YESTERDAY

The A's and Diamondbacks played to a 2-2 tie in Scottsdale...Bartolo Colón started for the A's and allowed two runs, both in the first inning (4.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...the A's scored their only two runs in the fourth on back-to-back RBI doubles by Seth Smith and John Jaso...Jordan Norberto pitched 2.0 scoreless innings (2 h, 1 so), Ryan Cook retired the side in order in the seventh (2 so), Pat Neshek pitched 0.2 scoreless frames (2 h) and Garrett Olson closed out the game by keeping the Diamondbacks off the board over the final 1.1 innings (1 bb, 1 so)...the A's were held to four hits, including the doubles by Smith and Jaso, a single by Yoenis Céspedes in the first and a double by Eric Sogard in the eighth.

A's vs. WHITE SOX

This is the first of two meetings between the A's and White Sox this spring...meet again in Phoenix March 22...the A's won the only game last year 9-4 at Camelback Ranch on March 12.

IN CAMP

The A's have 46 players remaining in camp...that includes 37 players on the 40-man roster and nine non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 21 pitchers, four catchers, 13 infielders and eight outfielders

MINOR LEAGUE DATES

Minor League camp is underway and Triple-A and Double-A games began Monday...Single-A games start next Monday.

A's ON THE AIR

The A's radio network will broadcast 13 games this spring, including 10 from Arizona and all three games against San Francisco in the Bay Area in April...the Arizona schedule includes all weekend games...remaining games can be heard in the Bay Area on the A's flagship station, 95.7 FM The Game, with the exception of March 24...Ken Korach returns for his 18th year in the A's broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (8th) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 28th season in the booth...in addition, Comcast SportsNet California will televise two games: Sunday, March 24 against Los Angeles (NL) and Saturday, March 30 against San Francisco...Glen Kuiper joins Fosse in the broadcast booth for those telecasts...the A's also have two remaining games on MLB Network: today vs. LAA (1:00 pm) and March 22 vs. CWS (9:00 pm PT)...in addition, A's vs. Giants games will be televised by CSNBA on March 23 and 28 and KNTV on March 29...all games from Arizona not aired on the A's Radio Network can be heard live via the A's website at oaklandathletics.com.

ABOUT THE A'S

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their first tie of the spring yesterday at Salt River Fields and are now 2-6-1 on the road compared to 6-3 at Phoenix Muni...A's pitchers have walked just one batter in each of the last three games and now have 47 for the spring, which is the fewest in the majors...the offense has walked 77 times, which is tied for fourth in the majors, and has a .370 on-base percentage, which is tied for third best...have hit 13 home runs, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...this is the A's 45th Spring Training in Arizona, including their 32nd consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...will train again in Phoenix next year before moving to a renovated Hohokam Stadium in Mesa in 2015...the A's are scheduled to play 33 games this spring, not including the exhibition game win against Italy's WBC team earlier this spring...the schedule includes 30 games in Arizona and three in the Bay Area against San Francisco (March 28-30)...the A's went 15-7-2 last spring, their first spring with a winning record since 2008 (18-8)...it was the best record among Cactus League teams and third best in the majors behind Toronto (24-7-1) and Detroit (20-8-5)...the 15 wins were three more than the A's total from each of the previous two springs (12-21-1 in 2011, 12-17-3 in 2010), despite playing just 24 games.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have signed or agreed to terms with all their players on the 40-man roster...two of those players are under contract beyond the 2013 season...Hiroyuki Nakajima is signed through 2014 with a club option for 2015 and Yoenis Céspedes is signed through 2015...Brett Anderson has club options for 2014 and 2015 and Coco Crisp and Chris Young have club options for 2014.

OFF SEASON MOVES: Although 20 of the 25 players on the A's American League Division Series roster return this year, including all 12 pitchers, the A's did make several off season acquisitions...the first came just nine days after the ALDS ended when Chris Young was acquired from the Arizona Diamondbacks October 20...Andy Parrino and Andrew Werner were acquired from San Diego November 16, Chris Resop came from Pittsburgh in a November 30 deal, John Jaso was acquired from Seattle in a three-team, five-player trade January 16 and Jed Lowrie and Fernando Rodriguez came from Houston in a five-player trade February 4...the A's re-signed free agent Bartolo Colón November 3 and inked Hiroyuki Nakajima to a two-year deal with a club option December 18...the five players from the ALDS roster who are gone are Chris Carter (Lowrie trade), Stephen Drew (free agent, Boston), Jonny Gomes (free agent, Boston), George Kottaras (waivers, Kansas City) and Cliff Pennington (Young trade)...free agents Brandon Inge and Brandon McCarthy also will not return.

Daric Barton is 0 for 10 over his last six games after going 5 for 9 (.556) over his first four contests...**Yoenis Céspedes** is 5 for 17 (.294) over his last six games after going 0 for 11 over his first five contests...is tied for eighth in the Cactus League in walks (6)...**Michael Choice** is 2 for 19 (.105) over his last nine games after starting the spring 11 for 20 (.550)...**Coco Crisp** is 1 for 8 (.125) over his last three games after going 6 for 15 (.400) over his first six contests...**Josh Donaldson** is 2 for 7 (.286) over his last three games after going 1 for 20 (.050) over his first eight games...that does not include a two-homer game in the rainout March 8 at Seattle...**David Freitas** has hit safely in seven of his nine games and is 8 for 14 (.571) with a double and home run...**Grant Green** is 0 for 5 over his last five games after three straight multiple hit games (6 for 8, .750)...is tied for fourth in the CL in doubles (5)...**John Jaso** is 4 for 13 (.308) over his last six games after going 1 for 9 (.111) over his first five contests...**Jed Lowrie** is 6 for 16 (.375) with two home runs and seven RBI over his last six games after going 3 for 11 (.182) with two RBI over his first five contests...has appeared in six games at shortstop, three at second base and two at third base...**Luke Montz** is hitless in 13 at bats over 12 games...**Scott Moore** is 1 for 11 over his last 10 games after going 2 for 5 (.400) over his first five contests...**Brandon Moss** had his third multiple hit game last Tuesday against Kansas City and is now 8 for 22 (.364) over his last eight games after going 1 for 8 (.125) over his first three contests...**Hiro Nakajima** is 0 for 5 with two walks and a hit by pitch over his last three games after going 6 for 16 (.375) over his previous six contests...**Derek Norris** is 2 for 12 (.167) over his last six games after going 3 for 8 (.375) with two home runs over his first four contests...**Andy Parrino** is 3 for 8 (.375) over his last seven games...is tied for 10th in the CL in doubles (4)...has appeared in seven games at third base, six in left field, three at shortstop, two at second base and one in right field...**Darwin Perez** has appeared in six games in left field, three at shortstop and two at second base...**Shane Peterson** is tied for fourth in the Cactus League in batting (.459), hits (17) and doubles (5), ranks fifth in slugging (.730) and on-base percentage (.487) and tied for sixth in total bases (27)...is the only player to appear in each of the A's 18 games...has appeared in nine games in left field, nine in right field, five in center field and one at first base...**Josh Reddick** hit his second home run of the spring Thursday against Texas and is now 6 for 17 (.353) with a double, two home runs and six RBI over his last seven games after going 1 for 8 (.125) over his first four contests...**Adam Rosales** drew his eighth walk of the spring yesterday at Arizona, which is tied for the CL lead...has appeared in five games at shortstop, four at second base, three at third base and one in left field...**Scott Sizemore** is 3 for 24 (.125) but has walked six times, which is tied for eighth in the CL...**Seth Smith** has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games (10 for 22, .455)...has appeared in five games at designated hitter, five in left field and one in right field...**Eric Sogard** went 2 for 3 against Kansas City last Tuesday, his first multiple hit game of the spring, and is 7 for 15 (.467) over his last nine games...has appeared in six games at shortstop, five at second base and three at third base...**Michael Taylor** was 1 for 2 with a single Thursday against Texas in his first action since March 3...**Jemile Weeks** is 0 for 4 with a walk over his last two games after he was out of action from March 2 to 13... hit safely in each of his first four games (6 for 11, .545)...**Chris Young** has appeared in seven games in center field, three in right field, one in left field and one at designated hitter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#11 JARROD PARKER RHP (0-1, 7.50 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his third start of the spring...allowed five runs in his last start after pitching 2.0 scoreless innings in his first start...also pitched in the A's minor league camp on the A's off day March 6...went 13-8 with a 3.47 ERA in 29 starts with the A's last year...tied with fellow rookie Tommy Milone for the team lead in wins as they both set an Oakland record for wins by a rookie...led the A's with 140 strikeouts, which was the third best mark by a rookie in Oakland history and the fourth best in Athletics history...his 29 starts were 10th most by an Oakland rookie...tied for second among American League rookies in wins, ranked fourth in strikeouts and innings pitched (181.1) and tied for fourth in starts...his ERA was the lowest among AL rookies with 130 or more innings, his .619 winning percentage was second best and his .248 opponents batting average was third best...his winning percentage was 10th best among all AL pitchers...allowed just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors...had a .358 opponents slugging percentage, which was sixth lowest in the AL.

#26 BRIAN GORDON RHP (0-0, 3.38 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the spring...has allowed at least one run in two of his three outings, including his last appearance Monday at San Diego (1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...the non-roster invitee was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract December 22, 2012...spent the entire 2012 season with the Samsung Lions of the Korean Baseball Organization where he was 11-3 with a 3.94 ERA in 25 games, 24 starts...his .786 winning percentage ranked third in the KBO...allowed a .288 opponents batting average...went 3-3 with a 3.86 ERA over his first 10 starts through June 9...finished the season by going 8-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final 15 games, including 14 starts...was originally drafted by Arizona in the seventh round of the June, 1997 draft and spent the first 10 seasons of his professional career as an outfielder...was converted to pitcher following the 2006 season and is 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five career Major League appearances.

#56 CHRIS RESOP RHP (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance of the spring...has not allowed a run in his first five appearances (5.0 ip), including his last outing Tuesday against Kansas City (1.0 ip)...opponents are 3 for 17 (.176) and he has not walked a batter...was acquired from Pittsburgh November 30, 2012 for minor league pitcher Zach Thornton...spent the entire 2012 season with the Pirates, posting a 1-4 record, one save and a 3.91 ERA in 61 relief appearances...had career-highs in innings pitched (73.2), hits (81) and runs (35) and matched his high in saves and losses...tied for seventh among National League relievers in innings...allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .237 (27-for-114) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (54-for-179) against right-handers...surrendered four of his six home runs to lefties...held the opposition to a .226 average with runners in scoring position, including .146 with RISP and two outs...allowed 10 of 27 (37.0%) inherited runners to score.
