A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's lost the first meeting of 2013 last night after winning the season series last year 5-4...it was their fifth consecutive season series victory...went 2-1 Oakland and 3-3 in Baltimore...have won 27 of their last 40 games against the Orioles, including 16 of the last 20 in Oakland...have not lost a season to Baltimore since series 1998...are 82-40 (.672) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best** vinning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-246 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 124-127 in Oakland and 125-119 in Datimate all time the A's are Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 985-926 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchis the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 21 saves, which is tied for the third longest streak in A's history.

Ryan Cook has not allowed a run his last eight games and 9.2 innings.

Jed Lowrie has 31 hits, which is two short of the Oakland record for the month of April.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1990 Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak...in 1997 Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional...in **2001** the A's tie an Oakland record with 11 extra base hits in a 16-6 win at at Chicago...Johnny Damon and Frank Menechino have two doubles each and Eric Chavez homers twice as the A's collect seven doubles and four home runs

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and six of the last seven games and are now 4-8 since the nine-game winning streak...have spent each of the last five days in second place in the American League West, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive days in sole possession of first and 15 consecutive days with at least a share of first...the streak of 11 consecutive days alone in first was the A's longest since they finished the 2006 season with a 65-day streak...are a season-high 21/2 games out of first place...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...the A's four-game losing streak from April 19-22 was just their second that was longer than three games over the last two years (9, May 22-June 1 of last year).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-8 with a 6.12 ERA (58 er in 85.1 ip) and .306 (107 for 350) opponents batting average over the last 16 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .205 (15 for 73) opponents average in three starts by Bartolo Colón and 3-8 with a 7.44 ERA (54 er in 65.1 ip) and .332 (92 for 277) opponents average by everyone else...starters are 10-10 with a 5.09 ERA (73 er in 129.0 ip) for the season... are tied for second in the American League in wins but have the fourth most losses...rank 10th in ERA.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.61 ERA (63 er in 101.0 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 2.82 ERA over the first 11 contests...now have a 4.21 ERA for the season, which ranks 10th in the American League...have yielded 14 home runs in the last 13 games after surrendering just six over the first 10.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in runs (126), doubles (52), walks (105), stolen bases (21), extra base hits (80) and on-base percentage (.348)...the 126 runs scored are fifth most in Oakland history over the first 23 games of the season and the most since 1996 (136)...they are the most by the A's in the month of April since 2003 (133)...the 52 doubles are third most in Oakland history in April (58 in 2003, 53 in 2011) and the 80 extra base hits are tied for fifth most...the last time the A's had more than 21 stolen bases in April was in 1990 (25)...also rank tied for second in the American League in hits (199) this year and fourth in slugging (.425)...the A's have homered three times in the last three games after homering just twice over the previous nine contests.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 11-2 against American League West competition and 2-8 against everyone else...are batting .291 (131 for 450) with 19 home runs in 13 games against the AL West compared to .207 (68 for 329) with five home runs in 10 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.00 ERA (39 er in 117.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.86 (56 er in 86.0 ip) against everyone else ... are 1-6 in this 10-game stretch against the AL East (0-3 vs. Tampa Bay, 1-2 at Boston, 0-1 vs. Baltimore)...this stretch ends Monday when the A's begin a three-game series with the Angels...currently have an 11-game winning streak against AL West foes, which is tied for the A's second longest winning streak against the West since divisional play began in 1969...it is the longest since 1994 when the record of 13 was set (June 12-August 11).

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are 4-2 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 9-8 in games started by a right-hander...are batting .285 (67 for 235) against south paws overall, which is second best in the American League...have a .243 (132 for 544) against right-handers...last year, the A's went 30-29 (.508) in games started by lefties and 64-39 (.621) in games started by righties.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game homestand against Baltimore (0-1) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (1-2) and Houston (3-0) and are 6-5 at home for the season...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 7-5 (.583) on the road...that is the fourth best road record in the American League...the A's are batting 282 (120 for 426) with 79 runs scored and 17 home runs in 12 games on the road compared to .224 (79 for 353) with 47 runs scored and seven home runs in 11 games in Oakland...have the second best road batting average in the AL and the third worst home average...A's pitchers have allowed six home runs in 12 games on the road compared to 14 in 11 games in Oakland.

THIS AND THAT: Of the A's 23 games, 18 have lasted at least 2 hours and 59 minutes...including an Oakland record 13 straight from April 5-19...have not played a game under 2:32 this year and have an average time of game of 3 hours and 13 minutes...the offense leads the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.07)...are 13-2 when scoring four or more runs in a game compared to 0-8 when scoring fewer than four...opponents have been successful in 16 of 17 (94.1%) stolen base attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the offense has been successful in 21 of 24 (87.5%) attempts, which is tied for third best in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-2 in one-run games and the four one-run decisions are tied for second fewest in the American League...went 25-18 (.581) in one-run games last year, which was the third best record in the AL...each of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat ...ranked second in the AL in last at bat wins in 2012 (23)...have one walk-off win after tallying a Major League leading 14 last year...that win came in 12 innings, the A's only extra inning game of 2013...went 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games last year, which was the second best record in the AL.

LOCKED UP: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2013 season...Hiroyuki Nakajima is signed through 2014 with a club option for 2015 and Yoenis Céspedes is signed through 2015...Brett Anderson has club options for 2014 and 2015 and Coco Crisp and Chris Young have club options for 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Céspedes, Nakajima, Rodriguez, Sizemore)...Rodriguez (sprained right elbow) and Nakajima (strained left hamstring) began the season on the DL...Sizemore (torn left ACL) was added April 10 and Céspedes (muscle strain in left hand) was added April 13...Rodriguez and Sizemore will both miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times



FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and 23-12 (.657) in his career...his teams are 28-12 (.700) in his 40 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in three of his four starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer three times.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA (4 er in 13.2 ip) and .231 (12 for 52) opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 6.17 ERA (8 er in 11.2 ip) and .313 (15 for 48) opponents average in two starts on the road...last year, he went 7-4 with a 2.74 ERA and .240 opponents batting average in 15 starts at home compared to 6-6 with a 4.83 ERA and .316 opponents batting average in 16 starts on the road...had the eighth lowest home ERA in the AL and the ninth highest road ERA...allowed 18 of his 24 home runs on the road, which was fourth most in the AL.

DON'T WALK: Has walked five batters over his first four starts and 25.1 innings for an average of 1.78 per nine innings, which is tied for seventh in the American League...has 21 strikeouts for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.20, which is eighth best...last year, he walked just 36 batters in 190.0 innings, an average of 1.71 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...it was the fifth lowest mark in Oakland history...had a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.81, which ranked seventh in the AL...it was the fourth best mark in Athletics history.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Took the loss in his last start after winning each of his first three starts...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...the loss snapped a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to September 9 of last year...had a 3.11 ERA and .308 opponents batting average over that eight-start stretch...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...his three wins this year are tied for sixth in the American League...the three wins match his most in a month (April, 2012; May, 2012).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed three home runs, all to right-handed hitters and all solo shots...opponents are batting .271 (16 for 59) with the bases empty compared to .160 (4 for 25) with runners in scoring position.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...allowed a home run to Gutierrez to start the game and Morse added a solo home run two outs later...did not allow a run over his final six innings...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced and 17 of the final 18.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-5 win at Los Angeles April 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a Hamilton sacrifice fly in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more in the third before he allowed another run in the third...had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Callaspo in the fifth.

THIRD START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-2 win over Houston April 15 in Oakland...the A's scored six times in the first inning and he retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced before allowing a RBI single to Pena in the fourth...also allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Tampa Bay last Sunday...allowed three runs in the first inning but only one was earned following a Reddick error...allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the second but then retired 15 of the next 18 batters he faced...allowed a RBI double to Roberts in the seventh and left with a runner on third and two outs...Neshek allowed the inherited runner to score on a wild pitch.

MILONE vs. BALTIMORE: Was the winning pitcher in his only a career appearance, a start in the A's 3-2 win September 14 of last year in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the third inning when Machado scored when Hardy reached on a two-out error by Donaldson...the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead but he allowed a home run to Davis to lead off the fifth and tie the game...Gomes had a RBI single in the fifth for the win.

THIS SPRING: Was 3-0 with a 4.63 ERA (23.1 ip, 28 h, 12 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 3 hr) in six games, all starts...the three wins tied for third in the Cactus League...led the A's in wins and innings and tied for the lead in starts...walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five starts before issuing two in his final start...had five walks in 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings) for the spring...allowed a .304 (28 for 92) opponents batting average.

2012 RECAP: Was one of four players acquired from Washington in the Gio Gonzalez trade during the offseason and went 13-10 with a 3.74 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts...also led the A's in innings pitched (190.0), had the only complete game and tied for the team-lead in wins...fellow rookie Jarrod Parker also won 13 games, both setting an Oakland record for wins by a rookie...the previous mark of 12 was held by Chris Codiroli (1983) and Joe Blanton (2005)...had the most wins by an Athletics rookie since Harry Byrd won 15 games for the 1952 Philadelphia A's en route to Rookie of the Year honors...the A's became the first team since the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers to have two rookies win 13 or more games (Joe Black 15, Billy Loes 13)...it was the second time in Oakland history the A's had two rookie 10-game winners...the other time was in 2009 (Anderson 11, Cahill 10)...with Parker making 29 starts, this was the third time in Oakland history the A's had two rookies with 20 or more starts (Keough and Johnson in 1978; Anderson and Cahill in 2009)...struck out 137, which was the fourth best rookie total in Oakland nistory and the sixth best in Athletics history...also tied for the fifth most games started by an Oakland rookie (31) and was sixth in innings pitched (190.0)...surrendered 24 home runs, which tied for second most.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for the lead among Major League rookies in complete games...tied for second among American League rookies in wins and games started, ranked third in innings pitched and was fifth in strikeouts...his ERA ranked third among AL rookies with 130 or more innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for third in the AL with six pickoffs...opponents were 8-for-18 (44.4%) in stolen base attempts, which was the second lowest mark in the AL...allowed a team-leading 207 hits, which were ninth most in the AL...his 31 games started were the fewest by an A's team leader since Steve Karsay led Oakland with 24 starts in 1997.

RUN SUPPORT: Received just 12 runs of support in his 10 losses (58.1 ip, 1.85 RSA)...received no run support six times and one run four times...had two wins where he received just one run of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (2-1, 4.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 9-2 over the first 19 starts of his career...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to have at least nine wins in his first 19 career games (Hudson, Zito)...has allowed a .156 average the first time through the lineup, .424 the second time and .172 after that ...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-6 A's loss at Boston last Monday (4.0 ip, 8 h, 9 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

3-0, 2.68 ERA (74.0 ip, 62 h, 26 r, 22 er, 28 bb, 61 so, 5 hr) The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in four of its last seven games (13 er in 24.2 ip, 4.74 ERA) after allowing one earned run or fewer in each of the previous 13 contests (1.25 ERA)...now has a 2.68 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 11 for 64 (.172) with three walks and a hit by pitch...the .214 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks third...has allowed four home runs in its last eight games (27.2 ip) after allowing just one over the first 14 contests (46.1 ip).
