A's vs. TIGERS

The A's lost the season series to Detroit, 3-4...the Tigers were one of two American League teams the A's had a losing record against (Kansas City, 4-5)...lost two of three in Detroit and split four games in Oakland...the pitching staff posted a 5.46 ERA against Detroit, which was their highest mark against an American League team this year...over the last six years, the A's have won two season series, lost two and split two...are 27-24 against Detroit since 2007...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 239-232 against the Tigers...that includes 133-103 in Oakland, 104-127 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 27-21 in Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 909-985 against the Tigers.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1990 the A's complete the four game sweep of the Red Sox in the ALCS with a 3-1 win for their third straight pennant...Dave Stewart picks up his second win as the A's pitching staff allows just one run in each of the four games...in 2001 Johnny Damon is a perfect 4 for 4 with a walk as the A's win at New York 5-3 in the first game of the ALDS

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their six-game postseason losing streak with a 2-0 win last night...the losing streak was the longest in Athletics postseason history...had never lost more than four straight prior to that...it snapped a five-game losing streak in elimination games...prior to last night, the last time the A's won an elimination game was in Game 4 of the 2000 ALDS against New York (lost Game 5)...the only time the Athletics won backto-back elimination games was in the 1973 World Series against the Mets when they trailed 3-2 after five games but came back to win the series...this is the A's seventh appearance in the ALDS, which is tied for fifth most all-time...have won two ALDS, both sweeps (1981 vs. Kansas City, 2006 vs. Minnesota)...lost four straight from 2000-03 with each of those series lasting the full five games (2000-01 vs. New York, 2002 vs. Minnesota, 2003 vs. Boston)...have a 15-14 (.517) record in the Division Series and the 15 wins are sixth most all-time.

PITCHING: Four A's pitchers combined on the 11th postseason shutout in Athletics history last night...it was the first since Game 2 of the 2001 ALDS against New York (2-0)...it marked the first time the A's used more than two pitchers in a postseason shutout...A's pitchers have struck out 11 batters in each of the last two games, tying the Oakland record for strikeouts in an ALDS game (2002 Game 5 vs. Minnesota, 2003 Game 1 vs. Boston)...have struck out 28 in the series while the A's offense has fanned 27 times...A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of the first three games and are 1-1 with a 1.47 ERA (3 er in 18.1 ip) and .212 (14 for 66) opponents batting average.

OFFNESE: The A's had five hits last night and won, their fewest hits in a postseason win since Game 5 of the 1989 ALCS against Toronto when they had four hits in a 4-3 win...have four extra base hits this series, including three home runs...struck out 14 times Saturday in Game 1, which were the A's most ever in an ALDS game...it tied their most in a nine-inning postseason game (1972 ALCS Game 3 against Detroit)

DOWN 2-1: The A's trail 2-1 in a postseason series for the sixth time in Athletics history, including the second time in the ALDS (2000 vs. New York)...have never come back to win a series when trailing 2-1...lost the first two games of a series for the eighth time in Athletics history and have never come back from a 2-0 deficit...in LDS history, only four teams have come back to win after trailing 2-0: the 1995 Mariners (vs. New York), the 1999 Red Sox (vs. Cleveland), the 2001 Yankees (vs. Oakland) and the 2003 Red Sox (vs. Oakland).

ROOKIES: A.J. Griffin will become the third rookie pitcher to start a game in this series, which will make the A's the first team in Major League history to start three different rookie pitchers (credit: Elias)...in 147 postseason games prior to this year, the A's started just two rookies (Joe Bush, 1913 World Series; Barry Zito, 2000 ALDS)...Griffin will become the fifth rookie to pitch for the A's this series, which will make the A's the second team in ML history to use five different rookie pitchers in one postseason (1944 Cardinals)...Griffin will become the eighth rookie overall...the ML record for rookies used by one team in a postseason series is nine by Arizona in the 2007 NLCS against Colorado...of the players on the A's 25-man roster for the Division series, 12 are rookies...that includes eight of the 12 pitchers (Blackley, Cook, Doolittle, Figueroa, Griffin, Milone, Parker, Scribner) in addition to four position players (Carter, Céspedes, Donaldson, Norris)...in Game 1 in Detroit, the A's became just the second team in Major League history to start four rookies in a postseason game (Céspedes, Donaldson, Norris, Parker)...the other was Arizona who did it three times in 2007: Game 3 of the NLDS against the Cubs and Games 3 and 4 of the NLCS against Colorado...the manager of the 2007 Diamondbacks was Bob Melvin.

POSTSEASON PLAY: The A's have a 79-71 (.527) record all-time in the postseason...the 79 wins are tied with the Red Sox for third most by any team...only the Yankees (221) and Cardinals (111) have more...have lost seven of their last eight postseason series, dating back to the 1990 World Series...are 14-26 (.350) over that span with the only win coming in the 2006 ALDS against Minnesota...have lost 13 of the last 20 postseason home games...this is the A's sixth postseason appearance over the last 13 years...have five American League West championships and one Wild Card appearance over that span.

A's AND TIGERS IN THE POSTSEASON: This is the A's second consecutive postseason series against the Tigers as Oakland's last postseason series was the 2006 American League Championship Series...were swept Detroit in four games that year and lost the first two games this year before winning last night...are batting .212 (47 for 222) with 16 runs scored in the seven games...none of the players on the A's Division Series roster this year were with the club in 2006 and only two were in the A's organization (Figueroa and Pennington)...the A's and Detroit also met in the 1972 ALCS, which the A's won three games to two en route to their first World Championship in Oakland...the A's are 4-8 (.333) against the Tigers in the postseason...the only team they have a worse record against is the Yankees (4-9, .308).

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Eight of the 25 players on the A's Division Series roster had postseason experience entering this year (Balfour, Crisp, Drew, Gomes, Kottaras, Neshek, Parker, Smith)...the three pitchers entered this postseason with a combined 18 games pitched and the five hitters had 41 games played...Grant Balfour has the most postseason appearances with this being his fourth (2004 with Minnesota, 2008 and 2010 with Tampa Bay)...Coco Crisp and Seth Smith are playing in their third postseason while the other five had just one year entering 2012...five of the players have gone on to play in the LCS (Balfour, Crisp, Drew, Kottaras, Smith) and three have played in the World Series (Balfour, Crisp, Smith).

ROSTER NOTES: The average age of the 25 players on the Division Series roster is 28.0 years...Derek Norris is the youngest (23 years, 235 days for Game 1) and Jarrod Parker is second youngest (23 years, 317 days)...seven of the players are 25 years old or younger as Brett Anderson and A.J. Griffin are 24 and Ryan Cook, Tommy Milone and Josh Reddick are 25...only Grant Balfour (34 years, 281 days) and Coco Crisp (32 years, 340 days) were born in the 70's...only 11 of the 25 players were on the A's Opening Day roster (Balfour, Blevins, Céspedes, Cook, Crisp, Donaldson, Gomes, Pennington, Reddick, Rosales, Smith)...only eight played for Oakland prior to this year (Anderson, Balfour, Blevins, Carter, Crisp, Donaldson, Pennington, Rosales)

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is scheduled to become the fifth rookie pitcher to start a postseason game in Athletics history, the third this year...prior to Parker and Milone, the last A's rookie to start a postseason game was Barry Zito, who started Game 4 of the 2000 ALCS at New York...Zito was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win (5.2 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...the other was Joe Bush in Game 3 of the 1913 World Series at New York...Bush tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 8-2 win (2 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 3 so).

IN THE DAYS OF MY YOUTH: Is scheduled to start today at the age of 24 years and 256 days...he will become the sixth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to make his first career postseason start.

LAST REGULAR SEASON START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-5, American League West clinching win over Texas in the final game of the regular season a week ago today in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed five runs, four earned, in the third inning...Beltre had a RBI single, Young a RBI double, Murphy a two-run single and Soto a RBI single...left after 2.2 innings but the A's scored six times in the fourth.

GRIFFIN vs. DETROIT: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 12-2 loss at Detroit September 18...allowed a career-high five runs on a career-high tying eight hits in 4.2 innings...also surrendered a career-high three home runs...the A's scored a run in the first inning but he allowed single runs in each of the first three innings on a Cabrera sacrifice fly, a Peralta home run and a Cabrera home run...also allowed a two-run home run to Fielder in the fifth.

ROOKIE STARTERS: Is one of five rookies in Athletics history to start a postseason game...including one of three this year (Milone and Griffin)...his start in Game 1 at Detroit made him the first A's rookie to start a postseason game since Barry Zito, who started Game 4 of the 2000 ALCS at New York...Zito was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win (5.2 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...the other was Joe Bush in Game 3 of the 1913 World Series at New York...Bush tossed a complete game five-hitter in the A's 8-2 win (2 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 3 so).

IN THE DAYS OF MY YOUTH: His start in Game 1 last Saturday came at the age of 23 years and 317 days...is the fifth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to start a postseason game...of the pitchers younger than him, only Barry Zito (2000 ALDS Game 4) picked up the win.

2012 ALDS: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss in Game 1 at Detroit last Saturday...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a run in the bottom of the first when

Jackson doubled and later scored when Cabrera grounded into a double play...allowed an unearned run in the third when Infante doubled and later scored on Parker's error...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Avila in the fifth.

2011 NLDS: His only postseason experience prior to this year came in the 2011 National League Division Series with Arizona...was called up by the Diamondbacks Sept. 19 and made one regular season start before he was added to Arizona's postseason roster...pitched in relief in Game 4 against Milwaukee...entered the game in the sixth inning with the Diamondbacks leading 7-3 and allowed a run on two hits and a walk in 0.1 innings.

PARKER vs. DETROIT: Was the losing pitcher in his only career regular season appearance, a 3-1 A's loss in Oakland May 13...shutout the Tigers on three hits and two walks over the first four innings before allowing a RBI single to Cabrera in the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a two-out double Boesch and then walked the bases loaded in the sixth...was relieved by Balfour, who walked in the go-ahead run.

- Recorded his first career postseason save last night in Game 3 after being charged with his first loss in Game 2 at Detroit...has a 0.79 ERA (11.1 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 9 so) in 11 career appearances in the Division Series...has a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) in 17 career postseason outings...this is his fourth postseason appearance (2004 with Minnesota, 2008 and 2010 with Tampa Bay).
- Has converted his only save opportunity this series after collecting 18 saves over his final 18 chances during the regular season...that is tied for

- Did not have a save opportunity in two regular season appearances against Detroit this year (1.2 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 3-2 with a 2.63 ERA (27.1 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 14 bb, 36 so, 3 hr) in 27 career appearances during the regular season against the Tigers.
