#### OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics recorded their second walk-off win after tallying a Major League leading 14 last year...the win snapped a season-high tying four-game losing streak.
- The A's recorded four doubles today and now have 61 for the season, which is an Oakland record for doubles in the month of April (previous: 58 in 2003)...had five extra base hits and now have 90 overall, which is an Oakland record for extra base hits in April (previous: 89 in 2003).
- Yoenis Céspedes** (2 for 5, 2 r, hr, 2 rbi, 2 so) was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list today and started in left field...hit a game-tying, two-run home run in the ninth inning...the A's are 9-2 (.818) with him in the starting lineup compared to 5-10 (.333) in games he doesn't start...last year, the A's were 82-46 (.641) with him in the starting lineup compared to 12-22 (.353) when he didn't start.
- Coco Crisp** (2 for 4, 2 r, 2 2b, rbi, bb, gidp) recorded the fourth walk-off sacrifice bunt in Oakland history...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...has scored 22 runs, which is one short of the Oakland record for runs in April (23, Jose Canseco in 1988).
- Josh Donaldson** (1 for 3, 2b, 2 rbi, 2 bb) is 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles, 10 RBI and six walks over his last seven games and is batting .394 (26 for 66) over his last 18 contests.

#### BALTIMORE NOTES

- The Baltimore Orioles had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped...are 3-1 on this 11-game road trip to Oakland (3-1), Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles (four games).
- The Orioles had their four-game winning streak in Oakland dating back to last season snapped...it was their longest winning streak at O.co Coliseum since they also won four in a row May 23-Sept. 9, 1998.
- Chris Davis** (2 for 5, r, 2b, hr, 3 rbi, so) is 14 for 39 (.359) with four doubles, three homers, nine RBI and five multiple hit games in his past 11 contests.
- Manny Machado** (4 for 5, r, 2b, 2 rbi) had his first career four-hit game...is batting .338 (27 for 80) with two home runs and 15 RBI in his last 19 games.
- Nate McLouth** (4 for 5, 4 r, 2b, sb) matched his career-highs with four hits (third time) and four runs (second time)...has reached base safely in 22 of his last 36 plate appearances...is 15 for 29 (.517) with seven walks in nine games over that span.
