The A's won the first meeting of 2013 last night and now have a five-game winning streak against the Rangers in Oakland...that is the A's longest Coliseum winning streak against Texas since an eight-game streak from June 17, 2003-April 6, 2004...won the season series last year, 11-8...it was just the A's second season series win over the previous seven years...are 63-71 (.470) against the Rangers since 2006...went 7-2 in Oakland last year and 4-6 in Texas...are 304-315 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 164-146 Oakland and 140-169 in Texas...have an all-time record of 401-397 ag Rangers/Senators. against the

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games after losing a season-high five consecutive games from May 6-10...are now 8-16 (.333) over the last 24 games (since April 19) after starting the season 12-4 (.750)...had the second best record in the majors through games of April 18 but are tied with the Mets (7-14) for the second worst record since April 19 (Houston, 6-18)...are in second place in the American League West for the 23rd consecutive day and trail Texas by five games...were also five games back of the Rangers after 40 games last year with an identical 20-20 record (lost game 41, remained five back)...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 23 days in second, three days tied for second, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 15-5 (.750) against American League West competition compared to 5-15 (.250) against the Central and East ... have the best intra-division record in the majors ... are batting .267 (191 for 715) with 125 runs and 27 home runs in 20 games against the AL West compared to .215 (143 for 665) with 67 runs and 13 home runs in 20 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.49 ERA (73 er in 188.0 ip) against the West compared to 5.18 (99 er in 172.0 ip) against everyone else.

APRIL AND MAY: The A's are batting .215 (85 for 396) with 34 runs scored in 12 games in May (2.83 runs per game) after hitting .253 with 158 runs scored in 28 games in April (5.64 per game)...have just one stolen base this month after stealing 25 bases in April...the A's are 4-8 in May after going 16-12 in April...have posted a losing record in May in four of the previous five seasons...this April was the A's fifth consecutive month with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in walks (167) and top the American League in hit by pitches (17)...also rank second in the AL in runs (192), doubles (84) and strikeouts (320) and third in extra base hits (130)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.242)...have been shut out four times, which is tied for the most in the AL...A's pitchers have allowed just seven runs in those four shutouts, including two 1-0 losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-20 with a 5.05 ERA (129 er in 230.0 ip), which is fifth highest in the American League...are tied for the most losses (20) and have allowed the second most home runs (36)...have a .227 (75 for 331) opponents batting average the first time they face a batter in a game, which is seventh lowest in the majors, compared to .304 (97 for 319) the second time, which is third highest...are 2-6 with a 5.48 ERA (28 er in 46.0 ip) and 12 home runs allowed over the last eight games and 5-16 with a 5.59 ERA (84 er in 135.1 ip) over the last 24 contests.

MORE PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.28 ERA (48 er in 101.0 ip) in May after posting a 4.31 ERA in April...have a 4.30 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the American League...have allowed 187 runs this year, 67 of which have come in the fourth and fifth innings (35.8%)...have a 4.05 ERA (54 er in 120.0 ip) over the first three innings, a 7.09 ERA (63 er in 80.0 ip) in innings four and five, and a 3.09 ERA (55 er in 160.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...have surrendered 27 home runs in the last 16 games after allowing 20 over the first 24 contests...opponents have 25 stolen bases, which is tied for third most in the AL...opponents have been successful in 25 of 30 (83.3%) of their steal attempts against the A's, which is tied for the third highest mark in the AL...have three pickoffs, which is tied for third.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Texas (1-0) and Kansas City (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-3) and Los Angeles (2-1) and are 10-8 in Oakland...went 3-7 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Cleveland (0-4) and Seattle (1-2) and have now lost 12 of the last 16 road games after going 6-0 on the first trip...are 10-12 on the road...the A's have hit 27 home runs in 22 games on the road compared to 13 in 18 games in Oakland...however, the pitching staff has allowed 26 home runs at home compared to 21 on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for 36 (.056) with two walks...lead the American League in pinch plate appearances (38) but have the second lowest batting average (Baltimore, 0 for 10)...however, have four pinch RBI, which is tied for fourth most.

TIME OF GAME: Five of the A's last seven games have been played in under 2 hours, 45 minutes...that stretch includes the three quickest games of the season (2:26 last night and last Wednesday and 2:28 a week ago tonight)...however, 22 of the A's first 33 games lasted at least 3 hours...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 12 minutes...the highest single season average time of game in Oakland history is 3 hours and 8 minutes in 2000...A's hitters rank second in the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.02) while the pitchers rank seventh in pitches per game (148.7)

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have three "walk-off" wins this season, which is tied for the American League lead...logged a Major League leading 14 last year...each of the A's three walk-off wins have come in extra innings, the A's only extra inning games of 2013...the three extra inning wins are tied for the AL lead...are 5-5 in one-run games and the 10 one-run decisions are tied for third fewest in the AL...three of the A's one-run wins have come in the last at bat and the A's are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat.

SCHEDULE NOTES: With Toronto and San Francisco facing each other tonight, the A's are one of four teams without an interleague game (Boston, Houston, St. Louis)...Houston will play its first game against the National League May 17 and the A's, Red Sox and Cardinals have their first interleague contest May 27.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have seven players on the DL (Anderson, Crisp, Nakajima, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sizemore, Young)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.



FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments this year and 19-12 (.613) over the last two years...his teams are 216-166 (.565) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in five of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked one batter or fewer all seven times.

FIRST FOUR, LAST THREE: Went 3-0

with a 2.42 ERA, .235 opponents batting average and two home runs allowed in 26.0 innings over his first four starts...is 0-2 with an 8.22 ERA (14 er in 15.1 ip), .354 (23 for 65) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in 15.1 innings over his last three starts.

DON'T WALK: Has walked just one batter over his first seven starts and 41.1 innings...leads the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (0.24) and highest strikeout-to-walk ratio (27.00)...his streak of seven consecutive starts with one walk or fewer and two innings or more to start the season is the longest by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916...is averaging the third fewest pitches per inning in the American League (14.3)...walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, his first walk of the season...that snapped a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed .236 (26 for 110) batting average with the bases empty compared to .377 (20 for 53) with runners on...including .333 (9 for 27) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .238 (15 for 63) average the first time through the lineup, .310 (31 for 100) after that...five of the six home runs he allowed have been to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 57 home runs over his last four seasons, 44 of which have been hit by lefties...five of the six home runs he has allowed have been on the

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) and .247 (19 for 77) opponents batting average in three starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 6.33 ERA (15 er in 21.1 ip) and .314 (27 for 86) opponents average in four starts during the day...in two seasons with the A's, is 11-5 with a 2.85 ERA (39 er in 123.1 ip) in 19 starts at night compared to 2-6 with a 5.12 ERA (40 er in 70.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day

RUN SUPPORT: Has not received any run support in his last two starts after getting at least three runs of support in each of his first five starts...his season run support average of 6.97 (32 rs in 41.1 ip) is seventh highest in the American League.

NOT WILD: Does not have a wild pitch over his first seven starts...did not issue a wild pitch last year and his 152.1 innings were fourth most in Oakland history among pitchers with no wild pitches...has not had a wild pitch in each of his last 63 games and 378.0 innings...his last wild pitch was May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL).

ACTIVE LEADERS: Is tied for third among active pitchers in complete games (33), tied for sixth in shutouts (10), ranks seventh in wins (174), strikeouts (1860) and games started (382) and eighth in innings pitched (2434.2).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 174 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (382), innings pitched (2434.2) and strikeouts (1860).

2013 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 6-3 A's win at Houston April 6...retired 11 of the first 12 batters...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Castro in the fourth innings...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 12inning win over Detroit April 12...allowed all three of his runs in the third inning on a three-run home run by Fielder...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win over Houston April 17 in Oakland ... allowed a run in the first inning when Altuve singled, went to third on a Castro single, and scored on a Carter fielders choice...the A's came back with six runs in the bottom of the first and he retired 15 of the 17 hitters he faced over his final five innings...tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 seven-inning win at Boston April 23...walked one and struck out seven...it was his 10th career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...at the age of 39 years, 334 days, he became the second oldest pitcher in Oakland history to pitch a shutout (Don Sutton is the oldest, as he was 40 years, 85 days on June 6, 1985 when he blanked Chicago 10-0)...the seven-inning shutout was third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8, 10-inning win against Baltimore *April 28* in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on one hit over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 15.0 innings...then allowed four runs in the fourth inning and another in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss at New York May 4...allowed lead-off home runs to Stewart in the third and Overbay in the fifth...also allowed a RBI single by Hafner with one out in the sixth...Hughes shutout the A's on four hits over the first eight innings.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 9-2 decision at Cleveland last Thursday...allowed a two-run home run to Kipnis in the first and three more runs in the second on a Gomes RBI double, a Stubbs RBI single and a Kipnis sacrifice fly...also allowed a leadoff home run to Swisher in the third...was relieved by Scribner after allowing six runs on eight hits in 4.0 innings

COLÓN vs. TEXAS: Is 18-7 with a 3.66 ERA (191.2 ip, 161 h, 83 r, 78 er, 52 bb, 166 so, 26 hr) in 29 career appearances, all starts...the 18 wins are his most against any team...the only pitchers with more wins against the Texas Rangers are Bert Blyleven, Dennis Leonard and Jack Morris, all with 19...is 13-2 with a 3.12 ERA (37 er in 106.2 ip) over his last 16 starts against Texas after going 5-5 with a 4.34 ERA over his first 13 starts...is 7-3 with a 4.47 ERA (43 in 86.2 ip) in 13 starts at Rangers Ballpark and 11-4 with a 3.00 ERA (35 er in 105.0 ip) in 16 starts in his home ballparks...including 1-1 with a 2.40 ERA (4 er in 15.0 ip) in two starts in the Coliseum...was 1-1 with a 2.40 ERA (15.0 ip, 13 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year, both in Oakland...the win was on June 6 when combined with Brian Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 victory...tossed eight innings and allowed all five of the hits...the Rangers biggest threat came in the second inning when he loaded the bases with one out...then got Moreland to ground into an inning ending double play...then took the loss in a 6-1 decision in Oakland July 17...retired the first eight batters before allowing a run in the third inning on an Andrus RBI single...surrendered three runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Beltre and RBI singles by Napoli and Gentry...Oswalt and four Rangers relievers limited the A's to a run on five hits.

RHP Dan Straily (1-1, 7.06 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 1 when Anderson went on the DL for his third stint with the A's this year...is 0-1 with a 7.84 ERA in two starts since his return...has allowed a .206 batting average the first time through the lineup, .242 the second time and .389 the third time...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss at Seattle last Friday (5.0 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against the Rangers, a 5-4 A's loss at Texas last year on September 24 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with Sacramento.

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...is 0-1 with a 7.84 ERA (9 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts since then.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed three home runs in four starts this year and has surrendered 14 home runs in 11 career starts and 61.0 innings (2.07 per nine innings)...the 14 home runs are the most by an Athletics pitcher over the first 11 games of his career since at least 1916 (previous, 13 by Vida Blue and Blake Stein)...no one has more than 13 over their first 12 starts...10 of the 14 home runs have been solo shots...has surrendered 10 home runs in 24.1 career innings in the Coliseum compared to four in 36.2 innings on the road.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...struck out a careerhigh 11 batters in a career-high tying 6.2 innings...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the sixth...allowed a leadoff double to Maxwell in the seventh and retired the next two batters before he was relieved by Neshek, who allowed Maxwell to score.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-8, 19-inning win over Los Angeles April 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in the 19th in a 6 hour and 32 minute game, the longest by time in Oakland history.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at New York May 5...the A's scored a run in the third, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the third on a Cano RBI single...Oakland then built a 4-1 lead before he was charged with two of the Yankees runs in a three-run sixth inning...was relieved by Blevins with one out and runners on first and second and he allowed both runs to score plus one of his own for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Seattle last Friday...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Morse and a RBI double to Smoak in the first inning...then allowed a three-run home run to Ibanez in the third and a RBI double to Morales in the fifth.

STRAILY vs. TEXAS: Had a no decision in his only career start, a 5-4 A's loss at Texas last year on September 24...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a Moreland RBI single in the bottom of the second...was leading 3-1 when he allowed a solo home run to Hamilton in the fifth...left with a 4-2 lead, two outs and the bases empty in the seventh innings...Blevins walked Hamilton and Neshek allowed a two-run home run to Beltre for the blown save.

• Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

ADAM ROSALES

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up
 going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by
 a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).
- Drew his first two walks of the season April 30 against Los Angeles, snapping a 28-game streak without a walk...his last walk prior to that was August 4, 2012.
- Started in the leadoff spot for the first time in his career May 3 at New York and hit Sabathia's first pitch of the game for his first career leadoff home run

SCOTT SIZEMORE

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

SETH SMITH

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.

CHRIS YOUNG

- Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.
- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).
- His sixth inning double April 11 at Los Angeles was the 200th of his career.
- Had his 11th career regular season multi-homer game April 24 at Boston (also has one in the postseason).
