Royals vs. A's

The Royals continue to struggle to score here in the Coliseum, dropping a pair of 2-1 contests to open this series and of their last 5 losses here, spanning 6 games, KC has been defeated by one run each time...Kansas City trails all-time by a 248-302 mark, 109-167 here in the Coliseum.

EARLY LEADS NOT ENOUGH--The Royals have taken an early advantage in each of the first two games of this weekend set, but the outcome has been eerily similar when the final out has been recorded, with KC falling by consecutive 2-1 counts...last night, Kansas City plated a first inning run in what has become common practice, picking up a pair of 2-out hits to get on the board...unfortunately, the Royals had ample opportunities in the subsequent innings, but couldn't forge any more runs across and fell prey to another late Oakland rally...this time it occurred in the sixth after starter Ervin Santana had tossed 5.0 innings of 2-hit ball, as the A's rode a double, walk and triple to their lone runs of the night...for Santana, he allowed 2 runs on 4 hits with 3 walks and 5 K's on the evening, falling short for a third straight start in an attempt to corral career win #100...Billy Butler and Salvador Perez combined for four of KC's five hits, while Alex Gordon doubled for the other knock...the Royals enter today's series finale with a 2-3 mark through 5 games of this 9-game trip.

RUNS AT A PREMIUM AT THE COLISEUM--Dating back to the last game the Royals played here in 2001, Kansas City has been able to muster just 9 total runs in the last 6 games at the Coliseum, posting a 1-5 mark...KC was blanked in the first 2 games of this stretch, then plated 3 runs in the lone victory, before scoring 4 times in an extra-inning loss last year and then just 2 tallies in the first 2 games of this series.

STARTERS IMPRESSIVE DESPITE OUTCOMES--Kansas City's revamped starting rotation has held its own as we hit the quarter pole of the 2013 season, entering today's series finale with a 3.74 ERA, which is good for fifth among all starting staffs in the American League...it's a huge improvement over the 5.01 mark the 2012 rotation wrapped up with, the 11th ranked ERA in the A.L...last night's 7.0 inning performance by Ervin Santana was the 15th time a Kansas City starter worked at least 7.0 frames, a figure the 2012 staff didn't attain until August 1 in game #103...thanks to the work of James Shields, the starters have already recorded as many 8.0-inning outings as they accumulated all of last year, with Shields possessing 5 of those 8...the starters have also worked 6.0 innings in 29 of the first 39 games, a figure the 2012 staff didn't reach until June 26 in game #72.

STARTERS EFFORT EQUALS RESTED PEN--What a difference a year and a revamped starting rotation means to the work out of the bullpen...a season ago, the Royals had the second most used bullpen in baseball to Colorado, who had employed a pitch limit on its starters...this year, Kansas City has the least used pen with 97.2 frames...St. Louis is second in the Majors at 107.0 innings, while the second fewest innings by a pen in the American League is Tampa Bay with 114.1.

SUPPORT SHORT FOR A PAIR--A couple of Kansas City starters have had the unfortunate distinction of taking the hill when the opposing hurler has been equally as tough, with Ervin Santana the most recent victim by giving up two runs last night while the A's limited the Royals to just a single tally...Santana is now tied with Chicago's Chris Sale for the least run support average in the American League at 3.09, while Friday's losing pitcher in a 2-1 contest, James Shields, is in sixth in that department with just 3.55 runs per game...as for Santana, who made his third attempt at career win #100 last night, has seen the offense plate more than 3 runs in just one of his starts, a 4-2 win in Boston on April 21, while the club has scored only 5 runs in his 3 losses.

SELFISH WITH FREE PASSES--The Minnesota Twins surrendered an uncharacteristic 8 walks in their loss to the Red Sox yesterday and coupled with the 3 allowed by the Royals, Kansas City has taken over the top spot in fewest walks issued in the Majors with 101, two fewer than the Twins...KC's total is way down over 39 games from the 146 allowed thru the same number of games a year ago...the Royals had a 4.19 walks to 9-inning ratio last year, while this season's stands at 2.63, good for second best in the American League...KC finished with the third most walks issued in the A.L. last year with 542 in 1,451.1 innings for a walks to 9-inning ratio of 3.36, also third highest.

TRIP ENDS IN HOUSTON--The final stop of this 3-city, 9-game journey will be in the newest American League city when KC travels to Houston for a 3-game set starting on Monday night...the Royals went 13-17 vs. the 'Stros when they were a member of the National League, including a 7-5 advantage in Minute Maid Park after a 1-2 visit to the Astrodome in the earlier editions of Interleague play.

LUIS MENDOZA makes his seventh appearance and sixth start of 2013...this is Luis' sixth appearance (third start) against the Athletics, his 75th Major League appearance (47th start)...he was acquired by Kansas City in a trade with Texas on April 2, 2010.

INTO THE WIN COLUMN--Mendoza opened this 9-game road trip with an 11-4 win on Monday night at Angel Stadium, his first victory since last September 21...he retired the first 6 Halos, 5 via the ground ball, and held them to a run through the first 5.0 innings...L.A. plated a pair in the sixth, though KC had built a 10-1 lead by that point...Mendy yielded the 3 runs on 6 hits, striking out 6 in his second career start of at least 6.0 innings with no walks allowed...Billy Butler's 5 hits and 5 RBI led the offense attack.

SOLID IN 2012--Mendoza spent his first full season in the big leagues last year, setting career highs in every category...after a choppy start that saw him pitch both in the rotation and the bullpen, he was shifted into the rotation for good on June 12 and from that point on served as a solid starter...in his final 20 starts, Mendy was 6-7 with a 3.83 ERA.

HUGE IN THE HOMELAND--Luis turned himself into a very popular figure south of the border this offseason, leading his Obregon winter league team to the Caribbean World Series title and then pitching flawlessly in the WBC for his home country...Mendy combined to toss 13.1 shutout innings in the Caribbean Series over two starts, including taking a no-hitter into the eighth inning on February 6 vs. Puerto Rico...for his work, Mendoza was named the Series MVP.

VS. OAKLAND--Luis has faced the A's 5 times in his career (2 starts), going 0-2 with a 3.48 ERA (4 ER in 10.1 IP)...the first 4 appearances came with Texas, including his Major League debut on September 8, 2007 in Arlington, when he scattered 2 hits over 2.0 scoreless innings as a starter...the lone matchup as a Royal was here in his 2012 debut on April 9...Luis allowed 1 run in 5.2 innings on 5 hits, 4 walks and a pair of K's, but absorbed 1-0 loss...KC was held to 3 hits, all doubles, and did not record a hit after the third inning.

ROAD WORK--Mendoza is making his fourth road start of the year, recording "quality" performances in each of his previous 3...he left his season debut on April 6 at Philly with a 3-1 lead, working 6.0 solid innings but the Phils rallied for 3 in the ninth and walked-off with a 4-3 win...Luis has limited opponents to a .187 average (14-for-75) and a 3.10 ERA through 20.1 road innings (7 ER)...he is 7-10 in 37 career road appearances (22 starts), compiling a 4.68 ERA (77 ER in 148.0 IP)...Mendoza finished 2012 at 4-5 with a 3.95 ERA in 15 outings away from Kauffman Stadium.

Pitching Notes

Tomorrow's Starter - Jeremy Guthrie

- Jeremy will start tomorrow's series opener in Houston...he is 5-1, with the 12th best ERA in the A.L. at 2.82 (17 ER in 54.1 IP).
- Guthrie had a shutout until the fourth on Tuesday at Angel Stadium, when Albert Pujols led off with the first of L.A.'s 4 solo homers...the Halos scored in each inning through the seventh, with Jeremy allowing 5 runs on 11 hits and 3 walks in a 6-2 loss, his first defeat since August 3, 2012 vs. Texas.
- Guthrie's loss on Tuesday halted his club mark for consecutive starts without a defeat at 18...he collected 10 wins over the span, ending a victory short of another Royals record, held by Paul Splittorff (August 13, 1977-April 22, 1978) and Rich Gale (June 17-August 23, 1980).
- Guthrie tossed his first Major League shutout in a 2-0 win on May 4 vs. Chicago, scattering 4 hits and a walk...the shutout came in his 189th career start.
- The Oregon native holds a 2-0 mark and a 3.68 ERA in 3 starts vs. Houston, winning twice last year while with Colorado...his lone outing at Minute Maid Park was his Colorado debut on April 6, 2012...he allowed 3 runs over 7.0 IP in a 5-3 win, working around back-to-back solo homers in the fourth.

 - Gutierrez is coming off Tommy John surgery in September, 2011...he posted 9 saves with the Diamondbacks in 2009 and 15 in 2010.

 - Herrera has fanned at least 1 batter in 14 of his 17 outings, with his 23 strikeouts tied for 10th among A.L. relievers.
 - The 23-year old was 4-3 with a 2.35 ERA in 2012...he set a Royals rookie record with 76 appearances.

 - Greg saved both games of a split doubleheader on April 21 at Boston, becoming the first KC pitcher to record two saves in a day since 2002.
 - He was named 2012 Royals Pitcher of the Year after going 7-4 with a 2.96 ERA and 16 saves in 67 outings...Holland converted his first 13 save chances after taking over the closer's role on July 31.

Hitting Notes

- Billy Butler** *This Series: 2-for-8, RBI* *This trip: 10-for-21 (.476), 3 2B, HR, 4 runs, 10 RBI* *Hit Streak: 1 g (2-4)*
- Billy broke out of a mini 0-for-6 drought with a pair of hits last night, including the Royals lone RBI...he has hit .476 (10-for-21) thru 5 games of this trip.
 - He went 5-for-5 with 5 RBI Monday in Anaheim, his first 5-hit game since July 27, 2009 in Baltimore, the first 5-hit game by a Royal since Eric Hosmer vs. Detroit on Sept. 20, 2011...it was the second 5-hit, 5-RBI game in franchise history, the other by Kevin Seitzer when he went 6-for-6 with 5 RBI on August 2, 1987.
 - His home run against the Yankees on May 11 was 500th career RBI, making him the 10th Royal to reach that total.
 - He's had some clutch hits already this year, tying the May 5 game against the White Sox with a 2-out, 2-run double in the ninth inning, with KC winning in 10...he also drove in the tying run in the eighth inning of the nightcap on April 21 in Boston with a home run over the Green Monster, a game the Royals won, 5-4 in 10.
 - He recorded a historic afternoon on April 7 in Philly, setting a career high and tying a club mark with 7 RBI, including his first career grand slam.
 - Billy was a 2012 AL All-Star, the Silver Slugger (DH) and Edgar Martinez Award winner...among Royals players with at least 2,000 plate appearances, his .299 career average is second all-time to Hall of Famer George Brett (.305).
 - He led the club in all three Triple Crown categories in 2012 and is the first player in franchise history to lead or share the team lead for RBI in four consecutive seasons (2009-12)...among the Royals all-time top 10 in SLG, OBP, OPS, doubles, hits, at bats and RBI.
- Lorenzo Cain** *This Series: 0-for-5, 2 BB* *This trip: 5-for-18 (.278), 4 runs, 2 2B, 5 RBI, 3 BB, 2 SB* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-6)*
- Lorenzo was 0-for-4 last night and is looking to breakout here in O.Co, going 1-for-9 in his career here.
 - Cain is second in the league to Detroit's Miguel Cabrera with a .457 average with runners in scoring position (16-for-35).
 - He recorded his third career 4-hit game on April 20 at Fenway, with a pair of doubles, his first homer of the year and 9 total bases, a team season high.
 - Cain missed a majority of the 2012 campaign due to left groin strain, torn hip flexor and right hamstring strain, playing just 61 games.
- Alcides Escobar** *This Series: 0-for-8* *This trip: 5-for-22 (.227), 4 runs, 2B, RBI* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-11)*
- Alcides has gone 0-for-4 on consecutive nights here and is in an 0-for-11 drought after picking up 5 hits in his first 11 at bats of this trip.
 - Esky is 8-for-8 in stolen bases, tying for fifth in thefts in the A.L...he's fourth-toughest to fan in the A.L. at 10.2 plate appearances per K (17 K's in 173 P.A.).
 - He's in his third year with KC and comes off his finest offensive season batting .293 with a club-record 177 hits by a shortstop...was voted the Joe Burke Special Achievement Award winner by the KC chapter of the BBWAA...his .293 average in 2012 was second in baseball among all shortstops (D. Jeter, NYY, .303).
 - With a career high 30 doubles and 35 steals, became the first Royals to post a 30 double/30 steal season since Carlos Beltran (44 2B, 35 SB) in 2002.
- Jeff Francoeur** *This Series: 0-for-3, BB* *This trip: 0-for-7, BB* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-8)*
- Jeff was 0-for-3 with a walk last night, his second start thru five games of this trip...he is scuffling through a .108 month of May (4-for-37).
 - Frenchy picked up his 119th career outfield assist May 6, the most in MLB since 2005...he is 32 clear of the Cubs' Alfonso Soriano, who is alone in second.
 - He had a tough offensive season in 2012, batting a career-low .235...led the entire Major Leagues with 19 outfield assists, tying his career high set in 2007...was 1 of 3 finalists for the Rawlings Gold Glove award in right field.
- Chris Getz** *This Series: Has not played* *This trip: 0-for-5* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-16)*
- Getz has not played since an 0-for-5 on Monday in Anaheim and is 4-for-43 in his last 14 games...he hit .300 (12-for-40) over his first 12 games of the year.
 - His April 16 homer against the Braves was his first since July 19, 2009, as a member of the White Sox he took current Royals starter Jeremy Guthrie deep when he was pitching for Baltimore...it was the second longest active drought in the Majors at 954 at bats, 829 as a Royal.
- Alex Gordon** *This Series: 2-for-7, run, 2B, BB* *This trip: 8-for-20 (.400), 4 runs, 2 2B, 2 BB* *Hit Streak: 6 g (10-24)*
- Alex was 1-for-3 with a double, walk and run scored last night...he extended his current streak to 6 games in which he's batted .417 (10-for-24)...he has batted .400 (14-for-35) since moving into the #3 spot in the order on May 9...he is the top two-out hitter in the Majors, batting .480 (24-for-50).
 - He homered in all 3 games of the Baltimore series on May 7-9, the first time he's homered in 3-straight games, and first by a Royal since Billy Butler in 2011.
 - Gordon's 19 multi-hit games are tied with Miguel Cabrera, Dustin Pedroia and Jean Segura for first in the Majors...he is also fifth in the A.L. in hits (55) and has a .441 average with RISP (15-for-34), which is third in the league...he has hit safely in 32-of-39 games this year and reached base in 34 of 39.
 - Alex hit his first career grand slam on April 25 in Detroit to give KC an 8-3 cushion in the 10th...his 4 RBI tied a career best, his fifth such contest.
 - He had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3-16, which is tied for the third-longest in the A.L. this season, batting .396 (21-for-53) during the streak.
 - In 2012, led all of baseball with 51 doubles, tied with teammate Billy Butler (2009) for the second-most in Royals history...his 106 doubles since the start of 2011 are the most in the majors, one more than Robinson Cano...is ninth on the Royals all-time doubles list with 191, moving past David DeJesus (187).

 - He joined KC as the player to be named on Feb. 12 in the 7-player trade with Tampa Bay that included James Shields and Wade Davis.

- George went 0-for-1 Monday after entering the game in the eighth inning...he has 5 walks in 18 plate appearances for a .389 on-base percentage.

 - He won the spring battle to serve as the Royals backup catcher...he is on his fifth-straight Opening Day roster after starting last season with Milwaukee.
 - 29-year-old veteran backstop played for both the Brewers and A's in 2012...blasted 6 homers in 27 games for Oakland as the club went 17-8 in his 25 starts down the stretch and captured the A.L. West crown on the last day of the season.
- David Lough** *This Series: 2-for-4, 2B, RBI* *This trip: 2-for-4, 2B, RBI* *Hit Streak: 1 g (2-4)*
- David was thrown into the fire on Friday night after being recalled earlier in the day, going 2-for-4 with a double and KC's lone RBI in the defeat...he also contributed an outfield assist, nabbing Brandon Moss trying to stretch a single into a double.
 - He was hitting .340 (52-for-153) with 6 doubles, 3 triples, 3 homers, 29 runs scored and 5 stolen bases for the Storm Chasers, good for 11th in the PCL...he had a 16-game hitting streak from April 19 to May 8.
 - Lough hit .237 with 2 doubles, a triple and 9 runs scored in 20 games for the Royals in 2012.
- Mike Moustakas** *This Series: 0-for-6, BB* *This trip: 1-for-20 (.050), 2B, BB* *Hit Streak: 0 g (0-10)*
- Moose was 0-for-3 with a walk last night and is 1-for-20 with a double through 5 games of this trip.

 - 2012 was his first full season in the majors, hitting 20 homers and becoming the first KC third baseman since Dean Palmer (26 as a 3B) in 1998 to record 20+.
 - Mike, like Francoeur and Hosmer, was 1 of 3 finalists for the Rawlings Gold Glove award in 2012...finished second in the league in fielding pct. (.967), while leading A.L. third baseman in assists (312), total chances (454) and zone rating (.841)...also led all MLB third basemen with 41 double plays.
 - Was the 2010 Sporting News Minor League Player of the Year as he tied for the minor league lead with 36 home runs and was second with 124 RBI.
- Salvador Perez** *This Series: 3-for-7, run, 2 2B* *This trip: 9-for-18, 2 runs, 4 2B, 4 RBI* *Hit Streak: 9 g (14-35)*
- Salvy had a pair of hits, including a double last night to extend his hitting streak to 9 games in which he's batted .389 (14-for-36)...he has also hit .377 during the month of May (20-for-53).
 - Perez's 43 hits lead all American League catchers, trailing only Yadier Molina in the Majors (51)...Salvy's 7 runners caught stealing are second in the A.L.
 - He extended his club record for pickoffs by a catcher with his first of the year and ninth career on April 20 at Boston, nabbing Daniel Nava at second base...he led all MLB catchers last season with 5 pickoffs, 2 more than anyone else...5 pickoffs were a franchise single-season record.
 - After returning from the D.L. last June 22, he led all A.L. catchers (min. 70 games caught) in average (.301), hits (87), runs (38) and doubles (16).

- Miguel went 1-for-3 Tuesday, his only appearance on this road trip...he is 6 for his last 14 (.429).
 - Tejada had a pinch single in the 2-run fifth on April 5 in Philly, scoring the first of 13 KC runs...he made the Royals as a non-roster invitee to spring training...he signed with the Royals as a minor league free agent on December 31, 2012...this is the 6-time All-Star's 14th career Opening Day roster.
 - Had a sensational winter and spring, batting .316 (6-for-19) and serving as a team leader for the undefeated 2013 WBC champion Dominican Republic...also named a Caribbean World Series All-Star while playing for Aguilas.
 - Tejada did not appear in the Majors last season, instead playing 36 games for Norfolk (AAA) in the Baltimore system.
 - The 2002 A.L. MVP is a career .285 batter with 304 home runs and 1,282 RBI for the A's (1997-2003), Orioles (2004-07, 2010), Astros (2008-09), Padres (2010) and Giants (2011).

This & That

YET ANOTHER ONE-RUN CONTEST--Consecutive 2-1 defeats have dropped the Royals to 7-9 in one-run decisions, the second most single tally contests in 2013...the White Sox have gone 8-9 in a league leading 17 one-run games...coupled with a 4-3 mark in two-run outcomes, the Royals have had 59% of their games in the early going decided by two runs or less, going 11-12.

GORDO NABS ANOTHER ONE--Two-time *Rawlings* Gold Glove winner, Alex Gordon, displayed once again his ability to nab runners when he threw out an aggressive Eric Sogard at second base in the third inning last night in an effort to turn a single into a double...for Gordon, it was his third outfield assist of the year and the 11th by the Kansas City outfield this year, good for a tie with Milwaukee for third most in the Majors...since the 2011 season, the KC outfield last amassed 113 assists, which are 35 more than any other big league club, which is Houston with 78...since making the full-time move to the outfield in 2011, Gordon has turned in a big league best 40 assists from leftfield, 17 more than any other leftfielder, and two more than any other outfielder, which is teammate Jeff Francoeur with 38.

ERRORLESS STREAK--The Royals played their fifth consecutive errorless game in the field last night, the longest streak the club has amassed since playing the first 7 games of the year without a miscue...all told, Kansas City has committed 27 errors on the year, tying for the third most in the A.L.

TIGHT ERA RACE IN A.L.--The Royals are among a tightly packed group at the top of the American League ERA race, with Kansas City's 3.54 mark currently third in the A.L., trailing only Texas in second at 3.38 and the Yankees at 3.53...KC's rotation has 24 "Quality Starts" under its belt this year, a figure the Royals didn't reach last year until game #65 on June 18 en route to 69 on the season...James Shields is tied for first in the league with 8 quality outings.

GORDO ON HIT PARADE--Alex Gordon is currently fifth in the American League with 55 hits, while tying for the big league lead with Miguel Cabrera, Dustin Pedroia and Jean Segura for the big league lead with 19 multi-hit games, including 7 in his last 12 contests...a year ago after 39 games, Gordon had 10 multi-hit games and finished the campaign with 60, good for a third place tie in the American League.

TWO OUT SUCCESS CONTINUES--Kansas City's lone tally in last night's game occurred with two out in the first inning as the Royals continue to lead the Majors in two-out hitting with a .289 mark (129-for-447) with 75 RBI, or 45% of the overall team run output...Detroit ranks second with a .279 team mark while Cleveland is third in the bigs at .277...Alex Gordon remains the best 2-out hitter in the game in 2013 with a .480 average (24-for-50) when batting with two outs, featuring 5 doubles, a triple, 4 home runs and 16 RBI.

BARK AT THE PARK RETURNING--Kansas City will host its fifth annual Bark at the Park a week from today, as the Royals take on the Los Angeles Angels at 1:10...fans can sit alongside their dog in a designated section of the ballpark (sections 107-109 and 206-209) during this special event...in addition, there will be vendors and activities in the Outfield Experience...gates open at 11:30 a.m...the Bark at the Park ticket package includes both a human and canine game ticket and a Royals dog leash...also, \$3 from each ticket package will be donated to Wayside Waifs, an organization that specializes in pet adoption and is committed to helping homeless animals find a permanent home...additional tickets can be purchased for \$15...note that fans with two or more dogs must have an additional adult accompany the canine...tickets to Bark at the Park must be purchased prior to the day of the event...fans can register their dog at www.royals.com/bark.

FAITH & FAMILY DAY ON NEXT STAY--The Royals will host the Los Angeles Angels in a special 1:10 p.m. matinee game next Saturday, that will feature the annual Faith & Family Day festivities presented by Hobby Lobby...fans are encouraged to arrive at Kauffman Stadium early, as the first 10,000 fans will receive the first installment of the Hot Dog Derby Bobblehead series – Ketchup – presented by Hy-Vee and Farmland...Faith & Family Day will feature postgame appearances and speeches by current Royals player Luke Hochevar and his teammates, Angels outfielder Josh Hamilton, who credits his Christian faith with helping to overcome his battles with substance abuse, first baseman Albert Pujols, and Scott Dawson from Safe at Home...top performing Christian rock and modern worship group Crowder will then take the stage for a 45-minute concert...all festivities will take place inside Kauffman Stadium following the game, and a game ticket is required for admittance...Faith & Family Day fans may purchase tickets starting at just \$10 by visiting www.royals.com/faith.

MAKE-UP OFFICIALLY ANNOUNCED--The Detroit Tigers notified the Royals that the rainout of April 23 will be made up as part of a split doubleheader on Friday, August 16 in Comerica Park...game times will be 12:05 and 6:05 (CDT)...Kansas City has had five games fall prey to a variety of interruptions including three by rain, one by snow after 3 1/2 innings were completed and also one by a manhunt in Boston...the only make-up game still remaining to be determined is the snowout of May 2 that will require Tampa Bay to make another trip to Kansas City.

TV MAKE-UPS--The Royals and FOX Sports Kansas City have announced a pair of postponement make-ups on the television schedule...the May 2 game that was snowed out after 3 1/2 innings against Tampa Bay will be made up by FSKC at the end of this road trip in Houston next Wednesday with first pitch slated for 7:05...the April 26 rainout vs. Cleveland will be made up on Wednesday, June 19, when the Royals complete a 3-game series in Cleveland.

NED AS A ROYAL--The 16th full-time manager in franchise history, Ned Yost, was named to his post on May 13, 2010 and has recorded a 218-272 ledger since taking the reins...included was a 72-90 mark a year ago...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).
