The Royals dropped the opener of this weekend series last night, the third time in the last 4 games contested here that KC lost a one-run decision...Kansas City trails all-time by a 248-301 mark, 109-166 here in the Coliseum.

LATE SOLOS SINK ROYALS -- An old fashioned pitchers duel jumpstarted this weekend series in the east bay, with the Athletics hitting leadoff solo homers in the seventh and eighth innings to turn a 1-0 deficit into a 2-1 decision...the Royals jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the third when David Lough doubled in Salvador Perez, who had doubled with one away...unfortunately, that would be the only tally in support of starter James Shields, who kept the A's off the board until Josh Donaldson tied the contest with a seventh inning blast...Oakland then took the lead when Adam Rosales homered to open the eighth...the result, Shields absorbed his fourth loss of the year, the second time he's done so with a complete game... he gave up 6 hits on the evening with a walk and season-high tying 9 strikeouts...Lough, recalled earlier in the day to take the roster spot vacated when Jarrod Dyson went on the shelf with a right ankle sprain, was the only Royal with more than one hit, going 2-for-4 with the lone RBI...KC is now 2-2 on this trip.

CLOSE CALLS HAUNTING SHIELDS.-James Shields fired an 8.0-inning complete game last night, his second route-going effort of the year, each of which have wound up in defeat, dropping the 2-1 decision last night...the loss dropped his season record to 2-4, while also dropping his ERA to 2.45, good for seventh in the American League...it was the sixth time he's started a game that wound up a one-run decision, with the Royals going 1-5 in those affairs, including each of his 4 setbacks...on the flip side, the Royals have mustered only 5 runs in his 4 defeats as he's lost by counts of 1-0, 3-2 (twice) and 2-1 last night...overall, Shields ranks sixth in the A.L. in overall lowest runs support at 3.55, with tonight's starter, Ervin Santana, third in that department at 3.35...Shields matched a season high with 9 strikeouts last night and has accumulated 62 on the year, which ranks sixth in the A.L.

SHIELDS ADDS TO STARTERS ROLL -- The complete game effort by James Shields last night was the eighth time this year that a Kansas City starter worked at least 8.0 frames, matching the entire total of 8.0-inning performances by last year's starting rotation...Shields possesses 5 of the 8 outings this year, which is why he leads the American League in innings pitched at 66.0...he has been the ultimate innings eater, eclipsing the 200-inning mark in each of his last 6 seasons and since the start of 2009, Shields is third in the Majors in innings pitched with 966.0, trailing only Felix Hernandez (1018.2) and Justin Verlander (1007.2)...overall, Kansas City starters have worked at least 6.0 innings in 29 of the 38 games played...a year ago, KC starters did get through 6.0 innings in 28 assignments until June 25 in the 71st game...the Royals have also had 14 starts of at least 7.0 innings, a number that was not reached in 2012 until July 24 in game #96

STARTERS EFFORT EQUALS RESTED PEN--What a difference a year and a revamped starting rotation means to the work out of the bullpen...a season ago, the Royals had the second most used bullpen in baseball to Colorado, who had employed a pitch limit on its starters...this year, Kansas City has the least used pen with 96.2 frames...St. Louis is second in the Majors at 102.0 innings, while the second fewest innings by a pen in the American League is Tampa Bay with 107.1.

SELFISH WITH FREE PASSES -- Kansas City has given up the second fewest number of walks in the Majors this year with 98, trailing only Minnesota's 95...KC's total is way down over 38 games from the 143 allowed thru the same number of games a year ago (146 over 39 games)...the Royals had a 4.19 walks to 9-inning ratio last year, while this season's stands at 2.61, good for third best in the American League...KC finished with the third most walks issued in the A.L. last year with 542 in 1,451.1 innings for a walks to 9-inning ratio of 3.36, also third highest.

ERVIN SANTANA looks to pick up career win #100 in the middle game of this series...he's making his eighth start of 2013 and fourth on the road...this is Santana's 244th career appearance (241st start) and 25th start (27th appearance) against Oakland...he was acquired from the Los Angeles Angels last October 31 with cash in exchange for lefty Brandon Sisk after spending 8 seasons with the Halos. Ervin's 2013 starts

HOMERS LEAD TO LOSS VS. YANKEES--Ervin took a 1-0 lead into the third on Sunday vs. New York before allowing a 2-run home run to Robinson Cano, followed a immediately by a solo shot from Vernon Wells...the Yankees added a run in the fifth en route to a 4-2 win, handing Ervin his second loss of 2013 and first at home...he entered the start first among A.L. pitchers with a 0.78 ERA at home

LOW SCORING GAMES -- Ervin's first 7 starts have featured a combined 40 runs between KC and its opposition, with Chicago's 5 tallies on April 3 the most by any team...the Royals are averaging 3.35 runs per 9.0 innings while Santana is on the mound, the third-lowest run support among qualifying A.L. pitchers.

ONE WIN FROM #100 -- Ervin's victory on April 27 was the 99th of his career and when he hits the century mark, Santana will be just the 10th Dominican-born pitcher to do so and the second active hurler, joining Bartolo Colon, who is in the home dugout tonight with 174 wins...Juan Marichal leads all Dominican pitchers with 243 wins while Santana, who debuted in 2005, possesses the most victories by a Dominican dating to 2003.

APRIL AWARD WINNER.—Ervin earned team Pitcher of the Month honors in his first month as a Royal, finishing 3-1 with a 2.00 ERA (8 ER in 36.0 IP)...it marked a complete flip from April, 2012, when he lost all 5 starts and posted a 6.16 ERA (21 ER in 30.2 IP).

LIMITING THE FREEBIES -- Ervin held New York without a walk on Sunday and has issued just 1 over his last 4 starts (26.1 IP), with his ratio of 1.12 walks per 9.0 IP (6 in 48.1 IP) second-lowest in the A.L. to Bartolo Colon (0.38 per 9.0 IP)...Santana issued 3.08 walks per 9.0 innings in 2012 (61 in 178.0 IP).

RIVALRY RENEWED -- Some of Ervin's best work as an Angel was against Oakland as he went 14-5 with a 2.03 ERA in 26 games (24 starts)... Santana has 21 quality starts, including 10 with no more than 1 run allowed against the Athletics...he dropped 2 of 3 decisions last year, all at Angel Stadium, recording a 2.18 ERA (5 ER in 20.2 IP), with the win occurring on May 15, a 4-0 triumph in which he allowed just 4 hits over 7.2 innings featuring 9 strikeouts...Santana is 6-1 in the Coliseum, possessing a 2.08 ERA over 12 outings (10 starts), with his last outing here a no decision on July 16, 2011, allowed 3 runs (2 earned) in 6.1 innings, an eventual 4-3 Oakland win...Ervin's last victory here was a 7-4 decision on September 4, 2010.

ON THE ROAD -- Ervin took a no decision in his last road start on May 7 at Baltimore and is 1-1 in 3 outings, dropping his season debut on April 3 at Chicago and winning at Fenway on April 21..he's 47-43 in 122 career road appearances (119 starts), recording a 4.93 ERA (395 ER in 721.0 IP).

Pitching Notes

Tomorrow's Starter - Luis Mendoza

- Luis will make his seventh appearance (sixth start) of 2013 in tomorrow's series finale...he enters at 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA (20 ER in 30.0 IP).
- Mendoza opened this 9-game trip on Monday at Angel Stadium, earning his first win of the year in an 11-4 game...he held the Halos to a run through the fifth, ultimately allowing 3 runs, 6 hits and no walks while striking out 6 over 6.0 innings.
- The former Ranger started against Oakland in his Major League debut on September 8, 2007 in Arlington (2.0 IP, 2 H) and has faced the A's 5 times (2 starts), posting a 3.48 ERA (4 ER in 10.1 IP) with 2 defeats...he held Oakland to 1 run over 5.2 IP here on April 9, 2012, taking the loss in a 1-0 game.
- Luis finished 2012 at 8-10 with a 4.23 ERA in 30 outings (25 starts)...he posted a 3.83 ERA in 20 starts after returning to the rotation on June 12.
- Mendoza is 3-for-3 in quality starts on the road this year, posting a 3.10 ERA over 4 appearances away from The K (7 ER in 20.1 IP), with opponents batting just .187 (14-for-75)...this will be Mendoza's 38th career road appearance and 23rd start...he is 6-10, recording a 4.68 ERA (77 ER in 148.0 IP).

Hit Streak:

- After an 8-for-13 stop in Anaheim with 9 RBI to open this trip, Billy started this series last night with an 0-for-4. He went 5-for-5 with 5 RBI Monday, his first 5-hit game since July 27, 2009 in Baltimore...it was the first 5-hit game by a Royal since Eric Hosmer was 5-for-5 vs. Detroit on Sept. 20, 2011...it was the second 5-hit, 5-RBI game in franchise history, the other by Kevin Seitzer when he went 6-for-6 with 5 RBI on August 2, 1987.
 - His home run against the Yankees on May 11 was 500th career RBI, making him the 10th Royal to reach that total.
- He's had some clutch hits already this year, tying the May 5 game against the White Sox with a 2-out, 2-run double in the ninth inning, with KC winning in 10...he also drove in the tying run in the eighth inning of the nightcap on April 21 in Boston with a home run over the Green Monster, a game the Royals won, 5-4 in 10.
 - He recorded a historic afternoon on April 7 in Philly, setting a career high and tying a club mark with 7 RBI, including his first career grand slam.
- Billy was a 2012 AL All-Star, the Silver Slugger (DH) and Edgar Martinez Award winner...among Royals players with at least 2,000 plate appearances, his .299 career average is second all-time to Hall of Famer George Brett (.305).
- He led the club in all three Triple Crown categories in 2012 and is the first player in franchise history to lead or share the team lead for RBI in four consecutive seasons (2009-12)...among the Royals all-time top 10 in SLG, OBP, OPS, doubles, hits, at bats and RBI.

This Series: 0-for-1, 2 BB Lorenzo Cain

This trip: 5-for-14 (.357), 4 runs, 2 2B, 5 RBI, 3 BB, 2 SB

Hit Streak: 0 g (0-2)

- Lorenzo was 0-for-1 with a pair of walks last night.
- Cain is tied for eighth in the A.L. with a .333 road average (22-for-66)...he is second in the league to Detroit's Miguel Cabrera with a .471 average with runners in scoring position (16-for-34).
 - He recorded his third career 4-hit game on April 20 at Fenway, with a pair of doubles, his first homer of the year and 9 total bases, a team season high.

- He's in his third year with KC and comes off his finest offensive season batting .293 with a club-record 177 hits by a shortstop...was voted the Joe Burke Special Achievement Award winner by the KC chapter of the BBWAA...his .293 average in 2012 was second in baseball among all shortstops (D. Jeter, NYY, .303).
 - With a career high 30 doubles and 35 steals, became the first Royals to post a 30 double/30 steal season since Carlos Beltran (44 2B, 35 SB) in 2002.

- Jeff has started once on this trip, going 0-for-4...he is scuffling through a .118 month of May (4-for-34).

- Alex extended his mini streak to 5 games, going 1-for-4 last night, hitting ..429 (9-for-21) during the streak...he has batted ..406 (13-for-32) since moving into the #3 spot in the order on May 9.
 - He homered in all 3 games of the Baltimore series on May 7-9, the first time he's homered in 3-straight games, and first by a Royal since Billy Butler in 2011.

- Eric 1-for-4 in last night's series opener...he is batting .319 (15-for-47) with 3 doubles and 5 RBI in two-out situations.
- Hosmer broke a 144 at-bat homerless drought with a 2-run shot in Baltimore on May 9...it was his first roundtripper since Sept. 11, 2012.
- Despite his offensive struggles in 2012, he ended up 1 of 3 finalists for the Rawlings Gold Glove award at first base...he swiped 16 bases last year, which tied him with Jeff King for the most by a Royals first baseman.
 - He was the starting first baseman this spring for Team USA in the WBC, hitting .200 (5-for-25) with 5 RBI in 6 games.

Hit Streak: 0 g (0-4)

- Elliot went 0-for-3 in the series opener last night...despite the 0'fer, he is 11-for-29 (.379) with 5 runs scored in his last 9 starts. He hit his first Royals home run on May 1 against Tampa Bay...his first roundtripper since Sept. 11, 2012, when he was a member of the Rays.
- He joined KC as the player to be named on Feb. 12 in the 7-player trade with Tampa Bay that included James Shields and Wade Davis.

- He was hitting .340 (52-for-153) with 6 doubles, 3 triples, 3 homers, 29 runs scored and 5 stolen bases for the Storm Chasers, good for 11th in the PCL...he had a 16-game hitting streak from April 19 to May 8.
 - Lough hit .237 with 2 doubles, a triple and 9 runs scored in 20 games for the Royals in 2012.

(.967), while leading A.L. third baseman in assists (312), total chances (454) and zone rating (.841)...also led all MLB third basemen with 41 double plays
 - Was the 2010 Sporting News Minor League Player of the Year as he tied for the minor league lead with 36 home runs and was second with 124 RBI.

Salvador Perez This Series: 1-for-3, run, 2B This trip: 7-for-15, 2 runs, 3 2B, 4 RBI

Hit Streak: 8 g (12-31)

Hit Streak: 1 g (1-3)

- Salvy extended his hitting streak to 8 games with a third inning double and scored KC's lone run...he's hitting .387 (12-for-32) during the streak and has a .377 average since April 30 spanning 14 games.
 - Perez's 41 hits lead all American League catchers, trailing only Yadier Molina in the Majors (49)...Salvy's 7 runners caught stealing are second in the A.L.

- Tejada had a pinch single in the 2-run fifth on April 5 in Philly, scoring the first of 13 KC runs...he made the Royals as a non-roster invitee to spring training... he signed with the Royals as a minor league free agent on December 31, 2012...this is the 6-time All-Star's 14th career Opening Day roster.
- Had a sensational winter and spring, batting .316 (6-for-19) and serving as a team leader for the undefeated 2013 WBC champion Dominican Republic...also named a Caribbean World Series All-Star while playing for Aguilas.
 - Tejada did not appear in the Majors last season, instead playing 36 games for Norfolk (AAA) in the Baltimore system.
- The 2002 A.L. MVP is a career .285 batter with 304 home runs and 1,282 RBI for the A's (1997-2003), Orioles (2004-07, 2010), Astros (2008-09), Padres (2010) and Giants (2011).



This & That

<u>ANOTHER ONE-RUN CONTEST</u>--Last night's loss dropped the Royals to 7-8 in one-run decisions, tying the Angels (6-9) for the second most single tally contests in 2013...the White Sox have gone 8-9 in a league leading 17 one-run games...coupled with a 4-3 mark in two-run outcomes, the Royals have had 58% of their games in the early going decided by two runs or less, going 11-11.

ERRORLESS STREAK—The Royals played their fourth consecutive errorless game in the field last night, the longest streak the club has amassed since playing the first 7 games of the year without a miscue...all told, Kansas City has committed 27 errors on the year, tying for the third most in the A.L.

TIGHT ERA RACE IN A.L.—The Royals are among a tightly packed group at the top of the American League ERA race, with Kansas City's 3.57 mark currently tied with the Yankees for third in the A.L., trailing only Texas in second at 3.42 and the league leading White Sox with a 3.41 mark, riding the second straight shutout that Chris Sale started...KC's rotation has 23 "Quality Starts" under its belt this year, a figure the Royals didn't reach last year until game #64 on June 17 en route to 69 on the season (#24 last year was attained on June 18 in game #65)...James Shields is tied for first in the league with 8 quality outings.

GORDO ON HIT PARADE--Alex Gordon is currently tied for fourth among all Major League players in hits with 54 (tied with Adam Jones, Gerardo Parra and Jean Segura), while tying for the big league lead with Miguel Cabrera with 19 multi-hit games, including 7 in his last 11 contests...a year ago after 38 games, Gordon had 10 multi-hit games and finished the campaign with 60, good for a third place tie in the American League.

SHOW-ME STATE SHOWS CLUTCH HITTING—The state of Missouri is well represented when hitting with runners in scoring position, as the Cardinals and Royals rank 1-2 in baseball in RISP situations...St. Louis has the top average at .332, while the Royals lead the American League at .310 mark...San Francisco is third in the big leagues with a .301 mark and the second best A.L. squad is Detroit at .292...Lorenzo Cain is second in the American League with a .471 mark (16-for-34), while teammate Alex Gordon is third at .441 (15-for-34).

TWO OUT SUCCESS CONTINUES--Kansas City's lone tally in last night's game occurred with two out in the third inning as the Royals continue to lead the Majors in two-out hitting with a .291 mark (127-for-436) with 74 RBI, or 44% of the overall team run output...Detroit ranks second with a .279 team mark while Cleveland is third in the bigs at .274...Alex Gordon remains the best 2-out hitter in the game in 2013 with a .479 average (23-for-48) when batting with two outs, featuring 4 doubles, a triple, 4 home runs and 16 RBI.

BARK AT THE PARK RETURNING--Kansas City will host its fifth annual Bark at the Park on Sunday, May 26, as the Royals take on the Los Angeles Angels at 1:10...fans can sit alongside their dog in a designated section of the ballpark (sections 107-109 and 206-209) during this special event...in addition, there will be vendors and activities in the Outfield Experience...gates open at 11:30 a.m...the Bark at the Park ticket package includes both a human and canine game ticket and a Royals dog leash...also, \$3 from each ticket package will be donated to Wayside Waifs, an organization that specializes in pet adoption and is committed to helping homeless animals find a permanent home...additional tickets can be purchased for \$15...note that fans with two or more dogs must have an additional adult accompany the canine...tickets to Bark at the Park must be purchased prior to the day of the event...fans can register their dog at www.royals.com/bark.

FAITH & FAMILY DAY ON NEXT STAY—The Royals will host the Los Angeles Angels in a special 1:10 p.m. matinee game on Saturday, May 25, that will feature the annual Faith & Family Day festivities presented by Hobby Lobby...fans are encouraged to arrive at Kauffman Stadium early, as the first 10,000 fans will receive the first installment of the Hot Dog Derby Bobblehead series — Ketchup — presented by Hy-Vee and Farmland...Faith & Family Day will feature postgame appearances and speeches by current Royals player Luke Hochevar and his teammates, Angels outfielder Josh Hamilton, who credits his Christian faith with helping to overcome his battles with substance abuse, first baseman Albert Pujols, and Scott Dawson from Safe at Home...top performing Christian rock and modern worship group Crowder will then take the stage for a 45-minute concert...all festivities will take place inside Kauffman Stadium following the game, and a game ticket is required for admittance...Faith & Family Day fans may purchase tickets starting at just \$10 by visiting www.royals.com/faith.

MAKE-UP OFFICIALLY ANNOUNCED--The Detroit Tigers notified the Royals that the rainout of April 23 will be made up as part of a split doubleheader on Friday, August 16 in Comerica Park...game times will be 12:05 and 6:05 (CDT)...Kansas City has had five games fall prey to a variety of interruptions including three by rain, one by snow after 3 1/2 innings were completed and also one by a manhunt in Boston...the only make-up game still remaining to be determined is the snowout of May 2 that will require Tampa Bay to make another trip to Kansas City.

HOUSTON NEXT--The final stop of this 3-city, 9-game journey will be in the newest American League city when KC travels to Houston for a 3-game set starting on Monday night...the Royals went 13-17 vs. the 'Stros when they were a member of the National League, including a 7-5 advantage in Minute Maid Park after a 1-2 visit to the Astrodome in the earlier editions of Interleague play.

TV MAKE-UPS--The Royals and FOX Sports Kansas City have announced a pair of postponement make-ups on the television schedule...the May 2 game that was snowed out after 3 1/2 innings against Tampa Bay will be made up by FSKC at the end of this road trip in Houston next Wednesday with first pitch slated for 7:05... the April 26 rainout vs. Cleveland will be made up on Wednesday, June 19, when the Royals complete a 3-game series in Cleveland.

NED AS A ROYAL--The 16th full-time manager in franchise history, Ned Yost, was named to his post on May 13, 2010 and has recorded a 218-271 ledger since taking the reins...included was a 72-90 mark a year ago...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).
