TIGERS AT A GLANCE: The Tigers finished the regular season with an 88-74 record to capture the American League Central Division championship. It marks the 14th time in franchise history the Tigers have secured a spot in the playoffs.

LOOKING BACK AT LAST NIGHT'S GAME: The Tigers suffered a 4-3 loss to Oakland last night, and the best-of-five game American League Division Series is tied 2-2. Jose Valverde took the loss in relief for Detroit, allowing three runs in the ninth inning. Prince Fielder led the Tigers with two hits, including a solo home run.

THE SERIES GOES THE DISTANCE: The Tigers and Athletics will battle in the fifth and deciding game of the American League Division Series this evening at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum. It marks the eighth time in the club's post-season history the Tigers have had a series go to the maximum number of games. Detroit has compiled a 3-4 record in the previous seven series. The Tigers won Game Seven of both the 1945 and 1968 World Series and Game Five of the 2011 American League Division Series, while the team suffered the loss in Game Seven of the 1909, 1934 and 1940 World Series and Game Five of the 1972 American League Championship Series.

QUALITY WORK: Tigers starting pitchers have registered a quality start in three of the club's four games thus far during the American League Division Series. Detroit starters have compiled a 1.75 ERA (25.2IP/5ER) and 30 strikeouts during the four starts, while limiting Oakland to a .191 batting average (17x89). The Tigers tied for second among all American League clubs with 90 quality starts during the regular season.

CABRERA REACHES SAFELY: Miguel Cabrera collected one hit last night at Oakland and he has now reached base safely in all 15 of his post-season games with the Tigers. His 15-game streak is the third-longest such streak in club history, trailing an 18-game streak by Hank Greenberg and a 16-game streak by Charlie Gehringer.

POSTING A DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUT TOTAL: Tigers pitchers combined to fan 12 batters last night in Game Four of the American League Division Series at Oakland. It marked the 12th time in club post-season history that Detroit has struck out 10-or-more batters during a single game. The Tigers equaled a single-game post-season record with 14 strikeouts in Game One of the American League Division Series on Saturday.

A SECOND STRAIGHT AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL DIVISION TITLE: The Tigers clinched the American League Central Divison for the second straight season on October 1 at Kansas City and advanced to the playoffs for the 14th time in franchise history. It marks the fifth time the Tigers have captured a division title since divisional play began during the 1969 season. Detroit has advanced to the playoffs in consecutive seasons for the first time since the club did so in both 1934 and 1935.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY FOR THE SKIPPER: Tigers Manager Jim Leyland has guided a club to the post-season for the seventh time in his 21 seasons as a major league manager, including the third time during his seven-year tenure with the Tigers. He has compiled a 34-30 record (.531) during post-season action. Leyland led the Pittsburgh Pirates to three straight National League East Division titles (1990-92), and he captured the National League Wild Card with the Florida Marlins in 1997. His 1997 Marlins defeated the Cleveland Indians to win the World Series. Leyland's 2006 Tigers club won the American League Wild Card, advancing to the World Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Division Series and Athletics in the American League Championship Series. The 2011 Tigers captured the American League Central Division title and advanced to the American League Championship Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Division Series.

TAKING ON OAKLAND DURING THE PLAYOFFS: The Tigers are taking on Oakland in post-season play for the third time in franchise history. Detroit swept Oakland 4-0 during the American League Championship Series to advance to the World Series in 2006. The Tigers fell 3-2 to the Athletics during the 1972 American League Championship Series.

MIGGY BRINGS HOME THE TRIPLE CROWN: Miguel Cabrera led the American League with a .330 batting average, 44 home runs and 139 RBI during the 2012 season to become the first player to win the Triple Crown since Boston's Carl Yastrzemski did so in 1967. It marked the 14th time since 1900 a player captured the Triple Crown and Cabrera is the 12th player to accomplish the feat during that time. He became the second Tigers player to do so, joining Ty Cobb (1909).

CABRERA'S SECOND STRAIGHT BATTING CROWN: Miguel Cabrera led the American League with a .330 batting average to capture his second straight batting crown. He is the first Tigers player to lead the American League in hitting in consecutive seasons since Ty Cobb did so in three straight seasons (1917-19). Cabrera led the American League with a .344 batting average during the 2011 season.

THIRD IN THE AMERICAN LEAGUE IN ERA: The Tigers finished third in the American League with a 3.75 ERA during the 2012 season. The club's 3.75 ERA marked the lowest ERA by a Detroit team since the club in 1988 posted a 3.71 ERA.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: The Tigers finished second in the American League with 8.29 strikeouts per nine innings during the 2012 season, while the club tied for second with 1,318 strikeouts. The 8.29 strikeouts per nine innings marked the highest rate at which Tigers pitchers have struck out batters in club history. Detroit established a club record with 1,318 strikeouts during the 2012 season. The previous franchise record of 1,115 strikeouts was held by both the 1968 and 2011 teams.

VERLANDER, SCHERZER SURPASS 200 STRIKEOUTS: Justin Verlander topped the American League with 239 strikeouts during the 2012 season, while Max Scherzer finished second with 231 strikeouts. Verlander and Scherzer became only the second duo in Tigers history to fan 200-or-more batters in a season. Mickey Lolich and Joe Coleman accomplished the feat three times for Detroit, doing so in 1971, 1972 and 1973

JUSTIN'S CASE: After completing his seventh full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his 10th career post-season start, his second in 2012, this evening at Oakland.

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Verlander was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the fifth time in his career in 2012.

STARTING THE ALL-STAR GAME: Verlander was selected to start for the American League during the All-Star Game in Kansas City. It marked the 10th time a Tigers pitcher has been selected to start the game. Verlander suffered the loss for the American League after allowing five runs in one inning of work.

LOOKING AT THE LEADERS: Verlander led the American League with 238.1 innings pitched and 239 strikeouts in 2012, while he finished second with a 2.64 ERA, .217 batting average against, 7.25 hits per nine innings and 3.98 strikeouts per walk, tied for third with 9.0 strikeouts per nine innings and tied for fourth with 17 wins.

POSTING 17-OR-MORE WINS: Verlander won 17 games in 2012, the sixth time during his career he has posted 17-or-more wins. He becomes the fifth pitcher in Tigers history with at least six seasons of 17-or-more wins. Additionally, Verlander has now won 17-or-more games in each of his last four seasons. It marks the longest such streak by a Tigers pitcher since Hal Newhouser posted six consecutive seasons with 17-or-more wins (1944-49).

HIS POST-SEASON EXPERIENCE: Verlander is making the 10th start of his post-season career this evening. In his previous nine starts, he is 4-3 with a 4.96 ERA (49.0IP/27ER) and 59 strikeouts. Verlander is 2-0 with a 3.65 ERA (12.1IP/5ER) and 17 strikeouts in two starts against the Athletics during his postseason career.

2012 GAME-BY-GAME RUNDOWN

LOOKING AT THE FRANCHISE LEADERS: Verlander is tops in Tigers history with 59 strikeouts during his post-season career, while he is tied for the lead with four wins and is third with 49.0 innings pitched.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS: Verlander fanned 11 batters in Game One of the American League Division Series in a win over Oakland on October 6. It marked the second time he has posted a double-digit strikeout total in a post-season start. Verlander is the first pitcher in Tigers history with multiple double-digit strikeout performances during post-season action.

SEPTEMBER HONORS: Verlander was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for September after he compiled a 5-1 record, 1.93 ERA (42.0IP/9ER) and 41 strikeouts in six starts. He led the American League with five wins and a 1.93 ERA during the month, while he tied for the lead with 41 strikeouts.

BACK-TO-BACK STRIKEOUT TITLES: Verlander led the American League with 239 strikeouts during the 2012 season, marking the second consecutive season he topped the American League in strikeouts. He is the first Tigers pitcher to led the league in strikeouts in back-to-back seasons since Jim Bunning di so in both 1959 and 1960.

FOURTH STRAIGHT SEASON WITH 200-OR-MORE STRIKEOUTS: Verlander fanned 239 batters this season, marking his fourth consecutive season fanning 200-or-more batters. His streak of four straight seasons with 200-or-more strikeouts is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).

SIXTH STRAIGHT SEASON WITH 200-OR-MORE INNINGS: Verlander tossed 238.1 innings this season, marking his sixth consecutive season surpassing the 200.0-inning mark. His streak of six straight seasons with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).

GOING THE DISTANCE: Verlander led the American League with a career-high six complete games this season. It marked the most complete games during a season by a Tigers pitcher since 2001, when Steve Sparks tossed eight complete games.

HIS 24TH CAREER DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUT GAME: Verlander finished with 11 strikeouts in his start on September 2 versus the White Sox, marking the 24th time in his career he has reached a double-digit strikeout total in a start.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Verlander has started nine games during his career at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum. He is 4-4 with a 2.47 ERA (62.0IP/17ER) in his previous nine outings.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad five times during his career (2007, 2009-12). Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006. He was selected the American League Most Valuable Player and unanimously named the American League Cy Young Award winner in 2011.
