A GOOD RUN: Since the start of the 2010 season, the Rangers have the 2nd best winning percentage in the major leagues at .578 (303-221), trailing only the New York Yankees at .594 (311-213).

ON TOP: Rangers have been in sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 23 straight days...club lost ground in the standings on Monday (6.0 to 5.0 GA) for the 1st time since May 2 (2.0 to 1.5 GB)...current **5.0-game lead over Oakland the largest among the 6 ML division leaders**...Texas' largest advantage was 6.0 games on 5/12...club had 6.5 game lead as early as April 30 after 23 games in 2012, the only other time the club has had an advantage of as many as 5.0 games this early in a season...the Rangers have 25 days alone in first place in 2013 with 27 days overall with at least a share of the division lead...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has been in first place in the West for 489 of the last 525 days in the regular season, including being on top for 203 of 225 days since the start of 2012.

VERSUS OAKLAND: Texas lost the season opener vs. the A's on Monday and has dropped the last 4 meetings overall, all in Oakland, since a win on 9/27/12 at Arlington...it is Texas' longest losing streak vs. Oakland since 4 consecutive defeats, 5/31-8/9/09...last longest losing streak was 7 straight losses, 7/17-9/10/05...Texas has dropped 6 of the last 7 overall beginning 9/25/12 and is 39-38 vs. Oakland since the start of 2009...the Rangers hold a 315-304 advantage in the all-time series.

--At the Oakland Coliseum: The Rangers have lost 5 in a row here since winning on 7/17/12, the team's longest losing streak in this ballpark since 8 straight defeats, 6/17/03-4/6/04...club has dropped 9 of 11 here beginning 9/22/11 and is 17-23 at the Coliseum beginning in 2009...the A's hold a 163-147 lifetime edge in the series in Oakland.

Scheppers (0.50) has the lowest ERA among A.L. qualifying relievers and Ross (0.56) is tied with Seattle's Tom Wilhelmsen for 2nd...Nathan has converted all 11 save tries, his 2nd best start ever in a season behind 2008, when he started 13-for-13 in save conversions...Nathan's next save will be his 310th, tying Rich Gossage for 19th all-time...the rest of the Texas bullpen has a composite 5.43 (35 ER/58.0 IP) ERA.
