### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won two of three at New York over the weekend and have now won five of the last seven games...however, are 6-10 over the last 16 games after starting the season 12-4...have spent each of the last 15 days in second place in the American League West, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive days in sole possession of first and 15 consecutive days with at least a share of first...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 15 days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**OFFENSE:** The A's lead the majors in runs (171), doubles (73), walks (149) and extra base hits (111), rank third in on-base percentage (.344) and stolen bases (25), tied for third in hit by pitches (14), fifth in hits (281) and 10<sup>th</sup> in slugging (.413)...are tied for the seventh most grounded into double plays (28)...have been shut out three times, which is tied for second in the American League...hit four home runs in the three-game series at New York after tallying just nine over the previous 18 games.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have a .212 (56 for 264) opponents batting average the first time they face a batter in a game, which is fourth lowest in the majors...have a .319 (82 for 257) average the second time, which is the highest...starters are 7-12 with a 5.52 ERA (86 er in 140.1 ip) and .289 (163 for 564) opponents batting average over the last 25 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-1 with a 3.45 ERA (12 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts by Bartolo Colón and 5-11 with a 6.11 ERA (74 er in 109.0 ip) by everyone else...are 12-14 with a 4.94 ERA (101 er in 184.0 ip) for the season...have the fourth highest ERA in the American League.

**MORE PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 150 runs this year, 54 of which have come in the fourth and fifth innings (36.0%)...have a 3.47 ERA (37 er in 96.0 ip) over the first three innings, a 7.31 ERA (52 er in 64.0 ip) in innings four and five, and a 3.22 ERA (48 er in 134.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...have compiled a 4.92 ERA (105 er in 192.0 ip) over the last 21 games after posting a 2.82 ERA over the first 11 contests...have a 4.19 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...have allowed 13 home runs in the last eight games after allowing four over the previous seven contests.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Cleveland (four games) and Seattle (three games)...this is the A's only trip longer than seven games this year...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) and are 9-6 (.600) on the road...that is tied with Baltimore (12-8) and Boston (9-6) for the best road record in the American League...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-3) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 9-8 at home...the A's are batting .271 (143 for 528) with 88 runs scored and 21 home runs in 15 games on the road compared to .234 (138 for 590) with 83 runs scored and 11 home runs in 17 games in Oakland...have the third best road batting average in the AL and the third worst home average...A's pitchers have allowed eight home runs in 15 games on the road compared to 25 in 17 games in Oakland.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** The A's are 13-3 (.813) against American League West competition compared to 5-11 (.313) against everyone else...are batting .282 (165 for 585) with 112 runs and 21 home runs in 16 games against the AL West compared to .218 (116 for 533) with 59 runs and 11 home runs in 16 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.33 ERA (57 er in 154.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.14 (80 er in 140.0 ip) against everyone else...the loss to Los Angeles last Wednesday snapped the A's Oakland record tying 13-game intra-division winning streak...also won 13 straight against the West from June 12-August 11, 1994.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 2 for 29 (.069) with two walks...are tied for the American League lead in pinch plate appearances (31) but have the third lowest batting average (Cleveland 0 for 3, Baltimore 0 for 9)...however, have four pinch RBI, which is third most.

**TIME OF GAME:** Of the A's 32 games this year, 21 have lasted at least three hours...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 19 minutes...the highest single season average time of game in Oakland history is 3 hours and 8 minutes in 2000...A's hitters lead the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) while the pitchers rank fourth in pitches per game (151.6)...played an Oakland record 6 hour and 32 minute game a week ago tonight against Los Angeles...the series with the Angels was the longest three-game series in Oakland history (13 hours, 46 minutes).

**WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's recorded their second consecutive "walk-off" win a week ago tonight and have three for the season...logged a Major League leading 14 walk-off wins last year...each of the A's three walk-off wins have come in extra innings, the A's only extra inning games of 2013...the three extra inning wins are tied with Kansas City and Los Angeles for the American League lead...improved to 4-3 in one-run games with the win yesterday and the seven one-run decisions are tied for first fewest in the AL...three of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat and the A's are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat.

**A's IN APRIL:** The A's went 16-12 last month marking just the second time in the last 10 years the A's posted a winning record in April (16-11 in 2008)...now have five consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...set Athletics records for most runs (158), doubles (66), extra base hits (100) and walks (130) in April and had the second highest total in hits (250) and strikeouts (210)...the A's 25 stolen bases were their most in April since 1990 (also 25)...the 66 doubles were one short of the Oakland record for any month (67 in September, 2004)...the 130 walks were the most in any month since September, 2000 (148).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list eight times this year...currently have six players on the DL (Anderson, Crisp, Nakajima, Rodriguez, Sizemore, Young)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

### A's vs. INDIANS

The A's won the season series last year, 8-2...lost the first two games of the season before winning each of the final eight...that is tied for the A's second longest winning streak against the Indians in Oakland history (fourth time, last: July 31, 2002-April 27, 2003)...the record is 10 from July 31, 1971-August 18, 1972...went 4-2 in Oakland last year and swept a four-game series in Cleveland...this is the third consecutive season the A's have made one trip to Cleveland and played a four-game series...the A's have won the season series in three of the previous four years and are 21-12 against the Indians in 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 258-222 against the Indians...that includes 136-98 in Oakland and 122-124 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 893-1015 against the Indians

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Grant Balfour** has a streak of 23 consecutive saves, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...has not blown a save in over a year (April 29, 2012 at Baltimore).

The A's are 13-4 (.765) with **Yoenis Céspedes** in the starting lineup compared to 5-10 (.333) in games he doesn't start...over the last two years, the A's are 95-5 (.655) with him in the lineup compared to 17-32 (.347) when he doesn't start.

**Brandon Moss** is batting .409 (18 for 44) on the road, which is the second highest road batting average in the American League.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1975** Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since August 12, 1979.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...the A's are 2-4 (.333) in his starting assignments this year and 19-16 (.543) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in just two of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer twice.

**FIRST WIN:** Picked up his first win of the season in his last start to snap his season-opening and career-high four-game losing streak...posted a 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak.

**IN APRIL:** Was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12<sup>th</sup> time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for fourth in the American League in losses (4)...his 7.36 ERA is the fifth highest ERA in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...use the same minimum, he has the highest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.434) and the fourth highest batting average (.350).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-3 with a 9.61 ERA (21 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland compared to 0-1 with a 2.79 ERA (3 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .350 opponents batting average includes a .294 (20 for 68) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .4188 (23 for 55) against left-handers...has allowed a .293 (24 for 82) opponents batting average over his first 60 pitches in a game compared to .463 (19 for 41) from the 61<sup>st</sup> pitch on...opponents are 10 for 33 (.303) with runners in scoring position... allowed a .215 average with RISP last year, which ranked fourth lowest in the AL...the leadoff hitter is 9 for 15 (.600) off him and the second hitter in the order is 7 for 13 (.538).

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...Céspedes homered in the first inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Morse in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Morales in the fifth.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles April 9...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...also walked three batters but yielded just two runs...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed RBI singles to Trumbo and Callaspo in the third...was relieved by Resop after loading the bases with one out in the fourth...Resop escaped the jam and the A's scored five times in the seventh for the win.

**THIRD START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit April 14 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...allowed a Hunter RBI double and a Martinez RBI single in the first and a Jackson two-run home run in the second...then allowed a two-run single to Cabrera and a RBI double to Fielder in the fourth before he was relieved by Scribner, who allowed Fielder to score on a Dirks RBI single.

**FOURTH START:** He lost his third consecutive decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Tampa Bay last Saturday...allowed a leadoff home run to Joyce in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in 6.1 innings...blanked the Rays on four hits and two walks over his final 4.1 innings...Hellickson, Peralta and Rodney combined to shutout the A's on three hits and a walk.

**FIFTH START:** He extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 10-2 loss to Baltimore last Thursday...the A's scored twice in the second inning to take a 2-0 lead but he allowed three runs in the third inning on RBI singles by McLouth and Markakis and a RBI double by Jones...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Markakis in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Davis in the sixth...left with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Resop allowed one of those runs to score.

**LAST START:** Picked up his first win of the season in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the third inning on errors by Rosales and Donaldson...the A's scored two times in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run double to Trout in the fifth...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the fifth and four more in the sixth to take the lead for good...walked Aybar to start the seventh and was relieved by Scribner, who allowed the run to score.

**PARKER vs. CLEVELAND:** Is 2-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 14 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts last year...combined with Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win August 19 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and allowed six of the hits...put runners in scoring position in each of the first three innings, allowing four hits and a walk, but stranded all five base runners...also put runners on first and third with two outs in the sixth before retiring each of the final seven batters he faced...also picked up the win in a 12-7 decision at Cleveland August 30...allowed a leadoff home run to Kipnis in the first inning but the A's scored once in the third and five times in the fourth to take the lead for good...also allowed a RBI single to Hannahan in the fourth and a RBI fielders choice by Choo in the fifth...was relieved by Scribner with runners on second and third and no outs in the sixth and he allowed both runners to score.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA (19.1 ip, 25 h, 18 r, 16 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in five games, all starts...also pitched in the A's minor league camp on the A's off day March 6...allowed a .309 (25 for 81) opponents batting average.

**2012 RECAP:** Was one of three players acquired from Arizona in the Trevor Cahill trade during the offseason and went 13-8 with a 3.47 ERA in 29 starts...tied with fellow rookie Tommy Milone for the team lead in wins as they both set an Oakland record for wins by a rookie...the previous mark of 12 was held by Chris Codiroli (1983) and Joe Blanton (2005)...had the most wins by an Athletics rookie since Harry Byrd won 15 games for the 1952 Philadelphia A's en route to Rookie of the Year honors...led the A's with 140 strikeouts, which was the third best mark by a rookie in Oakland history and the fourth best in Athletics history...his 29 starts were 10<sup>th</sup> most by an Oakland rookie.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Tommy Milone (3-3, 3.69 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 2-2 with a 2.63 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 6.17 ERA and .313 opponents batting average in two starts on the road...has walked just six batters over his first six starts, an average of 1.38 per nine innings, which is fourth lowest in the American League...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 10 so)...matched his career high with 10 strikeouts and has not walked a batter in any of his three 10-strikeout games...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks (Hunter, Blue)...is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (11.0 ip, 14 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 11 so) in two career starts against Cleveland, both last year.

**6-0, 2.95 ERA (110.0 ip, 95 h, 41 r, 36 er, 38 bb, 93 so, 9 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 5/8 (62.5%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed at least one run in nine of the past 10 games (17 er in 39.2 ip, 3.86 ERA)...has allowed at least two runs six times over that span...now has a 2.95 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...has a 3.34 ERA (24 er in 64.2 ip) at home compared to 2.38 (12 er in 45.1 ip) on the road...is tied for second in the AL in wins (5) and ranks third in innings pitched (110.0) and opponents on-base percentage (.292)...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 16 for 93 (.172) with four walks and a hit by pitch...the .210 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks fourth.

- Is a perfect 5 for 5 in save opportunities and has now converted each of his last 23 save chances dating back to last season...that is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- His five saves are tied for ninth most in the American League.
- Was 3 for 3 in save chances in four games against Cleveland last year (3.1 ip, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 4 for 4 in save opportunities with a 3.95 ERA in 25 outings in his career against the Indians (27.1 ip, 24 h, 12 r, 12 er, 11 bb, 39 so, 3 hr).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10<sup>th</sup> in saves.
