TONIGHT'S TILT... the Mariners continue their season-opening series of the 2013 season tonight with the second (1-0) of a four-game series vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum...Mariners will also travel to Chicago (3 G) during this seven-game road trip to open the season...open up Safeco Field next Monday, April 8 vs. Houston, as part of a 10-game homestand vs. the Astros (3 G), Rangers (4 G) and Tigers (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT Sports** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...

- **Grinders** - The Mariners will open the season 14 consecutive games before their first off day.
- **Michael Saunders** (Canada) was named to the METLIFE All-WBC Team (.727 AVG, HR, 7 RBI).
- **Spring Wins** - Mariners set a spring club record with 22 wins, trailing only KC (25) for most in MLB.

OPENING DAY FELIX... Felix Hernandez made his sixth career Opening Day start last night vs. the A's, tying Randy Johnson for most in club history...has started each of the Mariners last five Opening Days (since 2009)...tossed 7.2 scoreless innings last night (3 H, 8 K) vs. the A's, and is now **4-0 with a 1.33 ERA (7 ER, 47.1 IP) all-time on Opening Day...** here is a look at Felix's 6 OD starts:

HE'S PRETTY GOOD... Felix Hernandez recorded his 99th career victory last night with his fourth career Opening Day win (in 6 OD starts)...is the only pitcher in club history to record an Opening Day start of at least 7.0 shutout innings, and he has done it twice (also: 4/2/07 vs. OAK, 8.0 ShO IP).

FOR OPENERS... with last night's 2-0 shutout victory over the A's, the Mariners improved to **22-15 in season openers, including a current 7-game Opening Day winning streak...** have won 8 of the last 9 season openers...**OPENERS vs. THE A'S...** yesterday marked the 10th time in club history, and fourth straight (2010-2013), the Mariners opened the season against the A's...Seattle is 7-3 all-time on Opening Day against the A's (4-3 in Oakland, 3-0 in Seattle), including winning five straight...**ROAD OPENERS...** have opened each of the last five seasons on the road, including last season in Tokyo, Japan...have opened on the road in only 12 of 37 seasons in franchise history (7-5).

WEDGE RULES... Eric Wedge is the first manager in club history to win his first three Opening Day games...now tied for 2nd-most OD managerial wins in club history with Darrell Johnson (3-1) and two behind Lou Piniella (5-5)...Rene Lachemann (1982-83), Chuck Cottier (1985-86) and Don Wakamatsu (2009-10) each won their first two Opening Days...Wedge was 2-5 on OD with CLE.

OPENING DAY WIN STREAK... the Mariners extended their club-record Opening Day winning streak to 7 consecutive games with last night's 2-0 win over the A's...the previous longest in club history was a 5-game streak from 1982-86...the streak is tied with Arizona for the longest active Opening Day winning streak in the Majors.

LID LIFTERS... Seattle has opened the season with a win in 22 of 37 seasons for a .595 winning percentage...since the club debuted in 1977, the .595 winning percentage on Opening Day is 5th-best in the Majors behind New York-NL (28-9/.757), Arizona (10-6/.625), Chicago-AL (23-14/.622) and Baltimore (22-14/.611).

2-0?...the Mariners are attempting to start the season 2-0 for the 8th time in club-history...won the first two games of the year in 2011, 2007, 1996, 1995, 1985, 1983 and 1979...for those curious, the best start in club history is a 6-0 start in 1985.

MORSE HR KING... Michael Morse finished spring training leading the Majors with 9 home runs, including homers in three of his last four games (7 HR in last 13 G)...Morse set the Mariners single-spring record with his 9 HR, passing Mike Wilson's 8 home runs in 2009...**Morse also hit 9 home runs during spring play with the Washington Nationals in 2011, and went on to have a career season batting .303 with 31 HR, 95 RBI and a .910 OPS.**

SPRING HOMERS... the MLB-leading 58 HR hit by the Mariners were 2nd-most by any team in spring play over the last 20 years (since '94)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau* only the Cubs (62 in '99) hit more spring homers dating back to 1994...the 9 home runs by Michael Morse not only led the Majors, but were the most by a Cactus League player since 2003 when Barry Bonds hit 10.

YOU MAY ALREADY KNOW... that Felix Hernandez (7.2 IP), Charlie Furbush (1 BF), Stephen Pryor (0.1 IP) and Tom Wilhelmson (1.0 IP) combined for the third Opening Day shutout in club history (also: 3-0 in '95 vs. DET, 4-0 in '07 vs. OAK)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...it was the 300th shutout victory in club history (28th vs. the A's)?...Felix has been the winning pitcher in 25 of the 300 shutouts, second-most in club history behind Randy Johnson (26) after passing Jamie Moyer (24) with last night's win.

ABOUT IWAKUMA...

- Pronounced: he-sash-ee e-wah-ku-mah
- Making his first start of the 2013 season and 31th career MLB appearance/17th start tonight vs. the A's.
- Had a career record of 107-69 with a 3.25 ERA (557 ER, 1,541.0 IP) in 226 G/225 GS with Kintetsu (2001-04) and Rakuten (2005-2011) in the Japan League.
- Pitched in the 2004 Athens Olympics as a member of the Japan national team (bronze medal)...also part of gold medal-winning Japan squad in the 2009 World Baseball Classic...went 1-1 with 1.35 ERA (3 ER, 20.0 IP) in 4 G/3 GS in WBC play.
- Selected by Osaka Kintetsu in 5th round of 1999 NPB amateur draft.
- Made his NPB debut May 29, 2001 with Kintetsu vs. Nippon Ham... went 4-2 with a 4.53 ERA (22 ER, 43.2 IP) in 9 appearances (8 GS).
- Named 2008 Pacific League MVP & winner of Eiji Sawamura Award (Cy Young equivalent) going 21-4, 1.87 ERA (42ER, 201.2 IP) in 28 GS.
- A two-time selection for the Best Nine Award (2004, 2008) and was a two-time NPB All-Star (2004, 2008).
- Signed by Seattle as a free agent Jan. 5, 2012.
- 1 of 5 Mariners pitchers born in Japan, but is only the 2nd to make a start on the mound...the only other Japan-born pitcher to make a start for the Mariners was Mac Suzuki (9 GS, last: 5/17/99 vs. MIN).

LAST OUTING...made his final start of the 2013 on Oct. 1 and recorded his 9th win of the season vs. the Angels...allowed 6 hits, while walking 1 and striking out 7 in 6.0 scoreless innings.

SPRING TRAINING...went 2-0 with a 4.26 ERA (9 ER, 19.0 IP) in 6 official Spring Training appearances (5 GS)...also started in a MiL game on 3/23, allowing 2 runs on 10 hits with 5 strikeouts on March 23... recorded a ND in Mariners 6-4 on March 28 at Chicago-NL, allowing 3 runs on 5 hits (1 HR) and struck out 4 in 4.0 innings of work.

STARTING WHERE HE LEFT OFF...concluded the 2012 season winning final 3 starts of the season, 9/21-10/2...during this 3-game stretch held opponents to only 4 earned runs, while walking 1 and striking out 14 in 19.0 innings (1.89 ERA)...his longest career winning streak is 4 games, Aug. 11-Sept. 2, 2012.

LOVING SAFECO...is 6-3 with a 2.49 ERA (21 ER, 76.0 IP) and a .229 opponent batting average (64x279) in 17 games/10 starts at Safeco Field...compares to going 3-2-2 with 4.20 ERA (23 ER, 49.1 IP) and a .276 opponent batting average (53x192) on the road...though was 3-2 with a 2.80 ERA (11 ER, 35.1 IP) in 6 starts on the road in 2012.

2012 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- In 16 starts went 8-4 with a 2.65 ERA (28 ER, 95.0 IP) to rank first in club history in starter ERA by a rookie (2nd, F. Hernandez, 2.67 in 2005)...in 14 relief appearances went 1-1-2 and a 4.75 ERA (16 ER, 30.1 IP)...ranked 2nd on team with 3.16 ERA (min. 100.0 IP).
- Finished the season going 6-2, 1.83 ERA (11 ER, 54.0 IP) with 43 K's over his last 9 GS.
- Amongst AL pitchers with at least 100.0 IP, ranked 7th with a 3.16 ERA (44 ER, 125.1 IP)...ranked 3rd amongst AL starters (min. 15 GS) with a 2.65 ERA (28 ER, 95.0 IP) in 16 starts...posted the 5th-lowest ERA by an AL starting pitcher since 1988 at 2.65 (min. 15 GS).
- Set Mariners rookie record with 13 strikeouts in first MLB win as a starter July 30 vs. Toronto (8.0,4,1,1,3,13,HR)...only Japanese born pitcher with as many strikeouts in a MLB game is Hideo Nomo (7 G w/13+ strikeouts).
- Made first start July 2 vs. Baltimore (5.0,3,3,3,4,HR)...joined Ichiro (RF) and Munenori Kawasaki (2B) as first Japanese trio in a starting lineup...became 2nd Japanese born pitcher in club history to start on the mound, first since Mac Suzuki in 1999.

2013 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

WINNING WAYS...the Mariners finished their 37th spring in the Cactus League with a 22-11 record... have now recorded three consecutive winning springs (16-13-2 in '11, 16-9-1 in '12)...first three-year streak of winning springs since 1997-99... 13th spring overall with a .500 or better record (also: 2012, 2011, 2004, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1994, 1993, 1991, 1989, 1988, 1984)...recorded the second-best best spring winning percentage in club history, trailing only 1994 (21-9/.700)...finished 2nd in the Cactus League standings, 3.5 games behind the Kansas City Royals (25-7-2/.781).

SPRING WINS...the Mariners 22 wins set a spring training club record, and were the second-most in the Majors behind the Royals (25-7-2)...the old spring record was 21 wins in 1994, the first year the Mariners began training at the Peoria Sports Complex.

20 YEARS AT PEORIA STADIUM...the Mariners celebrated their 20th spring training at the Peoria Sports Complex, and their 37th season training in the Valley of the Sun...the Mariners and Padres have agreed to a long-term lease agreement with City of Peoria keeping the Peoria Sports Complex as the team's spring training and player development home up to 2034.

WINNING STREAK...the Mariners recorded a 10-game winning streak Feb. 23-March 4, setting a club spring record, besting the previous 8-game streak set March 28-April 4, 1993...also recorded a 6-game win streak March 14-19.

MORSE HR KING...**Michael Morse** finished spring training leading the Majors with 9 home runs, including homers in three of his last four games (7 HR in last 13 G)...Morse set the Mariners single-spring record with his 9 HR, passing Mike Wilson's 8 home runs in 2009...**Morse also hit 9 home runs during spring play with the Washington Nationals in 2011, and went on to have a career season batting .303 with 31 HR, 95 RBI and a .910 OPS**...Morse ended spring batting .357 (20x56) with 12 extra base hits (9 HR, 3 2B), and recorded the highest OPS in the Majors (1.332).

CACTUS HOMERS...the 9 home runs by **Michael Morse** were the most by a Cactus League player since 2003 when Barry Bonds hit 10 home runs for the Giants...Morse, who also hit 9 HR in 2011 with Washington, is one of just seven players with 9+ spring HR since 2002.

HOME RUN DERBY...the Mariners set a club spring record with 58 home runs, leading all MLB teams (Braves & Orioles were 2nd with 49)...the old record was 51 home runs in 32 games in 1999... the Mariners hit at least one home run in 32 of 33 spring games, with 22 players recording at least one home run (14 with 2+ HR)...**Michael Morse** (9), **Kendrys Morales** (7), **Franklin Gutierrez** (5) and **Justin Smoak** (5) led the team in home runs.

HR PERSPECTIVE...the 58 home runs hit by the Mariners are second-most by any team in spring play over the last 20 years (since 1994)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau* only the Cubs (62 in 1999) hit more spring homers dating back to 1994.

SMOAKIN...**Justin Smoak** finished spring play batting .407 (24x59) with 8 doubles, 5 home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.251 OPS (.455 OBP, .797 SLG)...**amongst Cactus League leaders listed for most doubles (T1st, 8), slugging percentage (4th, .497) and batting average (7th, .407)**...he recorded at least one hit in 16 of his 19 Cactus League games (7 multi-hit)...his batting average finished 21st all-time in spring club history (min. 50 AB), with **Michael Morse** holding the top spot (.492/32x65 in 2008) and **Raul Ibanez** ranking 6th (.443/27x61 in 2006).

MORE MORALES...**Kendrys Morales** finished his first spring with the Mariners with 7 home runs, tying for fourth-most in the Majors...the switch-hitter homered in 5 of his last 9 games, including three straight March 16-19...overall Morales batted .311 (19x61) with 7 home runs, 14 RBI and led the team with 15 runs scored...he hit .360 (9x25, 3 HR) from the right side of the plate, and .278 (10x36, 4 HR) from the left side.

PEORIA DIAMOND CLUB ROY...right-hander **Brandon Maurer** was named the Peoria Diamond Club Rookie of the Year...Maurer went 3-1 with a 1.50 ERA (4 ER, 24.0 IP) in 7 appearances (4 starts)...amongst qualifying Cactus League leaders, Maurer ranked first in ERA (1.50), T3rd in wins (3), T9th in innings pitched (24.0) and T5th in strikeouts (25)...Maurer was named the Mariners No. 4 starter to open the season.

NOT FIT FOR A TIE...for only the third time over the last 14 spring trainings, the Mariners did not have a game end in a tie...the Mariners had at least one tie in the last five springs, including three ties each in 2008 & 2009.

SAUNDERS NAMED TO ALL-WBC TEAM...**Michael Saunders** (Canada) was named the MVP of the World Baseball Classic Pool D played in Phoenix, and also named to the METLIFE All-WBC team...Saunders finished the tournament batting .727 (8x11) with 4 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 7 RBI (1.273 SLG, .769 OBP).

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC...**Michael Saunders** (Canada), **Alex Liddi** (Italy) and **Oliver Perez** (Mexico), as well as minor leaguers **Kalian Sams** (Netherlands) and **Brian Sweeney** (Italy) competed in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.

EARLY START = LONG SPRING...the Mariners Cactus League opener February 22 vs. the Padres was the earliest the Mariners have ever played a Spring Training game...the previous earliest spring game was Feb. 25, 2009 vs. the Padres...the 33 Cactus League games were the 2nd-most in club history, trailing 37 played in 2009 (also a WBC year).

ROAD GRAYS...the Mariners went 13-4 when playing as the road team during spring play, leading the Majors for most road wins.

SHUTOUTS...the Mariners 16-0 victory March 25 in Goodyear was the first shutout of the spring, and first since a 6-0 blanking of the Dodgers on March 25, 2011...it was also the largest margin of shutout victory in spring club history, besting a 14-0 blanking of Oakland on March 14, 1984.

- **Jesus Montero** hit .400 (18x45) with 6 doubles, 2 home runs and 11 RBI (1.149 OPS) in 16 spring G.
- **Felix Hernandez** went 1-1, 2.65 ERA with 17 strikeouts in 4 GS...struck out 9 March 22 vs. San Diego.
- Mariners relievers led the Cactus League with 13 saves...also posted the 3rd-lowest ERA (4.15).
- **K/9.0 IP** - **Kameron Loe** (12.0) and **Carter Capps** (13.0) were amongst relief leaders in K/9.0 IP.
