#### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in Oakland last week...won the season series last year, 11-8...it was just the A's second season series win over the previous seven years...are 63-73 (.463) against the Rangers since 2006...went 7-2 in Oakland last year and 4-6 in Texas...are 304-317 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 164-148 in Oakland and 140-169 in Texas...including 73-81 at Rangers Ballpark...have an alltime record of 401-399 against the Rangers/Senators.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has converted each of his last 26 save opportunities, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history.

**Ryan Cook** has not allowed a run in his last 19 games and 22.2 innings on the road...his 22.2inning road scoreless streak is third longest by a reliever in Oakland history.

Josh Donaldson is batting .370 (34 for 92) with 12 doubles, four home runs and 19 RBI over his last 26 games.

Sean Doolittle has not allowed a run in his last 10 games and 9.1 innings...he ranks second among American League relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.154), third in opponents batting average (.125), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (..219) and sixth in ERA (0.95).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in **2005** Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice files in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in **2011** Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000<sup>th</sup> career hit to become the 12<sup>th</sup> player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Swept a three-game series from Kansas City to close out the last homestand...had lost four consecutive series prior to that...are now 5-3 over the last eight games after losing a season-high five consecutive contests...are 11-18 (.379) over the last 29 games (since April 19) after starting the season 12-4 (.750)...had the second best record in the majors through games of April 18 but have the sixth worst mark since April 19...are in second place in the American League West and trail Texas by 6½ games for the third consecutive day...have spent 27 of the last 29 days in sole possession of second place in the West...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 27 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's swept a three-game series from Kansas City over the weekend, winning all three games by one run...it marked the fourth time in Oakland history the A's swept a three-game series while winning each game by one run (last: July 2-4, 1993 vs. New York)...also swept a four-game series from New York, winning each game by one-run, July 19-22, 2012...10 of the A's last 20 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 8-6 in one-run games for the season...improved to 6-1 in games decided in the last at bat with the win on Sunday and are tied for second in the American League in last at bat wins...are 3-1 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...have three "walk-off" wins.

**THE LONG BALL:** Yoenis Céspedes hit a solo home run in the eighth inning yesterday and each of the A's last 12 home runs have come with the bases empty...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history and is one short of the record of 13 consecutive solo home runs from June 1-15, 2007...the A's last home run with a runner on base was a two-run shot by Céspedes on May 5 at New York.

**APRIL AND MAY:** The A's are batting .219 (121 for 552) with 49 runs scored in 17 games in May (2.88 runs per game) after hitting .253 with 158 runs scored in 28 games in April (5.64 per game)...have the second lowest batting average in the majors in May (Miami, .213) and the second fewest runs scored (Miami, 44)...led the majors in runs in April...have just one stolen base this month after stealing 25 bases in April...the A's are 7-10 in May after going 16-12 in April...are tied for the third worst record in the AL in May...have posted a losing record in May in four of the previous five seasons...this April was the A's fifth consecutive month with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003.

**OFFENSE:** The A's lead the majors in walks (179) and top the American League in hit by pitches (19)...also rank second in the AL in doubles (94) and fourth in extra base hits (144)...have the third lowest batting average (.241), the fourth fewest home runs (43) and the fourth most strikeouts (355)...have been shut out four times, which is tied for third in the AL...A's pitchers have allowed just seven runs in those four shutouts, including two 1-0 losses.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers went 2-1 with a 3.22 ERA (13 er in 36.1 ip) and .227 (30 for 132) opponents batting average in six games on the last homestand...allowed just one run in three of the six games...however, are 15-21 with a 4.89 ERA (141 er in 259.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in losses, third in most home runs (37) and 10<sup>th</sup> in ERA...starters have a .224 (83 for 371) opponents batting average the first time they face a batter in a game, which is sixth lowest in the majors, compared to .301 (107 for 355) the second time, which is third highest.

**MORE PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 2.78 ERA (17 er in 55.0 ip) and .222 (45 for 203) opponents batting average in six games on the last homestand after posting a 5.11 ERA over the previous nine contests...have a 4.17 ERA overall, which ranks ninth in the American League...have allowed 204 runs, 103 of which have come in the third through fifth innings (50.5%)...have a 3.30 ERA (33 er in 90.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 6.47 (97 er in 135.0 ip) in innings three through five and 2.88 (58 er in 181.0) from the sixth inning on...are tied for second in the AL in pickoffs (4).

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** The A's are 15-7 (.682) against American League West competition compared to 8-15 (.348) against everyone else...are batting .264 (207 for 784) with 132 runs and 27 home runs in 22 games against the AL West compared to .217 (163 for 752) with 75 runs and 16 home runs in 23 games against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.65 ERA (84 er in 207.0 ip) against the West compared to 4.70 (104 er in 199.0 ip) against everyone else.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a six-game road trip tonight that features stops is Texas (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to New York (2-1), Cleveland (0-4) and Seattle (1-2) and have now lost 12 of the last 16 road games after going 6-0 on the first trip...are 10-12 on the road overall...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (3-0) and are 13-10 in Oakland...the A's have hit 27 home runs in 22 games on the road compared to 16 in 23 games in Oakland...however, the pitching staff has allowed 30 home runs at home compared to 21 on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** Adam Rosales flew out as a pinch hitter yesterday and A's pinch hitters are now 0 for their last 15...are 2 for 40 (.050) with three walks for the season...lead the American League in pinch plate appearances (43) but have the second lowest batting average (Baltimore, 0 for 11)...the A's also lead the AL in plate appearances with the bases loaded (56) as well as grounded into double plays (6)...are tied for the lead in doubles (5)...are batting .255 (12 for 47) with the bases full...A's number three hitters are batting a combined .201 (37 for 184), which is the lowest mark in the majors...the A's have turned just 29 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors (Toronto, 31)...are 17-12 (.586) in night games compared to 6-10 (.375) during the day.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list nine times this year...currently have five players on the DL (Anderson, Nakajima, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sizemore)...Rodriguez and Sizemore will miss the remainder of the season...the A's have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...used the DL 21 times last year, the fourth time in the last six years they used it at least 20 times.



FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments this year and 19-13 (.594) over the last two years...his teams are 216-167 (.564) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in six of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked one batter or fewer all eight times.

FIRST FOUR, LAST FOUR: Went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA, .235 opponents batting

average and two home runs allowed in 26.0 innings over his first four starts... is 0-2 with an 7.17 ERA (17 er in 21.1 ip), .314 (27 for 86) opponents batting average and five home runs allowed in 21.1 innings over his last four starts.

DON'T WALK: Issued just his second walk of the season in his last start and is averaging 0.38 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors...also leads the majors in strikeout to walk ratio (13.50)...his streak of eight consecutive starts with one walk or fewer and two innings or more to start the season is the longest by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916...is averaging the fewest pitches per game in the American League (83.4) and the second fewest pitches per inning (14.1)...walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, his first walk of the season...that snapped a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed six of his seven home runs and issued both of his walks to lefthanded hitters...has surrendered 58 home runs over his last four seasons, 45 of which have been hit by lefties...has yielded a .211 (15 for 71) average the first time through the lineup, .310 (35 for 113) after that...has allowed .224 (28 for 125) batting average with the bases empty compared to .373 (22 for 59) with runners on...including .345 (10 for 29) with runners in scoring position.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-0 with a 3.12 ERA (9 er in 26.0 ip) and .235 (23 for 98) opponents batting average in four starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 6.33 ERA (15 er in 21.1 ip) and .314 (27 for 86) opponents average in four starts during the day...in two seasons with the A's, is 11-5 with a 2.92 ERA (42 er in 129.1 ip) in 20 starts at night compared to 2-6 with a 5.12 ERA (40 er in 70.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day.

NOT WILD: Does not have a wild pitch in two seasons with the A's, a stretch of 32 starts and 199.2 innings pitched without a wild pitch...the 32 consecutive starts without a wild pitch is the second longest streak by an A's starting pitcher since 1993...Barry Zito had a 38-start streak from July 2, 2002-July 13, 2003...now has a streak of 64 games and 384.0 innings pitched since his last wild pitch on May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL).

ACTIVE LEADERS: Is tied for third among active pitchers in complete games (33), tied for sixth in shutouts (10), ranks seventh in wins (174), strikeouts (1860) and games started (383) and eighth in innings pitched (2440.2).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 174 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (383), innings pitched (2440.2) and strikeouts (1860).

2013 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 6-3 A's win at Houston April 6...retired 11 of the first 12 batters...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Castro in the fourth innings...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 12inning win over Detroit April 12...allowed all three of his runs in the third inning on a three-run home run by Fielder...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win over Houston April 17 in Oakland...allowed a run in the first inning when Altuve singled, went to third on a Castro single, and scored on a Carter fielders choice...the A's came back with six runs in the bottom of the first and he retired 15 of the 17 hitters he faced over his final five innings...tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 seven-inning win at Boston *April 23...*walked one and struck out seven...it was his 10<sup>th</sup> career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...at the age of 39 years, 334 days, he became the second oldest pitcher in Oakland history to pitch a shutout (Don Sutton is the oldest, as he was 40 years, 85 days on June 6, 1985 when he blanked Chicago 10-0)...the seven-inning shutout was third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip)...had a no decision in the A's 9-8, 10-inning win against Baltimore **April 28** in Oakland...blanked the Orioles on one hit over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to 15.0 innings...then allowed four runs in the fourth inning and another in the fifth...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss at New York May 4...allowed lead-off home runs to Stewart in the third and Overbay in the fifth...also allowed a RBI single by Hafner with one out in the sixth...Hughes shutout the A's on four hits over the first eight innings...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 9-2 decision at Cleveland May 9...allowed a two-run home run to Kipnis in the first and three more runs in the second on a Gomes RBI double, a Stubbs RBI single and a Kipnis sacrifice fly...also allowed a leadoff home run to Swisher in the third.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the eighth time in his career...it was the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings...did not allow a hit over the first three innings...then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a Cruz sacrifice fly and a Moreland two-run home run...the A's scored twice in the fifth and sixth and he left the game after six innings with a 4-3 lead...Cook allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save

COLÓN vs. TEXAS: Is 18-7 with a 3.69 ERA (197.2 ip. 165 h, 86 r, 81 er, 53 bb, 166 so, 27 hr) in 30 career appearances, all starts...the 18 wins are his most against any team...the only pitchers with more wins against the Texas Rangers are Bert Blyleven, Dennis Leonard and Jack Morris, all with 19...is 13-2 with a 3.20 ERA (40 er in 112.2 ip) over his last 17 starts against Texas after going 5-5 with a 4.34 ERA over his first 13 starts...is 7-3 with a 4.47 ERA (43 in 86.2 ip) in 13 starts at Rangers Ballpark, including 5-0 with a 3.27 ERA (15 er in 41.1 ip) over his last six starts...among visiting pitchers, only Barry Zito (11) has more career wins at Rangers Ballpark...is 11-4 with a 3.08 ERA (38 er in 111.0 ip) in 17 starts in his home ballparks, including 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (7 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts in the Coliseum...had a no decision in his only start against Texas this year (see last start above)...was 1-1 with a 2.40 ERA (15.0 ip, 13 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 10 so) in two starts last year, both in Oakland ... the win was on June 6 when combined with Brian Fuentes on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 victory...tossed eight innings and allowed all five of the hits...then took the loss in a 6-1 decision in Oakland July 17...allowed an Andrus RBI single in the third and three runs in the fourth on a leadoff home run by Beltre and RBI singles by Napoli and Gentry.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**BRIEFLY:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...is 0-2 with a 7.98 ERA (13 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts since then and has issued 11 walks while striking out 10 in 14.2 innings...has a 7.27 ERA for the season, which is the second highest mark in the American League among pitchers with 25 or more innings (Humber, HOU 9.59).

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Is tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (5), ranks fifth in strikeouts (27) and sixth in innings pitched (26.0).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .214 (9 for 42) batting average the first time through the lineup, .237 (9 for 38) the second time and .381 (8 for 21) the third time...has issued nine of his 12 walks to left-handed hitters...opponents are 10 for 23 (.435) with runners in scoring position after going 3 for 27 (.111) with RISP last year.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed three home runs in five starts this year and has surrendered 14 home runs in 12 career starts and 65.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...the 14 home runs are the most by an Athletics pitcher over the first 12 games of his career since at least 1916 (previous, 13 by Vida Blue, Miguel Jimenez, Blake Stein and Brett Anderson)...the most over the first 13 games is 15 by Stein...10 of the 14 home runs have been solo shots...has surrendered 10 home runs in 28.2 career innings in the Coliseum compared to four in 36.2 innings on the road.

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...struck out a careerhigh 11 batters in a career-high tying 6.2 innings...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12<sup>th</sup> pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the sixth...allowed a leadoff double to Maxwell in the seventh and retired the next two batters before he was relieved by Neshek, who allowed Maxwell to score.

career...is 2-1 with a 4.07 ERA (11 er in 24.1 ip) and .222 (20 for 90) opponents batting average over his last four starts.



- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more.
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).
- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.

#### JOSH DONALDSON

 Had his first career game-ending RBI April 12 against Detroit, a home run in the bottom of the 12th inning.

- Was a perfect 4 for 4 April 27 against Baltimore, matching his career high in hits (August 17, 2012 vs. Cleveland).
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of April 22-28...it was his first career weekly honor...went 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles (.864 slugging percentage), 10 RBI and seven walks (1 sf, .633 on-base percentage) in seven games.

#### NATE FREIMAN

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 3 against Seattle and had a RBI single off Joe Saunders in the second inning for his first ML hit...added another single in the fourth inning for his first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run April 22 against Houston, a three-run shot off Erik Bedard in the first inning...it snapped a 0 for 11 streak.

#### JOHN JASO

- Is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2011; Seattle, 2012).
- Hit his first career pinch hit home run April 9 at Los Angeles, a three-run shot off Jepsen in the seventh to give the A's a 7-5 lead.

#### JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying four RBI April 15 against Houston (fourth time, last: September 19, 2011 vs. Baltimore).
- Went 4 for 4 April 19 at Tampa, the third four-hit game of his career.
- Went 2 for 9 in the 19-inning game April 29 against Los Angeles to tie the Oakland record for at bats in a game (11th time, last: Mike Heath at Texas, July 1, 1979).
- Set an Oakland record for hits in the month of April with 34...broke the previous mark of 33 held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...had 11 doubles, which tied the Oakland April record (Mark Ellis, 2003).

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Matched his career high with five RBI April 10 at Los Angeles (also September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) after driving in four runs the night before.
- Had a career-high four strikeouts April 12 against Detroit...matched that figure April 29 against Los Angeles and May 12 at Seattle.
- Was on the paternity list from April 16 to 18 for the birth of his second son, Brody. (April 16).
- Went 0 for 4 April 21 at Tampa Bay to snap a 15-game road hitting streak dating back to Sept. 20, 2012...hit .463 (25 for 54) during the streak.

- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

#### DEREK NORRIS

Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
1992 vs. Texas).

#### SHANE PETERSON

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

#### JOSH REDDICK

• Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.

#### CHRIS RESOP

• Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

#### FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

#### ADAM ROSALES
