FOR THE A.L. WEST CROWN: The Rangers and A's play the regular season finale this afternoon with the A.L. West Division title on the line...a victory for Texas would give the club its 6th A.L. West title since the advent of the 3-division format in 1994, more than any other team...the Rangers and Angels are currently tied with 5 A.L. West titles each, followed by the A's with 4 and the Mariners with 3...Texas would be the 2nd team to win as many as 3 consecutive A.L. West crowns, joining the Angels (3 from 2007-09).

**DOWN TO THE FINAL DAY:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau this marks just the 3rd time since the start of divisional play in 1969 that 2 clubs will go head-to-head to decide a division title (winner-take-all) on the final day of the regular season: Oct. 3, 1982, Milwaukee wins at Baltimore, 10-2 for A.L. East Crown; Sept. 29, 1996, San Diego wins at Los Angeles, 2-0 in 11 innings for N.L. West crown...not including tiebreaker games played at end of reg. season.

PLAYOFF-BOUND: With a victory in Game 2 of Sunday's split doubleheader vs. Los Angeles, the Rangers clinched a 3rd consecutive postseason appearance for the 1st time in club history...it will be the team's 6th overall postseason appearance with A.L. West titles in 1996, 1998, 1999, 2010, and 2011...the Rangers join the Tigers, Yankees, and Cardinals as playoff returnees from 2011 with the Yankees the only other club with 3 straight postseason trips.

--Texas clinched its 2012 playoff spot in its 159th game, the 3rd latest in team

history and the latest since 1998 (160th game)...this is the 1st time that the Rangers have secured a playoff spot without clinching the A.L. West title: TEXAS RANGERS A.L. WEST CLINCH DATES

1996: Sept. 27, Game 161...lost to Angels at home but clinched with Seattle loss 1998: Sept. 25, Game 160...lost at Seattle but clinched with Angels loss

1999: Sept. 26, Game 155...won vs. Oakland at home

2010: Sept. 25. Game 154...won at Oakland

2011: Sept. 23, Game 157...won vs. Seattle at home, then clinched with Angels loss

TWO FROM THE A.L. WEST: With Oakland clinching a playoff spot on Monday, this will be the 1st time since 2002 that 2 teams from the A.L. West Division have advanced to postseason play...it occurred 3 times previously: 2000 (Oakland--West Champ; Seattle-Wild Card); 2001 (Seattle--West Champ; Oakland--Wild Card); and 2002 (Oakland--West Champ; Anaheim--Wild Card).

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers have lost 2 straight, 4 of 5, 6 of 8 and 8 of the last 12 games, the longer span beginning Sept. 21...club has won consecutive games just once in this span (Sept. 23-24)...Texas has not lost more than 2 consecutive games since 3 in a row, August 13-15 at NYY...over the longer span, Texas has 26 of the last 48 games beginning August 16, is 41-34 since the All-Star break and has won 60 of 103 beginning June 8...club is 78-64 since a 15-4 start...the Rangers' .578 winning percentage and 93 wins are tied for the 2nd best marks in the A.L...this is the 1st time since August 21 that Texas has not had at least a share of the A.L.'s best record...at 93-68, club has dropped to within 25 games of .500 for the 1st time since Sept. 4 (80-55)...the 93 wins are 4th-highest win total in team history but 2012 is 1st time since 2007 that club has not increased its win total from one year to the next...Texas has club-record 4th consecutive winning season (previously 3 straight twice)...season-high 29-over .500 twice, last on 9/24 (91-62)...the Rangers own majors' best winning pct. since 2011 All-Star break at .597 (138-93) and 2nd best overall in the majors in 2011-12 at .585 (189-134).

FIRST PLACE TIE: The Rangers had held outright possession of the A.L. West lead for 176 consecutive days before Oakland moved into a 1st place tie on Tuesday...it was on April 8 when Texas trailed by a half game that the club last was not alone at the top...Texas has lost 5.0 games in the standings in the last 8 days...The.Rangers' 178 overall days in first place lead the majors in 2012 and are the 2nd-most in team history for a season, one behind 1999...season's biggest advantage has been 6.5 games on 6 days, last thru games of August 12...club had a lead of at least 2.5 games for 154 straight days from April 14-Sept. 14...team has held at least a share of the West lead for 178 of 180 days in 2012 and 314 of last 316 days beginning May 16, 2011...beg. June 8, 2010, Texas has held 1st place for 464 of 480 days.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers are 11-9 on the road beginning August 18 but have lost 4 of 5...at 43-37 (.538), the Rangers are tied for 5th in A.L. in road winning percentage...is the 7th time Texas has had a winning road record, just their 5th in the last 35 years...with a 44-37 mark in 2011, it is the **1st time** 

that the Rangers have ever had consecutive seasons with a better than .500 road record....43 road wins are 4th most in team history behind 50 in 1977 and 44 in 1999 and 2011.

**BEST RECORDS IN MAJORS IN 2012** 

SERIES STUFF: This series with Oakland marks the 5th time that Texas has lost the 1st 2 games of a 3-game set in 2012...club won the 3rd game to avoid sweeps on June 3 at LAA, July 29 vs. CWS, and Sept. 23 at SEA and lost on July 5 at CWS...team also dropped the 1st 2 games of 4-game sets vs. LAA (won last 2 games, 8/1-2) and at NYY (lost 3rd game; won 4th game, 8/15-16)...team has dropped all games in a series just twice in 2012, 0-2 vs. KC, 5/14-15 and 0-3 at CWS, 7/3-5...that series in Chicago is the only time that Texas has lost all games in a series of 3+ games in the last 75 such series beginning June 17, 2011.

VS. OAKLAND: The Rangers are 8-10 against the A's in 2012, just the 2nd time in the last 7 seasons that the club has dropped the season's series...Texas has lost 4 of 5 and 6 of 9, the longer span beginning July 1.. Texas is 2-6 here in Oakland this season and has lost 3 in a row and 7 of last 9 here...last time with more than 6 defeats here was 2003 (1-8)...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 315-302 overall with the A's having a 160-148 edge at Oakand Coliseum. 
vs. A.L. West: Texas plays its final 19 games against A.L. West opponents (810 to date)...Rangers have gone 27-29 against the West this year after a 40-17 mark in 2011...club is just 10-16 in A.L. West parks, fewest wins since 2007 (9-20)...the Rangers were 20-10 on the road in its division a year ago.

BELTRE NAMED PLAYER OF THE MONTH: Adrian Beltre was named as the A.L. Player of the Month for September after batting .337 (33-98) with 11 HR and 19 RBI in 26 games...he led the majors in slugging (.724) and total bases (71) and ranked 2nd in HR...it was Beltre's 3rd month honor, September 2004 with the Dodgers and last September with the Rangers...he is 4th A.L. player to win monthly honors in consecutive Septembers, joining Eddie Murray (1980-81), Don Mattingly (1985-86), and Albert Belle (1998-99)...this is the 1st time that Texas has ever had 3 A.L. POM in a season as Josh Hamilton was the April and May winner.

POWERFUL PAIR: Adrian Beltre and Josh Hamilton have combined for 78 homers this season, the most of any pair of teammates in the majors and most by a Rangers duo since Mark Teixeira (43) and Alfonso Soriano (36) had 79 HR between them in 2005...Beltre's and Hamilton's combined 229 RBI are the 2nd most for a pair of ML teammates in 2012 to 244 for the Detroit pairing of Miguel Cabrera (139) and Prince Fielder (108).

--Hamilton enters the final day of the regular season 2nd to Cabrera in both homers (43) and RBI (128)...both totals match the 9th highest figures in Rangers history...Beltre enters today tied with Hunter Pence, Albert Pujols, and Hanley Ramirez for the ML lead with 19 game-winning RBI, one shy of the club record shared by Rafael Palmeiro in 1999 and Hamilton in 2011.

THE DEFENSE: The Rangers made a pair of errors on Tuesday after committing just one miscue in the previous 10 games...still the club has just 82 errors for the season, 5 less than the current team record for fewest miscues in a season set in 1996...Texas ranks 4th in the league with a .9860 (82 E/5874 TC) team fielding percentage...the current team record for highest fielding percentage in a season is .9857 in 1996...Texas' 99 errorless games in 2012 are a club record, surpassing the team's 95 in 1996.

<u>DAY GAMES:</u> Texas is 26-14 (.650) in day games in 2012, the 2nd best winning percentage in the majors to .696 (39-17) for Cincinnati and .650 (30-15) for Baltimore...that mark would be Texas' best day winning percentage ever with current mark being .636 (28-16) in 1996...club is 17-9 in road day games, winning 7 of 8...Rangers lead the majors in AVG (.277) and SLG (.473) in day action...Rangers' 40 day games are the fewest in the majors, team's fewest in a year since 2008 (41).

WHAT'S NEXT: Depending on the outcome of today's game, the Rangers could still be either the 1st, 2nd, 4th, or 5th seed in the 2012 A.L. playoffs...the club could play its 1st postseason game home or road on Friday, road on Saturday, or home or road on Sunday...the BOS-NYY (6:05 CT) and BAL-TB games (6:10 CT) are this evening.

SHORTS: Texas is 11-for-63 with 4 runs scored in the 1st 2 games of this series and is 36-for-161 (.224) in the last 5 games to drop its season average to .273 the lowest since April 15...the Rangers will have 5 players with at least 155 games played this season, a club record and just the 10th team since 1969 to accomplish that...the Texas bullpen has worked 8.1 scoreless innings in the last 3 games...with Tuesday's loss, Texas is 40-33 in games decided by one or 2 runs in 2012...this afternoon's game will be carried nationally by MLB Network.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

# #46 Ryan Dempster, RHP (12-8, 3.18 AL&NL)

TODAY: The 35-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 12th start for Texas in today's season finale in Oakland...his 7 wins since Aug. 1 are tied for A.L. lead (also TB's Alex Cobb and SEA's Hisashi lwakuma), T3rd-most in the majors in that span (8 for Gio Gonzalez and Kris Medlen)...is 1-2, 6.32 (11 ER/15.2 IP) last 3 starts to raise season figure from 2.86 to 3.18, but still has quality starts in 6 of last 8, going 6-2, 3.33 (18 ER/48.2 IP) in that span...will be working on regular 4 days' rest after taking loss on Friday vs. LAA...his 7 wins are 4th-most among Rangers for the season, as the only Texas pitchers with more victories are the 3 members of the season-opening rotation that are still active: Harrison, Darvish, and Holland...has won 7 of his 11 starts with Texas with Texas (all QS): 7-0, 1.75 (9 ER/46.1 IP); other 4 starts: 0-3, 11.44 (25 ER/19.2 IP)...acquired on July 31 from the Cubs for minor league 3B Christian Villanueva and RHP Kyle Hendricks...was 5-5 with a 2.25 ERA (26 ER/104.0 IP) in 16 games/starts with the Cubs...is 9-4, 3.93 (38 ER/87.0 IP) in 14 starts vs. A.L. clubs this year.

NEW PARK: Will be pitching in the Coliseum for the first time in his career today...this is one of 4 active big league parks in which he has never appeared...the others: Camden Yards, Comerica Park, and Rogers Centre...overall, this will be the 41st park for Dempster in his career.

LAST START: Took loss in Rangers' 7-4 defeat on Fri. vs. LAA (5.2 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 4 BB, 7 SO, 2 HR)...has suffered 2 of his 3 losses as a Ranger to the Halos...has surrendered multiple HR in each of his last 2 starts after one HR in his previous 6 outings...did not allow a multi-run inning, as Angels scored single runs in 4 different frames...exited the game trailing 4-1 in 6th inning with runners at first and second and 2 outs...is 0-2 with an 11.20 ERA (17 ER/13.2 IP) in 3 starts vs. LAA and 7-1 with a 2.92 ERA (17 ER/52.1 IP) in his other 8 starts with Texas.

. OAKLAND: Won only career outing vs. Oakland on 6/16/10 at Wrigley (6.2 IP, 8 H, 2 R-ER, 2 BB, 7 SO, 0 HR, 120 pitches)...bested Gio Gonzalez in that contest...A's had Kevin Kouzmanoff hitting cleanup.

5 STRAIGHT: Won 5 straight starts, Aug. 20-Sept. 12, the longest such win streak (winning every start) by a Texas pitcher since Kenny Rogers won a club-record 8 in a row, April 27-June 5, 2005...the last Texas right-hander to do it was Chan Ho Park, Aug. 23-Sept. 12, 2002, nearly 10 years to the date...prior to this season, Dempster had never won more than 4 straight  $\underline{\text{decisions}}$  (including no decisions), and he has now won 5 consecutive starts twice in 2012 (also June 5-July 14 w/ Cubs)...Dempster is the only ML pitcher in 2012 to have 2 streaks of winning at least 5 consecutive starts...only bitcher to win more than 5 consecutive starts in 2012 is Jered Weaver (9, June 20-Aug.

SINCE THE TRADE: Leads the club with 7 victories since he was acquired in the July 31 trade...has most wins in a single season by a Rangers pitcher who appeared for another team earlier in the year since Dock Ellis in 1977 (Elias)... Ellis won 10 games for the Rangers that year after being purchased from Oakland on June 15 (he also pitched for NYY that year)...Dempster has allowed the most runs (38) and T2nd-most home runs (10)...2nd on club with 67 strikeouts since the deal (Darvish, 83)...since the trade, has received 6.82 runs/9 in run support, well ahead of his rate in Chicago (3.89).

SUN WORSHIP: Is 6-2, 2.02 (16 ER/71.1 IP) in 11 day starts, 6th-lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 5 starts...opponents are batting just .199 in day games...has won both day starts for Texas (8/25 vs. MIN, 9/23 at SEA) at 2-0, 2.84 (4

BREAKDOWN: Is 9-4, 3.93 (38 ER/87.0 IP) in 14 starts vs. A.L. clubs this year...in 7 wins with Texas (all QS): 7-0, 1.75 (9 ER/46.1 IP); other 4 starts: 0-3, 11.44 (25 ER/19.2 IP)...ranks 12th in the majors with a .233 (149-639) opponents batting average...opposing batters have hit a combined .216 (29-134) with RISP, 16th in the majors...has allowed 10 HR with Texas: 8 solo HR, one 3-run HR, and a grand slam...no HR allowed in 4 straight from 8/31-9/18...surrendered 2 HR in last 2 straight after one in his previous 6 outings...is 10-1 in 13 starts in which he has received 4+ runs of support in 2012...has 19 quality starts in 27 games...with Geovany Soto as catcher: 10-3, 3.06 ERA (37 ER/109.0 IP) in 16 starts; with Mike Napoli: 0-1, 13.50 ERA (5 ER/3.1 IP); with Steve Clevenger: 2-2, 3.22 ERA (13 ER/36.1 IP) in 6 starts; with Koyie Hill: 1-2, 2.11 ERA (5 ER/21.1 IP) in 3 starts.
