ON TOP: Rangers have been in sole possession of first place in the A.L. West for 24 straight days...win on Tuesday gave Texas a 6.0 game lead over Oakland, matching the largest of the year (5/12)...it the biggest advantage among the 6 ML division leaders...club had 6.5 game lead as early as April 30 after 23 games in 2012, the only other time the club has had an advantage of as many as 6.0 games this early in a season...the Rangers have 26 days alone in first place in 2013 with 28 days overall with at least a share of the division lead...beginning June 8, 2010, Texas has been in first place in the West for 490 of the last 526 days in the regular season, including being on top for 204 of 226 days since the start of 2012. ---Texas' biggest lead at any point in 2012 was 6.5 games, last on August

---Texas' biggest lead at any point in 2012 was 6.5 games, last on August 12...the Rangers have not had a bigger lead at any point in a season since they won the A.L. West by 10.0 games in 2011.

<u>VERSUS OAKLAND:</u> Texas snapped a 4-game losing streak against the A's last night, winning for the 1st time since 9/27/12 at Arlington...the Rangers have dropped 6 of the last 8 in the series beginning 9/25/12 and are 39-39 vs. Oakland since the start of 2009...the Rangers hold a 316-304 advantage in the all-time series.

--At the Coliseum: The Rangers ended a span of 5 straight defeats at O.co Coliseum last night with their 1st victory since 7/17/12...club has dropped 9 of 12 here beginning 9/22/11 and is 18-23 at the Coliseum beginning in 2009...the A's hold a 163-148 lifetime edge in the series in Oakland.

--Next Meeting: The Rangers and A's will play again next week with a 3-game series in Arlington, May 20-22.

ON THE ROAD: Today will be the Rangers' 25th road game of the season, the most in the major leagues...club's only losing road was the one-game makeup at Wrigley Field which opened this trip...at 14-10 (.583), the Rangers have the 3rd best road winning percentage in the A.L. behind the Yankees at .632 (12-7) and the Orioles at .609 (14-9).

CLOSE AND LATE: Tuesday's 10-inning victory was the Rangers 1st extra inning win since 9/8/12 at TB (10 inn.)...club had dropped last 2, including one in 2013...Texas had been 0-14 when trailing after 7.0 innings before coming back on Tuesday, its 12th overall come from behind victory of 2013...club is 5-2 in games decided in the 7th or later and won for the 4th time in its final at bat, 2nd on the road.

--Texas is 9-2 in games decided by one run, winning its last 5 such games since a loss at LAA on April 23...Rangers are 2nd in A.L. in one-run wins, one less than CLE and .818 winning percentage is tops in the league.

VERSUS THE A.L. WEST: Texas is 15-6 (.714) vs. the A.L. West in 2013 winning 9 of the last 11 games...that matches the most wins for any major league team vs. one division in 2013 with A's vs. the A.L. West (15-6) and the Giants against the N.L. West (15-6).

RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD: The Rangers are 3-1 in the 3rd and deciding game of a series in 2013, winning both such contests on the road, 4/3 at HOU and 4/24 at LAA...in 2012, Texas was 17-7 in rubber games of 3-game series, winning 13 of the last 15

<u>CONVERSIONS:</u> The Rangers have converted all 13 of their save opportunities n 2013, the best starts for any major league club since 2002, when Pittsburgh converted its 1st 15 save tries before a blown save (Stats, Inc.)... it is the Rangers' best start since 1998 (15-15).

---Robbie Ross, Tanner Scheppers and Joe Nathan have combined for a 1.05 ERA (6 ER/51.2 IP) in their 48 total appearances to date in 2013... Scheppers (0.45) is tied for the lowest ERA among ML qualifying relievers and Ross (0.54) is 4th...Nathan has converted all 12 save tries, his 2nd best start ever in a season behind 2008, when he started 13-for-13 in save conversions...His save on Tuesday as the 310th of his career, tying Hall of Famer Rich Gossage for 19th all-time, one behind Tom Henke...the rest of the Texas bullpen has a composite 5.37 (35 ER/58.2 IP) ERA.

--Scheppers is tied with Toronto's Steve Delabar and Baltimore's Tommy Hunter for the A.L. lead with 3 relief wins...Texas relievers own 3 of the Rangers' last 6 wins and are 8-1 on the season.

THE LONG BALL: The Rangers have 13 homers in the last 5 games, going deep 3 times each in 4 of those contests, and are tied with Atlanta for the major league lead with 52 homers...18 of the team's 31 runs in the last 5 games have come via a home run...the Rangers have homered at least once in 7 straight games (16 HR), one shy of season high (April 16-24).. Adrian Beltre, Nelson Cruz, and Mitch Moreland all have 9 HR, tying Texas with Toronto for the most players with 9+ homers in the major leagues.

HOMERS IN EXTRA FRAMES: When Beltre and Moreland homered in the 10th inning on Tuesday, it marked just the 2nd time in team history that the Rangers have had multiple HR in an extra frame...Chris Davis and David Murphy both went deep in the 12th inning on June 25, 2009 at Arizona in a 9-8 Texas win (Stats, Inc.)...Beltre now has 5 career HR in extra innings and Moreland has 2.

MORE ON MORELAND: Mitch had the Rangers' 1st multi-homer game of 2013 on Tuesday, 1st for a Ranger since Mike Napoli on 9/30/12 vs. LAA (2)...it was his 5th career 2 HR game, 1st since 5/17/12 vs. OAK and 3rd career vs. the A's...Moreland has homered in back to back games (3 total HR) with 6 HR in last 9 contests...he leads the majors in HR (6) and slugging (.796) in May... overall he is T5th in A.L. in HR (9), is 6th in slugging (.578), and is T8th in EBH (19).

HOMESTAND: The Rangers open a 7-game homestand on Thursday that includes 4 games with Detroit and 3 games the A's...Texas won 7 of 10 vs. the Tigers last season, its most wins in the series since 1998 (8-3)... the Rangers won the final 2 and 4 of the last 5 meetings...Texas was 4-2 in 2 series in Arlington, winning the final 2 meetings...beginning tomorrow, Texas will play 12 of its next 17 games in Arlington through June 2...Texas has the majors' best home winning percentage at .733 (11-4).

RANGERS SIGN RICHMOND: The Rangers have signed RHP Scott Richmond to a minor league contract and assigned him to extended spring... Richmond, 33, is 9-14, 5.27 in 36 games/29 starts with Toronto in 2008-09 and 2011-12...he appeared in 3 games with the Blue Jays in 2012 while spending most of the year at Las Vegas (AAA)...spent the 1st part of 2013 with the Lotte Giants in the Korean Professional League.

SHORTS: Texas is 5-6 in day games, winning the last 2...Nelson Cruz was the 1st Ranger with 2 sac flies in a game last night since Adrian Beltre on 8/8/12 at BOS...last night's game time of 3:43 represented Texas' longest game by time this season...Robbie Ross allowed his 1st inherited runner of year to score Tues. after stranding 1st 15 of season....with Eleno Ornelas doing the OKC Thunder playoff game, Jose Guzman will do the play-by-play with analyst Benji Gil for today's Rangers-A's game on ESPN Deportes

TODAY: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to start the finale of this 3-game series and 9-game road trip today, career start no. 39...has quality starts in 3 of last 4 (4 QS overall in '13), allowing 3-ER-or-less in 7 of 8 starts...is 1-1, 2.92 (8 ER/24.2 IP) last 4 starts to drop season ERA from 3.32 to 3.09...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest after taking no decision in Rangers' 4-2 win on Fri. at HOU...has one win in his last 6 starts after 2-0 start...2.89 run support average is lowest in A.L...has received just 14 runs of support in 43.2 IP, one run or fewer in 4 of 8 starts...since fanning career-high 10 batters in first start of season at Houston, has struck out 5-or-fewer in 6 straight outings...will be making just his 9th start since 2011 after working almost exclusively out of the bullpen in 2012 (58 G/1 GS)...was named to the A.L. All-Star team in 2011, his only other year as a starter...among pitchers in Rangers history with at least 250.0 innings, Ogando is in the top 6 in opponent on-base percentage (3rd, .286), WHIP (3rd, 1.13), ERA (3rd, 3.12), opponent OPS (3rd, .638), opponent batting average (3rd, .225), opponent slugging (5th, .352), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6th, 2.82).

LAST START: Took no decision in Rangers' 4-2 win on Friday at Houston (5.2 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 4 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 102 pitches/67 strikes)...the 102 pitches were a season high, and his 4 BB matched career high (other 7/29/11 at TOR)...gave up solo HR to Trevor Crowe in the 2nd and other run scored on wild pitch in the 3rd...exited with 2 outs in 6th with game tied 2-2 after allowing single to Marwin Gonzalez, which brought up the top of the order...trio of Robbie Ross/Tanner Scheppers/Joe Nathan retired final 10 straight to end the game, with solo HR by Jeff Baker (7th) and David Murphy (9th) providing the final margin.

VS. OAKLAND: Will be his 2nd career start vs. A's, first start at the Coliseum...appeared in 8 of team's 9 games in Oakland in 2012, including season finale on Oct. 3, when he was charged with all 4 Oakland runs (0.1 IP, 4 R-2 ER) in 8th inning of a 12-5 loss that clinched A.L. West title for A's...permitted solo HR to Derek Norris in that game...career vs. OAK: 0-1, 3.79 (8 ER/19.0 IP) in 15 games/one start...career at Coliseum: 0-0, 5.14 (4 ER/7.0 IP) in 8 relief outings...only career start vs. A's was 9/10/11 in Arlington (L, 5.0 IP, 6 H, 5 R-3 ER), an 8-7 Texas loss that ended Rangers' 9-game win streak vs. Oakland...in that game, Ogando's last 2 runs allowed scored on a Scott Sizemore pinch grand slam off Yoshinori Tateyama in the 6th.

ON THE ROAD: Has made 6 of 8 starts away from Arlington this season, going 1-2 with a 3.62 ERA (13 ER/32.1 IP)...his 6 road starts are tied for the major league lead entering today...is winless in his last 5 road starts (0-2), compiling a 4.50 ERA (13 ER/26.0 IP) during that stretch...is 6-5, 3.28 (40 ER/109.2 IP) in 19 career road starts... has allowed 2 ER or fewer in 13 of 19 career road starts...has allowed just 10 total HR in those road starts, 3 of which came in start 4/17/11 at NYY...was 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (12 ER/32.0 IP) in 30 games/one start on the road last season

OTHER STARTS: Started club's 3rd game on 4/3 at HOU, recording a career-best 10 strikeouts over 6.1 SHO IP in victory...earned his 2nd straight win to open the season on 4/8 vs. TB (5.1 IP, 1 R-ER)...took no decision on 4/13 at SEA despite 6th straight start allowing one-run-or-less...had scoreless streak in regular season starts end at 18.1 IP when Evan Longoria scored on an error in the 2nd...had retired 10 of his last 11 batters before a one-out single and walk in the 6th, giving way to Joseph Ortiz... suffered first loss 4/18 at CHC (2.1 IP, 5 R-ER)...faced 14 batters, allowing 6 hits and 2 walks...gave up 2-run HR to Anthony Rizzo and solo shot to Alfonso Soriano (backto-back)...took a no decision in Rangers' 5-4, 11-inning walk-off loss on 4/23 at LAA despite pitching his longest outing of the season (7.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R-2 ER)...charged with 2 unearned runs in the 1st after Moreland could not corral a throw by Pierzynski on strikeout of Mike Trout...took loss in Rangers' 5-0 defeat 4/28 at MIN, posting his 2nd consecutive quality start and receiving no runs of support for the 2nd time in 3 outings... earned 3rd victory in 5-1 win 5/4 vs. BOS (6.0 IP, 1 R-ER)...allowed a baserunner in 6 of 7 innings he pitched, but Sox were 1-for-9 with runners on base.

AS A STARTER: Has gone 16-10, 3.41 (81 ER/213.2 IP) in 38 career starts (29 in 2011, one in 2012, 8 in 2013)...the 3.41 ERA as a starter is 4th-lowest in club history among pitchers with at least 35 starts...has held opposition to a .232 average as a starter, 4th-lowest in club history to Hall of Famer Nolan Ryan (.197), teammate Yu Darvish (.209), and Hall of Famer Bert Blyleven (.228)...reeled off 18.1-inning scoreless streak over a span of 5 regular season starts from 9/15/11 to 4/8/13 vs. TB...lone start last year was spot effort on June 10 at SF, filling in for disabled Derek Holland (retired all 9 batters faced)...combined with 3 relievers on a 3-hit shutout of the Giants...sustained a groin injury while attempting to beat out a bunt in the 4th inning and was forced to exit the game, resulting in a one-month stay on the disabled list.

RIGHT STUFF: Has held opposing right-handed batters to a .205 (116-565) average in his career, 13th-lowest among active major league pitchers (min. 500 AB's by RHB)... righties are hitting .273 (21-77) against him this season, highest in his career by more than 75 points, with at least 2 hits by RHB in each game...his .179 (24-134) opp. avg. by right-handers in 2012 was 3rd-lowest in the A.L. and 6th-lowest in the majors (140+ PA's against)...it was the 8th-lowest figure in club history...right-handed batters started the '12 season 0-for-28 against Ogando before a bunt single by the Angels' Peter Bourios on May 12.
