ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Halted a season-high five-game losing streak with last night's 4-3 win...however, are 7-15 over the last 22 games after starting the season 12-4...prior to last night's win, had sunk to 18-19, the first time the A's had been under the .500 mark since April 3 (1-2)...have spent each of the last 21 days in second place in the American League West...trail Texas by five games, which is their largest deficit of the season...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 21 days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .207 (62 for 299) with 24 runs scored over the first nine games of this road trip...however, have scored a Major League leading 186 runs for the season...also lead the majors in walks (162), rank third in doubles (80), extra base hits (124) and hit by pitches (16), and are seventh in on-base percentage (.332)...the A's have been shut out four times this year, which is tied with Houston and Toronto for the most in the American League...A's pitchers have allowed just seven runs in those four games, including two 1-0 losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-19 with a 5.08 ERA (123 er in 218 ip), which is third highest in the AL...have the most losses (19), allowed the second most home runs (34) and have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.274)...are 8-17 with a 5.58 ERA (108 er in 174.1 ip) and .284 (198 for 697) opponents batting average over the last 31 games (since April 9)...that includes 2-2 with a 4.58 ERA (18 er in 35.1 ip) in six starts by Bartolo Colón and 6-15 with a 5.83 ERA (90 er in 139 ip) by everyone else.

MORE PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.97 ERA (133 er in 241.0 ip) over the last 27 games (since April 13) and now have a 4.33 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth highest in the American League...have allowed 180 runs this year, 65 of which have come in the fourth and fifth innings (36.1%)...have a 3.95 ERA (50 er in 114.0 ip) over the first three innings, a 7.34 ERA (62 er in 76.0 ip) in innings four and five, and a 3.20 ERA (54 er in 152.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...have a .227 (174 for 765) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have a .297 (95 for 320) average the second time, which is the third highest mark in the AL...have surrendered 24 home runs in the last 14 games after allowing 20 over the first 24 contests.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 14-4 (.778) against American League West competition compared to 5-15 (.250) against everyone else...are batting .274 (178 for 650) with 119 runs and 25 home runs in 18 games against the AL West compared to .215 (143 for 665) with 67 runs and 13 home runs in 20 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.47 ERA (66 er in 171.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.18 (99 er in 172.0 ip) against everyone else...prior to last night, had lost two straight games vs. West opponents to snap an Oakland record tying 13-game intra-division winning streak (also 13 straight June 12-Aug. 11, 1994).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-6 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-1), Cleveland (0-4) and Seattle (1-1)...this is the A's only trip longer than seven games this year...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) and Boston (1-2) after going 6-0 on the first road trip to Houston (3-0) and Los Angeles (3-0)...are now 10-11 on the road for the season...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-3) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 9-8 at home...the A's have hit 27 home runs on the road compared to 11 in Oakland...however, the pitching staff has allowed 25 home runs at home compared to 19 on the road.

IN THE PINCH: Adam Rosales struck out as a pinch hitter Friday night and the A's are now 2 for 35 (.057) with two walks in the pinch for the season...lead the American League in pinch plate appearances (37) but have the second lowest batting average (Baltimore, 0 for 10)...however, have four pinch RBI, which is tied for fourth most.

ON THE BASES: The A's are tied for fourth in the American League in stolen bases (25)...opponents have 24 stolen bases, which is third most...with just four caught stealings, the opponents stolen base percentage of 85.7% ranks second highest in the AL...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for third.

TIME OF GAME: The A's played their fastest game of the season Wednesday night, a 2 hour and 26 minute contest, after playing 2 hours and 28 minutes the previous night...however, 24 of the A's 38 games this year have lasted at least three hours and the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes...the highest single season average time of game in Oakland history is 3 hours and 8 minutes in 2000...A's hitters rank second in the American League in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) while the pitchers rank seventh in pitches per game (149.5).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have three "walk-off" wins this season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...in the majors, only Cincinnati has more (4)...logged a Major League leading 14 last year...each of the A's three walk-off wins have come in extra innings, the A's only extra inning games of 2013...the three extra inning wins are tied with Kansas City, Baltimore and Los Angeles for the American League lead...are 5-5 in one-run games and the 10 one-run decisions are tied for the fourth fewest in the AL...three of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat and the A's are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat.

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 16-12 last month marking just the second time in the last 10 years the A's posted a winning record in April (16-11 in 2008)...now have five consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...set Athletics records for most runs (158), doubles (66), extra base hits (100) and walks (130) in April...the 66 doubles were one short of the Oakland record for any month (67 in September, 2004).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Crisp, Nakajima, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sizemore, Young)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.

A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have split the first two games of this series in Seattle after dividing a season-opening four-game series in Oakland...won the series last year, 12-7...went 5-3 in Oakland, 6-3 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...over the previous seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011)...the A's are 74-65 (.532) against Seattle since 2006...all-time, the A's are 307-227 (.575) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .576)...are 170-97 in Oakland, 136-129 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

With two more home runs, the A's will reach the 7,000-homer milestone in Oakland history. They currently stand at 6,998.

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 24 save opportunities, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.

Josh Donaldson is batting .358 (24 for 67) with eight doubles, three home runs, 17 RBI and 13 walks over his last 19 contests.

Pat Neshek has made 197 career appearances and is three way from the 200th of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1910**, Chief Bender tosses a no-hitter in the A's 4-0 win over Cleveland...the future Hall of Famer walks just one and finishes the season 23-5, one of two career 20-win seasons...in **1915**, catcher Wally Schang sets an American League record by throwing out six attempted base stealers..... in **2000**, Matt Stairs hits his fifth career walk-off home run as the A's erase a five-run deficit to defeat Seattle 9-7..

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 3-4 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and 23-15 (.605) in his career...his teams are 28-15 (.651) in his 43 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in six of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4

with a 2.63 ERA (8 er in 27.1 ip) over his last four starts, which is the longest losing streak of his career...has a .245 (26 for 106) opponents batting average during the streak and has issued just two walks while striking out 26...has received no run support in two of the four starts and has three runs of support total during his four losses...has received just 15 runs of support in his 14 losses in two seasons with the A's (85.2 ip, 1.58 RSA)...has received no support eight times over the last two years and one run of support five times...the A's have been shutout four times this year, twice in games started by Milone.

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in each of his last two starts and three for the season...has walked six batters over his first seven starts and 46.0 innings for an average of 1.17 per nine innings, which ranks second in the American League...has 41 strikeouts for a strikeout to walk ratio of 6.83, which is third best...did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts May 1 against Los Angeles...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks (Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue)...last year, he walked just 36 batters in 190.0 innings, an average of 1.71 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...it was the fifth lowest mark in Oakland history...had a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.81, which ranked seventh in the AL...it was the fourth best mark in Athletics history.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 2.63 ERA (8 er in 27.1 ip) and .236 (25 for 106) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA (8 er in 18.2 ip) and .274 (20 for 73) opponents average in three starts on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 9-6 with a 2.71 ERA (38 er in 126.0 ip) and .239 (114 for 477) opponents average in 19 starts in Oakland compared to 7-8 with a 4.66 ERA (57 er in 110.0 ip) and .309 (138 for 447) opponents average in 19 starts on the road...has allowed 19 of his 30 home runs with the A's on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .268 (30 for 112) with the bases empty compared to .163 (7 for 43) with runners in scoring position...has the seventh lowest opponents average with RISP in the American League...has allowed six home runs, all to right-handed hitters and all solo shots...has yielded a .326 (15 for 46) average and three home runs to batters leading off an inning...allowed a .319 batting average and 10 of his 24 home runs to hitters leading off an inning last year.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Won each of his first three starts this year, going 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA, .260 opponents batting average...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to last year...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...allowed a home run to Gutierrez to start the game and Morse added a solo home run two outs later...did not allow a run over his final six innings...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced and 17 of the final 18.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-5 win at Los Angeles April 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a Hamilton sacrifice fly in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more in the third before he allowed another run in the third...had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Callaspo in the fifth.

THIRD START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-2 win over Houston April 15 in Oakland...the A's scored six times in the first inning and he retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced before allowing a RBI single to Pena in the fourth...also allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the seventh.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Tampa Bay April 21...allowed three runs in the first inning but only one was earned following a Reddick error...allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the second but then retired 15 of the next 18 batters he faced...allowed a RBI double to Roberts in the seventh and left with a runner on third and two outs...Neshek allowed the inherited runner to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Baltimore April 26 in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first five innings before allowing an unearned run in the seventh...Hardy singled and went to second on a Reddick error before scoring on a Pearce single...Chen and Johnson combined to shutout the A's on three hits.

SIXTH START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles May 1 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced, with the lone exception being a two-out solo home run by Kendrick in the second...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Shuck in the fifth and a pair of solo home runs to Trout and Trumbo in the sixth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss at Cleveland on Tuesday...tossed seven innings and allowed just one unearned run in the fifth inning...Santana reached base on a Moss error to start the inning and advanced to second on an error by Sogard...after Raburn grounded out, Aviles singled him to third before Gomes had a sacrifice fly to drive him in...McAllister, Hill and Perez combined to shutout the A's on six hits and a walk.

MILONE vs. SEATTLE: Is 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (37.2 ip, 38 h, 11 r, 11 er, 4 bb, 36 so, 4 hr) in six career starts...is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts at Safeco Field and 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year (see first start above)...was 2-1 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts last year...the loss came in his first outing, a 4-0 decision at Seattle April 14...faced just one batter over the minimum over the first five innings but that was a solo home run by Montero in the second inning...then combined with Grant Balfour and Ryan Cook on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Seattle June 25...tossed seven innings and allowed all seven of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 4-1, 11-inning win July 6 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Seager in the first inning but then shutout the Mariners on three hits and a walk over his final six innings...his second win came in the A's 4-2 win at Seattle September 9...matched his career high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 win over Seattle September 30 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the second inning on RBI singles by Seager and Smook.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (3-3, 3.83 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and are 16-6 (.727) when he starts in his career...has gone 1-3 with a 5.11 ERA in his last four starts after opening the season with a 2-0 mark and 2.25 ERA in his first three starts...was tagged with a hard-luck 4-3 loss at Cleveland Wednesday in his last start (6.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 2 hr) when Adam Rosales' apparent game-tying home run with two outs in the ninth was ruled a double after a lengthy video tape replay...will make his third career appearance vs. Texas, having posted a 0-0 record and 4.50 ERA in two previous starts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-0, 3.02 ERA (125 ip, 107 h, 47 r, 42 er, 44 bb, 109 so, 10 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 6/9 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen has a 3.79 ERA (23 er in 54.2 ip) and .248 (52 for 210) opponents batting average over the past 16 games (since April 25)...posted a 2.43 ERA and .208 opponents average in its first 21 games...now has a 3.02 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the second lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.292), ranks third in innings pitched (125) and is tied for fifth in wins (5)...is one of two AL bullpens without a loss (Cleveland)...first batters faced are 20 for 106 (.189) with four walks and a hit by pitch...the .221 on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks fifth.

- Is a perfect 6 for 6 in save opportunities and has now converted each of his last 24 save chances dating back to last season...that is the third longest streak in Oakland history...his last blown save came on April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- Has not allowed a run in his past five games and 5.1 innings and has three saves over that span.
- Has not allowed a run in six appearances on the road (5.1 ip)...has a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip) in eight outings at home.
- Has allowed just one run in nine appearances (9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA) with two days rest or fewer...has a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in four games on three days rest or more.
- Has faced the Mariners twice this year (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 hr)...is 4 for 4 in save opportunities and has a 3.29 ERA against Seattle in 28 appearances in his career (27.1 ip, 23 h, 11 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 23 so, 3 hr).
- Had arthroscopic surgery Feb. 14 to perform a lateral meniscectomy of his right knee and did not pitch in a Cactus League game until March 21.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
