#### Royals vs. A's

Tonight is the first of 6 between these clubs this year, with KC here thru Sunday and then the Athletics hit Kauffman Stadium on July 5-7...the Royals were 5-4 against the A's last year, going 1-2 here during the season's first week and 4-2 at home... Kansas City trails all-time by a 248-300 mark, 109-165 here under a plethora of different ballpark names.

SEVEN-RUN FRAME ICES SERIES WIN--The Royals opened this 3-city journey by taking two of three from the Angels, winning a 9-5 decision in Wednesday's finale...Kansas City employed its biggest inning of the still young year, plating 7 runs in the third to jump out to an 8-0 advantage in support of starter and winner Wade Davis...the big blow in the frame was a bases clearing double by Lorenzo Cain, as he matched his single-game RBI high with one swing of the bat...Davis worked 5.1 innings allowing 4 runs on 9 hits with 3 walks and a pair of strikeouts...the final score was not indicative of how tight the game could've gotten on a couple of occasions, with the Halos loading the bases in the fourth, but Davis coaxed a double play ball from Erick Aybar to close the inning...L.A. then filled the bags again in the sixth with Royals' nemesis Albert Pujols at the plate, but reliever Aaron Crow got Pujols to ground out and end the threat...Cain finished the night 2-for-5, while Alex Gordon had 3 hits, and Salvador Perez and Elliot Johnson each contributed a pair of knocks.

ROSTER MOVE -- The Royals have placed outfielder Jarrod Dyson on the 15-day disabled list with a right ankle sprain and recalled outfielder David Lough from Omaha (AAA)...Dyson injured the ankle while scaling the centerfield fence in the eighth inning on Wednesday night in an attempt to pull back Mike Trout's home run...Lough, 27, is currently 11th in the PCL in hitting with a .340 mark in 36 games (52-for-153) with 29 runs scored, 6 doubles, 3 triples, 3 homers and 17 RBI...he had a 5-game hitting streak snapped on Tuesday, but hit .440 (11-for-25) during that streak...Lough appeared in 20 games for KC last year.

COUNTRY BREAKFAST LIFTS B.A. IN "BIGA" -- Billy Butler used a 3-day stop near the Land of Disney to raise his season batting average a full 40 points, upping his mark from .228 to .268 with an 8-for-13 (.615) stay in the "Big A" as the Royals took 2 of 3 from the Angels...the trip began with his second career 5-hit effort on Monday night, followed by a pair of hits in Tuesday's loss and then a single and pair of RBI in Wednesday's win.

STARTERS SHOULDERING THE LOAD -- Though Wade Davis only made it through 5.1 innings on Wednesday in Anaheim, the Kansas City starters have worked at least 6.0 innings in 28 of the 37 games played to this point...a year ago, KC starters did get through 6.0 innings in 28 assignments until June 19 in the 66th game...the Royals have also had 13 starts of at least 7.0 innings, a number that was not reached in 2012 until July 20 in game #92...KC has had 7 games this year with the starter working at least 8.0 innings, a number the starters didn't attain last year until September 9 in the 140th game and finished last year with eight contests of 8.0 or more frames...conversely, this has allowed the bullpen to go from the second most used in the Majors last year to the least used this year with 96.2 innings, just ahead of St. Louis (98.1).

FEW FREEBIES BY STAFF--Kansas City has given up the second fewest number of walks in the Maiors this year with 97, trailing only Minnesota's 88...KC's total is way down over 37 games from the 139 allowed thru the same number of games a year ago (143 over 38 games)...the Royals had a 4.19 walks to 9-inning ratio last year, while this season's stands at 2.65...KC finished with the third most walks issued in the A.L. last year with 542 in 1,451.1 innings for a walks to 9-inning ratio of 3.36, also third highest.

JAMES SHIELDS is making his ninth start of 2013, entering at 2-3 with a 2.48 ERA over 58.0 innings (16 ER)...tonight is his 227th career Major League appearance (226th start) and 13th career start against Oakland...he was acquired as the centerpiece of a 7-player deal with the Rays on December 9, 2012.

TOUGH LOSS VS. YANKEES -- James pitched well at home on Saturday against New York, but Vernon Wells' 2-run homer in the fifth was the deciding blow in a 3-2 game...Shields worked 8.0 innings for the third time in his last 4 starts, allowing 3 runs (2 earned) on 6 hits and 2 walks...an unearned run in the third snapped his scoreless stretch at 16.0 innings

STRONG NUMBERS IN DEFEATS -- Shields has produced quality starts in each of his 3 losses, limiting opponents to a .195 average and a 2.35 ERA (6 ER in 23.0 IP)... KC dropped each contest by a lone run, with a 1-0 loss on Opening Day at Chicago and 3-2 games on April 13 vs. Toronto and again last Saturday vs. New York

James' 2013 Starts

AS A "DEVIL" RAY--James made his big league debut as a member of the then

"Devil Rays" on May 31, 2006... Shields posted double-digit wins from 2007 to 2012, leaving as the franchise's all-time leader in victories (87), starts (217), innings pitched (1,452.2) and strikeouts (1,250)...he won the first postseason game in Rays history (Game 1 of the 2008 ALDS vs. Chicago) and later earned the club's lone World Series victory (Game 2 in 2008 vs. Philadelphia).

VS. OAKLAND--James enters at 5-3 with a 4.08 ERA over 12 outings against Oakland (37 ER in 81.2 IP)...the California native is 2-2 here at The Coliseum, posting a 4.99 ERA in 6 starts (22 ER in 39.2 IP)...his best outing against the A's was his most recent, a complete game shutout in an 8-0 Rays win here last July 31... James did not allow a runner past first base, scattering 3 hits and no walks over 98 pitches...he finished with 11 K's and fanned at least 1 batter in each inning from the second on, notching the seventh of his now 8 career shutouts.

MARQUEE MATCHUPS--Shields has faced a former All-Star 7 times in his first 8 assignments, a stretch that has also included a pair of Cy Young winners (Chris Sale twice, Cole Hamels, R.A. Dickey, Clay Buchholz, Justin Verlander and Andy Pettitte).

INNINGS EATER--James has worked at least 6.0 innings in 22 straight starts, dating back to last July 20...the stretch includes 19 quality starts and 4 complete games...since becoming a full-time starter in 2007, Shields has worked a minimum of 6.0 innings in 87% of his starts (173 of 199) and enters tonight fourth in the Majors in innings pitched in that span with 1,388.0, trailing only CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander and Felix Hernandez.

**BACK ON THE ROAD**--Shields is making his fifth road start of 2013 and first since April 25 at Detroit...he is 1-1 this year and 40-43 for his career, compiling a 4.48 ERA (700.2 IP, 732 H, 349 ER) in 110 games (109 starts).

#### **Pitching Notes**

- Tomorrow's Starter Ervin Santana

  Ervin takes his second shot at earning career win #100 tomorrow...he is 3-2 with a 2.79 ERA (15 ER in 48.1 IP) and 99-82 in 243 career outings (240) starts)...he was acquired from the Angels last October 31 with cash in exchange for lefty Brandon Sisk.
- The righty held a 1-0 lead in the third on Sunday vs. New York when Robinson Cano hit a 2-run homer and was followed by a Vernon Wells roundtripper...the Yankees added a run in the fifth and won 4-2, handing Ervin his second loss of 2013 and first at home...he allowed 4 runs on 8 hits over 6.1 IP.
- Ervin has issued just 1 walk over his last 4 outings (26.1 IP)...his 1.12 walk per 9.0 IP ratio (6 in 48.1 IP) trails only Bartolo Colon among A.L. pitchers.
- Santana is set to become the 10th Dominican-born pitcher to reach 100 wins...he debuted in 2005 and has the most wins of any Dominican since 2003.
- Some of Ervin's best work has come against his former A.L. West rivals...he is 14-5 in 26 games (24 starts), posting a 2.03 ERA overall and 6-1 at The Coliseum, recording a 2.08 ERA over 12 outings (10 starts)...Santana was 1-2 last year despite a 2.18 ERA (5 ER in 20.2 IP), with all 3 outings at Angel Stadium.

## **Hitting Notes**

Last Stand: 1-for-12, HR, run, RBI LAA Series: 8-for-13, 3 2B, HR, 4 runs, 9 RBI

Hit Streak:

- Billy collected a 2-run single in the 7-run third inning Wednesday...he finished the Angel series 8-for-13 (.615) with 3 doubles and 9 RBI.
- Butler went 5-for-5 with 5 RBI Monday, his first 5-hit game since July 27, 2009 in Baltimore...it was the first 5-hit game by a Royal since Eric Hosmer was 5-for-5 versus Detroit on Sept. 20, 2011...it was the second 5-hit, 5-RBI game in franchise history, the other by Kevin Seitzer when he went 6-for-6 with 5 RBI on August 2, 1987.
- His home run against the Yankees Saturday marked his 500th career RBI, making him the 10th Royal to reach that total...he knotted the May 5 game against the White Sox with a 2-out, 2-run double in the 9th inning, which the Royals won in 10...he also drove in the tying run April 20 in Boston with a home run over the Green Monster.
  - He recorded a historic afternoon on April 7 in Philly, setting a career high and tying a club mark with 7 RBI, including his first career grand slam.
- Billy was a 2012 AL All-Star, the Silver Slugger (DH) and Edgar Martinez Award winner...among Royals players with at least 2,000 plate appearances, his .299 career average is second all-time to Hall of Famer George Brett (.305).
- He led the club in all three Triple Crown categories in 2012 and is the first player in franchise history to lead or share the team lead for RBI in four consecutive seasons (2009-12)...among the Royals all-time top 10 in SLG, OBP, OPS, doubles, hits, at bats and RBI.

Lorenzo Cain LAA Series: 5-for-13, 2 2B, 4 runs, 5 RBI, 2 SB Last Stand: 1-for-6, run, RBI, HBP Hit Streak:

- Lo went 2-for-5 with 2 doubles and 3 RBI Wednesday...he broke the game open with a bases clearing double in the third inning as KC scored 7 times.
- Cain is sixth in the A.L. with a .338 road average (22-for-65) and is hitting .333 (17-for-51) since April 30...he is 2nd in the league to Detroit's Miguel Cabrera with a .471 average with runners in scoring position (16-for-34).
  - He recorded his third career 4-hit game on April 20 at Fenway, with a pair of doubles, his first homer of the year and 9 total bases, a team season high.
  - Cain missed a majority of the 2012 campaign due to left groin strain, torn hip flexor and right hamstring strain, playing just 61 games

Alcides Escobar LAA Series: 5-for-14, 2B, 4 runs, RBI

Last Stand: 2-for-11, run

- Alcides singled and scored in the third inning Wednesday, finishing the L.A. series 5-for-14...he went 3-for-5 Monday, his first 3-hit game since April 9.
- Esky's 8 steals in 8 attempts tie him for fifth in the A.L...he's the fifth-toughest to fan in the A.L. at 10.3 plate appearances per K (16 K's in 165 appearances).
- He's in his third year with KC and comes off his finest offensive season batting .293 with a club-record 177 hits by a shortstop...was voted the Joe Burke Special Achievement Award winner by the KC chapter of the BBWAA...his .293 average in 2012 was second in baseball among all shortstops (D. Jeter, NYY, .303).
  - With a career high 30 doubles and 35 steals, became the first Royals to post a 30 double/30 steal season since Carlos Beltran (44 2B, 35 SB) in 2002.

Hit Streak:

- Jeff entered Wednesday's game as a defensive replacement in the eighth inning...he is just 4-for-34 in the month of May (.118).
- Frenchy picked up his 119th career outfield assist May 6, the most in MLB since 2005...he is 33 clear of the Cubs' Alfonso Soriano, who is alone in second.
- He had a tough offensive season in 2012, batting a career-low .235...led the entire Major Leagues with 19 outfield assists, tying his career high set in 2007... was 1 of 3 finalists for the Rawlings Gold Glove award in right field.

LAA Series: 0-for-5 Chris Getz.

- Getz went hitless Monday and is 4-for-43 in his last 14 games...he hit .300 (12-for-40) over his first 12 games of the year.
- His April 16 homer against the Braves was his first since July 19, 2009, as a member of the White Sox he took current Royals starter Jeremy Guthrie deep when he was pitching for Baltimore...it was the second longest active drought in the Majors at 954 at bats, 829 as a Royal.
  - Getz was acquired by the Royals along with Josh Fields in a trade with the White Sox in 2009 that sent Mark Teahen to Chicago.

LAA Series: 6-for-13, 2B, 3 runs, BB

- Alex was 3-for-4 with a run scored Wednesday...he is batting .429 (12-for-28) with 3 doubles and 5 RBI since moving to the No. 3 spot in the order May 9.
- He homered in all 3 games of the Baltimore series last week, the first time he's homered in 3-straight games, and first by a Royal since Billy Butler in 2011
- Gordon's 19 multi-hit games lead Major Leagues...he is also tied for fourth in the A.L. in hits (53) and has a .441 average with RISP (15-for-34), which is third in the league...he has hit safely in 30-of-37 games this year and reached base in 32 of 37.

- Had a sensational winter and spring, batting .350 (6-for-19) and serving as a team leader for the undefeated 2013 WBC champion Dominican Republic...also named a Caribbean World Series All-Star while playing for Aguilas. Tejada did not appear in the Majors last season, instead playing 36 games for Norfolk (AAA) in the Baltimore system.
- The 2002 A.L. MVP is a career .285 batter with 304 home runs and 1,282 RBI for the A's (1997-2003), Orioles (2004-07, 2010), Astros (2008-09), Padres (2010) and Giants (2011).



# This & That

**PERFECT IN RUBBER GAMES**--Kansas City's win on Wednesday gave the Royals a 3-0 mark in rubber games to this point in 2013...the Royals also won series deciding contests in Philadelphia on April 7 and in Boston on April 21 in the nightcap of a split double-dip...at this stage a year ago, Kansas City had participated in five rubber games (4-1)...though not a story until Sunday, KC has also been solid on "getaway days" by posting a 7-2 mark just before the plane leaves.

**IN THE BIG INNING**--Kansas City enjoyed its biggest single inning of offense this year with the 7-run outburst in Wednesday's third inning at Anaheim...the Royals sent 11 men to the plate and used 5 hits and 3 walks to their advantage for the largest frame since plating 8 runs in the home half of the sixth inning on August 20, 2011, in a 9-4 win over Boston...Wednesday was the seventh time the Royals have batted around this year.

TIGHT ERA RACE IN A.L.—The Royals are among a tightly packed group at the top of the American League ERA race, with Kansas City's 3.60 mark currently third in a race that features Texas at the top with a 3.45 mark, followed by the White Sox at 3.49...the rotation has 22 "Quality Starts" under its belt this year, a figure the Royals didn't reach last year until game #62 on June 15 en route to 69 on the season...tonight's starting pitcher, James Shields, tied for third in the A.L. with 7 quality outings.

**GORDO ON HIT PARADE**—Alex Gordon is currently tied for fourth among all Major League players in hits with 53 (tied with Adam Jones and Jean Segura), while leading all big leaguers in multi-hit games with 19, including 7 in his last 10 contests…a year ago after 37 games, Gordon had 10 multi-hit games and finished the campaign with 60, good for a third place tie in the American League.

**SHOW-ME STATE SHOWS CLUTCH HITTING**—The state of Missouri is well represented when hitting with runners in scoring position, as the only two big league clubs with a team mark above .300 reside in the state...St. Louis has the top average at .327, while the Royals lead the American League at .312 in RISP situations after going 7-for-12 in Wednesday's win...San Francisco is third in the big leagues with a .298 mark and the second best A.L. squad is Detroit at .289... Lorenzo Cain is second in the American League with a .471 mark (16-for-34), while teammate Alex Gordon is third at .441 (15-for-34).

**TWO OUT SUCCESS CONTINUES**—The Royals went 7-for-15 with two out in Wednesday's game and upped their Major League leading batting average with two away to .295 (126-for-427) with 73 RBI, or 44% of the overall team run output...Detroit ranks second with a .284 team mark while Cleveland is third in the bigs at .275...Alex Gordon remains the best 2-out hitter in the game in 2013 with a .389 average (23-for-47) when batting with two outs, featuring 4 doubles, a triple, 4 home runs and 16 RBI.

**BARK AT THE PARK RETURNING**--Kansas City will host its fifth annual Bark at the Park on Sunday, May 26, as the Royals take on the Los Angeles Angels at 1:10...fans can sit alongside their dog in a designated section of the ballpark (sections 107-109 and 206-209) during this special event...in addition, there will be vendors and activities in the Outfield Experience...gates open at 11:30 a.m...the Bark at the Park ticket package includes both a human and canine game ticket and a Royals dog leash...also, \$3 from each ticket package will be donated to Wayside Waifs, an organization that specializes in pet adoption and is committed to helping homeless animals find a permanent home...additional tickets can be purchased for \$15...note that fans with two or more dogs must have an additional adult accompany the canine...tickets to Bark at the Park must be purchased prior to the day of the event...fans can register their dog at www.royals.com/bark.

**MAKE-UP OFFICIALLY ANNOUNCED**--The Detroit Tigers notified the Royals that the rainout of April 23 will be made up as part of a split doubleheader on Friday, August 16 in Comerica Park...game times will be 12:05 and 6:05 (CDT)...Kansas City has had five games fall prey to a variety of interruptions including three by rain, one by snow after 3 1/2 innings were completed and also one by a manhunt in Boston...the only make-up game still remaining to be determined is the snowout of May 2 that will require Tampa Bay to make another trip to Kansas City.

**NED AS A ROYAL**--The 16th full-time manager in franchise history, Ned Yost, was named to his post on May 13, 2010 and has recorded a 218-270 ledger since taking the reins...included was a 72-90 mark a year ago...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).
