■ **2012:** Spent the majority of the season with Class AAA Fresno in the San Francisco organization, appearing in 81 games at third base (80 starts) and 20 at first (19) ... recorded five straight multihit games from 4/20-24 (.542, 13-24) and 4/30-5/18 (.500, 12-24) ... batted .361 (34-94) prior to his promotion to San Francisco on 5/3 ... made five consecutive starts at third base for the Giants from 5/3-7 ... drove in a run in back-to-back games from 5/5-6 vs. Milwaukee ... was optioned back to Fresno on 5/13 ... was on the disabled list with a strained left groin (5/23-30) and fractured right toe (7/6-19) ... recorded a pinch-hit, three-run home run on 6/17 at Salt Lake ... entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 13 Prospect in the San Francisco organization and possessing the Best Strike-Zone Discipline.

■ **2011:** Appeared in 15 games (two starts) over two stints with San Francisco ... was promoted to the Giants on 6/5, optioned back to Class AAA Fresno on 6/12 and recalled again on 9/2 for the remainder of the season ... made his first career start on 6/7 vs. Washington ... recorded his first major-league home run (inside-the-park) and RBI on 9/27 vs. Colorado (off Esmil Rogers) ... became the first Giants player whose first home run was an inside-the-park shot since Dax Jones on 8/18/96 at Philadelphia.

■ **2008:** Made his major-league debut as a pinch-runner on 9/9 vs. Arizona, 96 days after being selected as the 37th pick in the draft ... became the fastest Giant draft pick to appear in a major-league game following the draft since Jeff Robinson in 1984 (306 days) ... was the first player from the 2008 draft class to reach the majors ... collected his first major-league hit on 9/16 at Arizona, a pinch single off Dan Haren.

■ **2011:** Led Class AAA Fresno in walks (66) and triples (6) ... went 5-12 (.417) with the bases loaded ... batted .365 (31-88) during August and September ... entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 17 Prospect in the Giants organization for the second straight season.

■ **2010:** Ranked second in the Eastern League with eight triples at Class AA Richmond ... hit a season-high .410 (34-83) in July ... batted .338 (45-133) against left-handers and .321 (45-140) with 54 RBI with runners in scoring position ... tied for the Arizona Fall League lead with five home runs for Scottsdale ... entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 17 Prospect in the Giants organization.

■ **2012:** Established career highs in virtually every offensive category, hitting a combined .230 (70-305) with 15 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 30 RBI, 34 runs scored and 12 stolen bases over 116 games between St. Louis and the Astros ... appeared in 59 games (43 starts) at second base, 43 (34) at shortstop, two in right field and one in left ... his streak of 17 consecutive stolen bases dating back to 4/30/09 ended on 4/29 vs. Milwaukee ... recorded his first career multihomer game and collected a career-high four RBI on 5/6 at Houston ... matched his career high with three hits on 5/6 at Houston, 5/15 vs. Cubs, 5/21 vs. San Diego and 6/15 vs. Kansas City ... was traded by the Cardinals to Houston in exchange for cash considerations on 8/9 ... made his first start with the Astros on 8/11 vs. Milwaukee, collecting a double and home run ... became the first Astro to record two or more extra-base hits in his first start since Vinny Castilla on 5/15/01 at Cubs.
