A's vs. ASTROS

The A's lead the season series 4-0...won the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a three-game series in Houston April 5-7...now have a six-game winning streak against the Astros...the A's lead the all-time series, 9-1...swept a three-game interleague series in Oakland in 2002 and won two of three in Houston in 2007.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 19 saves, which is tied for the sixth longest streak in Oakland history.

Coco Crisp has a 10-game hitting streak (17 for 44, .386), which is the 11th hitting streak of 10 or more games in his career...he is tied for the American League lead in doubles (6) and extra base hits (10), ranks second in runs (15), tied for second in total bases (35) and tied for third in stolen bases (41)

Sean Doolittle has not allowed a run in six appearances (5.2 ip) and has held opponents to a .105 (2 for 19) batting average.

Jed Lowrie has reached base safely via hit or walk in all 13 of his starts (20 for 51, .392)...he is tied for the American League lead in doubles (6), tied for second in total bases (35), ranks third in runs (13), tied for third in extra base hits (9), fourth in hits (20), tied for fourth in multiple hit games (6) and fifth in on-base percentage (.458).

Derek Norris made his seventh start of the season last night and has hit safely in each of those seven games (10 for 21, .476).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Sal Bando hits the first Grand Slam in Oakland history in the A's 6-1 win over California at the Coliseum...in 1984 Dave Kingman becomes the second player in Oakland A's history to homer three times in one game in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle...he has a grand slam in the first, and tworun shots in the third and fifth and drives in eight runs.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their two-game losing streak with an 11-2 win last night to improve to 10-4...that is the best record in the American League and second best in the majors (Atlanta, 11-1)...it is the A's best record after 14 games since the 1992 club also started the year 10-4 (lost game 15)...a win today would give the A's their best 15-game record since 1990 (12-3)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and have held at least a share of first place each of the last 10 days...spent just one day in sole possession of first last year and that was the final day of the season...for the season, have spent eight days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 9-2 against the American League West and have won each of their last nine games...the nine-game winning streak is their longest against divisional foes since October 2, 2001-April 3, 2002 when they also won nine straight...it is the longest single season streak since a 13-game winning streak from June 12-August 11, 1994, which is also the last time the A's won more than nine straight games against divisional foes...have outscored the West 77-35...are batting .290 (112 for 386) with 19 home runs in the 11 games...the pitching staff has a 2.82 ERA (31 er in 99.0 ip).

EARLY SEASON OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in runs (85), doubles (36), walks (60) and extra base hits (57), are tied for the lead in stolen bases (11), rank second in hits (130) and on-base percentage (.349), tied for second in home runs (20) and fourth in slugging (.465)...the 36 doubles and 57 extra base hits are the **most by an Athletics team over the first 14 games of the season since at least 1916...the 20 home runs are second most in Oakland history over the first 14 games (23 in 1994) and the 85 runs scored are fourth most and the most since 1996 (89).**

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 4.09 ERA (30 er in 66.0 ip) and .286 (76 for 266) opponents batting average over the last seven games after logging a 2.86 ERA and .215 opponents average over the first seven games...now have a 3.49 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...A's starting pitchers have a 6.23 ERA (27 er in 39.0 ip) and .331 (54 for 163) opponents batting average over the last seven games after compiling a 3.09 ERA and .233 opponents average over the first seven games...starters lead the AL in wins (8) and innings pitched (82.2).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and Houston (1-0) after going 2-2 on the first homestand against Seattle...begin their second road trip of the season Friday, a six-game trip to Tampa Bay (three games) and Boston (three games)...went 6-0 on the first road trip to Houston (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-0)...it was the third undefeated road trip of six or more games in Oakland history...had a 10-0 trip August 19-28, 2002 (Cleveland 4, Detroit 3, Kansas City 3) and an 8-0 trip April 9-16, 1981 (Minnesota 4, California 4)...this marks the first time the A's have won their first six road games since 1990 when they won their first eight...scored 51 runs on the trip, which was second most in Oakland history for a six-game road trip...scored 52 runs against Minnesota and Kansas City, July 18-23, 2001...the A's are batting .210 (54 for 257) with 34 runs scored and seven home runs in eight games in Oakland compared to .326 (76 for 233) with 51 runs scored and 13 home run in six games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-0 when scoring four or more runs compared to 0-4 when scoring fewer than four...A's catchers are batting a combined .380 (19 for 50), which is the best mark in the majors...each of the A's last 10 games have lasted at least 2 hours and 59 minutes...the average time of game over the first 14 games is 3 hours and 17 minutes...the A's are batting a Major League leading .318 (47 for 148) against left-handed pitching...the A's pitching staff has held left-handed hitters to a .216 (38 for 176) batting average compared to .272 (88 for 323) by right-handers...have held the opposition to a .218 (26 for 119) average with runners in scoring position, including 0 for 10 with the bases loaded...have allowed a .207 (12 for 58) average against the opponents number three hitter...opponents have been successful in all five of their stolen base attempts.

NINE-GAME WININNG STREAK SNAPPED: The A's had their nine-game winning streak snapped Saturday...it matched their longest winning streak from last year (August 24-September 2) and was the 14th of nine or more games in Oakland history...it was the second longest in Oakland history among streaks that took place entirely in the month of April...the longest is 11 in 1981 (April 9-19)...outscored the opposition 69-27 during the streak...trailed at the end of an inning just nine times...batted .314 with 27 doubles, one triple and 18 home runs (.563 slugging percentage)...the pitching staff had a 2.46 ERA.

WALK-OFFS: The A's had their first walk-off win of the season Friday night against Detroit after tallying a Major League leading 14 last year...also played their first one-run game and extra inning game of 2013...went 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games last year, which was the second best record in the AL...were 25-18 (.581) in one-run games, which was third best.

LOCKED UP: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2013 season...Hiroyuki Nakajima is signed through 2014 with a club option for 2015 and Yoenis Céspedes is signed through 2015...Brett Anderson has club options for 2014 and 2015 and Coco Crisp and Chris Young have club options for 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Céspedes, Nakajima, Rodriguez, Rosales, Sizemore)...Rodriguez (sprained right elbow), Rosales (strained left intercostal) and Nakajima (strained left hamstring) began the season on the DL...Sizemore (torn left ACL) was added last Wednesday and Céspedes (muscle strain in left hand) was added Saturday...Rodriguez and Sizemore will both miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's were 12-3 (.800) in his starting assignments last year...tossed six or more innings in nine of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 14

WINS: Has won each of his first two starts...is attempting to become the second A's pitcher since 1991 on the Opening Day roster to win more than his first two starts of the season...the other is Tommy Milone, who won his third straight start to begin the season last night...is now 9-1 in 17 career starts...the nine wins match the most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first 17 games of his career...the other is Tim Hudson who also started his career 9-1 in 1999...Hudson won his 10th game in his 18th start, which are the fewest games a pitcher has needed to reach 10 career wins in Oakland history.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win over Seattle April 4 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a Saunders sacrifice fly in the fifth...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fifth and he allowed a leadoff home run to Morse in the sixth.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win at Los Angeles last Thursday...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning on a Kendrick RBI double...blanked the Angels on one walk over his final four innings and the A's scored four times in the sixth for the win.

GRIFFIN vs. HOUSTON: Has never faced the Astros in his career.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA (20.0 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 12 er, 4 bb, 21 so, 4 hr) in five starts this spring...walked just four batters in 20.0 innings (1.80 per nine innings)...struck out 21 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.25...allowed a .263 (20 for 76) opponents batting average...also pitched in a minor league game March 13 (4.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so) and started at Seattle March 8 in the

game that was cancelled in the top of the fourth because of rain (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so).

2012 RECAP: Began the year at Double-A Midland but finished the season in the starting rotation for Oakland...went 7-1 with a 3.06 ERA in 15 starts in his Major League debut with the A's...his .875 winning percentage was the best in Oakland history and third best in Athletics history among pitchers with 15 or more starts...it topped the previous Oakland high by Tim Hudson, who went 11-2 (.846) in 1999...it was the best by an Athletic since Jim Nash went 12-1 (.923) in 1966...it was the second best mark by any ML pitcher over the last 17 years to Cliff Lee, who went 22-3 (.880) for Cleveland in 2008...it was second best by a rookie in ML history (since 1900) among pitchers with 15 or more starts to Nash in 1966...had the eighth lowest ERA in the American League among pitchers with 81 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, it was the sixth best mark by a rookie in Oakland history...ranked 10th among AL rookies in wins...walked just 19 batters in 82.1 innings, an average of 2.08 per nine innings...struck out 64 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.37.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .236 opponents batting average, which included a .225 (34-for-151) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .245 (40-for-163) against left-handers...opponents were 16-for-83 (.193) with three walks (.221 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .218 average with the bases empty but that rose to .341 with runners in scoring position...allowed a .359 batting average to the number three hitter, .218 against everyone else.

SPLITS: Was 7-1 with a 2.34 ERA in 10 starts at night, 0-0 with a 5.23 ERA in five starts during the day...was 3-0 with a 1.95 ERA in five starts against AL West competition.

MINORS: Was named the A's Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Year with Dan Straily after combining for a 7-3 record and a 2.82 ERA in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...struck out 91 and walked just 18 in 102.0 innings...averaged 1.59 walks per nine innings with a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.06...yielded just seven home runs, an average of 0.62 per nine innings...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .181 (33-for-182) against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (46-for-193) against right-handers...surrendered six of his seven home runs to righties...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty compared to .294 with runners in scoring position...compiled a 1.32 ERA over the first two innings of a game, had a 7.16 ERA in the third inning and a 2.44 ERA from the fourth inning on...his teams were 11-6 (.647) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 11 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked one batter or fewer 14 times.

MORE WITH THE A's: Was selected from Sacramento June 24, making his Major League debut that day against San Francisco...became the 43rd pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut and had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win...allowed a two-run home run to Posey in the first inning but those were the only runs he would yield in six innings...left trailing 2-1 but Norris hit a three-run "walk-off" home run for the win...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in his second start at Texas June 29 as part of a career-high 14.0 inning scoreless streak from June 24 to July 4...the streak ended on the 4th when he surrendered David Ortiz' career home run...earned his first Major League win in his fourth start, a 6-3 win at Minnesota July 13...allowed three runs in six innings but a Gomes grand slam in the fourth gave him a 4-3 lead...struck out a career-high nine batters July 25 at Toronto...tossed six or more innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first seven starts, which was the longest such streak to start a career in Athletics history...left after 1.2 innings in his eighth start Aug. 4 against Toronto...was placed on the 15-day disabled list the next day with right shoulder tightness...was 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA at the time...was reinstated from the DL Sept. 1...won each of his first three starts following his return, allowing just two runs in 20.1 innings (0.89 ERA), including Sept. 12 at Los Angeles (AL) when he tossed a career-high 8.0 shutout innings...that improved his career record to 6-0 with a 1.94 ERA over his first 11 starts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in NL, 1913 in AL), he is just the second pitcher to go undefeated in at least his first 11 Major League appearances, all starts, while maintaining an ERA under 2.00...is the first pitcher in Oakland history to start his career 6-0 and just the second Athletic since 1927 (Jim Nash, 7-0 in 1966)...allowed three runs or fewer and walked two batters or fewer in each of his first 11 starts, which is the longest such career-opening streak by a ML pitcher since at least 1916...was charged with his first loss Sept. 18 at Detroit...walked a career-high three batters Sept. 23 at New York, snapping a career-opening streak of 12 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer...that is the longest streak to start a career by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916...finished September with a 4-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in six starts...started Game 4 of the ALDS against Detroit and had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win...allowed two runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings

RHP Bartolo Colón (1-0, 4.15 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...has allowed one home run in each of his first two starts, both three-run shots...16 of the 17 home runs he allowed last year were solo shots...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 12 innings over Detroit last Friday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 so)...is 4-2 with a 3.66 ERA in seven career appearances, all starts, against Houston...including a win in his only start this year April 6 at Houston (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 so)...was 1-2 with a 6.30 ERA (20.0 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 1 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in six games, including three starts, this spring...was 10-9 with a 3.43 ERA in 24 starts last year before his suspension...won 10 games for the ninth time in his career, but it was his first 10-win season since 2005

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 13 of the first 14 games...including each of the past 12 contests (5 er in 40.1 ip, 1.12 ERA)...has a 1.55 ERA, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 1.30)...has the third lowest opponents batting average (.197) and on-base percentage (.262) in the AL and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.312)...first batters faced are 8 for 44 (.182), which is third lowest...is tied for the fewest saves (1) and save opportunities (2)...ranks third in innings pitched (46.1).

- Has appeared in five of the A's 14 games, the fewest appearances among A's relievers...converted his only save opportunity April 6 at Houston.
- Has now converted each of his last 19 save opportunities dating back to last season, which is tied for the sixth longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- Is in his 10th season in the majors...is on his fifth consecutive Opening Day roster (2011-13 with Oakland, 2009-10 with Tampa Bay).
- Posted a 2.25 ERA in four spring training appearances...opponents were 2 for 14 (.143) with no walks in 4.0 innings...had arthroscopic surgery February 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Has a save in two appearances against Houston this year (2.0 ip, 2 so).
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.

- Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in seven spring games...did not allow an earned run over his final six outings (6.2 ip).
- Faced Houston for the only time this season on April 7 (1.0 ip, 1 so)...it was his first career appearance against the Astros.
- Completed his sixth season in an Oakland uniform last year, but it was just his second full season (2010)...was 5-1 with a save, a 2.48 ERA and a .201 opponents batting average in 63 relief appearances...the ERA and opponents batting average were the lowest marks of his career.

more innings in 12 of his 24 starts last year, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 22 times...including one batter or fewer 18 times.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed one home run in each of his first two starts, both three-run shots by left-handed hitters...surrendered 14 of his 17 home runs last year and 41 of his 53 over his last four years to lefties...however, 16 of his 17 home runs last year and 43 of his 51 over his previous three seasons were solo shots.

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks fourth among active pitchers in complete games (32), seventh in wins (172) and strikeouts (1840), eighth in games started (377) and innings pitched (2406.1) and tied for eighth in shutouts (9).

2012 RECAP: Was 10-9 with a 3.43 ERA in 24 starts when he was suspended for 50 games Aug. 22 after testing positive for Testosterone, a performance-enhancing substance in violation of Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...won 10 games for the ninth time in his career, but it was his first 10-win season since 2005 when he posted a career-high 21 victories with Los Angeles (AL)...his 3.43 ERA was the second lowest of his career to a mark of 2.93 in 2002 with Cleveland and Montreal.

39-YEAR OLD: At the age of 39, he became just the third pitcher in Oakland history to win 10 games in a season at age 36 or older...the other two are Don Sutton (13 in 1985 at age 40) and Tom Candiotti (11 in 1998 at age 40)...is just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to start a game at age 39 or older...the other four are Tommy John (age 42 in 1985), Candiotti (41 in 1999), Sutton (40 in 1985) and Jim Perry (39 in 1975).
