RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers defeated the Toronto Blue Jays 11-1 yesterday afternoon at Comerica Park. Doug Fister (2-0) limited the Blue Jays to one run on eight hits in eight innings of work to earn the victory. Prince Fielder finished with two hits, including a double, and four RBI to lead the offense, while Torii Hunter finished with a pair of hits and three RBI. The club begins a nine-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game series at Oakland. The club enjoys an off day on Monday before continuing the trip with a three-game series at Seattle beginning Tuesday and a three-game series at Los Angeles against the Angels beginning next Friday.

WHEN WE LAST MET: The Tigers return to Oakland tonight for the first time since defeating the Athletics 6-0 in Game 5 of the American League Division Series on October 11, 2012. Justin Verlander fired a four-hit shutout in the victory as the Tigers punched their ticket to the American League Championship Series for the second consecutive year.

EIGHT IS GREAT FOR FISTER: Doug Fister limited the Blue Jays to one run on eight hits over eight innings to earn the victory yesterday afternoon and improved his record to 9-0 with a 0.73 ERA (74.0IP/6ER) in nine starts of eight-or-more innings since joining the Tigers. Prior to joining the Tigers, Fister posted a 1-3 record and 1.67 ERA (81.0IP/15ER) in 10 starts of eight-or-more innings.

TURNING IT UP TO 11 WITHOUT A LONGBALL: The Tigers plated 11 runs yesterday afternoon against the Blue Jays without hitting a home run. It marks the first time the Tigers have scored at least 11 runs without hitting a home run since doing so in a 12-3 victory over the Kansas City Royals on August 23, 2010 at Comerica Park.

JACKSON GETTING ON AND GETTING IN: Austin Jackson collected three hits and scored three runs yesterday against the Blue Jays and has reached base safely in all nine games this season, while scoring a run in eight of the nine. He is the sixth Tigers player since at least 1916 to score at least one run in eight of the club's first nine games of the season, joining Darrell Evans (1986), Gates Brown (1967), Al Kaline (1967), Barney McCosky (1939) and Charlie Gehringer (1929).

HUNTER A MULTI-HIT MAVEN: Torii Hunter finished yesterday's game against the Blue Jays with two hits, marking his seventh multi-hit game in the team's first nine games of the season. He is the third Tigers player since at least 1916 to collect multiple hits in seven of the club's first nine games of the season, joining Gee Walker (1937) and Charlie Gehringer (1936).

HUGE HOMESTAND FOR FIELDER: Prince Fielder collected two hits, two walks and four RBI yesterday against the Blue Jays and finished the six-game homestand batting .474 (9x19) with two doubles, two home runs and 13 RBI. The 13 RBI are the second-most that Fielder has racked up in one homestand during his major league career. He drove home 15 runs on a 10-game homestand for the Milwaukee Brewers from April 30-May 9, 2007. (Source: Elias Sports Bureau)

MIGGY ON THE MARK AGAINST OAKLAND: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game batting .356 (53x149) with 11 doubles, 14 home runs and 43 RBI in 41 career games against the Athletics. He leads all active players with a .459 on-base percentage and .711 slugging percentage against Oakland, while ranking second with a .356 batting average.

CABRERA, FIELDER FORM POWERFUL COMBO: Miguel Cabrera and Prince Fielder are among the leaders in the major leagues in home runs and RBI since the start of the 2006 season. Fielder is third in the major leagues with 260 home runs during that stretch, while Cabrera is fifth with 244 home runs. Cabrera is second in the major leagues with 844 RBI since the start of the 2006 season, while Fielder is fourth with 768 RBI.

MIGGY'S ON THE MONEY IN RISP MANAGEMENT: Miguel Cabrera is hitting .377 (126x334) with runners in scoring position since the start of the 2011 season, tops in the major leagues during that stretch.

LONGEST ERRORLESS STREAK TO BEGIN SEASON SINCE AT LEAST '21: Tigers fielders have not committed an error in each of the club's first nine games of the season, marking the longest season-opening errorless streak by a Tigers team since at least 1921. (Source: STATS LLC)

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Jim Leyland is in his eighth season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 612-532 record (.535).

- Leyland enters tonight's game with 1,681 wins during his major league managerial career, 15th-most all-time in major league history. Leyland is tops among all active major league managers with 1,681 wins.

- Tonight's game marks the 3,347th game Leyland has managed during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.

- Leyland is one of only three managers in Tigers history to register at least 600 victories with the club. Sparky Anderson (1,331 wins) and Hughie Jennings (1,131 wins) are the two other managers in Tigers history with at least 600 wins with the club.

TAKING IT TO THE MAX: In his fourth season with the Tigers, Scherzer will make his second start of the season tonight against the Athletics.

HEADED TOWARDS 1,000 STRIKEOUTS: Scherzer enters his start tonight against the Athletics with 836 strikeouts during his major league career, 164 strikeouts shy of reaching 1,000 for his career.

LUCKY SEVEN: Since joining the Tigers in 2010, Scherzer has posted 49 outings with seven-or-more strikeouts, tied with Felix Hernandez for the second-most in the American League during that stretch. Only Justin Verlander (61) has posted more during that period of time.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS WITH THE TIGERS: Scherzer has fanned 596 batters with the Tigers since the beginning of the 2010 season. He is second among all American League pitchers with 9.20 strikeouts per nine innings during that stretch.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: Scherzer has limited righthanded batters to a .233 batting average (335x1437) during his major league career. Lefties are hitting .272 (444x1632) with Scherzer on the mound.

WINNING AGAINST THE AL WEST: Scherzer is making the 21st start of his career against a team from the American League West this evening. In his previous 20 starts, he is 12-3 with a 3.14 ERA (120.1IP/42ER) and 131 strikeouts.

RECORD AT O.co COLISEUM: Scherzer is making the third start of his career at O.co Coliseum tonight. In his previous two outings, he is 1-1 with a 5.56 ERA (11.1IP/7ER). He has also made one start in the ballpark during postseason play, posting a no-decision after allowing one unearned run over 5.1 innings of work in Game 4 of the 2012 American League Division Series.

CHECKING THE LEADER BOARDS IN 2012: Scherzer led the American League with 11.1 strikeouts per nine innings, while he finished second with 231 strikeouts and tied for sixth with 16 wins.

ESTABLISHING A CAREER HIGH IN WINS: Scherzer established a career best with 16 wins for the Tigers during the 2012 season. His previous career high was 15 wins established during the 2011 season.

SURPASSING 200 STRIKEOUTS: Scherzer established a career high with 231 strikeouts during the 2012 season, posting 200-or-more strikeouts for the first time during his career. His previous career high was 184 strikeouts established with the Tigers during the 2010 season.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Scherzer was acquired by the Tigers from the Arizona Diamondbacks in a four-player deal on December 9, 2009. Scherzer was selected by the Diamondbacks in the first round (11th overall) of the June 2006 draft.
