**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers lost 4-3 in 12 innings last night to the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum. Brayan Villarreal (0-2) allowed a walk-off home run to Josh Donaldson in the 12th inning to take the loss. Prince Fielder led the Tigers offense with four hits, including a double, home run, and three RBI. Austin Jackson and Andy Dirks both chipped in with a pair of hits. The club continues a nine-game road trip today with the second game of a three-game series at Oakland. The club enjoys an off day on Monday before continuing the trip with a three-game series at Seattle beginning Tuesday and a three-game series at Los Angeles against the Angels beginning Friday.

**PRINCE PROMINENT ON EARLY LEADER BOARD:** Prince Fielder enters today's game at Oakland among the American League leaders in a number of offensive categories early in the season. He ranks second with 17 RBI, fourth with a .417 batting average and .778 slugging percentage, tied for fourth with seven walks, fifth with a .489 on-base percentage and tied for ninth with three home runs.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** The Tigers enter today's game at Oakland leading the American League with a .306 batting average, 112 hits and a .362 on-base percentage, while the club is second in the league with 50 RBI.

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** Tigers pitchers combined for 17 strikeouts last night against the Athletics, matching the most strikeouts by a Tigers team against Oakland. The club also recorded 17 strikeouts against the Athletics on May 30, 2010 at Comerica Park. The strikeout total also marks just the fifth time since at least 1916 that the Tigers have recorded 17-or-more strikeouts in a road game, also doing so on April 30, 2011 at Cleveland, July 29, 2009 at Texas, June 5, 2001 at Boston, and July 8, 2000 at Milwaukee.

**JACKSON GETTING ON AND GETTING IN:** Austin Jackson collected a pair of singles and scored a run last night at Oakland and has reached base safely in all 10 games this season, while scoring a run in nine of the 10. He is the fourth Tigers player since at least 1916 to score at least one run in nine of the club's first 10 games of the season, joining Gates Brown (1967), Al Kaline (1967) and Charlie Gehringer (1929).

**MIGGY'S THE MAN AGAINST THE AL WEST:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game batting .332 (229x690) with 54 doubles, a triple, 39 home runs and 152 RBI in 183 career games against teams from the American League West. Among players with at least 200 at-bats against the division, he is tops with a .332 batting average and ranks second with a .409 on-base percentage and .583 slugging percentage.

**PRINCE PILING UP THE RBI:** Prince Fielder finished with three RBI last night against the Athletics, marking his third game with three-or-more RBI in the team's first 10 games this season. It marks the fifth time since at least 1916 that a Tigers player has posted three games with three-or-more RBI in the first 10 games of the season, joining Travis Fryman (1996), Charlie Gehringer (1932), Harry Heilmann (1929) and Marty McManus (1929).

**MIGGY ON THE MARK AGAINST OAKLAND:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game batting .351 (54x154) with 11 doubles, 14 home runs and 43 RBI in 42 career games against the Athletics. He leads all active players with a .452 on-base percentage and .695 slugging percentage against Oakland, while ranking second with a .351 batting average.

**CABRERA, FIELDER FORM POWERFUL COMBO:** Miguel Cabrera and Prince Fielder are among the leaders in the major leagues in home runs and RBI since the start of the 2006 season. Fielder is third in the major leagues with 261 home runs during that stretch, while Cabrera is fifth with 244 home runs. Cabrera is second in the major leagues with 844 RBI since the start of the 2006 season, while Fielder is fourth with 771 RBI.

**MIGGY'S ON THE MONEY IN RISP MANAGEMENT:** Miguel Cabrera is hitting .375 (126x336) with runners in scoring position since the start of the 2011 season, tops in the major leagues during that stretch.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Jim Leyland is in his eighth season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 612-533 record (.534).

- Leyland enters today's game with 1,681 wins during his major league managerial career, 15th-most all-time in major league history. Leyland is tops among all active major league managers with 1,681 wins.

- Today's game marks the 3,348th game Leyland has managed during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.

- Leyland is one of only three managers in Tigers history to register at least 600 victories with the club. Sparky Anderson (1,331 wins) and Hughie Jennings (1,131 wins) are the two other managers in Tigers history with at least 600 wins with the club.

**TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER****'13 Season (Detroit):** 1-1, 2.19 ERA, 2 G, 2 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 12.1 IP, 11 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 4 BB, 11 SO.**'13 Spring (Detroit):** 1-3, 4.01 ERA, 6 G, 6 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 24.2 IP, 19 H, 12 R, 11 ER, 4 BB, 21 SO.**'12 Season (Detroit):** 17-8, 2.64 ERA, 33 G, 33 GS, 6 CG, 1 SHO, 0 SV, 238.1 IP, 192 H, 81 R, 70 ER, 60 BB, 239 SO.**JUSTIN'S CASE:** In his eighth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his third start of the season this afternoon at Oakland.**SIGNING FOR THE LONG HAUL:** Verlander agreed to terms on a five-year contract extension (plus a vesting option for the 2020 season) with the Tigers on March 29, 2013. The five-year contract extension will keep Verlander in a Tigers uniform through the 2019 season.**OPENING DAY NOD:** Verlander made his sixth career Opening Day start on April 1 at Minnesota. He is the first Tigers pitcher to start six consecutive Opening Days since Jack Morris started 11 straight (1980-90).**RECORD AT O.co COLISEUM:** Verlander is making the 10th start of his career at O.co Coliseum this afternoon. In his previous nine outings, he is 4-4 with a 2.47 ERA (62.0IP/20ER).**LAST TIME WE WERE HERE:** Verlander takes the mound today at O.co Coliseum for the first time since Game 5 of the 2012 American League Division Series on October 11, 2012. Verlander blanked the Athletics on four hits, while striking out 11 to lift the Tigers to a second consecutive trip to the American League Championship Series. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Verlander joined Sandy Koufax as the only two pitchers in major league history to toss a shutout with 10-or-more strikeouts in a series-deciding game of a postseason series. Koufax did so by fanning 10 batters for the Dodgers as he blanked the Twins 2-0 on three hits in Game 7 of the 1965 World Series.**MOVING UP THE ALL-TIME STRIKEOUTS LIST:** Verlander enters his start today at Oakland fifth in Tigers history with 1,465 strikeouts during his career. With 209 more strikeouts, he would tie Tommy Bridges for fourth on the club's all-time list with 1,674 strikeouts.**WORKING HIS WAY UP THE WINS LIST:** Verlander enters his start today at Oakland 10th in Tigers history with 125 wins during his career. With eight more wins, he would tie Earl Whitehill for ninth on the club's all-time list with 133 wins.**DOMINANT IN DAY GAMES:** Verlander has posted a 48-17 record and 2.85 ERA (571.0IP/181ER) in 83 starts in day games during his career. He leads all active pitchers with a .738 winning percentage in day games and ranks seventh with a 2.85 ERA.**LOOKING AT THE AMERICAN LEAGUE LEADER BOARDS IN 2012:** Verlander topped the American League with six complete games, 238.1 innings pitched and 239 strikeouts during the 2012 season, while he finished second with a 2.64 ERA, .217 batting average against, 7.25 hits per nine innings and 3.98 strikeouts per walk, tied for third with 9.0 strikeouts per nine innings and tied for fourth with 17 wins.**BACK-TO-BACK STRIKEOUT TITLES:** Verlander has led the American League in strikeouts in each of the last two seasons for the Tigers, fanning 250 batters in 2011 and finishing with 239 strikeouts during the 2012 season. He is the first Tigers pitcher to lead the league in strikeouts in back-to-back seasons since Jim Bunning did so in 1959 and 1960.**FOUR STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE STRIKEOUTS:** Verlander registered 239 strikeouts during the 2012 season, marking his fourth consecutive season fanning 200-or-more batters. His streak of four straight seasons with 200-or-more strikeouts is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).**SIX STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE INNINGS:** Verlander tossed 238.1 innings during the 2012 season, marking his sixth consecutive season surpassing the 200.0-inning mark. His streak of six straight seasons with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad five times during his career (2007, 2009-12). Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
