WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

The Chicago White Sox have lost a season-high matching five straight games as they continue their eight-game trip today in Oakland ... the Sox are tied for third place in the American League Central, 5.5 games behind first-place Detroit.

Following today's series finale at the O.co Coliseum, the Sox will conclude the trip with three games in Seattle (6/3-5)

Chicago went 5-2 on its last homestand vs. Boston (2-1), Miami (3-0) and the Cubs (0-1) from 5/20-28 and 4-3 on its last trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) from 5/13-19.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

Chicago is trying to avoid their season high for a losing streak (six) and tying the season-high for most games under .500 (six). Chris Sale owns a 23.0 scoreless IP streak and is 4-0 with a

1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) over his last five starts. The White Sox are hitting .209 (34-163) with no homers and

nine runs scored during their five-game losing streak ■ Jeff Keppinger is 17-44 (.386) with a home run, four RBI and

four runs scored over his last 13 games (five multihit efforts). Twenty-one of the Sox last 27 games have been decided by three runs or less (they own a 13-8 record in those contests).

ROSTER MOVES

The White Sox today placed OF Dewayne Wise on the 15-day disabled list (retroactive to 5/30) with a strained right hamstring and recalled OF Jordan Danks from Class AAA Charlotte.

Danks is 3-15 (.200) with a home run and two RBI over nine games with the White Sox this season ... he will wear No. 20. Wise has appeared in just two games since making his last start on 5/18 at Los Angeles-AL.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

Hector Santiago walked Josh Reddick with the bases loaded in the 10th inning to force in the game-winning run in Oakland's 4-3 victory over the White Sox.

Santiago pitched out of a bases loaded, no outs situation in the ninth inning to force extra innings (double play and strikeout). Alejandro De Aza tied the game at 3-3 with a two-run single

in the seventh ... Paul Konerko left the game in the sixth inning with a stiff neck ... he is day-to-day. Jesse Crain worked 1.0 scoreless IP to establish career highs

in consecutive scoreless games (22) and IP (20.1).

SALE GOES STREAKING

Chris Sale's 23.0 consecutive scoreless IP streak is the longest by a White Sox pitcher since J.J. Putz in 2010 (27.0) and longest by a starter since Mark Buehrle in 2001 (24.2).

He is 10-0 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP) and a .204 opponents average (67-329) over 24 career games (11 starts/nine quality) vs. the American League West.

Sale and Dock Ellis (1976-77) are the only pitchers in history to win their first 10 decisions vs. the West (source: STATS LLC).

VENTURA, PARENT TO MISS GAMES

 Manager Robin Ventura (6/6-7) and bench coach Mark Parent (6/7-8) will each miss two games vs. Oakland next week to attend family graduation ceremonies in California.

Ventura will miss the game on 6/6 and Parent will manage Ventura and Parent will both miss the game on 6/7 and Joe McEwing will manage the club, while Daryl Boston will coach third base and Harold Baines will coach first.

- Ventura will resume his managerial duties on 6/8.
- Special assistant Vance Law will join the team from 6/6-8.

BROTHERLY LOVE

Brothers John and Jordan Danks are on the White Sox active roster at the same time for the first time in their careers.

They are the ninth set of brothers to play for the Sox, and the first at the same time since Roberto and Sandy Alomar (2004). See page 53 of the White Sox media guide for a full list of brothers to play for Chicago.

UP AND DOWN ON THE ROAD

The White Sox have lost a season-high six straight on the roas starters own a 6.37 ERA (21 ER/29.2 IP) during that span.

By contrast, Chicago went 8-4 in its previous 12 road contests

from 5/1-17 (started the season 3-8 on the road from 4/9-30). A comparison of the Sox road numbers over the last six games (since 5/18), the previous 12 and the first 11:

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The Athletics lead the season series, 2-0, with one game remaining in Oakland and four at U.S. Cellular Field.
- All seven meetings this season take place in a span of 10 days (5/31-6/2 in Oakland and 6/6-9 in Chicago).
- The White Sox are hitting .217 (15-69) with a 3.57 ERA (7) ER/17.2 IP) and have been outscored, 7-3, this season.
- The Sox are 9-11 (.450) at Oakland since 2008 after going
- 6-27 (.181) from 2001-2007. Chicago went 3-3 vs. the Athletics in 2012, going 2-1 at U.S.
- Cellular Field and 1-2 at the O.co Coliseum. The Sox trail in the all-time series, 270-292 ... they are 140-

137 at home (88-82 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 128-154 on the road (all games at the O.co Coliseum).

BETTER BY THE BAY

The White Sox are 9-11 over their last 20 games in Oakland since 2008 ... they have won three series during that span.

- Sox starters have allowed three runs or less 15 times.
- By contrast, Chicago won just six of 33 games at O.co Coliseum from 2001-07 (one series win).

TRIP TIDBITS

The White Sox are 0-4 on this eight-game trip to Wrigley Field (0-2), Oakland (0-2) and Seattle (6/3-5).

- The Sox are hitting .237 (32-135) with no homers, a 6.15 ERA
- (23 ER/33.2 IP) and have been outscored, 24-9. Chicago's offense has scored three runs or less four times,

has just six extra-base hits and is 7-25 (.280) with RISP. Starters own a 6.19 ERA (14 ER/20.1 IP) while relievers have registered an 6.08 mark (9 ER/13.1 IP).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

The White Sox have made 910 quality starts since 2003, the second most in the majors behind the Angels during that span.

- Chicago is tied for sixth in the American League this season
- with 30 quality starts, five behind league-leading Detroit (34). Chris Sale is tied for fifth in the AL with eight QS this year.

NO SHORTAGE OF DRAMA

Forty-one of the Sox 53 games (77.4 percent) in 2013 have been decided by three runs or less ... the Sox are 10-10 in onerun games, 6-5 in two-run games and 6-4 in three-run games. Chicago's 20 one-run games are tied with Toronto for the

second-most in the majors ... Arizona leads MLB with 21.

The Sox have suffered just seven losses by five-plus runs.

STARTING POINT

Chicago starters own a 5.97 ERA (21 ER/31.2 IP) and .285 opponent average (37-130) in the last six games (one quality). White Sox starters are 15-12 with a 3.24 ERA (88 ER/244.2 IP) in the last 40 games (24 quality starts).

Sox starters lead the American League in ERA, opponents average (.221), opponents OBP (.285) and WHIP (1.11) during that span ... Sox pitchers over the last 40 games (since 4/16):

LAST START

Extended his winning streak to four games on 5/17 at Los Angeles-AL	Γ
allowed just three hits with three walks and a season-high 12 strikeouts	
over 7.2 scoreless IP.	

Did not allow a run for the second consecutive start, extending his scoreless IP streak to 23.0 dating back to 5/6 at Kansas City. Retired 13 of the final 15 batters he faced ... just two of the six hitters

to reach base advanced to second base.

- Departed with the Sox winning, 2-0 ... threw 113 pitches (79 strikes).
- Lowered his career ERA vs. the Angels to 0.38 (1 ER/24.0 IP).

2013 SEASON QUICK HITS

Is receiving a 3.09 run support average (22 runs scored), the second-lowest mark in the American League behind Ervin Santana (3.00) ... has received three runs of support or less in seven of his nine starts.

Ranked ninth in the AL in 2012 with a 5.48 run support average (117 runs scored)

■ The Sox are 7-2 in his starts ... has made eight quality starts and left with the lead five times ... has induced seven double plays, recorded one pickoff and thrown one wild pitch... is averaging 104.1 pitches per start ... Sox defense has committed five errors in his starts.

HISTORIC RUN VS. THE AL WEST

Improved to 10-0 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP) lifetime vs. the American League West in his last start at Angel Stadium ... joined Dock Ellis (1976-77) as the only pitchers in baseball history to win their first 10 career decisions vs. the division (source: STATS LLC).

ONE-HIT WONDER

Threw a one-hit shutout on 5/12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, the first of his career and second complete game. According to Elias, became the 12th White Sox pitcher to throw a shutout while allowing one hit with no

walks or hit batters, and just the sixth since 1958 to equal those numbers when facing 27 or 28 hitters. Joined St. Louis' Shelby Miller, Boston's Jon Lester and New York-NL's Matt Harvey as pitchers who worked 9.0 scoreless IP and allowed just one batter to reach base via a hit, walk or hit-by-pitch in May.

It was the first time since 1900 that four pitchers accomplished the feat in a month (source: Elias).

EANING LEFT

Left-handers are 3-48 (.063) this season and batting .202 (73-361) since 2011 ... the .202 mark is the third-lowest among American League lefties during that span (Brett Cecil, .181 and David Price, .196). ■ Lefties are hitting .209 (82-392) with a .261 on-base percentage and three home runs in his career ... Brennan Boesch (2) and Travis Hafner (1) are the only left-handed hitters to homer off Sale.

HOME BODY

■ Has allowed just five earned runs with 28 strikeouts over four home starts (30.2 IP) in 2013 ... by contrast, is 2-2 with a 3.51 ERA (13 ER/33.1 IP) in five starts on the road.

Owns a 2.09 ERA (29 ER/124.2 IP) at home since 2012, the fifth-lowest mark in MLB during that span. ■ Has made 15 quality starts at U.S. Cellular Field in his career, and 12 away from home.

WHO NEEDS A BREAK?

Is 17-4 with a 2.53 ERA (57 ER/203.0 IP), two saves and 197 strikeouts lifetime in the first half.

His 2.53 first-half ERA since 2010 is the second-lowest in baseball (Jered Weaver, 2.40).

■ Went 10-2 with a 2.19 ERA (25 ER/102.2 IP), 98 strikeouts and a .198 opponents average (73-368) prior to the All-Star break last season ... owned a 7-6 record with a 4.03 mark (40 ER/89.1 IP) in the second half.

CROOKED FRAMES

Has allowed 13 of his 18 earned runs in the first and fifth inning ... ERA is 7.00 (7 ER/9.0 IP) in the first inning and 6.48 (6 ER/8.1 IP) in the fifth ... owns a 0.96 mark (5 ER/46.2 IP) in the other seven frames.

OPENING HONORS

Was the eighth White Sox draft pick to start on Opening Day and third first-round selection (also Alex Fernandez and Jack McDowell).

Became the fifth-youngest OD starter in White Sox history behind Britt Burns (1981), Steve Trout (1980), Tommy John (1966) and Mark Buehrle (2002)

■ Joined Buehrle (2002-06, 2008-11), Jose Contreras (2007) and John Danks (2012) as the fourth Sox pitcher to start on OD since 2002

STARTING AND RELIEVING

■ Is 22-10 with a 2.93 ERA (83 ER/255.0 IP) and 252 strikeouts over 38 career starts (27 quality) since joining the White Sox rotation full-time in 2012.

Has gone 4-3 with a 2.55 ERA (27 ER/95.1 IP), 12 saves, 18 holds and 112 strikeouts over 80 career relief appearances ... his first 79 career appearances were out of the White Sox bullpen.

Registers 8.89 strikeouts per 9.0 IP as a starter, compared to 10.57 in relief.
