WEDNESDAY, MAY 1, 2013 OAKLAND, CA GAME #27 (9-17) ROAD GAME #15 (3-11)

LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the final game (1-5) of a seven-day, seven-game road trip to Seattle (April 25-28; 1-3) and Oakland (April 29-May 1; 0-2)...Halos have dropped four straight games...Club looks to avoid being swept for second straight series vs. Oakland...LAA last dropped six of seven on a road trip May 13-19, 2011 (TEX, OAK, SEA)...Angels' 9-17 mark after 26 games equals worst mark in club history (4th time, last, 1994)... Club has been 9-18 after 27 games twice in team annals (1994, 1961)...Halos have dropped eight of last nine road games...Club is 5-13 vs. A.L. West foes.

APRIL WOES: The Angels finished 9-17 in the month...17 losses set a club record for April...Halos are 17-32 in April over the last two seasons...Club ended the month -8.0 games back of first place, largest deficit in the opening month since 2001 (-10.0)...Six losses came by a single run in the month...Club was 2-7 in nine series played....Angels used a club record 18 pitchers in the month.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS: The Angels recalled RHP Ryan Brasier from Salt Lake prior to today's game...Yesterday, the Angels optioned LHP Michael Roth to Arkansas and selected the contract of OF Scott Cousins from Salt Lake...Club placed OF Peter Bourjos on the 15-day DL (left hamstring strain) and activated INF Erick Aybar from DL...Following game, the club optioned LHP Nick Maronde to Arkansas.

OAKTOWN MARATHON: Monday, the Angels fell to the Oakland A's in 19 innings on a Brandon Moss walk-off HR...At 6 hours and 32 minutes, Monday's contest was the longest game in Angels history, surpassing the 6 hour and 6 minute affair played on April 13, 1982 vs. Seattle (20 innings)...Innings-wise, was the third longest game in Angels history (20 innings, twice, 4/13/82 vs. SEA & 7/9/71 @ OAK)...Two of three games of at least 19 innings in Angels history have been walk-off losses to A's... Two clubs used a combined 16 pitchers (eight each)...LAA and Oakland pitchers combined to throw a total of 597 pitches (Angels, 297 pitches, 185 strikes; A's, 300 pitches, 188 strikes)...Angels pitchers tossed 297 pitches, the team's most since at least 1988.

MARATHON PART II: Howie Kendrick and Brendan Harris both went 2-for-9, becoming the second and third Angels to log nine at-bats in a game (Don Baylor, 5-for-9, 4/13/82 vs. SEA)...Albert Pujols launched two HRs and posted his 40th career four-hit game (third since joining Angels)...Mark Trumbo went 3-for-8, including an estimated 475-foot blast, tied for the longest in MLB this season according to ESPN...Seven of the Angels' nine position players went the full 19 frames...All told offensively, the Angels finished 15-for-70 with three homers, six walks and 18 strikeouts...Four players left game due to injury (Peter Bourjos, hamstring; Luis Jimenez, shin; Coco Crisp, hamstring; Chris Young, quad).

<u>SCHEDULING UPDATE:</u> Friday's (5/3) Angels vs. Orioles game will be televised on KCOP-TV (My13). Coverage for both broadcasts will begin with "Angels Live" at 6:30pm PT.

@ OAKLAND: In last meeting, Angels were swept at home by A's for first time since Oct. 4-7, 2001...Angels are 0-5 against A's for first time since starting 0-5 against Oakland in 1990...Angels have not been swept in back-to-back series Oakland since 1991 (A's swept three straight series)...Angels have allowed eight-or-more runs in five straight games vs. Athletics, marking just second time ever the Halos have given up eight runs in five straight games to a single opponent (also, five in a row vs. White Sox in 1979)...Two of the three longest games in Angels history have come against the A's (Monday night, 19 innings; 7/9/71, 20 innings)...A's claimed 2012 season series 10-9 with the Halos dropping seven of 10 contests at Angel Stadium against Oakland...Halos have lost three straight season series vs. A's...Angels trail all-time series vs. OAK, 390-440...Halos are 9-11 in last 20 games in Oakland, 13 winning eight of last games here.

<u>UP NEXT – VS. BALTIMORE:</u> LAA claimed 2012 series 7-2...Halos have won five of last six games...**Halos are 49-28 vs. O's since 2004**...LAA is 8-1-0 in last nine season series.

HURTIN' HALOS: Yesterday, the Angels placed Peter Bourjos (left hamstring strain) on the 15-day disabled list...LAA now has seven players (four pitchers) on the 15-day D.L...Angels used 18 pitchers in April, the most in any month since August, 2000 and the most the Halos have ever used in April.

Is 5-1 with a 2.32 ERA in day games since joining Angels last season

- Makes sixth start of regular season today and third on the road...Angels have won each of his last three starts.
- <u>LAST TIME OUT:</u> Earned the win Friday at Seattle after holding the Mariners to three runs on seven hits across 5.1 innings...Struck out a season-high nine Mariners batters...His 5.1 IP marked his shortest start of the year.
- Opened the season by pitching exactly six innings in each of his first four starts (ties franchise record).
- VS. OAKLAND: Owns a 7-7 career record and 3.70 ERA (112 IP 46 ER) with 106 strikeouts in 42 career games (13 starts) against the Athletics...His seven victories and 42 appearances against A's are his second most against any opponent (12 wins, 51 games vs. Seattle)...As a starter, is 6-4 with a 3.23 ERA (83.2 IP – 30 ER) and 78 strikeouts.
- AT O.CO COLISEUM: Is 3-3 with a 3.00 ERA (48 IP 16 ER) in 19 career games (six starts) at the Coliseum...As an Angel, is 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA (18 IP - 5 ER) and 14 strikeouts in Oakland.
- Since joining Angels in 2012, has a 5-1 record in day games with a 2.32 ERA (50.1 IP 13 ER) and 32 strikeouts.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Is 58-45 with six complete games, one shutout, 52 saves and a 3.67 ERA (939.2 IP -383 ER) in 364 career appearances, 112 starts).
- Since becoming a full-time starter in 2010, has compiled a 46-25 record with six complete games, one shutout and a 3.40 ERA (659 IP - 249 ER) in 106 starts...46 wins since 2010 rank fourth in A.L. amongst LHP (Sabathia - 59, Price -52, Lester – 47)...106 starts since 2010 are tied for the most in MLB (Hernandez).
