WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 3-game series in Oakland tonight, the final stop on this 9-game, 10-day roadtrip...Texas is 4-2 on the trip to Wrigley Field (loss in makeup game), Milwaukee (1-1), and Houston (3-0)...club has won 4 straight games since losing at Miller Park on Tuesday, matching its longest winning streak of the season, 4/19-22...the Rangers have not had a longer winning streak since 5 victories in a row, 6/26/30/12...Texas has won 7 of 9, 15 of 22 and 17 of 26, the longer span beginning 4/13...at 24-13 (.649), the Rangers have the best record in the majors...it matches 1996 and 1998 for the best mark in team history after 37 games...Texas is a season best 11 games over .500...longest losing streak of the season has been 2 games 3 times as the Rangers and the Yankees are majors' only teams who have not lost more than 2 straight.

BEST IN THE MAJORS: The Rangers have outright possesion of the best record in the majors for the 1st time this season...club was tied for the best mark on April 5 at 3-1 and May 5 at 20-11...it is the 1st time Texas has held that distinction since a 7-day run from June 28-July 4, 2012.

<u>A GOOD RUN:</u> Since the start of the 2010 season, the Rangers have the 2nd best winning percentage in the major leagues at .579 (303-220), trailing only the New York Yankees at .594 (310-212).

ON TOP: Rangers have been in sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 22 straight days...club has gained 3.5 games in the standings the last 5 days with its season high **6.0-game lead over Oakland the largest among the 6 ML division leaders**...it is also Texas' biggest advantage since a 6.0-game lead on 8/25/12...club had a 6.5 game lead as early as April 30 after 23 games in 2012, the only other time the club has had as bigger advantage this early in a season...the Rangers have 24 days alone in first place in 2013 with 26 days overall with at least a share of the division lead...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has been in first place in the West for 488 of the last 524 days in the regular season, including being on top for 202 of 224 days since the start of 2012.

--Texas' biggest lead at any point in 2012 was 6.5 games, last on August 12...the Rangers have not had a bigger lead at any point in a season since they won the A.L. Westr by 10.0 games in 2011.

VERSUS OAKLAND: The Rangers conclude this roadtrip with 3 games with the A's...it is the 1st meeting of the year between the teams after Texas has already played 2 series each against the Angels, Astros, and Mariners...Rangers will play 6 of their next 10 with the A's...Texas was 8-11 vs. the A's in 2012, losing the final 3 games of the year at the Oakland Coliseum to give Oakland the A.L. West crown by 1.0 game...Texas has dropped 5 of the last 6 overall beginning 9/25/12 and is 39-37 vs. Oakland since the start of 2009...the Rangers hold a 315-303 advantage in the all-time series. --At the Oakland Coliseum: Texas was just 2-7 here in Oakland a year ago, their fewest wins in that ballpark since 2003 (1-8)...the Rangers have lost 4 in a row here since winning on 7/17/12 and are 17-22 here beginning in 2009...the A's hold a 163-146 lifetime edge in the series in Oakland.

SERIES SWEEPS: The Rangers' 3 wins in Houston over the weekend marked the 3rd time that Texas has won all games in a series in 2013, the others April 19-21 vs. SEA and May 3-5 vs. BOS, both 3-0...the Houston games marked the 1st time that Texas has swept a series of any length on the road since it went 3-0 at SD, June 18-20, 2012...overall, the Rangers are 7-2-4 in 13 series in 2013, the losses being to White Sox at home, April 30-May 2 (1-2) and one-game makeup series at Wrigley Field on May 6.

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers' current 4-game winning streak is the team's most consecutive wins away from home since 4 victories in a row, June 10-20, 2012...last longer streak was 7 straight, 4/13-21/12...at 13-9 (.591), the Rangers have the 4th best road winning percentage in the A.L.

<u>7-UP BUT TWO WINS:</u> The Rangers allowed 7 runs in each of the final 2 games of the Astros series, winning both games...it is the 1st time the club has issued 7+ runs in back-to-back games since 3 games in a row, 9/26-28/12...it is also the 1st time club has won consecutive contests when allowing 7+ runs since August 1 (10) and 2 (9), 2012 vs. LAA...Texas has posted a 5.37 ERA (31 ER/52.0 IP) in the 1st 6 games of the trip to raise its season ERA from 3.02 to 3.39, still the 2nd lowest figure in the majors to St. Louis (3.03) but highest since April 2 (3.71)...team ERA after 37 games in 2012 was 3.24.

CONVERSIONS: The Rangers have converted all 12 of their save opportunities n 2013, the best starts for any major league club since 2002, when Pittsburgh converted its 1st 15 save tries before a blown save (Stats, Inc.)... it is the Rangers' best start since 1998 (15-15).

---Robbie Ross, Tanner Scheppers and Joe Nathan have combined for a 0.94 ERA (5 ER/48.0 IP) in their 45 total appearances to date in 2013... Scheppers (0.50) has the lowest ERA among A.L. qualifying relievers and Ross (0.56) is tied with Seattle's Tom Wilhelmsen for 2nd...Nathan has converted all 11 save tries, his 2nd best start ever in a season behind 2008, when he started 13-for-13 in save conversions...Nathan's next save will be his 310th, tying Rich Gossage for 19th all-time...the rest of the Texas bullpen has a composite 5.73 (35 ER/55.0 IP) ERA.

ROOKIE HURLERS: Nick Tepesch (3), Justin Grimm (2), and Joseph Ortiz (2) have combined to win 7 games, the most wins by rookies of any A.L. team and tied with St. Louis for the 2nd most in the majors, one less than Milwaukee...Rangers rookies won 25 games n 2012, 16 by Yu Darvish.

HERE COME THE BATS: The Rangers scored 12 runs on Sunday, the club's most since 8/22/12 vs. BAL (12) and the 4th time in double figures in 2013...the 17 hits on Sunday were one shy of season high (5/3 vs. BOS)... Texas is 49-for-151 (.325) with 11 HR the last 4 games and is hitting .287 (205-714) with 103 runs scored over the last 20 games to improve from .245 to .3rd, 4th highest in the A.L. and best since April 11 (.271)...the Rangers have homered 3 times in each of the last 3 games, the team's longest string of games with 3+ long balls since 3 in a row, 5/25/27/12.

BELTRE-BUSTING: Adrian Beltre owns both 4-hit games by a Ranger in 2013, T2nd in A.L. after his 4-for-5 performance on Sunday...Beltre also posted club season highs with 3 EBH and 8 TB and tied best with 4 RBI... he has a 4-game hitting streak (8-18) with 6 RBI and is hitting .372 (16-43) with 12 RBI in last 10 games to go from .214 to season high .260...he connected for his 354th career HR on Sunday, tying Luis Gonzalez and Lee May for 82nd all-time.

LEURY GARCIA became the 1st Ranger to score 4 runs in a game on Sunday since Ian Kinsler on 8/2/12 at LAA...he also had 3 hits after entering the game with 3 career ML hits, and drove in his 1st ML run...Garcia is the 1st Rangers rookie with 3+ hits and 4+ runs in a game since David Murphy (5 R/5 H) and Jarrod Saltalamaccia (5 R/4 H) both accomplished the feat in the 30-3 win at Balitmore on 8/22/07...Sunday was Garcia's 4th ML start as the last ML player to score 5+ runs in a game in his 1st 4 ML starts was the Mets Mike Jacobs (5 runs) in his 3rd ML start on 8/24/05 at ARI (Elias).

<u>VERSUS THE A.L. WEST:</u> Texas is 14-5 (.737) vs. the A.L. West in 2013 winning 8 of the last 9 games...it matches Oakland's record vs. A.L. West for the best winning pct. of any A.L. club vs. one division (min. 8 games).

THE LAST TIME WE MET: The Rangers and A's meet for the 1st time since the final day of the 2012 regular season on Oct. 3 here at the Colise-um... it was just the 3rd time since the start of divisional play in 1969 that 2 clubs went head-to-head to decide a division title (winner-take-all) on the final day of the regular season: the other, Oct. 3, 1982, Milwaukee wins at Baltimore, 10-2 for A.L. East Crown; Sept. 29, 1996, San Diego wins at Los Angeles, 2-0 in 11 innings for N.L. West crown...this does not include tiebreaker games played at end of regular season...the A's were 12-5 winners to take the A.L. West title and put the Rangers in the wild card game... tonight's starter A.J. Griffin also started that game but had no decision, allowing 5 runs (4 ER) in 2.2 innings.

SHORTS: Sunday was the 12th time Texas pitching has recorded 10+ strikeouts in 2013, 4th most among A.L. teams...Nelson Cruz had played in the Rangers' last 137 games over 2 seasons before sitting out on Sunday.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#51 Justin Grimm, RHP (2-2, 3.45)

TONIGHT: The 24-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 6th start of the year in tomorrow's series opener in Oakland...will be starting on extended 5 days' rest after suffering his second straight loss on Tuesday in Milwaukee...has dropped 2 straight following a 2-game win streak...among ML rookies with at least 5 starts, has 4th-lowest ERA, tied for 5th-most wins, and 2nd-lowest 6th-best opp. avg. (.261)...has 29 strikeouts over 24.2 innings in his last 4 outings...named American League Rookie of the Month for April after going 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER/17.0 IP) and 15 strikeouts in 3 starts...made his season debut with Round Rock (AAA) in their second game on April 5 vs. Omaha...spent his first big league camp with Texas this spring... is the first Rangers draft pick to win a start in his major league debut for Texas since 1993 after defeating the Astros at Rangers Ballpark on June 16, 2012 jumped from Double-A to the majors last season in just his second professional campaign...just 2 years removed from the University of Georgia, Grimm was rated by Baseball America as the club's top right-handed starter and 5th-best prospect overall entering 2013.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Among ML rookies with at least 5 starts, has 4th-lowest ERA, tied for 5th-most wins, and 2nd-lowest 6th-best opp. avg. (.261)

LAST START: Suffered his second straight loss on Tuesday in Milwaukee (5.0 IP, 8 H, 5 R-ER, 3 BB, 7 SO, 1 HR, 99 pitches/65 strikes)...permitted all 5 runs in the first inning... allowed 6 base runners, but no runs over the next 4.0 innings...whiffed Aramis Ramirez with the bases loaded to end the 4th inning.

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> Has made just one relief appearance against the Athletics, allowing a run on 4 hits over 3.0 innings of relief in a 9-3 Texas loss on Sept. 26, 2012 in Arlington.

ON THE ROAD: Is 1-1 with a 4.95 ERA (11 ER/20.0 IP) in 5 road games/3 starts in his career...is 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA (7 ER/16.0 IP) in 3 road starts this season, his only 3 career road starts...also allowed 4 ER over 4.0 IP in 2 relief appearances on road in 2012...owns a .275 opp. average (22-80) on the road with just 2 HR and 4 doubles.

2013: Holding opponents to .182 (6-33) with RISP, incl. 15 strikeouts...opposition hitting .220 (13-59) with runners on base...batters hitting .356 (16-45) with no outs, .200(14-70) with one or 2 outs...first time through order: .350 (14-40), 2nd: .150 (6-40), 3rd: .313 (10-32)...has retired just 13 of 29 leadoff hitters (.448 opp. OBP leading off inning)

APRIL HONORS: Grimm was named the American League Rookie of the Month for April after going 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER/17.0 IP) and 15 strikeouts in 3 starts...he is just the 4th Ranger to win the A.L.'s monthly rookie award since it was first instituted in 2003, joining Gerald Laird (April 2004), Neftali Feliz (September 2010), and Yu Darvish (April 2012)...this is the second straight April for a Texas rookie pitcher to win April honors.

OTHER STARTS: Was originally summoned to the club on April 11 to start the series opener in Seattle after Matt Harrison was scratched with lower back stiffness...lasted just 4.0 IP in season debut on 4/11 at SEA...earned his 2nd career victory on 4/21 vs. SEA (6.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R-1 ER, 1 BB, 9 SO,)...set career high with 9 strikeouts, most by a homegrown Rangers rookie (drafted by club) since Derek Holland had 10 on 7/30/09vs. SEA...first batter of the game reached on an error and scored the first run of the game on a double...retired 12 of the next 15 batters he faced after the double, including 6 via strikeout...recorded 2nd consecutive win on 4/26 at MIN (7.0 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 4 SO)...since Tommy Hunter tossed 7.2 SHO IP on 8/12/09 at CLE, the only Texas rookie besides Grimm with a scoreless outing of 7.0-or-more innings is Yu Darvish (4/24/12 vs. NYY; 8/28/12 vs. TB)...only other rookie in Texas history with a start of 7.0+ IP, no runs, no walks, and 5-hits-or-fewer was Matt Harrison on 8/16/08 vs. TB (8.0 SHO IP, 3 H, 0 BB, 8 SO)...escaped a 2nd-and-3rd, 2-out jam in the first inning, but did not allow multiple baserunners in any of his final 6 frames...exited with a 3-0 lead and Rangers held on for a 4-3 victory despite Oswaldo Arcia's 3-R HR off Joe Nathan with 2 outs in the 9th...took first loss of '13 despite quality start and matching a career best with 9 strikeouts on May 2 vs. CWS.

ROUND ROCK: Grimm made his season debut with Round Rock (AAA) in their second game on April 5 vs. Omaha (5.2 IP, 4 H, 1 R-1 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 89 pitches/58 strikes)... lone run scored on a double play with no outs and runners on the corners in the 2nd... was pulled after allowing a 2-out double in the 6th, his only extra-base hit allowed.

SPRING TRAINING: Went 0-2 with a 9.64 (10 ER/9.1 IP) in 4 spring games/one start... also allowed 5 ER in 0.2 IP in an intrasquad game...allowed only one run over 5.0 IP in his final 2 outings (9 runs in 4.1 IP in first 2)...optioned to Round Rock on March 22.

2012: Grimm appeared in 5 games/2 starts across 2 stints with Texas and spent the balance of the season with Triple-A Round Rock and Double-A Frisco...had his contract purchased from Double-A Frisco on June 16 to start vs. Houston...posted a quality start in

his ML debut with no walks and 7 K's, 3rd pitcher since 2000 to do that in a major league debut, first A.L. pitcher since NYY's Rich Beck on 9/14/65 at WSH...whiffed 5 straight from 1st-3rd innings, first Ranger ever to strike out 5 consecutive batters in a ML debut... became 13th Ranger to win a start in his ML debut, joining Yu Darvish as Rangers to do it in 2012...the first Rangers draft pick to win his ML debut in a start for Texas since Steve Dreyer on 8/8/93 vs. Seattle...optioned to Frisco on July 7...recalled on Sept. 1 and made 2 relief appearances during the month, allowing 2 runs over 4.0 innings...in the minors last year, combined to go 11-6 with a 2.81 ERA (42 ER/134.2 IP) and 103 strike-outs against 30 walks over 25 games/22 starts at the minor league level...was 10-6 with a 2.94 ERA (41 ER/125.1 IP) as a starter and 1-0 with a 0.96 ERA (1 ER/9.1 IP) in relief.

ROUND ROCK: Promoted to the Express on July 12 and joined the Round Rock rotation...Pacific Coast League batters hit .273 (53-194)...went 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (8 ER/28.0 IP) over his first 5 games/4 starts...went at least 4.0 innings with one run allowed in 3 of his first 4 outings...was 1-3 with a 7.04 ERA (18 ER/23.0 IP) over last 4 starts with the Express.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — LHP DEREK HOLLAND (3-2, 2.54 in 7 games/starts)

The 26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 8th start/appearance of the season tomorrow in Oakland...issued 10 hits but just one run in 7.0 innings in his victory on Wed. at MIL...it marked just the 11th time in team history that a Texas starter has issued 10+ hits and allowed one or fewer runs in at least 7.0 innings of work...the last Ranger to win a game when allowing at least 10 hits and no more than one run was Robinson Tejeda on 9/26/06 at LAA...Holland has worked 7.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs in 5 of 7 starts, T3rd-most such starts behind Clay Buchholz (7) and Matt Harvey (6)...ranks among A.L. leaders in ERA (10th), opp. OBP (8th, .259), WHIP (8th, 1.01), opp. avg.
