Sexson).

CORNER PRODUCTION...Kyle Seager has 83 RBI this season...that trails only Miguel Cabrera (136) and Adrian Beltre (100) among AL third basemen this season...if you only count RBI while playing 3B (no DH, PH or other positions) the list is Cabrera (131), Beltre (84) and Seager (78).

GOOD MATCH-UP...Jesus Montero is 5-for-9 (.556) with a double and a home run vs. today's A's starter, Tommy Milone...he boasts a matching .556 OBP, and a shiny, 1.000 slugging percentage.

TOUGH WAY TO WIN ... the Mariners are 0-for-14 with Men in Scoring Position this series, posting matching 0-for-7 games Friday and Saturday...are 0-for-their-last-16 (dating back to Thursday) overall.

NOT 2 MUCH LATELY...Kyle Seager is T4th in the Majors with 43 two-out RBI, but he hasn't collected one in over a month...his last 2-out RBI -- actually, his last 2 -- were Aug. 28 at MIN...after collecting 43 2-out RBI among his first 75 total RBI, his last 8 RBI have all been with 0 or 1 outs.

STILL TIME...Michael Saunders collected his 19th HR and his 21st steal yesterday...the Mariners have not had a 20-20 guy since 2002 (Mike Cameron, 25 HR, 31 SB) and its only been done 9 times (by five different players) in franchise history: Rodriguez, 3x; Cameron, 2x; Griffey, 2x; R. Jones; P. Bradley.

HOMER HAPPY...Mariners have homered in 18 straight games (see chart in box at left), collecting 25 total HR during streak...it's the longest streak this season (prev: 11, Aug. 17-28) for Seattle...the last season the Mariners had 2 streaks of 11+ consecutive games w/a HR was 1997 (14, 8/19-9/1 and 13 8/5-8/17).

D-FICIENT...the Mariners have committed an uncharacteristic 12 errors in their last 14 games (4-10), a .978 fielding percentage, and have posted just 4 errorless games...in the season's first 144 games, Seattle committed just 57 errors, a .989 fielding percentage, and had 96 errorless games.

SMOAKIN'...Justin Smoak is batting .329 (24x73) with 11 runs, 4 doubles, 5 HR and 9 RBI in 22 games in September, including 20-for-his-last-51 (.392) since Sept. 13 (14 G); counting his 8 walks during that stretch, he's reached base safely in 28 of his last 59 plate appearances (.475 OBP, .745 SLG, 1.220 OPS).

1 FOR THE MONEY...Seattle has played 53 one-run games this season, posting a 25-28 mark... since the start of the 2008 season, Seattle has played 259 one-run games, the (tied) most in the Majors...Seattle and Minnesota are tied with 259 games, tops among all MLB teams, and ahead of TOR (250), KC (244) & TB (239) among AL teams...OAK is 26th in MLB at 217.

CLOSING IT OUT...Tom Wilhelmsen has not allowed a run in his last 12.1 innings in relief...since Sept. 3, he has limited opponents to a .116 average (5x43) with 3 walks and 11 strikeouts, while recording 7 saves in 10 relief appearances... Wilhelmsen is 1 save away from becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 30 saves in a single season, while his 76.2 innings pitched are the most by a Mariners reliever in a season since Brandon League tossed 79.0 innings in 2010.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DINGERS...Seattle has 7 players with at least 10 HR this season...Justin Smoak (19), Kyle Seager (19), Michael Saunders (19), Jesus Montero (15), Dustin Ackley (12), Miguel Olivo (12) and John Jaso (10)...marks the first time since 2000 the Mariners have had 7 players with doubledigits in home runs (Rodriguez/Martinez/Buhner/Cameron/Olerud/Bell/Oliver)... Casper Wells has 8, and if he reaches 10 HR, will be first time since 1997 (9 players) that 8 or more players hit 10+ HR...2012 is also the first time with 4 players with 15+ home runs since 2009 (Branyan/Griffey Jr./Gutierrez/Lopez).

AS YOU KNOW...Michael Saunders has 19 homers this season, including 8 off of left-handed pitching, but DID YOU KNOW?...that the 8 left-off-left homers rank T8th in the Majors (6th in AL) this season?...8 by a LHH off of LHP is T9th in Mariners history (also: Ken Griffey Jr.)...only 3 other Mariners (9x) have hit at least 8 left-off-left HR: Griffey (7x), Russel Branyan and Tino Martinez

- Making his 8th career MLB start, and 16th overall appearance with the Mariners today vs. the A's.
- Made his Major League debut April 9 at Texas (3.0,2,1,1,1,3,HR)...allowed a solo HR to J. Hamilton.
- Listed by Baseball America as the Mariners No. 13 prospect heading into the 2012 season.
- Signed by as a non-drafted free agent on 9/1/07... signed by scouts Ubaldo Heredia and Bob Engle.
- Named the 2011 Nicaragua Athlete of the Year by the Instituto Nacional de Deportes (Institute of Sport).
- One of 12 players born in Nicaragua to play in MLB (9th pitcher).
- Named the Mariners MiL Pitcher of the Year in 2009 after...11-1, 0.51 in 14 G/13 GS with VSL Mariners.

LAST TIME OUT...L#3 in his last start Sept. 25 vs. the Angels in Anaheim (6.0,7,5,3,0,3,2 HR)...recorded his third consecutive quality start (and 4th overall) this season...allowed 2 unearned runs in the first inning, and a 2-run home run (Torii Hunter) and solo home run (Erick Aybar)...did not walk a batter for the second consecutive start.

CONTROL FREAK...has not walked a batter in his last 14 innings, and in 7 starts at the Major League level has walked only 4 batters in 40.2 innings (0.88 BB/9.0 IP)...has a 8.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio as a starter.

FIRST WIN ... recorded his first Major League win on Sept. 11 at TOR (7.0,6,2,2,1,6)...was his first start at the Major League level since June 30 vs. Boston.

AS A STARTER...is 1-3 with a 3.76 ERA (17 ER, 40.2 IP) as a starter, compared to 0-0, 2.25 in 8 relief appearances...in last 5 starts is 1-2 with a 2.27 ERA (8 ER, 31.2 IP), holding opponents to a .179 batting average (20x112) with 27 strikeouts.

ROOKIE K'S...struck out career-high 10 batters June 26 vs. Oakland... 8th rookie (17th time) in club history to record a double-digit strikeout performance (Iwakuma also stuck out 13 on 7/30 vs. TOR)... Freddy Garcia (4x), Mark Langston (4x), Randy Johnson (3x), Byron McLaughlin (2x), Erik Hanson, Felix Hernandez (8/15/05 vs. KC) and Michael Pineda all had a 10+ strikeout performance during their rookie season...is 1 of 11 rookies in the ML this season to strikeout at least 10 batters in a game.

FIRST & SECOND TIME AROUND ... made the Mariners Opening Day roster and was with the team until being optioned to Tacoma on May 5...did not record a decision in 7 appearances with the Mariners, posting a 2.45 ERA (3 ER, 11.0 IP)...recalled to Seattle on June 13 and made first career start on June 14...went 0-2 with a 4.58 ERA (10 ER, 19.2 IP) in 4 starts...on the DL with right elbow flexor strain, July 1-Aug. 4, including 2 rehab starts with Tacoma, July 25-Aug. 4... recalled from DL and optioned to Tacoma on Aug. 5...recalled from Tacoma to Seattle on Sept. 1...in 4 outings (3 GS) since rejoining the roster is 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA (7 ER, 22.0 IP).

WITH THE RAINIERS ... made 15 starts in 2 stints with AAA Tacoma, May 5-June 13 and Aug. 5-31...went 6-3 with a 3.72 ERA (32 ER, 77.1 IP)...did not allow a home run in last 5 outings and allowed only 1 HR at home.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB...Kyle Seager (83 RBI) is just the 4th player in Mariners history to record 80 or more RBI in either of the first two seasons of a Major League career...he joins Alvin Davis (116 in 1984 - rookie), Jim Presley (84 in 1985 - 2nd year) and Ken Griffey Jr. (80 in 1990 - 2nd year)...since 2008, Seager is one of just 5 AL players with an 80+ RBI season in the first two years of a career, joining Mark Trumbo (2011), Evan Longoria (2008-09) and Josh Hamilton (2008).

LET'S ALL START "FELIXING"...Felix Hernandez was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August...Hernandez compiled a perfect 4-0 record with a 1.08 ERA (5 ER, 41.2 IP) and 3 shutouts in 5 starts...all three shutouts were by 1-0 score, becoming the third pitcher in Major League history with three 1-0 shutouts in a calendar month...threw the 23rd Perfect Game in MLB history Aug. 15 vs. Tampa Bay in a 1-0 victory...the monthly award was the 3rd of Felix's career (also: June & Sept, 2009)...combined with Jason Vargas to become only the second set of Mariners teammates to receive back-to-back Pitcher of the Month Awards (also: Felix and Jarrod Washburn in June and July, 2009).

<u>0-for-17 MISP</u>...Seattle was 0-for-17 with runners in scoring position Sept. 18; that marked the most hitless at-bats with runners in scoring position in a single game since Boston went 0-for-19 in a 12-inning, 3-2 win over the Yankees on April 24, 2004 (according to Baseball-Reference.com).

ROAD WARRIOR...Kyle Seager has recorded 59 of his team-leading 83 RBI this season on the road...ranks 2nd in the AL and T4th in the Majors in road RBI...Seager is batting .293 (90x307) with 15 of his 19 HR in 75 games on the road...ranks T7th in the AL with 37 extra base hits on the road (16 at home).

SWING AND A MISS...Seattle matched an MLB record (and their

own club-record) with 20 strikeouts Tuesday at LAA (Seattle also struck out 20 times vs. Roger Clemens in '86)...it marked the 6th time in club history (including extra inning games) that Seattle has struck out 18 or more times; the club did it twice in 1986 and have done it twice this season.

THE SECRET TO SUCCESS...the Mariners are 53-20 (.726) when scoring 4+ runs, compared to 20-65 (.235) when scoring 3 or less... scored 3 or fewer in 18 of last 26 G, going 9-17 during stretch.

<u>JUMPING AHEAD</u>...the Mariners have scored first in 88 of their 158 games this season, ranking 2nd in the Majors behind the Angels (95 of 157)...the Mariners are 57-31 (.648) when scoring first, and 28-20 (.583) when scoring in the first inning.

HR BOTH SIDES OF PLATE...Tuesday, Justin Smoak became just the fourth player in Mariners history to homer from both sides of the plate, joining Larry Milbourne (7/15/78); Donnie Scott (4/29/85) and David Segui (4/1/98).

HITTING CATCHERS...John Jaso (38 GS) and Jesus Montero (53 GS) have combined to start 91 of the Mariners 158 games...each is batting over .295 when playing catcher, with Montero ranking 2nd among AL catchers (.311/64x206) and Jaso 3rd (.296/37x125) --min. 35 G as catcher...Montero (10 HR), Miguel Olivo (11 HR) and

Jaso (5 HR) have combined for a club-record **26** home runs by catchers (old record was 22 in 2000)...overall, Mariners backstops rank 2nd in AL batting .276 (164x595), trailing the Twins (.307).
