ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a season-high tying four straight (third time, last: April 24-27) after winning five of the previous seven...are now 6-14 over the last 20 games after starting the season 12-4...are 18-18 for the season...have spent just three days under .500, the first three days of the season...have spent each of the last 19 days in second place in the American League West...trail Texas by four games, which is their largest deficit of the season...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 19 days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (50 for 234) with 17 runs scored over the first seven games of this road trip...however, have scored a Major League leading 179 runs for the season...also lead the majors in doubles (77) and walks (160), rank third in extra base hits (117) and hit by pitches (16) and fourth in on-base percentage (.337)...the A's have been shut out four times this year, which is tied with Houston for the most in the American League...A's pitchers have allowed just seven runs in those four games, including two 1-0 losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-18 with a 4.96 ERA (114 er in 206.2 ip), which is third highest in the American League...are tied for the most losses (18) and most home runs allowed (30) in the AL and have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.277)...are 7-16 with a 5.47 ERA (99 er in 163.0 ip) and .288 (189 for 656) opponents batting average over the last 29 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-2 with a 4.58 ERA (18 er in 35.1 ip) in six starts by Bartolo Colón and 5-14 with a 5.71 ERA (81 er in 127.2 ip) by everyone else.

MORE PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.98 ERA (124 er in 224.0 ip) over the last 25 games (since April 13) and now have a 4.31 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth highest in the American League...have allowed 171 runs this year, 62 of which have come in the fourth and fifth innings (36.3%)...have a 3.75 ERA (45 er in 108.0 ip) over the first three innings, a 7.38 ERA (59 er in 72.0 ip) in innings four and five, and a 3.27 ERA (53 er in 146.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...have a .228 (166 for 728) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have a .301 (92 for 306) average the second time, which is the second highest mark in the AL...have surrendered 22 home runs in the last 12 games after allowing 20 over the first 24 contests.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 13-3 (.813) against American League West competition compared to 5-15 (.250) against everyone else...are batting .282 (165 for 585) with 112 runs and 21 home runs in 16 games against the AL West compared to .215 (143 for 665) with 67 runs and 13 home runs in 20 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.33 ERA (57 er in 154.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.18 (99 er in 172.0 ip) against everyone else...the loss to Los Angeles May 1 snapped the A's Oakland record tying 13-game intra-division winning streak...also won 13 straight against the West from June 12-August 11, 1994.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters were 0 for 2 yesterday afternoon and are now 2 for 34 (.059) with two walks for the season...lead the American League in pinch plate appearances (36) but have the third lowest batting average (Cleveland 0 for 3, Baltimore 0 for 9)...however, have four pinch RBI, which is tied for fourth most.

ON THE BASES: The A's rank third in the American League in stolen bases (25)...opponents have 23 stolen bases, which is tied for third most...with just four caught stealings, the opponents stolen base percentage of 85.2% is tied for second highest in the AL...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-5 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Cleveland (0-4) and Seattle (three games)...this is the A's only trip longer than seven games this year...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) after going 6-0 on the first road trip to Houston (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-0), just the third time in Oakland history the A's went undefeated on a trip of six or more games...are now 9-10 on the road overall...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-3) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 9-8 at home...the A's have hit 23 home runs on the road compared to 11 in Oakland...however, the pitching staff has allowed 25 home runs at home compared to 17 on the road.

TIME OF GAME: The A's played their fastest game of the season Wednesday night, a 2 hour and 26 minute contest, after playing 2 hours and 28 minutes the previous night...however, 23 of the A's 36 games this year have lasted at least three hours and the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 15 minutes...the highest single season average time of game in Oakland history is 3 hours and 8 minutes in 2000...A's hitters rank second in the American League in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) while the pitchers rank sixth in pitches per game (150.0).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have three "walk-off" wins this season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...in the majors, only Cincinnati has more (4)...logged a Major League leading 14 last year...each of the A's three walk-off wins have come in extra innings, the A's only extra inning games of 2013...the three extra inning wins are tied with Kansas City and Los Angeles for the American League lead...are 4-5 in one-run games and the nine one-run decisions are tied for the fourth fewest in the AL...three of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat and the A's are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat.

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 16-12 last month marking just the second time in the last 10 years the A's posted a winning record in April (16-11 in 2008)...now have five consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...set Athletics records for most runs (158), doubles (66), extra base hits (100) and walks (130) in April...the 66 doubles were one short of the Oakland record for any month (67 in September, 2004).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Crisp, Nakajima, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sizemore, Young)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

A's vs. MARINERS

The A's split a season-opening four-game series against the Mariners in Oakland after winning the season series last year, 12-7...went 5-3 in Oakland, 6-3 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...over the previous seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011)...the A's are 73-64 (.533) against Seattle since 2006...all-time, the A's are 306-226 (.575) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 170-97 in Oakland, 135-128 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 23 save opportunities, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.

Daric Barton has appeared in 470 games at first base with the A's...needs one more game to tie Norm Siebern for ninth in A's history.

Brandon Moss ranks fourth in the American League with a .356 (21 for 59) batting average on the road.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1992** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Mike Bordick all homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York...in **1996** Ernie Young hits three home runs in the A's 15-5 win over Minnesota to tie an Oakland record...he adds a single and drives in six runs...Young, Geronimo Berroa and Brent Gates all homered in the fifth inning to tie an Oakland record...in **2007** Dan Johnson is a perfect 4 for 4 with two home runs, four RBI, four runs scored and two walks and Jack Cust also homers twice as the A's hit six home runs to defeat Kansas City, 17-3.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...the A's have won all three of his starting assignments this year and are 8-2 (.800) in his starting assignments in his career...has tossed six or more innings in one of his starts this year, allowed two runs or fewer once and walked two batters or fewer twice.

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed two home runs in three starts this year and has surrendered 13 home runs in 10 career starts and 56.0 innings (2.09 per nine innings)...the 13 home runs match the most by an Athletics pitcher over the first 10 games of his career since at least 1916 (Blake Stein)...10 of the 13 have been solo shots...has surrendered 10 home runs in 24.1 career innings in the Coliseum compared to three in 31.2 innings on the road.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...struck out a career-high 11 batters in a career-high tying 6.2 innings...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the sixth...allowed a leadoff double to Maxwell in the seventh and retired the next two batters before he was relieved by Neshek, who allowed Maxwell to score.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-8, 19-inning win over Los Angeles April 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in the 19th in a 6 hour and 32 minute game, the longest by time in Oakland history.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at New York last Sunday...the A's scored a run in the third, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the third on a Cano RBI single...Oakland then built a 4-1 lead before he was charged with two of the Yankees runs in a three-run sixth inning...was relieved by Blevins with one out and runners on first and second and he allowed both runs to score plus one of his own for the blown save.

STRAILY vs. SEATTLE: Had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 7-4, 10-inning win in Oakland September 29 of last year...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Jaso scored on a Céspedes error...then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Seager home run and a Saunders two-run home run...left after 4.1 innings with the A's trailing 4-1 but Oakland scored once in the eighth, twice in the ninth and three times in the 10th for the win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with Sacramento...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins...has a .159 opponents batting average, including .111 (3 for 27) by left-handed hitters compared to .190 (8 for 42) by right-handers...did not allow a home run in 18.2 innings.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-2 with a 5.82 ERA (21.2 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 7 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in seven games, including six starts, this spring...tied for the team lead in starts...allowed a .333 (31 for 93) opponents batting average...walked one batter or fewer in six of his seven outings...his one relief appearance came on March 25 against Milwaukee.

2012 RECAP: Began the year having never pitched above Single-A but finished the season in the starting rotation in Oakland...led all of Minor League Baseball with a career-high 190 strikeouts...also went 2-1 with a 3.89 ERA in seven starts over two stints with the A's...struck out 32 batters in 39.1 innings, giving him a combined 222 strikeouts in 191.1 innings in the majors and minors (10.44 per nine innings)...was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the A's sixth best prospect following the season...was also listed as having the best slider and changeup in the magazine's Best Tools survey

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .237 opponents batting average, including .215 (20-for-93) against right-handed hitters compared to .271 (16-for-59) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his 11 home runs and issued 13 of his 16 walks to lefties...had a .253 on-base percentage and .387 slugging percentage against right-handers compared to .403 and .644 against lefties...opponents hit .265 with the bases empty compared to .185 with runners on, including .111 with runners in scoring position...held the opponents number three hitter to a .111 (2-for-18) batting average, although both of the hits were home runs.

SPLITS: Went 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA in three starts on the road, 0-1 with a 5.95 ERA at home...allowed eight home runs in 19.2 innings at home...was 2-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts at night compared to 0-1 with a 7.90 ERA in three starts during the day...allowed eight home runs in 13.2 innings during the day...was 2-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-1 with a 7.90 ERA in three starts on four days rest...allowed eight home runs in 13.2 innings when pitching on four days rest

MINORS: Was named A's Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Year along with A.J. Griffin after combining for a 9-7 record and a 2.78 ERA in 25 starts with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Sacramento...his 190 strikeouts are fourth most by a minor leaguer in Oakland history...it was the most since 1971...averaged 11.25 strikeouts per nine innings...walked 42 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.52...was named to the *Baseball America* Minor League All-Star team...allowed a .202 opponents batting average, which ranked 11th among full season minor leaguers...went 6-2 with a 1.22 ERA and .151 opponents batting average in 11 starts in June and July.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (1-5, 7.34 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is tied for third in the American League in losses (5)...his 7.34 ERA is fourth highest in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...is 1-3 with a 9.61 ERA (21 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland compared to 0-2 with a 4.30 ERA (7 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts on the road...picked up his first win of the season April 30 to snap his season-opening and career-high four-game losing streak...is 1-2 with a 5.94 ERA (16.2 ip, 14 h, 11 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against Seattle...including a loss in his only start this year on April 2 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so, 1 hr).

The A's bullpen has a 4.22 ERA (23 er in 49.0 ip) and .249 (47 for 189) opponents batting average over the past 14 games (since April 25)...posted a 2.43 ERA and .208 opponents average in its first 21 games...now has a 3.17 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...has the second lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.291), ranks third in innings pitched (119.1) and is tied for fourth in wins (5)...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 18 for 101 (.178) with four walks and a hit by pitch...the .213 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average is tied for third.

- Has not allowed a run in his past four games and 4.1 innings and has two saves over that span.
- Has not allowed a run in five appearances on the road (4.1 ip)...has a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip) in eight outings at home.
- Has allowed just one run (9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA) in nine appearances with two days rest or fewer...has a 4.50 ERA (2 er in 4.0 ip) in four games on three days rest or more.
- Faced the Mariners for the only time this year on April 2 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 hr)...is 3 for 3 in save opportunities and has a 3.42 ERA against Seattle in 27 appearances in his career (26.1 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 21 so, 3 hr).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
