West titles in 1996, 1998, 1999, 2010, and 2011...the Rangers join the Yankees, who also clinched a playoff spot on Sunday, as the only ML clubs who are currently assured of being in the postseason in both the last 2 and last 3 seasons.

--Texas clinched its 2012 playoff spot in its 159th game, the 3rd latest in team history and the latest since 1998 (160th game)...this is the 1st time that the Rangers have secured a playoff spot without clinching the A.L. West title...the dates and games for the 5 times Texas has clinched the A.L. West title:

TWO FROM THE A.L. WEST: With Oakland clinching a playoff spot on Monday, this will be the 1st time since 2002 that 2 teams from the A.L. West Division have advanced to postseason play...it occurred 3 times previously: 2000 (Oakland--West Champ; Seattle-Wild Card); 2001 (Seattle--West Champ; Oakland--Wild Card); and 2002 (Oakland--West Champ; Anaheim--Wild Card).

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers have lost 3 of 4, 5 of 7 and 7 of the last 11 games, the longer span beginning Sept. 21...club has won consecutive games just once in this span (Sept. 23-24)...over the longer span, Texas has won 15 of 28 and 26 of the last 47 games, the longer span beginning August 16...are 34-24 (.586) since the start of August...Texas is 41-33 since the All-Star break and has won 60 of 102 beginning June 8...club is 78-63 since a 15-4 start...the Rangers' .581 winning percentage is tied for best in the A.L. and tied for 3rd-best in majors (see chart below)...also tied for A.L. lead with 93 wins, the 4th-highest win total in team history (see below)...had outright possession of the A.L.'s best record for 40 straight days before being tied by the Yankees on Monday...current record is 3rd-best in club history through 160 games...Texas has club-record 4th consecutive winning season (previously 3 straight twice)...season-high 29-over .500 twice, last on 9/24 (91-62)...the Rangers own majors' best winning pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .600 (138-92) and 2nd best overall in the majors in 2011-12 at .587 (189-133).

West by 1.0 game over Oakland with 2 to play...that is the smallest margin since Texas held a half game lead on April 11 through the first 6 games of the season...club has held outright possession of 1st every day since April 9...Texas has lost ground in the division in 6 of the past 7 days after not losing any ground for 9 straight days...Rangers' 177 days in first place lead majors in 2012 and tie 1996 for the 2nd-most in team history for a season, 2 behind 1999...season's biggest advantage has been 6.5 games on 6 days, last thru games of August 12...club had a lead of at least 2.5 games for 154 straight days from April 14-Sept. 14...have had outright possession of A.L. RANGERS

CLOSE GAMES: Each of Texas' last 3 games have been decided by one run (1-2) and 7 of the last 10 contests have been one-run games (3-4), inclusing 4 in a row, Sept. 2225...the Rangers are 24-22 on-run contests in 2012, 9-13 on the road, losing 3 of last 4 away from home...since the start of 2011, Texas is 17-33 in one-run games on the road.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers are 11-8 on the road beginning August 18...club is 20-18 away from home since the All-Star break...at 43-36 (.554), the Rangers are tied with the Angels (43-36) for the 2nd-best away winning percentage in the A.L. behind .570 (45-34) for Baltimore...this marks the 7th season in which the Rangers have had a winning road record, just their 5th in the last 35 years...with a 44-37 mark in 2011, it is the 1st time that the Rangers have ever had consecutive seasons with a better than .500 road record....43 road wins are 4th most in team history behind 50 in 1977 and 44 in 1999 and 2011.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 8-9 against the A's, losing 3 of 4 and 5 of 8, the longer span beginning July 1...the Rangers have won 6 of last 11 and are 20-11 vs. the A's beginning May 10, 2011...club has captured 5 of the last 6 season's series beginning 2006...Texas is 2-5 here in Oakland this season and has lost 2 in a row and 6 of last 8 here...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 315-301 overall with the A's having a 159-148 advantage here at Oakand Coliseum

vs. A.L. West: Texas plays its final 19 games against A.L. West opponents (8-9 to date)...Rangers have gone 27-28 against the West this year after a 40-17 mark in 2011...club is just 10-15 in A.L. West parks, fewest wins since 2007 (9-20)...the Rangers were 20-10 on the road in its division a year ago.

THE IRONMEN: Nelson Cruz (157), Elvis Andrus (156), and Ian Kinsler (155) are 3 of just 17 A.L. players who have appeared in at least 155 game in 2012...Adrian Beltre and Michael Young enter Tuesday with 154 games played...Texas' current team record for most players with 155+ games in a season is 4 in 2005 (Hank Blalock, Alfonso, Soriano, Mark Teixeira, Michael Young)...since the start of division play in 1969, there have been just 10 teams with at least 5 players who saw action in 155 games, the last being the 2009 Phillies with 6.

MIKE NAPOLI is 4-for-6 with 3 homers, 7 RBI, and 2 walks in his last 2 games and is 6-for-14 with 4 homers and 10 RBI in his last 4 starts...he is batting .295 (13-44) with 7 HR, 16 RBI, and 6 BB in 14 games/13 starts since being activated from DL on Sept. 15...beginning Sept. 15, Napoli ranks 2nd in the majors in both homers and RBI behind Detroit's Miguel Cabrera (8 HR/18 RBI)...in September-October regular season games in 2011-12, he is batting .377 (43-114) with 15 homers and 35 RBI in 35 games.

THE DEFENSE: The Rangers have committed just one error in the last 10 games and have 80 errors for the season, 4th fewest in the A.L....the current team record for fewest miscues in a season is 87 in 1996...Texas ranks 4th in the league with a .9863 (80 E/5836 TC) team fielding percentage...the current team record for highest fielding percentage in a season is .9857 in 1996...Texas' 99 errorless games in 2012 are a club record, surpassing the team's 95 in 1996.

MATT HARRISON has 18 victories entering his final regular season start of 2012, tying Kenny Rogers in 2004 for the most wins ever by a Texas left-hander...overall, Harrison has recorded just the 10th season of 18 wins in Texas history, the 8th different pitcher to do so...a Texas pitcher has won has many as 19 games 6 times, last by Rick Helling (20-7) and Aaron Sele (19-11) both in 1998...Harrison enters tonight's game with a 3.26 ERA...the only pitcher in Rangers history with 18 wins and a sub-3.30 ERA in a season was Hall of Famer Fergie Jenkins, who did it in both 1974 and 1978...2 A.L. pitchers have won as many as 19 games in 2012: 20 for both David Price and Jered Weaver...Harriosn is 10-6 in 17 road starts...a Texas pitcher has won as many as 11 road games 3 times: 12--Scott Feldman in 2009; 11--Rick Helling in 198 and Vicente Padilla in 2008.

KOJI AGAIN: Koji Uehara's string of consecutive batters retired ended at 25 when Brandon Moss singled with 2 outs in the 8th inning on Monday...it was the longest string of consecutive batters retired by a Rangers pitcher since Jeff Zimmerman set down 25 in a row, May 11-22, 1999 (Elias)...Moss was the 1st batter to reach off Uehara since Cleveland's Casey Kotchman singled in the 8th inning on Sept. 11...Uehara had gone a club-record 9 consecutive appearances without allowing a baserunner, spanning 7.2 innings with 15 K's...Uehara extended his scoreless innings streak on Monday to 10.1 IP ovwe his last 13 apperances.

SHORTS: Michael Young snapped a 21-game homer drought on Monday...each of Young's last 7 homers have come on the road since his lone home blast on April 11... the Rangers reached the 200-home run mark for the 10th time on Monday, just the 3rd time in the last 7 seasons...Texas is 28-18 in games started by opposing lefthanders in 2012 with a 13-7 mark on the road.

TONIGHT: The 27-year-old southpaw is slated to make his team-leading 32nd start and appearance tonight...has posted just the 10th season of 18 wins in Texas history, the 8th pitcher to do so...takes the mound looking to become the 6th 19-game winner in club history, and the first since Rick Helling (20-7) and Aaron Sele (19-11) both got there in 1998...has tied Kenny Rogers (2004) for the most wins by a left-hander in club history...has established new career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched (207.1), strikeouts (128), complete games (4), and shutouts (2), while also posting the most losses, hits (204), runs (79, tied), earned runs (75), HR (21), and walks (58) in his career...his current 3.17 ERA would be lowest of his career...could finish the year as just the 2nd pitcher in Rangers history to win at least 18 games with an ERA under 3.30, joining Fergie Jenkins in 1974 (25-12, 2.82) and 1978 (18-8, 3.04)...is 3rd in the A.L. with 18 wins, behind David Price (20 and Jered Weaver (20)...ranks 7th in the A.L. in ERA and 8th in innings (207.1)...has taken a win or loss in 28-of-31 starts, T3rd in the majors with 28 decisions...is 10-6 with an **A.L.-best 3.03** road **ERA** (39 ER/116.0 IP) in 17 road starts, but has lost his last 2, 9/4 at KC (4.2 IP, 5 R/3 ER) and 9/22 at SEA (CG, 8.0 IP, 1 R-ER)...at least one GIDP in season-high 4 straight starts (8 GIDP)...all 4 of Harrison's CG have been on the road, tying Justin Verlander for the ML lead...his 4 CG are T3rd-most in A.L. and match Derek's Holland's 2011 total for the most CG by a Ranger in the last 14 seasons (beginning 1999)...Harrison is 14-7, 2.66 (47 ER/159.0 IP) last 23 starts beginning May 22...was a first-time All-Star and June A.L. Pitcher of the Month this season. tied Kenny Rogers (2004) for the most wins by a left-hander in club history...has established

LAST START / VS. OAKLAND: Is 2-0, 4.19 (9 ER/19.1 IP) in 3 starts vs. Oakland this season, all at RBIA, winning last start on Thurs. as Texas salvaged a split in a 4-game series (6.0 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR)...handed a 5-0 lead in the bottom of the 1st as the Rangers knocked out Travis Blackley...gave up 4 runs over the next 3 frames on Reddick's solo HR in the 2nd, Gomes' RBI double in the 3rd, and Norris' 2-run HR in the 4th...left after 6.0 IP with a 9-4 lead before Mike Adams gave up 3 solo HR in the 8th in 9-7 final...in 9 career starts, is 6-1, 3.33 (20 ER/54.0 IP) against the A's, including 2-1, 3.86 (9 ER/21.0 IP) in 4 starts in Oakland, none in 2012...won his first 2 career starts at the Coliseum in 2008. including a 5-hit shutout on 9/12/08, going 2-0, 0.64 (1 ER/14.0 IP), but is 0-1, 15.26 (13 ER/7.2 IP) in his last 3 games (2 starts) here over the 2010-11 seasons.

NIGHT GAMES: Has gone 12-7, 2.75 ERA (41 ER/134.0 IP) in 20 night starts, compared to 6-3, 4.17 (34 ER/73.1 IP) in 11 day starts...ranks among A.L. night leaders in wins (T3rd) and ERA (2nd)...after starting season 9-1 at night, is 3-6 in his last 9 night starts.

winning: Has recorded just the 10th season of 18 wins in Texas history, the 8th pitcher to do so...has tied Kenny Rogers' record (2004) for most wins by a left-hander in club history...takes the mound looking to become the 6th 19-game winner in club history, and the first since Rick Helling (20-7) and Aaron Sele (19-11) both got there in 1998...the only pitcher in Rangers history with 18 wins and a sub-3.30 ERA in a season was Hall of Famer Fergie Jenkins, who did it in both 1974 and 1978...with a win today, could become the 3rd A.L. pitcher to reach the 19-win mark in 2012 (also David Price-20 and Jered Weaver-20).

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER -RHP Ryan Dempster (12-8, 3.18 NL/AL in 27 games/starts)

The 35-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 12th start for Texas in the season finale tomorrow...his 7 wins since Aug. 1 are tied for A.L. lead (also TB's Alex Cobb), T3rd-most in the majors in that span (8 for Gio Gonzalez and Kris Medlen)...is 1-2, 6.32 (11 ER/15.2 IP) last 3 starts to raise season figure from 2.86 to 3.18, but still has quality starts in 6 of last 8...will be working on regular 4 days' rest after taking loss in Rangers' 7-4 defeat on Friday vs. LAA (5.2 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 4 BB, 7 SO, 2 HR)...has suffered 2 of his 3 losses as a Ranger to the Halos...is 0-2 with an 11.20 ERA (17 ER/13.2 IP) in 3 starts vs. LAA and 7-1 with a 2.92 ERA (17 ER/52.1 IP) in his other 8 starts with Texas...has surrendered multiple home runs in each of his last 2 starts after one HR in his previous 6 outings...allowed a run in 4 of the 6 innings he pitched...exited the game trailing 4-1 in 6th inning with runners at first and second and 2 outs...won only career outing vs. Oakland on 6/16/10 at Wrigley (6.2 IP, 8 H, 2 R-ER, 2 BB, 7 SO, 0 HR, 120 pitches)...best-ed Gio Gonzalez in that contest...his 7 wins are 4th-most among Rangers for the season, as the only Texas pitchers with more victories are the 3 members of the season-opening rotation that are still active: Harrison, Darvish, and Holland...has won 7 of his 11 starts with Texas...in 7 wins with Texas (all QS): 7-0, 1.75 (9 ER/46.1 IP); other 4 starts: 0-3, 11.44 (25 ER/19.2 IP)...won 5 consecutive starts (starts, not just decisions) from Aug. 20-Sept. 12, the longest such streak by a Texas pitcher since Kenny Rogers won a clubrecord 8 in a row, April 27-June 5, 2005...acquired on July 31 from the Cubs for minor league 3B Christian Villanueva and RHP Kyle Hendricks...was 5-5 with a 2.25 ERA (26 ER/104.0 IP) in 16 games/starts with the Cubs.
