ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of their last six games...however, are now 5-10 over the last 15 games after starting the season 12-4...have spent each of the last 14 days in second place in the American League West, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive days in sole possession of first and 15 consecutive days with at least a share of first...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 14 days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's have drawn 28 walks in their last five games and now have a Major League leading 145 for the season, which is 20 more than any other team...also lead the majors in runs (166) and doubles (71), tied for first in extra base hits (106), ranks second in stolen bases (25), fourth in on-base percentage (.346), tied for fourth in hit by pitches (13), tied for fourth in hits (274) and 11th in slugging (.410)...are seventh in most grounded into double plays (28)...have been shut out three times, which is tied for the American League lead...have hit just 10 home runs over the last 20 games after clubbing 19 over the first 11 contests.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a .224 (57 for 255) opponents batting average the first time they face a batter in a game...have a .316 (79 for 250) average the second time...starters are 8-11 with a 5.57 ERA (83 er in 134 ip) and .292 (159 for 545) opponents batting average over the last 24 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-1 with a 3.45 ERA (12 er in 31.1 ip) and .252 (30 for 119) opponents average in five starts by Bartolo Colón and 4-11 with a 6.61 ERA (71 er in 96.2 ip) and .303 (129 for 426) opponents average by everyone else...are 12-14 with a 4.94 ERA (98 er in 178.2 ip) this season...have the fourth highest ERA in the AL.

MORE PITCHING: The A's have allowed 107 runs this year, 54 of which have come in the fourth and fifth innings (50.5%)...have a 3.48 ERA (36 er in 93.0 ip) over the first three innings, a 7.55 ERA (52 er in 62.0 ip) in innings four and five, and a 3.12 ERA (45 er in 130 ip) from the sixth inning on...have compiled a 4.97 ERA (101 er in 183 ip) over the last 20 games after posting a 2.82 ERA over the first 11 contests...have a 4.20 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...have allowed 13 home runs in the last seven games after allowing four over the previous seven contests.

TIME OF GAME: The A's three-game series with the Angels earlier this week lasted 13 hours and 46 minutes, including an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minute game Monday that lasted 19 innings...it was the longest three-game series in Oakland history by over an hour, topping the 12 hour and 30 minute series here at New York last year from September 21-23...20 of the A's 31 games this year have lasted at least three hours and the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 19 minutes...the highest single season average time of game in Oakland history is 3 hours and 8 minutes in 2000...A's hitters lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.05) while the pitchers rank fourth in pitches per game (151.5).

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 13-3 (.813) against American League West competition compared to 4-11 (.267) against everyone else...the loss to Los Angeles on Wednesday snapped the A's Oakland record tying 13-game intra-division winning streak...also won 13 straight against the West from June 12-August 11, 1994...are batting .282 (165 for 585) with 112 runs and 21 homers in 16 games against the AL West compared to .222 (111 for 500) with 56 runs and 10 homers in 15 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.33 ERA (57 er in 154.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.22 (76 er in 131 ip) against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have embarked on 10-game road trip that features stops in New York (1-1, one game), Cleveland (four games) and Seattle (three games)...this is the A's only trip longer than seven games this year...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 8-6 (.571) on the road...that is the third best road record in the American League...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-3) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 9-8 at home...the A's are batting .275 (136 for 494) with 83 runs scored and 18 home runs in 14 games on the road compared to .234 (138 for 590) with 83 runs scored and 11 home runs in 17 games in Oakland...have the third best road batting average in the AL and the fourth worst home average...A's pitchers have allowed eight homers in 14 games on the road compared to 25 in 17 games in Oakland.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for 29 (.069) with two walks...lead the American League in pinch plate appearances (31) but have the third lowest batting average (Cleveland 0 for 2, Baltimore 0 for 9)...however, have four pinch RBI, which is third most.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's recorded their second consecutive "walk-off" win Monday night and have three for the season...logged a Major League leading 14 walk-off wins last year...each of the A's three walk-off wins have come in extra innings, the A's only extra inning games of 2013...the three extra inning wins are tied with Los Angeles and Detroit for the American League lead...are 3-3 in one-run games and the six one-run decisions are tied for second fewest in the AL to the Yankees (five)...each of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat and the A's are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat.

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 16-12 last month marking just the second time in the last 10 years the A's posted a winning record in April (16-11 in 2008)...now have five consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...set Athletics records for most runs (158), doubles (66), extra base hits (100) and walks (130) in April and had the second highest total in hits (250) and strikeouts (210)...the A's 25 stolen bases were their most in April since 1990 (also 25)...the 66 doubles were one short of the Oakland record for any month (67 in September, 2004)...the 130 walks were the most in any month since September, 2000 (148).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list eight times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Crisp, Nakajima, Rodriguez, Sizemore, Young)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

A's vs. YANKEES

The teams have split the first two games of this series...the A's and Yankees split the season series last year, 5-5...went 4-3 in Oakland and 1-2 in New York...it marked the fifth consecutive year the A's have not won the season series with the Yankees...are 13-33 (.283) against New York since 2008, which is the worst mark by any team with 10 or more games against the Yankees over that span...are 6-15 (.286) at Yankee Stadium, which is the second worst record by a visiting team with at least 15 games at this park...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 227-267 against the Yankees...that includes 124-121 in Oakland and 103-146 in New York...all-time, the A's are 768-1133 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has a streak of 22 consecutive saves, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history.

The A's are 12-4 (.750) with **Yoenis Céspedes** in the starting lineup compared to 5-10 (.333) in games he doesn't start...over the last two years, the A's are 94-50 (.653) with him in the lineup compared to 17-32 (.347) when he doesn't start.

Josh Donaldson is batting .386 (17 for 44) with eight doubles, 13 RBI and 10 walks over his last 12 games.

Brandon Moss is batting .409 (18 for 44) on the road, which is the third highest road batting average in the American League.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1949, Bobby Shantz tosses nine hitless innings of relief in the A's 5-4 win over Detroit...Wally Moses hits a two-run home run in the 13th inning after Shantz allows a run in the top of the inning... in 2000, the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's have won both of his starting assignment this year and are 7-2 (.778) in his starting assignments in his career...tossed six or more innings in four of his seven starts last year, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento last Monday to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento Tuesday and recalled Wednesday when Anderson went on the DL.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed two home runs in his last start and has now surrendered 13 home runs in nine career starts and 50.2 innings (2.31 per nine innings)...the 13 home runs are the most by an Athletics pitcher over the first nine games of his career since at least 1916...10 of the 13 have been solo shots...has surrendered 10 home runs in 24.1 career innings in the Coliseum compared to three in 26.1 innings on the road.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...struck out a career-high 11 batters in a career-high tying 6.2 innings...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the sixth...allowed a leadoff double to Maxwell in the seventh and retired the next two batters before he was relieved by Neshek, who allowed Maxwell to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-8, 19-inning win over Los Angeles last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in the 19th in a 6 hour and 32 minute game, the longest by time in Oakland history.

STRAILY vs. NEW YORK: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with Sacramento...is tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins...has a .159 opponents batting average, including .111 (3 for 27) by left-handed hitters compared to .190 (8 for 42) by right-handers...did not allow a home run in 18.2 innings.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-2 with a 5.82 ERA (21.2 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 7 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in seven games, including six starts, this spring...tied for the team lead in starts...allowed a .333 (31 for 93) opponents batting average...walked one batter or fewer in six of his seven outings...his one relief appearance came on March 25 against Milwaukee.

2012 RECAP: Began the year having never pitched above Single-A but finished the season in the starting rotation in Oakland...led all of Minor League Baseball with a career-high 190 strikeouts...also went 2-1 with a 3.89 ERA in seven starts over two stints with the A's...struck out 32 batters in 39.1 innings, giving him a combined 222 strikeouts in 191.1 innings in the majors and minors (10.44 per nine innings)...was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the A's sixth best prospect following the season...was also listed as having the best slider and changeup in the magazine's Best Tools survey

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .237 opponents batting average, including .215 (20-for-93) against right-handed hitters compared to .271 (16-for-59) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his 11 home runs and issued 13 of his 16 walks to lefties...had a .253 on-base percentage and .387 slugging percentage against right-handers compared to .403 and .644 against lefties...opponents hit .265 with the bases empty compared to .185 with runners on, including .111 with runners in scoring position...held the opponents number three hitter to a .111 (2-for-18) batting average, although both of the hits were home runs.

SPLITS: Went 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA in three starts on the road, 0-1 with a 5.95 ERA at home...allowed eight home runs in 19.2 innings at home...was 2-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts at night compared to 0-1 with a 7.90 ERA in three starts during the day...allowed eight home runs in 13.2 innings during the day...was 2-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-1 with a 7.90 ERA in three starts on four days rest...allowed eight home runs in 13.2 innings when pitching on four days rest

MORE 2012 WITH OAKLAND: Was selected from Sacramento Aug. 3 and made his Major League debut that day against Toronto...allowed just one run on five hits and a walk in 6.0 innings but had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 15-inning win...left with a 4-1 lead but Cook allowed a three-run home run in the ninth for the blown save...combined on a six-hit, 3-0 shutout at Kansas City Aug. 16 for his first ML win...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...was 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA over his first three starts but was optioned to Sacramento Aug. 20 when Brett Anderson was reinstated from the DL...returned Sept. 7 after the injury to McCarthy and went 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA in four starts in September.

MINORS: Was named A's Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Year along with A.J. Griffin after combining for a 9-7 record and a 2.78 ERA in 25 starts with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...his 190 strikeouts are fourth most by a minor leaguer in Oakland history...it was the most since 1971 when Chris Floethe had 225 for Double-A Birmingham and Glenn Abbott had 195 for Single-A Burlington...the record is 231 by Vida Blue at Burlington in 1968...averaged 11.25 strikeouts per nine innings...walked 42 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.52...was named to the *Baseball America* Minor League All-Star team...allowed a .202 opponents batting average, which ranked 11th among full season minor leaguers...that included a .189 (59-for-312) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .219 (51-for-233) against left-handers...opponents hit .202 with runners in scoring position, including .143 with RISP and two outs...went 6-2 with a 1.22 ERA and .151 opponents batting average in 11 starts in June and July.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (1-4, 7.36 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season ... notches first win of the season in his last start to snap his season-opening and career-high four-game losing streak...posted a 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak...is 1-3 with a 9.61 ERA (21 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland compared to 0-1 with a 2.79 ERA (3 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts on the road...pitched 6.0 innings in his last start, a 10-6 win over the Angels April 30...allowed six hits, four runs (three earned), three walks and struck out four in his first victory of the season... is 2-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 14 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances vs. Cleveland, both starts last year.

5-0, 2.96 ERA (106.1 ip, 90 h, 40 r, 35 er, 37 bb, 89 so, 9 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 4/6 (66.6%)

The A's bullpen allowed at least one run in each game on the last homestand for a 4.31 ERA (15 er in 31.1 ip)...the pen now has a 3.34 ERA (24 er in 64.2 ip) at home compared to 2.38 (11 er in 41.2 ip) on the road...has a 2.96 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...the pen is third in the AL in innings pitched (106.1) and tied for second in wins (5)...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...is tied for the fewest save opportunities (6) and tied for the second fewest saves (4)...first batters faced are 15 for 89 (.169) with four walks and a hit by pitch...the .208 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks third...the pen tossed 14.1 innings Monday night...that was the most by A's relievers since 1969 when an Oakland record 15.1 innings were tossed by relievers September 6 against Minnesota.

- Tossed the 10th and 11th innings Monday night against Los Angeles, his first appearance of two or more innings this season.
- With Friday night's one-out save vs. New York, is 4 for 4 in save opportunities and has now converted each of his last 22 save chances dating back to last season...that is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- Has a .222 opponents batting average, including .176 (3 for 17) against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (7 for 28) against right-handers.
- Converted his only save opportunity and did not allow a run in five games against New York last year (6.0 ip, 3 h, 7 so).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.

- Retired the three batters he faced in yesterday's 4-2 loss to the Yankees...struck out two of the three hitters he faced.
- Recorded the win Monday night against Los Angeles after entering the game in the 18th inning.
- Had his first Major League at bat Monday night in the 18th inning and struck out swinging...was the first A's reliever to record an at bat since Grant Balfour June 12, 2012 at Colorado.
- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his first 15 outings, including a season-opening seven-game, 6.1-inning scoreless streak.
- Tied for second in appearances among American League relievers (15), ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.175), and is fourth in innings pitched (17.1).
