A's vs. MARINERS

The A's lost the first game of this series in Seattle last night after splitting a season-opening four-game series in Oakland...won the series last year, 12-7...went 5-3 in Oakland, 6-3 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...over the previous seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011)...the A's are 73-65 (.529) against Seattle since 2006...all-time, the A's are 306-227 (.574) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 170-97 in Oakland, 135-129 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 23 save opportunities, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.

Daric Barton appeared in the 471st game of his career at first base last night, tying Norm Siebern for ninth in A's history.

Josh Donaldson is batting .349 (22 for 63) with eight doubles, two home runs, 16 RBI and 13 walks over his last 18 contests.

Pat Neshek has made 197 career appearances and is three way from the 200th of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 Al Simmons drives in a run for the 11th consecutive game as Lefty Grove defeats Chicago, 5-2 en route to a 31-win season...the win moves the A's into first place for good as the Athletics win their third straight American League pennant...in 2012 Brandon Inge drives in four runs for the fourth time in his last five games to become the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the first was Lou Gehrig in 1931.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a season-high five straight after winning five of the previous seven...are 6-15 over the last 21 games after starting the season 12-4...are now 18-19 for the season, the first time the A's have been under the .500 mark since April 3 (1-2)...have spent each of the last 20 days in second place in the American League West...trail Texas by five games, which is their largest deficit of the season...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 20 days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .207 (55 for 266) with 20 runs scored over the first eight games of this road trip...however, have scored a Major League leading 182 runs for the season...also lead the majors in doubles (80) and walks (160), rank third in extra base hits (119) and hit by pitches (16) and fourth in on-base percentage (.333)...the A's have been shut out four times this year, which is tied with Houston and Toronto for the most in the American League...A's pitchers have allowed just seven runs in those four games, including two 1-0 losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-19 with a 5.10 ERA (120 er in 211.2 ip), which is third highest in the American League...have the most losses (19), allowed the second most home runs (33) and have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.277)...are 7-17 with a 5.63 ERA (105 er in 168.0 ip) and .288 (195 for 677) opponents batting average over the last 30 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-2 with a 4.58 ERA (18 er in 35.1 ip) in six starts by Bartolo Colón and 5-15 with a 5.90 ERA (87 er in 132.2 ip) by everyone else.

MORE PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.04 ERA (130 er in 232.0 ip) over the last 26 games (since April 13) and now have a 4.37 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth highest in the American League...have allowed 177 runs this year, 63 of which have come in the fourth and fifth innings (35.6%)...have a 4.05 ERA (50 er in 111.0 ip) over the first three innings, a 7.30 ERA (60 er in 74.0 ip) in innings four and five, and a 3.20 ERA (53 er in 149.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...have a .228 (170 for 745) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have a .299 (94 for 314) average the second time, which is the second highest mark in the AL...have surrendered 23 home runs in the last 13 games after allowing 20 over the first 24 contests.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 13-4 (.765) against American League West competition compared to 5-15 (.250) against everyone else...are batting .276 (170 for 617) with 115 runs and 22 home runs in 17 games against the AL West compared to .215 (143 for 665) with 67 runs and 13 home runs in 20 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.50 ERA (63 er in 162.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.18 (99 er in 172.0 ip) against everyone else...have lost the past two games against West opponents to snap an Oakland record tying 13-game intra-division winning streak...also won 13 straight against the West from June 12-August 11, 1994.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-6 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Cleveland (0-4) and Seattle (0-1)...this is the A's only trip longer than seven games this year...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) after going 6-0 on the first road trip to Houston (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-0)...are now 9-11 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-3) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 9-8 at home...the A's have hit 24 home runs on the road compared to 11 in Oakland...however, the pitching staff has allowed 25 home runs at home compared to 18 on the road.

IN THE PINCH: Adam Rosales struck out as a pinch hitter last night and the A's are now 2 for 35 (.057) with two walks in the pinch for the season...lead the American League in pinch plate appearances (37) but have the third lowest batting average (Cleveland 0 for 3, Baltimore 0 for 9)...however, have four pinch RBI, which is tied for fourth most.

ON THE BASES: The A's rank fourth in the American League in stolen bases (25)...opponents have 24 stolen bases, which is third most...with just four caught stealings, the opponents stolen base percentage of 85.7% ranks second highest in the AL...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second.

TIME OF GAME: The A's played their fastest game of the season Wednesday night, a 2 hour and 26 minute contest, after playing 2 hours and 28 minutes the previous night...however, 23 of the A's 37 games this year have lasted at least three hours and the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes...the highest single season average time of game in Oakland history is 3 hours and 8 minutes in 2000...A's hitters rank second in the American League in pitches per plate appearance (4.03) while the pitchers rank sixth in pitches per game (149.4).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have three "walk-off" wins this season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...in the majors, only Cincinnati has more (4)...logged a Major League leading 14 last year...each of the A's three walk-off wins have come in extra innings, the A's only extra inning games of 2013...the three extra inning wins are tied with Kansas City, Baltimore and Los Angeles for the American League lead...are 4-5 in one-run games and the nine one-run decisions are tied for the fourth fewest in the AL...three of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat and the A's are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat.

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 16-12 last month marking just the second time in the last 10 years the A's posted a winning record in April (16-11 in 2008)...now have five consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...set Athletics records for most runs (158), doubles (66), extra base hits (100) and walks (130) in April...the 66 doubles were one short of the Oakland record for any month (67 in September, 2004).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Crisp, Nakajima, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sizemore, Young)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 2-5 (.286) in his starting assignments this year and 19-17 (.528) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in just two of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two batters or fewer three times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in losses (5)...his 7.34 ERA is fourth highest in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the highest opponents on-base percentage (.429) and slugging percentage (.579) in the majors and the third highest batting average (.345)...is tied for third in the AL in home runs allowed (8).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .345 opponents batting average includes a .292 (21 for 72) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .397 (29 for 73) against left-handers...opponents are batting .375 (27 for 72) with six of his eight home runs with the bases empty compared to .263 (10 for 38) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .295 (28 for 95) opponents batting average over his first 60 pitches in a game compared to .440 (22 for 50) from the 61st pitch on...the first three hitters in the batting order are hitting a combined .490 (25 for 51) off him.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 9.61 ERA (21 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland compared to 0-2 with a 4.30 ERA (7 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

FIRST WIN: Picked up his first win of the season April 30 to snap his season-opening and career-high four-game losing streak...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak.

IN APRIL: Was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...Céspedes homered in the first inning to give the A's a 1-0 lead but he allowed a three-run home run to Morse in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Morales in the fifth.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles April 9...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...also walked three batters but yielded just two runs...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed RBI singles to Trumbo and Callaspo in the third...was relieved by Resop after loading the bases with one out in the fourth...Resop escaped the jam and the A's scored five times in the seventh for the win.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit April 14 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...allowed a Hunter RBI double and a Martinez RBI single in the first and a Jackson two-run home run in the second...then allowed a two-run single to Cabrera and a RBI double to Fielder in the fourth before he was relieved by Scribner, who allowed Fielder to score on a Dirks RBI single.

FOURTH START: He lost his third consecutive decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Tampa Bay last Saturday...allowed a leadoff home run to Joyce in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in 6.1 innings...blanked the Rays on four hits and two walks over his final 4.1 innings...Hellickson, Peralta and Rodney combined to shutout the A's on three hits and a walk.

FIFTH START: He extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 10-2 loss to Baltimore last Thursday...the A's scored twice in the second inning to take a 2-0 lead but he allowed three runs in the third inning on RBI singles by McLouth and Markakis and a RBI double by Jones...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Markakis in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Davis in the sixth...left with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Resop allowed one of those runs to score.

SIXTH START: Picked up his first win of the season in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles April 30 in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the third inning on errors by Rosales and Donaldson...the A's scored two times in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run double to Trout in the fifth...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the fifth and four more in the sixth to take the lead for good...walked Aybar to start the seventh and was relieved by Scribner, who allowed the run to score.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Cleveland last Monday...surrendered a career-high four home runs...had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two...all four home runs were solo shots...Kipnis and Cabrera had back-to-back home runs in the first and Cabrera and Reynolds went deep in the fifth.

PARKER vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-2 with a 5.94 ERA (16.2 ip, 14 h, 11 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in three career starts...including a loss in his only start this year (see first start above)...went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two starts last year...the win came in his first start, a 2-1 A's victory at Seattle June 27...struck out a career-high nine batters...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Jaso with one out in the bottom of the second inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...then took the loss in a 7-1 decision in Oakland July 7...allowed an unearned run in the first and the A's tied the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run double to Ryan in the second and a solo home run to Wells in the fourth...was also charged with two of the Mariners runs in a three-run fifth inning.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA (19.1 ip, 25 h, 18 r, 16 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in five games, all starts...also pitched in the A's minor league camp on the A's off day March 6...allowed a .309 (25 for 81) opponents batting average.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (3-4, 3.13 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 0-4 with a 2.63 ERA (8 er in 27.1 ip) over his last four starts, which is the longest losing streak of his career...has a .245 (26 for 106) opponents batting average during the streak and has issued just two walks while striking out 26...has walked six batters over his first seven starts and 46.0 innings for an average of 1.17 per nine innings, which ranks second in the American League...has 41 strikeouts for a strikeout to walk ratio of 6.83, which is third best...is 2-2 with a 2.63 ERA (8 er in 27.1 ip) and .236 (25 for 106) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA (8 er in 18.2 ip) and .274 (20 for 73) opponents average in three starts on the road...is 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (37.2 ip, 38 h, 11 r, 11 er, 4 bb, 36 so, 4 hr) in six career starts against Seattle...is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts at Safeco Field and 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland.

The A's bullpen has a 3.98 ERA (23 er in 52.0 ip) and .242 (48 for 198) opponents batting average over the past 15 games (since April 25)...posted a 2.43 ERA and .208 opponents average in its first 21 games...now has a 3.09 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...has the second lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.288), ranks third in innings pitched (122.1) and is tied for fifth in wins (5)...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 18 for 103 (.175) with four walks and a hit by pitch...the .209 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks third.

- Is a perfect 5 for 5 in save opportunities and has now converted each of his last 23 save chances dating back to last season...that is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- Has not allowed a run in his past four games and 4.1 innings and has two saves over that span.
- Has not allowed a run in five appearances on the road (4.1 ip)...has a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip) in eight outings at home.
- Has allowed just one run in nine appearances (9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA) with two days rest or fewer...has a 4.50 ERA (2 er in 4.0 ip) in four games on three days rest or more.
- Faced the Mariners for the only time this year on April 2 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 hr)...is 3 for 3 in save opportunities and has a 3.42 ERA against Seattle in 27 appearances in his career (26.1 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 21 so, 3 hr).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
