PLAYOFF-BOUND: With a victory in Game 2 of Sunday's split doubleheader, the Rangers clinched a 3rd consecutive postseason appearance for the 1st time in club history...it will be the team's 6th overall postseason appearance with A.L. West titles in 1996, 1998, 1999, 2010, and 2011...the Rangers join the Yankees, who also clinched a playoff spot on Sunday, as the only ML clubs who are currently assured of being in the postseason in both the last 2 and last 3 seasons.

--Texas clinched its 2012 playoff spot in its 159th game, the 3rd latest in team history and the latest since 1998 (160th game)...this is the 1st time that the Rangers have secured a playoff spot without clinching the A.L. West title ... the dates and games for the 5 times Texas has clinched the A.L. West title: TEXAS RANGERS A.L. WEST CLINCH DATES

1996: Sept. 27, Game 161...lost to Angels at home but clinched with Seattle loss 1998: Sept. 25, Game 160...lost at Seattle but clinched with Angels loss 1999: Sept. 26, Game 155...won vs. Oakland at home

2010: Sept. 25, Game 154...won at Oakland2011: Sept. 23, Game 157...won vs. Seattle at home, then clinched with Angels loss -Sunday marked the 3rd time that the Rangers have clinched a playoff spot at home and the 3rd time they have clinched with a win.

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers and A's meet in the final 3 games of the regular season with this 3-game series...Texas was 3-4 on its final homestand with Oakland (2-2) and Los Angeles (1-2) following a split of Sunday day-night doubleheader...the club has lost 4 of 6 and 6 of 10, but have won 13 of 24, 15 of 27, and 26 of the last 43 games, the longer span beginning August 16...are 34-23 (.596) since the start of August... Texas is 41-32 since the All-Star break and has won 60 of 101 beginning June 8...club is 78-62 since a 15-4 start...the Rangers' .585 winning percentage is best in the A.L. and tied for 3rd-best in majors (see chart below)...also lead A.L. with 93 wins, the 4thhighest win total in team history (see below)...have had A.L.'s best record for 40 straight days, currently a game ahead of the Yankees and Orioles...current record matches 2011 for 2nd-best in club history through 159 games...Texas has club-record 4th consecutive winning season (previously 3 straight twice)...season-high 29-over .500 twice, last on 9/24 (91-62)...the Rangers own majors' best winning pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .603 (138-91) and are tied with the Yankees at .589 (189-132) for last 2 years.

IN THE LEAD: The Rangers lead the A.L. West by 2.0 games over Oakland with 3 to play...that is the smallest mar-gin since Sept. 15 (2.0 GA), just the 2nd day since April 13 when lead has been small...last smaller lead was 1.5 games on April 12...have lost ground in the division in 5 of the past 6 days after not losing any ground for 9 straight days...magic number to clinch the division is 2 ...Rangers' 176 days in first place lead majors in 2012 and are the 3rd-most in team history for a season...season's biggest advantage has been 6.5 games on 6 days, last thru games of August 12...club has led by at least 3.5 games for 146 of last 167 days beginning April 17...have had outright possession of A.L. West lead for last 175 days and have held at least a share of the West lead for 176 of 178 days in 2012 and 312 of last 314 days beginning May 16, 2011...beg. June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 462 of 478 days.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers have won 3 of 5 away from home and are 11-7 on the road beginning August 18...club is

20-17 away from home since the All-Star break...at 43-35 (.551), the Rangers have the the 2nd-best away winning percentage in the A.L. behind .577 (45-33) for Baltimore...this marks the 7th season in which the Rangers have had a winning road record, just their 5th in the last 35 years ... with a 44-37 mark in 2011, it is the 1st time that the Rangers have ever had consecutive seasons with a better than .500 road record....43 road wins are 4th most in team history behind 50 in 1977 and 44 in 1999 and 2011.

TWO GAMES IN ONE DAY: The Rangers lost Game 1 and won Game 2 of Sunday's split doubleheader and are 0-2 with 5 splits in 7 lifetime day-night twinbills...in conventional doubleheaders (not including split DH), Texas is 6-0-4 in 10 twinbills since being swept by the Yankees on May 3, 2007, the last time Texas lost twice on the same day

CLOSE GAMES: Both games on Sunday were decided by a single run and 6 of Texas' last 9 contests have been one-run games (3-3)...the Rangers are 24-21 on-run contests in 2012, 15-8 at home....the Game 1 defeat yesterday marked just the 3rd time in 2012 that Texas has lost when leading after 8 innings, the other April 11 vs. SEA and Sept. 13 vs. CLE, all blown saves by Joe Nathan...it was the 12th time the opponent has won in its last at bat.

IN SEPTEMBER: The Rangers were 15-13 (.536) in September, the 7th best winning percentage in the A.L. for the month...it was the team's 3rd consecutive winning September, and the 15 wins matched its 2nd most in the month in the last 13 seasons (19 in 2011; 15 in 2005 and 2010). Texas ranked 9th in the league with a 4.39 team ERA and was 8th in A.L. with a .255 batting average... Texas tied for 3rd with 42 HR

ADRIAN BELTRE homered 11 times in September, the 2nd most in the majors to Tampa Bay's B.J. Upton (12)...he had the 9th highest batting average at .337 (33-98) and tied for 8th with 19 RBI...Beltre had 12 HR in September 2011...the only other active player to hit 11+ HR multiple times in September is Ryan Howard (11 HR in Sept. of both 2007 and 2008).

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers and A's are tied, 8-8 in the 2012 series with this 3-game series to play...Texas has dropped 4 of 7 beginning July 1 but has won 6 of last 10...the Rangers are 20-10 vs. the A's beginning May 10, 2011 and have captured 5 of the last 6 season's series beginning 2006...Texas is 2-4 here in Oakland this season and has lost 5 of last 7 here...Texas is 11-8 in last 19 games at the Coliseum since Sept. 24, 2010...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 315-300 overall with the A's having a 158-148 advantage here at Oakand Coliseum.

vs. A.L. West: Texas plays its final 19 games against A.L. West opponents (8-8 to date)...Rangers have gone 27-27 against the West this year after a 40-17 mark in 2011...club is just 10-14 in A.L. West parks but has split its last 14 games....the Rangers were 20-10 on the road in its division a year ago.

MIKE NAPOLI had a pair of homers and 6 RBI in the Game 2 victory Sunday that sent the Rangers into postseason for a 3rd straight year...it was his 10th career 2-homer game, the 3rd this season...the former Angel is just the 2nd player in 2010-11 to have a game of 2+ homers and 6+ RBI versus his former team...the other was Seattle's Justin Smoak (2 HR, 6 RBI) against the Rangers on May 30, 2011, also in Arlington...Napoli matched his career best with 6 RBI, --of Napoli's 6 multi-HR games with the Rangers in 2011-12, 4 have come

against the Angels...he has homered 6 times versus his former club in each of the last 2 years...the only other former Angel to hit as many as 6 homers as an opposing player vs. the club is Bobby Bonds, 7 vs. Califonia with the Rangers in 1978 (Elias Sports Bureau).

--Napoli also homered twice versus the Angels on Sept. 28, 2011 at Anaheim to give Texas home-field advantage throughout the A.L. playoffs.

JOE NATHAN recorded just his 3rd blown save of the season in Game 1 on Sunday, then came back to earn his 37th save of 2012 in Game 2...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he becomes the 1st pitcher in franchise history to have both a save and a blown save on the same day...the last major league pitcher to do it was St. Louis' Ryan Franklin on June 5, 2008 at WAS as he had a save in Game 1 and a blown save in Game 2 of a regular DH.

--Nathan's 37 saves match Francisco Cordero in 2005 for the 7th most in team history...it was the 298th save of his career, 24th all-time, 2 behind Jason Isringhausen and Bruce Sutter.

KOJI AGAIN: Koji Uehara tossed a perfect 8th inning with 3 strikeouts in Game 2 on SUN...he has gone a club-record 9 consecutive appearances without allowing a baserunner, spanning 7.2 innings with 15 K's...is the 13th such streak in ML history of at least 9 games, the 3rd in 2012, 12 for the Mets' Tim Byrdak, May 6-22 and 9 for the White Sox' Donnie Veal, August 29-Sept. 12...Uehara has retired 23 consecutive batters since allowing a single to Cleveland's Casev Kotchman in the 8th inning on Sept. 11.

JOSH HAMILTON enters play on Monday tied with Detroit's Miguel Cabrera for the ML lead with 43 homers...a Ranger has led the majors in homers 4times:Juan Gonzalez in 1992 and 1993 (tied) and Alex Rodriguez in 2002 and 2003 (tied)...in addition to that group, A. Rodriguez topped A.L. in HR in 2001.

SHORTS: Rangers have one error in the last 9 games and 80 for the season, 4th fewest in the A.L....club record for fewest errors is 87 in 1996...Texas is 33-47 all-time in regular season October games, going 1-2 in 2010.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#33 Martin Perez, LHP (1-3, 5.03)

TONIGHT: The 21-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 6th career start and 12th major league appearance tonight against the A's in Oakland...is making 3rd straight start after joining the rotation with the shuffle of Scott Feldman to the bulloen after his last start on Sept. 15 vs. SEA...working on regular 4 days' rest after suffering the loss to Oakland on Wednesday night in Texas...has allowed 8 ER in 4.2 IP (15.43 ERA) over his last 2 starts after just 5 ER over 17.1 IP (2.60 ERA) in his first 3...is 1-3, 5.32 (13 ER/22.0 IP) in 5 starts; 0-0, 4.50 (6 ER/12.0 IP) in 6 relief app....holding LHB to .239 (11-46)...is in his 3rd stint with Texas, others June 26-July 17 & July 23-31...the Venezuelan has been rated as one of the Rangers' top 5 prospects by Baseball America in 4 straight seasons (2009-12)...was the youngest active player in Triple-A at the time of his initial promotion in June...at 21 years, 87 days of age, became the 5th-youngest Ranger ever to win a start for Texas, youngest since Ed Correa (21.059) on 6/27/87 vs. MIN...overall at Triple-A this season, went 7-6, 4.25 (60 ER/127.0 IP) in 22 games/21 starts...his .256 (119-464) opp. avg. as a starter was 5th-lowest among PCL starters...had 2 CG...ranked among team leaders in wins (T2nd, 7), strikeouts (T2nd, 69), starts (3rd, 21), and innings (3rd, 127.0).

LAST START: Suffered a loss to Oakland on Wednesday night at Rangers Ballpark (0.2 IP, 6 H, 5 R-ER, 0 BB, 1 SO, 0 HR, 24 pitches/18 strikes)...surrendered a careerhigh 5 runs in only 0.2 innings, the shortest of 5 starts in his career...allowed 4 consecutive hits with one out in the 1st...was the start was the shortest by a Ranger since Derek Holland lasted 0.2 IP on July 2, 2011 vs. FLA, with those 2 starts the only 2 noninjury- or ejection-caused outings by Rangers starters in the last 5 seasons (2008-12).

2012: Is 1-3, 5.32 (13 ER/22.0 IP) in 5 starts; 0-0, 4.50 (6 ER/12.0 IP) in 6 relief appearances...holding LHB to .239 (11-46) with 2 XBH (2 2B), including 2-for-17 in his last 3 outings and 6-for-33 (.182) in his last 7 games...opponents are hitting .314 (11-35) with RISP, 5-for-21 (.238) in his last 6 games.

VS. OAKLAND: Has made 2 of his 5 starts against Oakland this season, as he also beat them to earn first major league win in his first career major league start (2nd app.) on June 30 (5.1 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 103 pitches/59 strikes)...allowed solo HR to Carter in the 2nd and a double to Carter and RBI single by Inge in the 4th before Rangers put up 5 unearned runs against Milone in 5th on a Kinsler 2-run single and Hamilton 3-run HR.

AS STARTER: Is 1-3, 5.32 (13 ER/22.0 IP) in his first 5 career starts for Texas...opponents are batting .305 (29-95) in his starts with 8 walks, 13 strikeouts...opposition batting .317 (13-41) on the first time through the order in his 5 starts...opponents batting .406 (13-32) 2nd time through order...earned win in his first career start on 6/30 vs. OAK (see separate note)...took ND in next start on 7/6 vs. MIN...in his 3rd start, exited in a 1-1 tie and Joe Nathan gave up a run in the 9th inning of a 2-1 Rangers loss, July 24 vs. BOS (6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER)...has received just 10 runs of support in his 5 starts (4.09 runs -per-nine-innings), just 4 total runs in last 4 starts...is one of just 3 lefties to start for Texas in 2012 (also Harrison and Holland)...has made just one start away from Arlington on Sept. 21 at SEA (4.0 IP, 4 R-3 ER).

AS RELIEVER: Has no record and 4.50 ERA (6 ER/12.0 IP) in 6 relief outings, including a 1.59 (2 ER/11.1 IP) figure his last 5 relief appearances since his ML debut...has allowed runs in just one of his last 5 ML relief efforts, holding opponents to a .220 (9-41) figure with 4 walks and 8 K's...tossed 4.1 hitless shutout innings on 9/15 vs. SEA, the first Texas reliever with 4.1+ IP/0 H/0 R since Mark Brandenburg (4.2 IP - 7/6/96 vs. SEA)...it was the first such relief outing in the majors since Arizona's Max Scherzer did it (4.1 IP - 4/29/08 vs. HOU)...owns 2 of the 3 longest relief appearances by a Ranger in 2012: 5.0 IP on 9/9 at TB and 4.1 IP on 9/15 vs. SEA.

TOP PROSPECT: The Venezuelan has been rated as one of the Rangers' top five prospects by *Baseball America* in 4 straight seasons (2009-12), including the top billing last season and the number two spot entering 2012...was the youngest active

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER - LHP Matt Harrison (18-10, 3.26 in 31 games/starts)

The 27-year-old southpaw is slated to make his 32nd start and appearance tomorrow night in Oakland...has posted just the 10th season of 18 wins in Texas history, the 8th pitcher to do so...takes the mound looking to become the 6th 19-game winner in club history, and the first since Rick Helling (20-7) and Aaron Sele (19-11) both got there in 1998...has tied Kenny Rogers (2004) for the most wins by a left-hander in club history...has established new career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched (207.1), strikeouts (128), complete games (4), and shutouts (2), while also posting the most losses, hits (204), runs (79, tied), earned runs (75), HR (21), and walks (58) in his career...his current 3.17 ERA would be lowest of his career...is 3rd in the A.L. with 18 wins, behind David Price (20 and Jered Weaver (20)...ranks 7th in the A.L. in ERA and 8th in innings (207.1)...could finish the year as just the 2nd pitcher in Rangers history to win at least 18 games with an ERA under 3.30, joining Fergie Jenkins in 1974 (25-12, 2.82) and 1978 (18-8, 3.04)...has taken a win or loss in 28-of-31 starts, and could become just the 16th pitcher in Rangers history with at least 29 decisions, the first since Rick Helling (16-13) in 2000...is 10-6 with a 3.03 ERA (39 ER/116.0 IP) in 17 road starts, but has lost his last 2, 9/4 at KC (4.2 IP, 8 H, 5 R, 3 ER, 3 SO) and 9/22 at SEA (CG, 8.0 IP, 7 H, 1 R-ER, 4 BB, 6 SO)...all 4 of Harrison's CG have been on the road, tying Justin Verlander for the ML lead and the most for a Ranger away from home since Ken Hill and Roger Pavlik had 4 apiece in 1996...his 4 CG are T3rd-most in A.L. and match Derek's Holland's 2011 total for the most CG by a Ranger in the last 14 seasons (beginning 1999)...Harrison is 14-7, 2.66 (47 ER/159.0 IP) last 23 starts beginning May 22...is 2-0, 4.19 (9 ER/19.1 IP) in 3 starts vs. Oakland this season, all at RBIA, winning last start on Thurs. (6.0 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR)...in 9 career starts, is 6-1, 3.33 (20 ER/54.0 IP) against the A's, including 2-1, 3
