CAREER:

- Has a career batting average of .303 at Busch Stadium (27-89), his high BA at any stadium with 50 or more at-bats.
- Hit three career pinch-hit home runs, currently ranking T32nd among active MLB players, and hit two last season (T4th MLB).

2012 SEASON:

- Played in 78 games at New York (NL) despite a season with two injuries placing him on the 15-day disabled list twice: first with a left intercostal strain (4/23-5/11) and again (5/30-6/22) with a strained left calf.
- Batted .259 (43-166), his highest average since 2008 and finished with a career-best .741 OPS.
- Drove in a career high-tying five runs at San Francisco (8/2).
- Hit .300 (6-20) as a pinch hitter with two home runs...hit his first pinch-hit home run of the season at San Diego (8/5) off Jason Marquis and his second vs. Atlanta (9/8) off Kris Medlen.
- Had a season-best three hits vs. Washington (4/10) and again at San Francisco (8/2)...April 10 was his first start of the season...played third base and finished with a double and an RBI.
- Hit a three-run home run vs. Cincinnati (5/17)...It was his first home run and most RBI since May 28, 2011.
- Hit in a season-best five consecutive games, May 19-23...batted .421 (8-19) during that run.
- Hit leadoff on 5/24 vs. San Diego, his first time at the top of the order since 5/27/10.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

2011 – Was Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter at shortstop for the second straight year...made 125 appearances (118 starts) at shortstop and ranked fourth in the National League with a career-high .978 fielding percentage...went 45 consecutive games without making an error from 4/16-6/9... made his lone start and appearance at second base 5/11 at LAD. It was his first game there since 6/24/09...established a career-high with 30 walks, which included a team-high seven intentional walks...connected off Yovani Gallardo for his first home run of the season at MIL (5/13)...batted .290 (27-93) in 26 games in August...had a season-high 11-game hitting streak from June 19-July 22 (17-37, .459)...placed on the seven-day Disabled List with a concussion (7/2)...transferred to the 15-day DL on (7/16) and was reinstated on 7/22...had 24 games with two hits and one, three-hit game, 8/23 vs. Milwaukee...hit .267 during a four-game rehabilitation assignment with Indianapolis (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League.

2010 – Made a career-high 132 starts at shortstop...tied for sixth among National League shortstops with 39 extra-base hits...ranked T3rd on the Pirates with a career-best 29 doubles...batted .285 (65-228) in 67 games after the All-Star break...reached base safely in 19 straight games from May 8-May 29...tied a career high (second time) with four hits (three doubles) July 18 vs. Houston...delivered his first career walkoff hit on April 7 vs. Los Angeles when he singled in the 10th inning to lift the Pirates to a 4-3 win.

2009 – Established a career-high in 10 home runs while splitting the year between Seattle and Pittsburgh...with the Mariners, he made 39 starts at shortstop, eight starts at second base, four starts in leftfield and two starts at third base...started 42 games at shortstop for the Pirates.



2008 – Hit his first career grand slam on April 22 against the Mets' Jorge Sosa at Wrigley Field...Also had a double in the game and collected a career-high five RBI...did not make an error in 47 consecutive games from May 27- September 24 (141 total chances). **2008 POSTSEASON** - Appeared in one game for Chicago in the Division Series against Los Angeles (NL)...Stole one base.

2007 – Spent the majority of the year with Iowa (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...played in 38 games with the Cubs...hit his first career pinch-hit home run against Milwaukee's Claudio Vargas on April 6...fashioned a .446 batting mark (45-101) with eight home runs in June to be named the PCL Player of the Month. **2007 POSTSEASON** - Made Chicago's postseason roster and appeared in two games of the NLDS vs. Arizona (Game 1 as a pinch runner and Game 2 as a pinch-hitter).

2006 – Spent his first full season in the major leagues playing in a career high 151 games...was a member of the Cubs' Opening Day roster at the age of 23...collected a career-high four hits vs. St. Louis (4/9)...put together a career-best 13-game hitting streak, 9/5-19...hit .432 (16-37) during the run...ranked T5th in the Majors with 15 sac....his seven triples marked a career best, ranking 2nd on the Cubs behind Juan Pierre (13) and T14th in the N.L.

2005 – Made his major league debut on April 23 as a pinch runner vs. Pittsburgh...picked up his first hit and RBI vs. CIN (4/26) off Danny Graves...hit his first career home run, May 5 at Milwaukee (off Gary Glover).

2004 – Named to the Southern League (AA) midseason All-Star team.

2003 – Recorded 22 multiple-hit games with Daytona (A) of the Florida State League.

2002 – Spent the majority of the year with Lansing (A) of the Midwest League.

2001 – Led the Arizona League in batting and was second in hits.

2000 – Spent his first professional season with the Venezuelan Summer League Cubs.
