The Mariners will play their home opener on Monday, April 8 hosting the Houston Astros at Safeco Field...Seattle is 21-15 all-time in the first home game of the season, including going 6-5 in home openers after starting on the road.

**TONIGHT'S TILT...** the Mariners open their 37th season with a road tilt at the Oakland A's...tonight is the first game of a 4-game series against the A's and a 7-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Chicago-AL)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT Sports** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

### ODDS AND ENDS...

- This will be the first Opening Day for pitchers **Carter Capps**, **Brandon Maurer** and **Stephen Pryor**.
- Carter Capps** (22.237) is the youngest player on the Mariners Opening Day roster, while **Raul Ibanez** (40.303) is the oldest.
- Justin Smoak** hit .407 (59x24) with 5 HR, 8 2B, 15 RBI and a 1.251 OPS in 19 spring G.
- Jesus Montero** hit .400 (18x45) with 6 doubles, 2 home runs and 11 RBI (1.149 OPS) in 16 spring G.
- Michael Saunders** (Canada) was named to the METLIFE All-WBC Team (.727 AVG, HR, 7 RBI).
- Kyle Seager** hit 15 of his team-high 20 HR last season on the road...ranked 2nd in AL with 60 road RBI.

**SPRING WINS...** the Mariners 22 wins during spring training play set a club record, and were the second-most in the Majors behind the Royals (25-7-2)...the old spring record was 21 wins in 1994, the first year the Mariners began training at the Peoria Sports Complex.

**KING FELIX TO GET SIXTH OPENING DAY NOD...** Felix Hernandez is making his sixth career Opening Day start (2007 vs. OAK, 2009 at MIN, 2010 at OAK, 2011 at OAK, 2012 at OAK-Tokyo), and his fifth consecutive...will tie Randy Johnson for the Mariners record for most Opening Day starts...he is 3-0, 1.59 ERA (7 ER, 39.2 IP) with 33 strikeouts in his five career Opening Day starts, the lowest ERA of any active pitcher with at least five OD starts (entering 2013)...Felix's 3 career Opening Day wins are the most in Mariners history (R. Johnson - 2).

**FOR OPENERS...** the Mariners are 21-15 in season openers, including a current 6-game Opening Day winning streak...have won 7 of the last 8 season openers...**OPENERS vs. THE A'S...** 2013 marks the 10th time in club history the Mariners will open the season against the A's, and 7th time opening a season in the road grays vs. the A's...Seattle is 6-3 all-time on Opening Day against the A's (3-3 in Oakland, 3-0 in Seattle), including winning four straight...**NIGHT OPENERS...** the Mariners open the season with a night game for the fifth consecutive season, but just the sixth time over the last 12 seasons...Mariners are 18-9 in night openers (3-6 during the day)...**MONDAY OPENERS...** will open on a Monday for the 15th time in club history (most of any day of the week)...Seattle is 7-7 when opening on a Monday.

**OPENING DAY WIN STREAK...** the Mariners have won 6 consecutive season openers to set a club record, and are tied for the longest current streak with the Arizona Diamondbacks...Seattle's previous record for consecutive OD wins was 5 straight from 1982-86...the last club to record an Opening Day winning streak of 7 or more games was the Chicago White Sox from 1987-93.

**ROAD OPENERS...** the Mariners open on the road for the fifth consecutive season ('09 at MIN, '10 at OAK, '11 at OAK, '12 at OAK), and fourth straight season facing the A's (last season played in Tokyo)...marks only the 12th time (in 37 season) to open on the road (opened at home in 13 of 14 seasons from 1995-2008)...Seattle is 6-5 all-time in season openers on the road.

**NO FOOLIN...** the Mariners are opening a season on April Fools Day for the fifth time in club history (also: 1997, 2002, 2003, 2011)...Seattle is 2-2 in season openers on April Fools Day.

**MORSE HR KING...** Michael Morse finished spring training leading the Majors with 9 home runs, including homers in three of his last four games (7 HR in last 13 G)...Morse set the Mariners single-spring record with his 9 HR, passing Mike Wilson's 8 home runs in 2009...**Morse also hit 9 home runs during spring play with the Washington Nationals in 2011, and went on to have a career season batting .303 with 31 HR, 95 RBI and a .910 OPS...** Morse ended spring batting .357 (20x56) with 12 extra base hits (9 HR, 3 2B), and recorded the highest OPS in the Majors (1.332).

**HOME RUN DERBY...** the Mariners set a club spring record with 58 home runs (1.76 HR/G), leading all MLB teams (Braves & Orioles were 2nd with 49)...the old record was 51 home runs in 32 games in 1999...the Mariners hit at least one home run in 32 of 33 spring games, with 22 players recording at least one home run (14 with 2+ HR)...**Michael Morse** (9), **Kendrys Morales** (7), **Franklin Gutierrez** (5) and **Justin Smoak** (5) led the team in home runs.

**HR PERSPECTIVE...** the 58 HR hit by the Mariners are second-most by any team in spring play over the last 20 years (since 1994)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau* only the Cubs (62 in 1999) hit more spring homers dating back to 1994...the 9 home runs by **Michael Morse** not only led the Majors, but were the most by a Cactus League player since 2003 when Barry Bonds hit 10.

**MR. IBAÑEZ...** 2013 marks the 15th Opening Day roster that **Raul Ibanez** has been listed on, with his first coming with the Mariners in 1999.

**YOU ALREADY KNOW...** that **Felix Hernandez** is making his sixth career Opening Day start tonight vs. the A's...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?...** that Felix will become just the third pitcher during the modern era (since 1920) to record six Opening Day stats prior to turning 27?...Felix, who does not turn 27 until April 8, will join Bert Blyleven and Dwight Gooden as the only other pitchers with six Opening Day starts prior to their 27th birthday...additionally, Felix will become one of 10 active pitchers with at least 6 Opening Day starts.

**ABOUT FELIX**...26-year-old (turns 27 April 8) right-hander is making his first start of the season & the 239th of his ML career tonight vs. the A's.

- In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young Award**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joins Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young...named *Sporting News* AL Pitcher of the Year.
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days old on 7/6/84 at MIN).
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002.
- Selected to AL squad in 2009, 2011 and 2012 All-Star Game.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 193 of 238 GS (81.1%), including 119 of last 134 starts (88.8%)...27 of 33 (81.8%) in 2012.
- Is 16-9, 2.69 ERA (73 ER, 244.0 IP) in 36 career starts in the first month of the season (March/April).

**OPENING DAY**...will be making his 6th career Opening Day start, 5th consecutive...was the starting pitcher vs. the A's last year March 28 in Tokyo (ND, 8.0,5,1,1,0,6)...also had Opening Day starts: April 1, 2011 at Oakland (W, 9.0,5,2,2,0,5,HR), April 5, 2010 at Oakland (ND, 6.2,3,3,3,6,4), April 6, 2009 at Minnesota (W, 8.0,5,1,1,3,6) and April 2, 2007 vs. Oakland (W, 8.0,3,0,0,2,12)...**is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (7 ER, 39.2 IP) in 5 career OD starts**...threw a the last Opening Day CG by a MLB pitcher in 2011 (4/1/11 @OAK).

**FELIX & RANDY**...tonight will be Felix's 6th career Opening Day start (2007, 2009-12), tying Randy Johnson (1992-96, 98) for the most in club history...also ties The Big Unit for most consecutive Opening Day starts with five straight...Felix's three OD wins (2007, 2009, 2011) are the most in club history.

**NOT WASTING TIME**...in his first start of the season is 3-2, 1.43 ERA (9 ER, 56.2 IP) with 44 strikeouts...Oakland has been his opponent in 5 of the 8 starts (2006-07, 2010-12), going 2-1, 1.77 (7 ER, 35.2 IP) with 31 strikeouts in those games.

**SPRING TRAINING**...made four Cactus League starts, going 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER, 17.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts...allowed 9 hits and 3 runs in 6.0 innings in his final spring tune-up March 27 vs. the Dodgers (against Clayton Kershaw)...struck out 9, including 6 straight in the 3rd-4th innings, March 22 at San Diego.

**APPROACHING 100**...with two more wins, Felix will reach the 100-win mark for his career...he will join Jamie Moyer (145) and Randy Johnson (130) as the only Mariners to record 100 wins in a Mariner uniform.

**PERFECTION**...Felix threw the first perfect game in Mariners history, and 23rd in Major League history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over the Tampa Bay Rays at Safeco Field...struck out 12 while retiring all 27 batters he faced on 113 pitches (77 strikes)...it was the 7th Perfect Game in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and first in the AL since 1984.

**2012 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...**

- Season Overview** — Went 13-9 with a 3.06 ERA (5th in AL) in 33 starts... led the AL in shutouts (5), ranked 2nd in innings (232.0) and complete games (5), T3rd in strikeouts (223), T5th in quality starts (21), 9th with 8.65 K/9.0 IP.
- All-Star** — Selected to his 3rd All-Star Game (2009-STL & 2011-ARI), but did not pitch in the game in KC...became the 6th player in club history to be selected to at least 3 ASG, and the 2nd pitcher, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro (10), Edgar Martinez (7), Randy Johnson (5) & Alex Rodriguez (4).
- Awesome August** — Went 4-0 with a 1.08 ERA (5 ER, 41.2 IP) and 3 shutouts in 5 August starts to be named the American League Pitcher of the Month...all three shutouts were by 1-0 score, becoming the third pitcher in MLB history with three 1-0 shutout in a calendar month: Carl Hubbell (July 1933) and Dick Rudolph (August 1916).
- Something For the Effort** — Tied for the AL lead with 11 no-decisions, posting a 2.45 ERA (21 ER, 77.0 IP) in those starts...had a MLB leading four no-decisions allowing 1 or fewer runs in 8.0 or more IP, tied for most by a pitcher in a single season dating back to 1918.
- Going Deep** — Recorded 17 starts where he pitched 7.0 or more innings with 1 or fewer runs allowed, leading the Majors, and setting a club record (he had 15 in 2010 Cy Young season).
- Felix Quality Start** — Recorded 12 starts where he allowed 1 or fewer runs in 8.0 or more innings pitched (8-0, 0.45 ERA, 4 ND)...twice as many as any other AL pitcher (Matt Harrison/Bartolo Colon/James Shields – 6)...Felix had 13 such starts during his Cy Young season in 2010.
- No Margin for Error** — Recorded four 1-0 shutouts (of his MLB leading 5 shutouts)...just the third pitcher during the divisional era (since 1969) to have four wins with the score 1-0 in a single season (all CG shutouts), joining Hall of Famers Fergie Jenkins (1974) and Bert Blyleven (1976)...Don Drysdale and Bob Gibson also had four 1-0 shutouts in 1968 (record is 5, last: Dean Chance in 1964).
- 200 Strikeouts** — Has reached the 200-strikeout milestone for the fourth consecutive season...894 strikeouts since 2009 ranks 3rd-best behind Justin Verlander (977) and Tim Lincecum (902)...only Randy Johnson (5, 1991-95) has recorded more consecutive seasons with 200+ strikeouts as a Mariner...joins Verlander as the only pitchers with four consecutive seasons with 200 or more innings and 200+ strikeouts.

## 2013 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

**WINNING WAYS**...the Mariners finished their 37th spring in the Cactus League with a 22-11 record... have now recorded three consecutive winning springs (16-13-2 in '11, 16-9-1 in '12)...first three-year streak of winning springs since 1997-99... 13th spring overall with a .500 or better record (also: 2012, 2011, 2004, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1994, 1993, 1991, 1989, 1988, 1984)...recorded the second-best best spring winning percentage in club history, trailing only 1994 (21-9/.700)...finished 2nd in the Cactus League standings, 3.5 games behind the Kansas City Royals (25-7-2/.781).

**SPRING WINS**...the Mariners 22 wins set a spring training club record, and were the second-most in the Majors behind the Royals (25-7-2)...the old spring record was 21 wins in 1994, the first year the Mariners began training at the Peoria Sports Complex.

**20 YEARS AT PEORIA STADIUM**...the Mariners celebrated their 20th spring training at the Peoria Sports Complex, and their 37th season training in the Valley of the Sun...the Mariners and Padres have agreed to a long-term lease agreement with City of Peoria keeping the Peoria Sports Complex as the team's spring training and player development home up to 2034.

**WINNING STREAK**...the Mariners recorded a 10-game winning streak Feb. 23-March 4, setting a club spring record, besting the previous 8-game streak set March 28-April 4, 1993...also recorded a 6-game win streak March 14-19.

**MORSE HR KING**...**Michael Morse** finished spring training leading the Majors with 9 home runs, including homers in three of his last four games (7 HR in last 13 G)...Morse set the Mariners single-spring record with his 9 HR, passing Mike Wilson's 8 home runs in 2009...**Morse also hit 9 home runs during spring play with the Washington Nationals in 2011, and went on to have a career season batting .303 with 31 HR, 95 RBI and a .910 OPS**...Morse ended spring batting .357 (20x56) with 12 extra base hits (9 HR, 3 2B), and recorded the highest OPS in the Majors (1.332).

**CACTUS HOMERS**...the 9 home runs by **Michael Morse** were the most by a Cactus League player since 2003 when Barry Bonds hit 10 home runs for the Giants...Morse, who also hit 9 HR in 2011 with Washington, is one of just seven players with 9+ spring HR since 2002.

**HOME RUN DERBY**...the Mariners set a club spring record with 58 home runs, leading all MLB teams (Braves & Orioles were 2nd with 49)...the old record was 51 home runs in 32 games in 1999... the Mariners hit at least one home run in 32 of 33 spring games, with 22 players recording at least one home run (14 with 2+ HR)...**Michael Morse** (9), **Kendrys Morales** (7), **Franklin Gutierrez** (5) and **Justin Smoak** (5) led the team in home runs.

**HR PERSPECTIVE**...the 58 home runs hit by the Mariners are second-most by any team in spring play over the last 20 years (since 1994)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau* only the Cubs (62 in 1999) hit more spring homers dating back to 1994.

**SMOAKIN**...**Justin Smoak** finished spring play batting .407 (24x59) with 8 doubles, 5 home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.251 OPS (.455 OBP, .797 SLG)...**amongst Cactus League leaders listed for most doubles (T1st, 8), slugging percentage (4th, .497) and batting average (7th, .407)**...he recorded at least one hit in 16 of his 19 Cactus League games (7 multi-hit)...his batting average finished 21st all-time in spring club history (min. 50 AB), with **Michael Morse** holding the top spot (.492/32x65 in 2008) and **Raul Ibanez** ranking 6th (.443/27x61 in 2006).

**MORE MORALES**...**Kendrys Morales** finished his first spring with the Mariners with 7 home runs, tying for fourth-most in the Majors...the switch-hitter homered in 5 of his last 9 games, including three straight March 16-19...overall Morales batted .311 (19x61) with 7 home runs, 14 RBI and led the team with 15 runs scored...he hit .360 (9x25, 3 HR) from the right side of the plate, and .278 (10x36, 4 HR) from the left side.

**PEORIA DIAMOND CLUB ROY**...right-hander **Brandon Maurer** was named the Peoria Diamond Club Rookie of the Year...Maurer went 3-1 with a 1.50 ERA (4 ER, 24.0 IP) in 7 appearances (4 starts)...amongst qualifying Cactus League leaders, Maurer ranked first in ERA (1.50), T3rd in wins (3), T9th in innings pitched (24.0) and T5th in strikeouts (25)...Maurer was named the Mariners No. 4 starter to open the season.

**NOT FIT FOR A TIE**...for only the third time over the last 14 spring trainings, the Mariners did not have a game end in a tie...the Mariners had at least one tie in the last five springs, including three ties each in 2008 & 2009.

**SAUNDERS NAMED TO ALL-WBC TEAM**...**Michael Saunders** (Canada) was named the MVP of the World Baseball Classic Pool D played in Phoenix, and also named to the METLIFE All-WBC team...Saunders finished the tournament batting .727 (8x11) with 4 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 7 RBI (1.273 SLG, .769 OBP).

**WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC**...**Michael Saunders** (Canada), **Alex Liddi** (Italy) and **Oliver Perez** (Mexico), as well as minor leaguers **Kalian Sams** (Netherlands) and **Brian Sweeney** (Italy) competed in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.

**EARLY START = LONG SPRING**...the Mariners Cactus League opener February 22 vs. the Padres was the earliest the Mariners have ever played a Spring Training game...the previous earliest spring game was Feb. 25, 2009 vs. the Padres...the 33 Cactus League games were the 2nd-most in club history, trailing 37 played in 2009 (also a WBC year).

**ROAD GRAYS**...the Mariners went 13-4 when playing as the road team during spring play, leading the Majors for most road wins.

**SHUTOUTS**...the Mariners 16-0 victory March 25 in Goodyear was the first shutout of the spring, and first since a 6-0 blanking of the Dodgers on March 25, 2011...it was also the largest margin of shutout victory in spring club history, besting a 14-0 blanking of Oakland on March 14, 1984.
