CHICAGO WHITE SOX (24-28) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-24) LHP Jose Quintana (3-2, 3.75) vs. RHP Dan Straily (3-2, 5.08) Game #53/Road #29 • Saturday, June 1, 2013

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost four straight games but are 9-8 over the last 17 as they continue their eight-game trip today in Oakland ... the Sox are in third place in the American League Central, 4.5 games behind first-place Detroit.
- Following this three-game series vs. the Athletics, the Sox will conclude the trip with three games in Seattle (6/3-5).
- Chicago went 5-2 on its last homestand vs. Boston (2-1), Miami (3-0) and the Cubs (0-1) from 5/20-28 and 4-3 on its last trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) from 5/13-19.
- The remainder of the 2013 schedule includes three three-city trips, three interleague series and one visit to the west coast.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are trying to avoid matching their longest losing streak of the season at five (previously 4/9-13).
- The Sox have won three series in Oakland since 2008 after winning just one from 2001-07.
- Jose Quintana owns a 3.90 ERA (13 ER/30.0 IP) and a 2.10 run support average (seven runs scored) in his last five starts.
- Twenty of the Sox last 26 games have been decided by three runs or less ... Chicago owns a 13-7 record in those contests.
- Jesse Crain needs one scoreless game to set a career high (22) and 0.2 scoreless IP to match a career high (20.0).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Bartolo Colon threw a five-hit shutout, and Oakland scored three times in the eighth inning en route to a 3-0 victory.
- The White Sox were shut out for the fifth time this season ... four of the shutouts came in May.
- Starter Dylan Axelrod suffered the loss despite allowing two runs on four hits over 7.0 IP ... he allowed just two hits over the first seven innings and retired 12 straight from the third-seventh.
- The Sox collected just five singles, failed to draw a walk and did not have a baserunner advance to second base.

WHITE SOX ON THE MEND

- Gordon Beckham collected a game-ending, RBI single in the ninth inning last night for Class AAA Charlotte vs. Toledo.
- He is 4-10 with a double, two RBI and two runs scored over his last two games as he resumed his injury rehab assignment with the Knights.
- Beckham, who has been on the DL since 4/10, did not play from 5/24-29 due to irritation in his surgically-repaired left wrist.

BETTER BY THE BAY

- The White Sox are 9-10 over their last 19 games in Oakland since 2008 ... they have won three series during that span.
- Sox starters have allowed three runs or less 14 times and worked at least 6.0 IP or more 13 times in the last 19 games.
- By contrast, Chicago won just six of 33 games at O.co Coliseum from 2001-07 (one series win).
- A comparison of the Sox numbers in Oakland since 2008 (19 games) and from 2001-07 (33 games):

UP AND DOWN ON THE ROAD

- The White Sox have lost five straight road games ... Sox starters own a 6.66 ERA (18 ER/24.1 IP) during that span.
- By contrast, Chicago went 8-4 in its previous 12 road contests from 5/1-17 (started the season 3-8 on the road from 4/9-30).
- A comparison of the Sox road numbers over the last five games (since 5/18), the previous 12 and the first 11:

STAY HOT AT THE PLATE

- Conor Gillaspie is 8-25 (.320) over his last seven games.
- Jeff Keppinger is 15-40 (.375) with a home run, four RBI and three runs scored over his last 12 games (four multihit efforts).
- Paul Konerko is hitting .333 (13-39) with a homer and five RBI in his last 11 games ... he owns a .364 mark (4-11) with RISP.
- Alexei Ramirez is batting .324 (24-74) with five RBI and 11 runs scored in his last 18 games (seven multihit efforts).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made 910 quality starts since 2003, the second most in the majors behind the Angels during that span.
- Chicago is tied for sixth in the American League this season with 30 quality starts, four behind league-leading Detroit (34).

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox and Athletics meet seven times in 2013 (three games at the O.co Coliseum and four at U.S. Cellular Field).
- All seven meetings this season take place in a span of 10 days (5/31-6/2 in Oakland and 6/6-9 in Chicago).
- The Sox are 9-10 (.474) at Oakland since 2008 after going 6-27 (.181) from 2001-2007.
- Chicago went 3-3 vs. the Athletics in 2012, going 2-1 at U.S. Cellular Field and 1-2 at the O.co Coliseum.
- The White Sox are hitting .167 (5-30) with a 3.38 ERA (3 ER/8.0 IP) and have been outscored, 3-0, this season.
- The Sox trail in the all-time series, 270-291 ... they are 140-137 at home (88-82 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 128-153 on the road (all games at the O.co Coliseum).

GO WEST, YOUNG MEN

- Chicago has won 22 of its last 36 games vs. the American League West and is 70-48 (.593) since 2010, the second-best winning percentage among AL teams during that span.
- Since 2010, the Sox are 38-20 at home and 32-28 on the road vs. the AL West ... they are 15-17 vs. Los Angeles, 13-13 vs. Oakland, 26-5 vs. Seattle and 16-13 vs. Texas.
- By contrast, the Sox went 79-88 vs. the West from 2005-09.
- Chris Sale is 10-0 with a 2.55 ERA lifetime vs. the division.

TRIP TIDBITS

- The White Sox are 0-3 on this eight-game trip to Wrigley Field (0-2), Oakland (0-1) and Seattle (6/3-5).
- The Sox are hitting .229 (22-96) with no homers, a 7.13 ERA (19 ER/24.0 IP) and have been outscored, 20-6.
- Chicago's offense has scored three runs or less three times, has just four extra-base hits and is 5-18 (.278) with RISP.
- Starters own a 6.60 ERA (11 ER/15.0 IP) while relievers have registered an 8.00 mark (8 ER/9.0 IP) with a .294 (10-34) opponents average.

TOUGH FROM THE START

- Chicago starters own a 6.15 ERA (18 ER/26.1 IP) and .257 opponent average (27-105) in the last five games (one quality).
- White Sox starters are 15-12 with a 3.20 ERA (85 ER/239.1 IP) in the last 39 games (24 quality starts).
- Sox starters lead the American League in ERA, opponents average (.216), opponents OBP (.280) and WHIP (1.08) during that span ... Sox pitchers over the last 39 games (since 4/16):

SAVE AND SOUND

- The White Sox have converted 17-21 (81.0 percent) of their save chances this season, the fourth-best percentage in baseball ... their 17 saves are tied for the fifth-most in the majors.
- The Sox have three stretches this season of converting five or more consecutive save chances, including 12 of the last 14.
- Addison Reed is tied for second in the AL with 17 saves and ranks fourth in save percentage (94.4, 17-18) ... he has converted his last seven save opportunities (7.0 scoreless IP).

NO SHORTAGE OF DRAMA

- Forty of the Sox 52 games (76.9 percent) in 2013 have been decided by three runs or less ... the Sox are 10-9 in one-run games, 6-5 in two-run games and 6-4 in three-run games.
- Chicago's 19 one-run games are tied for the second-most in the majors this season ... Arizona leads MLB with 21.
- The Sox have suffered just seven losses by five-plus runs.

CLEAN IT UP

- Chicago has committed three errors in the last four games.
- The White Sox are tied for the most errors (36) in American League in 2013 and rank last in fielding percentage (.981).
- The Sox have seven multierror games in 2013 ... they made multiple errors in a game 11 times last season.
- Chicago led the majors with a .988 fielding mark in 2012.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- **Adam Dunn:** Eight home runs to tie Billy Williams for 46th place all-time with 426 ... one walk to tie Lance Berkman for 60th place all-time (1,190) ... 31 games for 1,800 career.
- **Paul Konerko:** Four homers to tie Cal Ripken and Jason Giambi for 42nd place (431) ... seven games to tie Nellie Fox for second in Sox history (2,115) ... 29 homers to tie Frank Thomas (448) for first in Sox history.
- **Addison Reed:** Four saves for 50 in his career.
- **Alex Rios:** Seven steals for 200 and 45 RBI for 700.
- **Matt Thornton:** 30 games for 600, 59.0 IP for 600.0 and 41 strikeouts for 600 career.

QUINTANA AT A GLANCE

- The 24-year-old left-hander will make his 11th start of the season and sixth on the road.
- Has gone 7-3 with a 2.90 ERA (37 ER/115.0 IP) and 81 strikeouts before the All-Star Break since 2012 (20 appearances/18 starts).
- Is receiving a 3.99 run support average (86 runs/194.0 IP) since 2012, the fifth-lowest in the American League.
- Owns a career 5-6 record with a 4.18 ERA (43 ER/92.2 IP) and 63 strikeouts in 18 games (16 starts) at U.S. Cellular Field, compared to a 4-2 mark with a 3.38 ERA (38 ER/101.1 IP) and 62 strikeouts in 17 games (16 starts) on the road.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2013 after going 6-6 with a 3.76 ERA (57 ER/136.1 IP) in his first major-league season last year.
- Became the first rookie to throw 8.0 scoreless IP or more three times in a season last year since Detroit's Just Verlander in 2006 (also three) and first White Sox rookie to accomplish the feat since Britt Burns in 1980 (source: STATS LLC).
- Signed by the White Sox as a free agent on 11/10/11.

LAST START

- Suffered the loss on 5/27 vs. the Cubs at home ... allowed four runs on four hits over 6.0 IP, including a first-inning run despite striking out the side ... matched a season high with three walks (also 5/16 at Los Angeles-AL) ... threw 95 pitches (56 strikes).
- Departed with the White Sox trailing, 4-0 ... Cubs went on to win, 7-0.
- Received two runs or less of support for the fifth consecutive start.

2013 QUICK HITS

- Tossed a career-high 18.2 consecutive scoreless IP spanning three starts from 4/12-24.
- Allowed a career-low one hit over 7.0 IP on 4/12 at Cleveland ... retired 10 consecutive batters before exiting, and 18 in a row extending to his next start on 4/17 at Toronto.
- Lost a no-hit bid with one out in the seventh inning on a two-strike, broken-bat single to David Ortiz on 5/21 vs. Boston.
- The Sox are 4-6 in his starts ... has made four quality starts ... left with the lead three times and the game tied twice ... has thrown one wild pitch, hit one batter, picked off two runners and induced two double plays ... opponents are 1-3 in stolen-base attempts ... is averaging 99.3 pitches per start.
- Chicago's defense has made nine errors in his starts.

STRONG OUT OF THE GATE

- Owns a 3.60 ERA (4 ER/10.0 IP) in the first inning, and a .143 (5-35) opponent average with two home runs and 11 strikeouts.
- Has yet to allow a run in the second-third inning and is holding opponents to a .129 (11-85) average with four extra-base hits, four walks and 23 strikeouts the first time through the lineup.
- By contrast, opponents are hitting .231 (18-78) with three homers the second time and .389 (21-54) with seven extra-base hits the third time through the order.
- Is posting an 11.00 ERA (11 ER/9.0 IP) in the fifth inning of games this season.

BLINDED BY THE LIGHT

- Owns a 2-2 career record in 13 career day games (10 starts).
- Is holding opponents to a .234 average (54-231) lifetime during the day, compared to a .274 mark (138-504) in night games.
- Ranks fifth among American League left-handers since 2012 with a 3.13 ERA (22 ER/63.1 IP) in day games ... teammate Chris Sale ranks fourth with a 3.11 mark (37 ER/107.0 IP).

DECISION DILEMMA

- Has received a no decision in five of his 10 starts in 2013, tied for the sixth-most in the majors.
- Received 10 no decisions in 22 starts last season, fourth-most in the American League.
- Is tied for eighth in the majors with 15 no decisions and ranks third among left-handers since 2012.
- Received a no decision on 7/19/12 at Boston despite working 8.0 scoreless IP ... the no decision was his third of the year after working 8.0 scoreless IP (also 6/17 at Los Angeles-NL and 6/24 vs. Milwaukee).
- According to Elias, became the first pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to work 8.0 scoreless IP three times in a season and receive a no decision in all three outings.
- His three outings of 8.0 scoreless IP or more were tied for the fourth-most in baseball ... Seattle's Felix Hernandez led the majors with seven such starts last year.

2012 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Was recalled from Class AA Birmingham on 5/7 and made his major-league debut the same day vs. Cleveland (see note below) ... was optioned back following the game.
- Was recalled back to Chicago and earned the win in first start on 5/25 vs. Cleveland (2 ER/6.0 IP).
- Worked 7.0 IP or more eight times and at least 6.0 IP 13 times.
- Compiled a 16.0 scoreless IP streak from 6/17-24, the sixth-longest scoreless streak by a Sox rookie in franchise history ... Jack Harshman owns the longest stretch among Sox rookies at 33.0 from 8/3-19/54.
- Faced 100 consecutive batters from 6/6-29 without issuing a walk, tied for the fourth-longest stretch in baseball last season and the longest by a White Sox pitcher since Mark Buehrle (101) from 5/13-6/4/09 (source: STATS LLC).
- Owned a 1.46 ERA (6 ER/37.0 IP) over his first six starts, the lowest ERA by a Sox pitcher over his first six major-league starts since Cisco Charles (0.93) in 1967 ... the 1.46 mark is also the sixth-lowest overall in White Sox history.

DOMINANT DEBUT

- Made his major-league debut on 5/7-1/12 at Cleveland, tossing 5.2 scoreless IP in relief.
- Became the first White Sox pitcher to work at least 5.2 scoreless IP in his major-league debut since Jack McDowell on 9/15/87 vs. Minnesota (7.0).
- Was the first Sox reliever to work 5.2 scoreless IP or more in his big-league debut since 1920.
- The last time a reliever in baseball worked at least 5.2 scoreless IP in his major-league debut was Minnesota's Jeff Holly on 5/1/77 vs. Detroit (7.0) ... information courtesy of STATS LLC.

- Chris Sale is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and sixth on the road.
- Is 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) over his last five starts ... currently owns a 23.0 scoreless IP streak.
- Was scratched from his start on 5/22 vs. Boston with tendinitis in his left posterior shoulder ... threw 3.0 IP on 5/28 against the Cubs before the game was postponed due to rain.
- Owns a 2.92 ERA (83 ER/256.0 IP) since 2012, the fifth-lowest mark in the American League.
- Ranks among AL leaders in opponents average (4th, .192) and ERA (6th, 2.53) this season.
- Earned the win in his last start on 5/17 at the Angles, allowing just three hits with a season-high 12 strikeouts over 7.2 scoreless IP/
- Is 2-0 with a 3.79 ERA (8 ER/19.0 IP), one save and 21 strikeouts in seven career appearances (two starts) vs. Oakland ... went 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (4 ER/14.2 IP) and 16 strikeouts in two starts last season ... received a no decision on 4/25/12 at O.co Coliseum (2 ER/8.0 IP).
