A's vs. BREWERS

The A's and Brewers are meeting for just the second time in interleague play...the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland June 10-12, 2002...this marks the A's first appearance in Miller Park as Milwaukee was the only National League city the A's had yet to play in...went 173-154 against the Brewers while they played in the American League and are 177-154 against Milwaukee overall...that includes 103-64 in Oakland and 74-90 in Milwaukee...last night's game was the A's first in Milwaukee since Aug. 17, 1997, a 5-2 A's loss...have lost 23 of their last 28 games in Milwaukee.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight, 10 of the last 11 and 15 of the last 17 games to move to a seasonhigh 11 games over .500 at 35-24...that is the third best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 17-5 over the last 22 games, which is the best record in the majors since May 11 (Cincinnati, 16-6)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18) and 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10)...are 92-50 (.648) since July 1 of last year, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (Cincinnati, 90-53)...are 5-0-1 over the last six series after losing each of the previous four series...swept a three-game series from Chicago over the weekend, the A's seventh series sweep of the season...last year, the A's did not record their first sweep until June 12-14 at Colorado...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by 1½ games...that is the closest the A's have been to first place since they were also 1½ back on May 3...have spent 41 of the last 43 days in sole possession of second place in the West...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 41 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 10 runs last night on a season-high 19 hits (previous: 18, May 25 at Houston)...are now batting .282 (147 for 521) with 78 runs scored over the last 15 games (5.20 per game) after hitting .219 with 104 runs scored over the previous 27 contests (3.85 per game)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (244) and top the American League doubles (128) and hit by pitches (26)...rank second in the AL in intentional walks (15), third in on-base percentage (.336) and fourth in extra base hits (192)...hit two home runs last night to snap a season-high streak of five consecutive games without a home run...have hit the fourth fewest homers in the AL (55).

PITCHING: The A's have tossed two shutouts in the past four games and now have five for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...now have a 2.43 ERA (41 er in 152.0 ip) and .220 (123 for 560) opponents batting average over the last 17 games (since May 17)...have a 3.80 ERA for the season, which ranks seventh in the AL...have walked two batters or fewer in 13 of the last 14 games (20 bb in 125.0 ip, 1.44 walks per nine innings)...have issued 147 walks for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.298).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in nine of the last 17 games...are 11-2 with a 2.66 ERA (33 er in 111.2 ip) and .223 (92 for 412) opponents batting average over that span...are now 25-23 with a 4.32 ERA (169 er in 352.0 ip) for the season...are tied for fourth in the American League in losses and rank ninth in ERA...starters have issued one walk or fewer in 11 of the last 13 games (10 bb in 85.2 ip, 1.05 walks per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-1 in interleague play following last night's win in Milwaukee...swept a two-game series against the Giants in Oakland last Monday and Tuesday and split two games in San Francisco Wednesday and Thursday...in addition to this three-game series with the Brewers, the A's have an eight-game homestand against Cincinnati (two games), St. Louis (three games) and Chicago (three games) from June 25-July 4, a three-game series at Pittsburgh July 8-10 and a two-game series at Cincinnati Aug. 6-7...went 10-8 against the National League last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing interleague record...it was the ninth time in 16 seasons the A's had a winning interleague record...the A's are now 158-131 (.547) all-time in interleague play, which is sixth best.

PITCHERS HITTING: Tommy Milone was 2 for 4 with two runs and a RBI last night...the hits were the first by an A's pitcher this year...A's pitchers are now 2 for 9 (.222) with a walk and three strikeouts this year and are 3 for 47 (.064) over the last three years...have a .088 (26 for 296) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, nine walks and 133 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest by an AL team over that span (Detroit, .094)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 25-12 (.676) record in night games compared to 10-12 (.455) during the day...have the second best night record in the American League and the fourth worst mark during the day...have a 3.30 ERA (124 er in 338.0 ip) at night compared to 4.66 (100 er in 193.0 ip) during the day...have the lowest night ERA in the AL and the third highest day ERA.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (1-0) and Chicago (four games)...have won seven of the last nine road games and are 17-14 on the road...swept a three-game series from Chicago on the last homestand and have an eight-game home winning streak...that is the A's longest home winning streak since a 10-game streak from Aug. 11-Sept. 1, 2006...are 18-10 in Oakland.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 9-1 in games decided in the last at bat and rank second in the American League in last at bats wins...have won each of their last six one-run decisions and are 11-6 (.647) in one-run games...are tied for the AL lead in one-run wins and have the second best record...are 4-1 (.800) in extra inning games...are tied for the second best record and second most wins in extra inning games in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...have four "walk-off" wins.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are 5 for 55 (.091) with two home runs, seven RBI, seven walks and a sacrifice hit...lead the American League in plate appearances (63), rank second in walks and tied for second in home runs and RBI...have the lowest batting average...the A's also lead the AL in plate appearances (86) and grounded into double plays (7) with the bases loaded...are tied for the lead in bases load doubles (6) and rank second in RBI (50) and walks (7)...are hitting .243 (18 for 74) with the bases full...are 12-8 when the opponent starts a left-hander.

17 GAMES IN 17 DAYS: The A's are 10-1 during this 17-day stretch without a day off that began May 24 at Houston and concludes next Sunday at Chicago...it matches their longest stretch without a day off for the season (Aug. 23-Sept. 8).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...the A's are 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments this year and are 19-7 (.731) when he starts in his career...has tossed six or more innings in eight of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

APRIL AND MAY: Went 3-2 with a 3.55 ERA in five starts in May after going 2-2 with a 4.65 ERA in five starts in April.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-2 with a 3.65 ERA (18 er in 44.1 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.74 ERA (13 er in

24.2 ip) in four starts during the day...is now 11-3 with a 2.89 ERA (34 er in 106.0 ip) in 17 career starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.96 ERA (25 er in 45.1 ip) in nine starts during the day.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .163 (15 for 92) batting average the first time through the lineup, which is the second lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...has yielded a .326 (29 for 89) average the second time through the lineup and .241 (20 for 83) after that...opponents are 15 for 81 (.185) with two outs, which is sixth lowest in the AL (min. 50 ip)...including 2 for 21 (.095) with runners in scoring position and two outs, which is tied for second lowest (min. 50 ip)...eight of the 11 home runs he has allowed have come with the bases empty.

INTERLEAGUE: Was the losing pitcher in his only interleague start this year, his last start last Thursday at San Francisco...is now 0-1 with a 4.63 ERA (6 er in 11.2 ip) in two career interleague starts, both against the Giants.

WITH THE BAT: Walked in his first Major League plate appearance last Thursday at San Francisco before striking out in his next at bat...prior that, his only professional plate appearance was a walk on Aug. 5, 2001 with Single-A Stockton against Visalia.

12-5: Is 12-5 over the first 26 starts of his career...in Oakland history, only Tim Hudson (13-4) has won more games over his first 26 games (Hudson improved to 14-4 after 27 games).

BY INNING: Has a 0.82 ERA (1 er in 11.0 ip) in the first inning this year and 1.38 (4 er in 26.0 ip) in his career...has allowed 19 of his 34 runs this year (55.9%) in the fourth and fifth innings (16 er in 21.0 ip, 6.86 ERA).

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 4-0 with a 2.76 ERA (10 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts against American League West competition compared to 1-4 with a 5.20 ERA (21 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts against everyone else...is now 7-0 with a 2.39 ERA (16 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 career starts against intra-division foes and 5-5 with a 4.25 ERA (43 er in 91.0 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else.

2013 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-2 win over Seattle April 4 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a Saunders sacrifice fly in the fifth...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fifth and he allowed a leadoff home run to Morse in the sixth...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win at Los Angeles *April 11*...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning on a Kendrick RBI double...blanked the Angels on one walk over his final four innings and the A's scored four times in the sixth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 16 in Oakland ... walked a career-high four batters in six innings but struck out eight ... allowed two runs in the third inning on RBI singles by Maxwell and Carter...then walked Pena to load the bases with one out before retiring each of the final 11 batters that he faced...left after six innings with the A's leading 3-2 but Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save before Donaldson had a RBI triple in the bottom of the eighth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-6 loss at Boston April 22...allowed a career-high nine runs on a career-high tying eight hits in 4.0 innings...allowed just one run over the first three innings on a Napoli RBI double in the second ... had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Middlebrooks in the fourth...also allowed a grand slam to Napoli in the Red Sox five run fifth inning...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-3 loss to Baltimore **April 27** in Oakland...the A's scored single runs in the second and third innings to take a 2-0 lead...he allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a tworun home run by Markakis, a solo home run by Jones and a RBI single by Harday...then retired 10 of the final 11 batters that he faced...combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a six-hit 2-0 shutout at New York May 3...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all six of the hits...allowed just one base runner as far as third base and that was in the third inning when Stewart walked and went to third on a Cano double...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Cleveland May 8...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...had a 3-0 lead entering the bottom of the fifth when he loaded the bases with no outs...allowed two runs to score on a fielders choice/error...then allowed solo home runs to Swisher and Santana in the sixth inning for the loss...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Texas **May 13**...allowed a two-out solo home run to Moreland in the second inning but that was the only run he would allowed in seven innings...blanked the Rangers on four hits over his final five innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Kansas City May 19 in Oakland...allowed single runs in the third and fourth innings on RBI singles by Gordon and Getz ... the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fourth but he allowed another run in the fifth inning on a Hosmer RBI double...retired the side in order in the sixth and was relieved by Okajima to start the seventh with the A's trailing 3-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-5 win at Houston May 25...allowed a career-high tying three home runs, all solo shots...Castro homered in the bottom of the first but the A's scored six times in the second to take the lead for good ... also allowed a home run to Dominguez in the third and Castro added another round-tripper in the fourth and a RBI single in the sixth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at San Francisco last Thursday...blanked the Giants on one walk (Pence in the second) and one hit (Sandoval in the fourth) over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two-run single to Sandoval and was relieved by Okajima with runners on first and second and two outs...Okajima allowed a two-run double to Belt.

GRIFFIN vs. MILWAUKEE: Has never faced Milwaukee.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Bartolo Colón (6-2, 3.33 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...tossed a five-hit shutout in his last start to become the second 40-year-old in Oakland history with a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago)...became the first American League pitcher to toss a shutout at age 40 or older since Curt Schilling on June 7, 2007 for Boston at Oakland...has two shutouts for the season, which are the most in a season by an Athletics 40-year-old since Jack Quinn had four for the Philadelphia A's in 1928...has walked just four batters this year, an average of 0.51 per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors...leads the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (10.50) and is tied for the lead in complete games (2) and shutouts (2)...is 3-0 with a 0.78 ERA (2 er in 23.0 ip), .247 (20 for 81) opponents batting average and no home runs allowed in 23.0 innings over his last three starts...is 2-1 with a 4.87 ERA (27.0 ip, 38 h, 19 r, 14 er, 12 bb, 23 so, 5 hr) in five career starts against Milwaukee...is 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA (4 er in 7.0 ip) in one start at Miller Park.

Save/Save Opportunities: 14/19 (73.7%) The A's bullpen has allowed nine runs in its last nine games (8 er in 25.1 ip, 2.84 ERA) after a 19.1-inning scoreless streak...now has an American League leading 2.77 ERA for the season...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.281) and the third lowest batting average (.222)...has the fourth best save percentage (73.7%)...is tied for fourth in wins (10) and has the fewest losses (1)...first batters faced are 28 for 156 (.179) with five walks and a hit by pitch (.206 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage against first batters are the lowest in the majors

Is a perfect 13 for 13 in save opportunities and is one of two American League closers without a blown save (Janssen, TOR)...that is the longest season-opening streak without a blown save by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 31 save chances...ranks fifth in the AL in saves (13).

21 Has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 15 appearances (1 er in 15.1 ip, 0.59 ERA) and has a 1.48 ERA 21 for the season, which ranks eighth among AL relievers. 21

- Has not yielded a run in nine appearances on the road (8.1 ip).
- Opponents are 1 for 19 (.053) with runners in scoring position, including 0 for 12 with RISP and two outs.
- Has faced the Brewers twice in his career, both times in 2004 (1.2 ip, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Has converted each of his two saves in three interleague appearances (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 3.00 ERA)...has a 1.25 ERA (7 er in 50.1 ip) in 43 career interleague outings.
