ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and are now 4-7 since the nine-game winning streak...are 13-9 (.591) overall, which is the third best record in the American League...it matches the best record by an A's team over the first 22 games over the last 21 years...the 2008 club also started the year 13-9 (won game 23)...have spent each of the last four days in second place in the AL West, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive days in sole possession of first and 15 consecutive days with at least a share of first...the streak of 11 consecutive days alone in first was the A's longest since they finished the 2006 season with a 65-day streak...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...the A's four-game losing streak from April 19-22 was just their second that was longer than three games over the last two years (9, May 22-June 1 of last year).

OFFENSE: The A's scored 24 runs in the three-game series at Boston and hit .276 (27 for 98) with 22 walks...however, lost two of three games...now have a Major League leading 124 runs scored for the season...that is tied for the fourth most runs scored in Oakland history over the first 22 games and the most since the 1996 club had 132...also lead the majors in doubles (50), walks (101), extra base hits (78), stolen bases (21) and on-base percentage (.350)...lead the American League in slugging percentage (.432) and rank third in hits (193)...went 9 for 24 (.375) with runners in scoring position over the final two games in Boston after going 6 for 32 (.188) over the first four games of the trip...have homered three times in the last two games after homering just twice over the previous nine contests.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 5.85 ERA (52 er in 80.0 ip) and .301 (99 for 329) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...that includes 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .205 (15 for 73) opponents average in three starts by Bartolo Colón and 3-7 with a 7.20 ERA (48 er in 60.0 ip) and .328 (84 for 256) opponents average by everyone else...starters have a 4.88 ERA for the season, which ranks ninth in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.28 ERA (54 er in 92.0 ip) over the last 11 games after posting a 2.82 ERA over the first 11 contests...now have a 3.99 ERA for the season, which ranks ninth in the American League...have yielded 13 home runs in the last 12 games after surrendering just six over the first 10.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 11-2 against American League West competition and 2-7 against everyone else...are batting .291 (131 for 450) with 19 home runs in 13 games against the AL West compared to .209 (62 for 297) with five home runs in nine games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.00 ERA (39 er in 117.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.49 (47 er in 77.0 ip) against everyone else...are 1-5 in this 10-game stretch against the AL East (0-3 vs. Tampa Bay, 1-2 at Boston, four games vs. Baltimore)...this stretch ends April 29 when the A's host the Angels in a three-game series...currently have an 11-game winning streak against AL West foes, which is tied for the A's second longest winning streak against the West since divisional play began in 1969...it is the longest since 1994 when the record of 13 was set (June 12-August 11).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand tonight against Baltimore (four games) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (1-2) and Houston (3-0) and are 6-4 at home for the season...went 1-5 on the road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2)...are 7-5 (.583) on the road for the season, which is tied for the second best road record in the American League...the A's are batting .282 (120 for 426) with 79 runs scored and 17 home runs in 12 games on the road compared to .227 (73 for 321) with 45 runs scored and seven home runs in 10 games in Oakland...A's pitchers have allowed six home runs in 12 games on the road compared to 13 in 10 games in Oakland.

THIS AND THAT: Of the A's 22 games, 17 have lasted at least 2 hours and 59 minutes...including an Oakland record 13 straight from April 5-19...have not played a game under 2:32 this year and have an average time of game of 3 hours and 13 minutes...the offense ranks second the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.07)...are 13-2 when scoring four or more runs in a game compared to 0-7 when scoring fewer than four...opponents have been successful in 13 of 14 (92.9%) stolen base attempts, which is tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the highest mark in the majors...the offense has been successful in 21 of 24 (87.5%) attempts, which is third best in the American League.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are 4-2 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 9-7 in games started by a right-hander...are batting .286 (64 for 224) against south paws overall, which is second best in the American League...have a .247 (129 for 523) against right-handers...last year, the A's went 30-29 (.508) in games started by lefties and 64-39 (.621) in games started by righties.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-2 in one-run games and both of the wins have come in the last at bat...went 25-18 (.581) in one-run games last year, which was the third best record in the American League...ranked second in the AL in last at bat wins in 2012 (23)...have one walk-off win after tallying a Major League leading 14 last year...that win came in 12 innings, the A's only extra inning game of 2013...went 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games last year, which was the second best record in the AL.

LOCKED UP: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2013 season...Hiroayuki Nakajima is signed through 2014 with a club option for 2015 and Yoenis Céspedes is signed through 2015...Brett Anderson has club options for 2014 and 2015 and Coco Crisp and Chris Young have club options for 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Céspedes, Nakajima, Rodriguez, Rosales, Sizemore)...Rodriguez (sprained right elbow), Rosales (strained left intercostal) and Nakajima (strained left hamstring) began the season on the DL...Sizemore (torn left ACL) was added April 10 and Céspedes (muscle strain in left hand) was added April 13...Rodriguez and Sizemore will both miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's won the season series last year 5-4, their fifth consecutive season series victory...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-3 in Baltimore...have won 27 of their last 39 games against the Orioles, including 16 of the last 19 in Oakland...have not lost a season series to Baltimore since 1998...are 82-39 (.678) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-245 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 124-126 in Oakland and 125-119 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 985-925 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 21 saves, which is tied for the third longest streak in A's history.

Ryan Cook has not allowed a run in his last eight games and 9.2 innings.

Coco Crisp is tied for the ML lead with 20 runs scored...that is three short of the Oakland record for runs in April (Canseco, 1988).

Jed Lowrie had his Major League leading fifth game of three or more hits yesterday...has 30 hits, which is three short of the Oakland record for the month of April (Javier in 1994, Grieve in 1998).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history...he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average...in **1987** Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits his 100th career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 1-3 (.250) in his starting assignments this year and 18-15 (.545) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in just one of his four starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer twice.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has lost each of his first three decisions, which matches the longest losing streak of his career (August 1-19, 2012)...is tied for third in the American League in losses.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-2 with a 12.96 ERA (12 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 0-1 with a 2.79 ERA (3 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .593 (16 for 27) average to the number one, two and three hitters compared to .255 (13 for 51) against everyone else

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...Céspedes homered in the first inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Morse in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Morales in the fifth.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles April 9...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...also walked three batters but yielded just two runs...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed RBI singles to Trumbo and Callaspo in the third...was relieved by Resop after loading the bases with one out in the fourth...Resop escaped the jam and the A's scored five times in the seventh for the win.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit April 14 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...allowed a Hunter RBI double and a Martinez RBI single in the first and a Jackson two-run home run in the second...then allowed a two-run single to Cabrera and a RBI double to Fielder in the fourth before he was relieved by Scribner, who allowed Fielder to score on a Dirks RBI single.

LAST START: He lost his third consecutive decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Tampa Bay last Saturday...allowed a leadoff home run to Joyce in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in 6.1 innings...blanked the Rays on four hits and two walks over his final 4.1 innings...Hellickson, Peralta and Rodney combined to shutout the A's on three hits and a walk.

PARKER vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-0 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 2 bb, 13 so) in two career starts, both last year...the no decision came in a 14-9 A's win at Baltimore July 27...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Davis in the second...also allowed a RBI double to Hardy in the third and then surrendered four runs in the fifth inning on a Hardy RBI single and a Jones three-run home run...the A's scored three times in the sixth and he was relieved by Norberto to start the bottom of the sixth with an 8-6 lead...the bullpen allowed three runs in the eighth inning...the win came in a 5-2 decision at Oakland September 15...allowed single runs in the second and third innings on a Reynolds RBI double and a McLouth solo home run...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the third and he blanked the Orioles on three hits and a walk over his final four innings.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA (19.1 ip, 25 h, 18 r, 16 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in five games, all starts...also pitched in the A's minor league camp on the A's off day March 6...allowed a .309 (25 for 81) opponents batting average.

2012 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from Arizona in the Trevor Cahill trade during the offseason and went 13-8 with a 3.47 ERA in 29 starts...tied with fellow rookie Tommy Milone for the team lead in wins as they both set an Oakland record for wins by a rookie...the previous mark of 12 was held by Chris Codiroli (1983) and Joe Blanton (2005)...had the most wins by an Athletics rookie since Harry Byrd won 15 games for the 1952 Philadelphia A's en route to Rookie of the Year honors...the A's became the first team since the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers to have two rookies win 13 or more games (Joe Black 15, Billy Loes 13)...it was the second time in Oakland history the A's had two rookie 10-game winners...the other time was in 2009 (Anderson 11, Cahill 10)...with Milone making 31 starts, this was the third time in Oakland history the A's had two rookies with 20 or more starts (Keough and Johnson in 1978; Anderson and Cahill in 2009)...led the A's with 140 strikeouts, which was the third best mark by a rookie in Oakland history and the fourth best in Athletics history...his 29 starts were 10th most by an Oakland rookie.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for second among American League rookies in wins, ranked fourth in strikeouts and innings pitched (181.1) and tied for fourth in starts...his ERA was the lowest among AL rookies with 130 or more innings, his .619 winning percentage was second best and his .248 opponents batting average was third best...received one third place vote in the BBWAA AL Rookie of the Year balloting and finished fifth

AMONG THE LEADERS: His winning percentage was 10th best among all AL pitchers...allowed just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors...had a .358 opponents slugging percentage, which was sixth lowest in the AL...tied for first in the AL in sacrifice hits allowed (7), tied for third in sacrifice flies (8), ranked fifth in stolen bases against (21) and tied for sixth in wild pitches (10).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .248 opponents batting average, including .247 (86-for-348) against left-handed hitters and .248 (80-for-322) against right-handers...opponents hit .215 with runners in scoring position, which ranked fourth lowest in the AL...yielded a .173 batting average to the number three hitter in the order, which was fourth lowest in the AL...eight of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots.

BASES ON BALLS: Issued a team-leading 63 walks, which were the fewest by a team-leader in a non-strike season in Oakland history...the previous low was 69 by Doug Johns in 1996...walked four batters or more in six of his first 12 starts (36 bb in 73.2 ip, 4.40 per nine innings)...then walked three batters or fewer in each of his final 17 starts (27 bb in 107.2 ip, 2.26 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Went 5-3 with a 2.46 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts, 2-4 with a 6.15 ERA and .309 opponents average over a seven-start stretch from July 7 to Aug. 14 and 6-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .252 opponents average over his final nine starts...had eight wins after the All-Star Break, which tied for third in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (3-1, 4.26 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA and .231 opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 6.17 ERA and .313 opponents average in two starts on the road...has walked five batters over his first four starts and 25.1 innings for an average of 1.78 per nine innings, which is tied for seventh in the American League...had his career-high five-game winning streak dating back to last year snapped in his last start, an 8-1 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Sunday (6.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only a career appearance against Baltimore, a start in the A's 3-2 win September 14 of last year in Oakland (6.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

3-0, 2.43 ERA (70.1 ip, 55 h, 22 r, 19 er, 25 bb, 59 so, 5 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 3/5 (60.0%)

The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in three of its last six games (10 er in 21.0 ip, 4.29 ERA) after allowing one earned run or fewer in each of the previous 13 contests (1.25 ERA)...now has a 2.43 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.280) and fourth in opponents batting average (.208)...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 10 for 63 (.159) with two walks...the .194 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks third...has allowed four home runs in its last seven games (24.0 ip) after allowing just one over the first 14 contests (46.1 ip).

- Has a .207 opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (5 for 17) against right-handers.
- Had a loss and three saves in five games against Baltimore last year (3 er in 3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA)...is 2-1 with five saves and a 3.09 ERA in 31 outings in his career (32.0 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 11 er, 15 bb, 31 so, 1 hr).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.

- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his first 11 outings, including a season-opening seven-game, 6.1 inning scoreless streak.
- Ranks third among American League relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.156), tied for third in appearances (11), is fifth in ERA (0.71), and tied for fifth in innings pitched (12.2) and strikeouts (15).
- His .140 opponents batting average includes a .071 (1 for 14) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .172 (5 for 29) against right-handers.
