OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics have won three straight to move to a season-high eight games over .500 at 12-4...that is the best record in the American League, second best in the majors (Atlanta, 12-2) and tied for third best in Oakland history over the first 16 games.
- The A's are 12-2 against the American League West and have won each of their last 11 games...the 11-game winning streak is the A's longest against division foes since they won 13 straight from June 12-August 11, 1994.
- The A's went 4-2 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (1-2) and Houston (3-0)...begin their second road trip of the season Friday, a six-game trip to Tampa Bay (three games) and Boston (three games).
- The time of game today was 3 hours and 25 minutes, which is the A's 12th consecutive game of at least 2 hours, 59 minutes...that is tied for the longest such streak in Oakland history (also: August 15-28, 1992)...the average time of game over the first 15 games is 3 hours and 17 minutes.
- Grant Balfour is 3 for 3 in save opportunities and has now converted each of his last 21 save chances dating back to last season...that is tied for the third longest streak in Oakland history.
- Jed Lowrie (2 for 3, r, 2b, rbi, bb) is 11 for 24 (.458) with six runs, two home runs, eight RBI and four walks in six games against Houston this year.
- Shane Peterson (1 for 3, r, rbi, bb, so) recorded his first Major League hit, a single to center in the fourth inning.
- Seth Smith (3 for 5, r) had three hits, his fifth multiple hit game in 12 contests this year...including three games of three or more hits.

HOUSTON NOTES

Rick Ankiel (1)

- The Houston Astros are on a five-game losing streak, which is one short of their season-high (6, April 2-8)...went 3-6 on this nine-game, 10-day road trip to Seattle (2-1), Los Angeles (1-2) and Oakland (0-3)...begin a six-game homestand Friday against Cleveland (three games) and Seattle (three games).
- Bud Norris tossed 0.2 innings, the shortest start of his career (previous: 1.0 ip, Aug. 23, 2009 vs. Arizona)...allowed six runs after yielding just seven runs, four earned, in 18.1 innings (1.96 ERA) in his first three starts.
- Astros starting pitchers were 0-3 and allowed 15 runs in 5.1 innings in three games this series.
- Jose Altuve (3 for 5, r, rbi, sb) batted .385 (15 for 39) with a home run and six RBI on the road trip...has reached base safely in 14 of the Astros 15 games for the season.
- Rick Ankiel (1 for 1, r, hr, rbi) hit a pinch hit home run...it was the sixth of his career, his second of the season (also: March 31 vs. Texas).
- Carlos Pena (1 for 4, r, hr, rbi, so) has homered in back-to-back games...is 10 for 29 (.345) with four doubles, two home runs, six RBI and six walks over his last eight games.
