### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight and seven of the last eight games and are now 4-9 since the nine-game winning streak...have lost more than three straight games just twice over the last two years...had a four-game losing streak earlier this year from April 19-22 and lost nine straight last year from May 22-June 1...dropped a season-high 3½ games back of first place Texas with the loss last night...have spent each of the last six days in second place in the American League West, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive days in sole possession of first and 15 consecutive days with at least a share of first...the streak of 11 consecutive days alone in first was the A's longest since they finished the 2006 season with a 65-day streak...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, six days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were shutout for the third time this year last night, which is tied for the American League lead...have been outscored 6-0 in those three games...were held to three hits last night for the sixth time this year...no other team has more than three games with three hits or fewer...despite the three shutouts, the A's lead the majors in runs scored (126)...also top the majors in doubles (54), walks (107) and extra base hits (82), are tied for the lead in stolen bases (21) and rank third in on-base percentage (.342).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-9 with a 5.67 ERA (58 er in 92.0 ip) and .301 (113 for 376) opponents batting average over the last 17 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .205 (15 for 73) opponents average in three starts by Bartolo Colón and 3-9 with a 6.75 ERA (54 er in 72.0 ip) and .323 (98 for 303) opponents average by everyone else...starters are 10-11 with a 4.84 ERA (73 er in 135.2 ip) for the season...are tied for third in the American League in most wins and most losses...rank 10<sup>th</sup> in ERA.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.23 ERA (64 er in 110.0 ip) over the last 13 games after posting a 2.82 ERA over the first 11 contests...now have a 4.08 ERA for the season, which ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in the American League...have yielded 14 home runs in the last 14 games after surrendering just six over the first 10...have allowed 20 home runs for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.

**A's IN APRIL:** The A's are 13-11 in April...have finished the month of April with a winning record just once over the previous nine years (16-11 in 2008)...however, are a combined 119-120 in April over the last 10 years (since 2004)...have 54 doubles this month, which is four short of the Oakland record for doubles in April (58 in 2003)...the A's 82 extra base hits are tied for fourth most in Oakland history in April...the 126 runs scored are their most in April since 2003 (133)...the last time the A's had more than 21 stolen bases in April was in 1990 (25).

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** The A's are 11-2 (.846) against American League West competition and 2-9 (.182) against everyone else...are batting .291 (131 for 450) with 19 home runs in 13 games against the AL West compared to .198 (71 for 359) with five home runs in 11 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.00 ERA (39 er in 117.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.40 (57 er in 95.0 ip) against everyone else...are 1-7 in this 10-game stretch against the AL East (0-3 vs. Tampa Bay, 1-2 at Boston, 0-2 vs. Baltimore)...this stretch ends Monday when the A's begin a three-game series with the Angels...currently have an 11-game winning streak against AL West foes, which is tied for the A's second longest winning streak against the West since divisional play began in 1969...it is the longest since 1994 when the record of 13 was set (June 12-August 11).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this seven-game homestand against Baltimore (0-2) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (1-2) and Houston (3-0) and are 6-6 at home for the season...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 7-5 (.583) on the road...that is the fourth best road record in the American League...the A's are batting 282 (120 for 426) with 79 runs scored and 17 home runs in 12 games on the road compared to .214 (82 for 383) with 47 runs scored and seven home runs in 12 games in Oakland...have the second best road batting average in the AL and the second worst home average...A's pitchers have allowed six home runs in 12 games on the road compared to 14 in 12 games in Oakland.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's dropped to 0-9 in games in which they score fewer than four runs with the loss last night...are 13-2 when scoring four or more...opponents have been successful in 17 of 18 (94.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the highest mark in the majors...the one caught stealing came on an A.J. Griffin pickoff on April 16 against Houston (Altuve)...the offense has been successful in 21 of 24 (87.5%) attempts, which is tied for third best in the American League...16 of the A's 24 games have lasted at least three hours and they have not played a game under 2:32 this year...have an average time of game of 3 hours and 12 minutes...the offense leads the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.06) and the pitching staff ranks sixth in most pitches per game (149.6).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 2-2 in one-run games and the four one-run decisions are tied for second fewest in the American League...went 25-18 (.581) in one-run games last year, which was the third best record in the AL...each of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat...ranked second in the AL in last at bat wins in 2012 (23)...have one walk-off win after tallying a Major League leading 14 last year...that win came in 12 innings, the A's only extra inning game of 2013...went 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games last year, which was the second best record in the AL.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have four players on the disabled list (Céspedes, Nakajima, Rodriguez, Sizemore)...Rodriguez (sprained right elbow) and Nakajima (strained left hamstring) began the season on the DL...Sizemore (torn left ACL) was added April 10 and Céspedes (muscle strain in left hand) was added April 13...Rodriguez and Sizemore will both miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

### A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2013 after winning the season series last year 5-4...it was their fifth consecutive season series victory...went 2-1 in Oakland and 3-3 in Baltimore...have not lost a season series to Baltimore since 1998...are 82-41 (.667) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-247 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 124-128 in Oakland and 125-119 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 985-927 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Grant Balfour** has converted each of his last 21 saves, which is tied for the third longest streak in A's history.

**Coco Crisp** has scored 20 runs, which is three short of the Oakland record for runs in April (23, Jose Canseco in 1988).

**Jed Lowrie** has 32 hits, which is one short of the Oakland record for the month of April held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...he also has 10 doubles, which is one short of Mark Ellis' Oakland April record of 11 (2003).

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1968** Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in **1981** former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in **2002** the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menchino connect for the home runs.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 15-4 (.789) when he starts in his career...has tossed six or more innings in three of his four starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer three times.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has not allowed a hit to the opponents number three hitter (0 for 12) but the clean-up batter is 6 for 9 (.667)...last year, he allowed a .359 batting average to the number three hitter, .218 against everyone else...opponents are 0 for 9 with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .156 (5 for 32) average the first time through the lineup, .424 (14 for 33) the second time and .172 (5 for 29) after that...has surrendered all three of his home runs to right-handed hitters.

**9-2:** Is 9-2 over the first 19 starts of his career...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to have at least nine wins in his first 19 career games...Tim Hudson was 10-2 and Barry Zito was 10-5...with a win today, he would join Hudson (10-2) and Zito (10-6) as the only pitchers in Oakland history with 10 wins over their first 20 career games.

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win over Seattle April 4 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a Saunders sacrifice fly in the fifth...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fifth and he allowed a leadoff home run to Morse in the sixth.

**SECOND START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win at Los Angeles April 11...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning on a Kendrick RBI double...blanked the Angels on one walk over his final four innings and the A's scored four times in the sixth for the win.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 16 in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters in six innings but struck out eight...allowed two runs in the third inning on RBI singles by Maxwell and Carter...then walked Pena to load the bases with one out before retiring each of the final 11 batters that he faced...left after six innings with the A's leading 3-2 but Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save before Donaldson had a RBI triple in the bottom of the eighth for the win.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-6 loss at Boston last Monday...allowed a career-high nine runs on a career-high tying eight hits in 4.0 innings...allowed just one run over the first three innings on a Napoli RBI double in the second...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Middlebrooks in the fourth...also allowed a grand slam to Napoli in the Red Sox five run fifth inning.

**GRIFFIN vs. BALTIMORE:** Is making his first career appearance and start.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA (20.0 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 12 er, 4 bb, 21 so, 4 hr) in five starts this spring...walked just four batters in 20.0 innings (1.80 per nine innings)...struck out 21 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.25...allowed a .263 (20 for 76) opponents batting average...also pitched in a minor league game March 13 (4.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so) and started at Seattle March 8 in the game that was cancelled in the top of the fourth because of rain (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so).

**2012 RECAP:** Began the year at Double-A Midland but finished the season in the starting rotation for Oakland...went 7-1 with a 3.06 ERA in 15 starts in his Major League debut with the A's...his .875 winning percentage was the best in Oakland history and third best in Athletics history among pitchers with 15 or more starts...it topped the previous Oakland high by Tim Hudson, who went 11-2 (.846) in 1999...it was the best by an Athletic since Jim Nash went 12-1 (.923) in 1966...it was the second best mark by any ML pitcher over the last 17 years to Cliff Lee, who went 22-3 (.880) for Cleveland in 2008...it was second best by a rookie in ML history (since 1900) among pitchers with 15 or more starts to Nash in 1966...had the eighth lowest ERA in the American League among pitchers with 81 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, it was the sixth best mark by a rookie in Oakland history...ranked 10th among AL rookies in wins...walked just 19 batters in 82.1 innings, an average of 2.08 per nine innings...struck out 64 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.37.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .236 opponents batting average, which included a .225 (34-for-151) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .245 (40-for-163) against left-handers...opponents were 16-for-83 (.193) with three walks (.221 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .218 average with the bases empty but that rose to .341 with runners in scoring position.

**SPLITS:** Was 7-1 with a 2.34 ERA in 10 starts at night, 0-0 with a 5.23 ERA in five starts during the day...was 3-0 with a 1.95 ERA in five starts against AL West competition.

**MINORS:** Was named the A's Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Year with Dan Straily after combining for a 7-3 record and a 2.82 ERA in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...struck out 91 and walked just 18 in 102.0 innings...averaged 1.59 walks per nine innings with a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.06...yielded just seven home runs, an average of 0.62 per nine innings...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .181 (33-for-182) against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (46-for-193) against right-handers...surrendered six of his seven home runs to righties...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty compared to .294 with runners in scoring position...compiled a 1.32 ERA over the first two innings of a game, had a 7.16 ERA in the third inning and a 2.44 ERA from the fourth inning on...his teams were 11-6 (.647) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 11 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked one batter or fewer 14 times.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Bartolo Colón (3-0, 2.89 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...tossed a three-hit shutout in his last start last Tuesday at Boston in a rain-shortened seven inning game, a 13.0 A's win (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...at the age of 39 years, 334 days, he became the second oldest pitcher in Oakland history to pitch a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days in 1985)...issued his first walk of the season in his last start, snapping a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to last year...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley (50.1 ip, Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990)...is averaging 0.35 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the American League...is 12-8 with a 3.10 ERA in 26 career appearances, 25 starts, against Baltimore...was 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 ip, 14 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year, both at Baltimore.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

**3-0, 2.71 ERA (76.1 ip, 63 h, 28 r, 23 er, 30 bb, 65 so, 5 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 3/5 (60.0%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in five of its last eight games (14 er in 27.0 ip, 4.67 ERA) after allowing one earned run or fewer in each of the previous 13 contests (1.25 ERA)...now has a 2.71 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 11 for 67 (.164) with three walks and a hit by pitch...the .205 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks third.

**First Hitters: 3-8 (0 bb)**

- Is 3 for 3 in save opportunities and has now converted each of his last 21 save chances dating back to last season...that is tied for the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- Has a .207 opponents batting average, including .083 (1 for 12) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (5 for 17) against right-handers.
- Had a loss and three saves in five games against Baltimore last year (3 er in 3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA)...is 2-1 with five saves and a 3.09 ERA in 31 outings in his career (32.0 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 11 er, 15 bb, 31 so, 1 hr).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10<sup>th</sup> in saves.

**First Hitters: 2-9 (1 bb, 1 sf)**

- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his first 11 outings, including a season-opening seven-game, 6.1 inning scoreless streak.
- Ranks third among American League relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.156), fifth in ERA (0.71), tied for seventh in appearances (11) and strikeouts (15) and tied for ninth in innings pitched (12.2).
- His .140 opponents batting average includes a .071 (1 for 14) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .172 (5 for 29) against right-handers.
- Had a win in two appearances against the Orioles last year (2.0 ip, 3 h, 3 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in eight career games against Baltimore (9.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 12 so).

**SHUTOUT:** Tossed a three-hit shutout in his last start last Tuesday at Boston in a rain-shortened seven inning game...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...at the age of 39 years, 334 days, he became the second oldest pitcher in Oakland history to pitch a shutout...Don Sutton is the oldest, as he was 40 years, 85 days on June 6, 1985 when he blanked Chicago 10-0...the seven-inning shutout was third shortest in Oakland history...Chuck Dobson pitched 5.1 innings June 11, 1968 at Cleveland in a 2-0 game that was called with one out in the top of the sixth...Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971 against Kansas City in a 5-0 victory in a game that was called after the top of the sixth...the last complete game by an A's pitcher of fewer than eight innings was by Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip).

**DON'T WALK:** Walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning in his last start Tuesday at Boston, his first walk of the season...that snapped a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990...has walked just one batter in 26.0 innings for an average of 0.35 walks per nine innings, which is the **lowest** mark in the American League...his strikeout to walk ratio of 17.0 is also the **best** in the AL...has the **fourth** lowest opponents on-base percentage (.242) and the **fourth** fewest pitches per inning (13.8)...did not walk a batter over his first three starts this year to become the Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 to start the season with three consecutive games of five or more innings and no walks...had a four-game streak with no walks and at least five innings pitched dating back to last year, which was the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 3 for 25 (.120) with one walk (.154 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is **second** lowest in the American League and the batting average is **third** lowest...has allowed a .167 (6 for 36) average the first time through the lineup, .274 (17 for 62) after that.

**LAST NINE STARTS:** Is 7-1 with a 1.94 ERA (13 er in 60.1 ip) and .235 (55 for 234) opponents batting average over his last nine starts dating back to July 28, 2012...has issued just five walks in 60.1 innings over that stretch (0.75 per nine innings).

**NOT WILD:** Does not have a wild pitch over his first four starts...did not have a wild pitch last year and his 152.1 innings were fourth most in Oakland history among pitchers with no wild pitches...has not had a wild pitch in each of his last 60 games and 362.2 innings...his last wild pitch was May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL).

**ACTIVE LEADERS:** Is **tied for third** among active pitchers in complete games (33), **tied for sixth** in shutouts (10), ranks **seventh** in wins (174), strikeouts (1850) and games started (379) and **eighth** in innings pitched (2419.1).

**DOMINICAN LEADERS:** His 174 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (379), innings pitched (2419.1) and strikeouts (1850).

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win at Houston April 6...retired 11 of the first 12 batters...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Castro in the fourth innings...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings and the A's scored four times in the sixth for the win.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 12-inning win over Detroit April 12...allowed all three of his runs in the third inning on a three-run home run by Fielder...the A's came back with single runs in the third, sixth and seventh to get him off the hook...allowed eight hits, all to the top four hitters in the order...the bottom five were 0 for 15.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win over Houston April 17 in Oakland...he allowed a run in the first inning when Altuve singled, went to third on a Castro single, and scored on a Carter fielders choice...the A's came back with six runs in the bottom of the first and he retired 15 of the 17 hitters he faced over his final five innings.

**LAST START:** He tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 win at Boston last Tuesday...walked one and struck out seven...allowed a two-out single Pedroia in the first but then retired 12 straight before allowing back-to-back two-out singles to Saltalamacchia and Gomes in the fifth...also walked Ellsbury to start the sixth before retiring each of the final six batters.

**COLON vs. BALTIMORE:** Is 12-8 with a 3.10 ERA (165.2 ip, 158 h, 59 r, 57 er, 61 bb, 117 so, 10 hr) in 26 career appearances, 25 starts...is 5-7 with a 3.33 ERA (36 er in 97.1 ip) in 15 starts at Camden Yards and 7-1 with a 2.77 ERA (21 er in 68.1 ip) in 11 games, 10 starts, at his home ballpark...was 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 ip, 14 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year, both at Baltimore...the no decision came in the A's 5-2 loss April 29...shutout the Orioles on five hits and a walk over the first eight innings and took a 2-0 lead into the ninth...allowed infield singles to Hardy and Jones and his own throwing error put runners on second and third with one out...was relieved by Balfour who allowed a Wieters two-run double for the blown save and a Betemit three-run home run for the loss...the win came in a 6-1 victory July 28...scattered seven hits over 5.2 innings but did not allow a run...had a runner in scoring position in four of his six innings but allowed just one runner as far as third base...left with a 5-0 lead and Scribner allowed a Markakis home run in the ninth.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 1-2 with a 6.30 ERA (20.0 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 1 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in six games, including three starts, this spring...allowed a .344 (31 for 90) opponents batting average but issued just one walk in 20.0 innings...struck out a team leading 22, which tied for ninth in the Cactus League...also started in a minor league game against the Angels March 20 (5.0 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 2 bb, 3 so).

activated April 13...sustained a sprained right ankle, which placed him on the DL for a second time from July 15 to Aug. 11...missed 52 team games in that stretch...tied his career high with a nine-game hitting streak from April 27 to May 6, during which he hit .469 with three home runs and nine RBI...hit home runs in three consecutive games from June 7-9, becoming the first Astros shortstop to do so since Andujar Cedenro from April 9-12, 1994...prior to Lowrie, the last Astro at any position to homer in three straight games was Lance Berkman (four games) from July 4-8, 2010...combined to play in six minor league games while on injury rehab assignments, including four playoff games...appeared in games for Double-A Corpus Christi and Single-A Lancaster during their playoff runs in September.

**2011**—Had a career-high four triples in 88 games in a season that included a trip to the disabled list...saw action at all four infield positions with 49 games at shortstop, 33 at third base, four at first base and one at second base...hit .330 against left-handed pitching, the seventh-best mark in the American League among players with at least 115 plate appearances against lefties...hit an AL-best (min. 50 PA) .368 in April and led the Sox with a .574 slugging percentage, which was 10th-best in the AL during the month...placed on the 15-day DL with a left shoulder strain June 17...played in five rehab games with Triple-A Pawtucket, hitting .412 with four doubles and five RBI...activated from DL Aug. 8...hit .270 in 55 games before the trip to the DL and .221 after...began a 5-4-3 triple play in game two of a double-header Aug. 16 against Tampa Bay...it was just the second triple play turned by Boston since 1980 and the club's first since shortstop John Valentin's unassisted triple play July 8, 1994 against Seattle.

**2009**—Limited to 32 games with the Big League club due to two trips to the disabled list...made an Opening Day roster for the first time in his career...appeared at second base (2 games), third base (4 games) and shortstop (26 games) for the second straight season...made his first career Opening Day start April 7 against Tampa Bay, going 1-for-4...was placed on the 15-day DL April 12 with a left wrist sprain...underwent an ulnar styloid excision and arthroscopic ligament repair on that wrist April 21...reinstated from the DL July 8 and optioned to Short-Season Single-A Lowell...recalled by the Sox from Triple-A Pawtucket July 18 but appeared in only 14 games before returning to the DL Aug. 7 with ulnar neuritis in his left wrist...reinstated Sept. 8...belted his first career grand slam off Chris Perez on the final day of the regular season, Oct. 4 against Cleveland...combined to hit .202 with three homers and 11 RBI in 26 minor league games between Pawtucket, Portland and Lowell, including 18 rehab outings...played in all three of Boston's ALDS games against Los Angeles but made no starts.

career before a miscue at third base in the second game of a doubleheader Aug. 26 at New York (AL)...was a non-roster invitee to Spring Training and accompanied the team to Japan before opening the year at Triple-A Pawtucket...selected to the ML roster when Mike Lowell went on the DL April 10...started at third base in his Big League debut April 15 at Cleveland...knocked a two-run single off Rafael Perez in the seventh inning for first hit...finished the game with three RBI, which was the most by a Red Sox in his first ML game since Merrill Combs also had three Sept. 12, 1947...hit safely in his first eight tilts with an at-bat, tallying a .357 clip through April 26...that matched the third longest by a Sox player to begin his Major League career since at least 1920 behind only nine-game runs by Ted Williams (April 20-May 4, 1939) and Shea Hillenbrand (April 2-12, 2001)...connected for his first Major League homer off Glen Perkins May 10 at Minnesota...optioned to Pawtucket May 11 and rejoined Boston July 12 after an injury to Julio Lugo...started 57 of the club's final 64 games...led all rookies with 21 doubles after All-Star break...knocked a game-winning solo homer in the 11th inning Aug. 24 at Toronto to give Boston a 6-5 victory...made eight starts at shortstop in the postseason and played in nine of Boston's 11 games overall...hit .207 with two RBI...was second on the club with a .364 average in the ALDS against Los Angeles...hit safely in each of his three ALDS games, including a walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning of Game 4 to give the Sox a 3-2 win and clinch the series, 3-1...lined a two-out pitch from Scot Shields into right field to score Jason Bay from second base...became just the fourth rookie ever to end a postseason series with a walk-off hit...was 2-for-18 (.111) with a RBI in six ALCS games against the Rays.
