The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series from Chicago last weekend...it was the A's first sweep against the White Sox since Aug. 14-16, 2007...the A's are 32-29 against the White Sox since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 293-270 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 156-130 in Oakland and 137-140 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 970-1025 against Chicago.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Grant Balfour** is a perfect 13 for 13 in save opportunities...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 31 save chances.

**Josh Donaldson** is batting .370 (57 for 154) with 15 doubles, six home runs and 29 RBI over his last 42 games...his average ranks second highest in the majors over that span (since April 22).

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last six, 11 of the last 13 and 16 of the last 19 games to improve to a season-high tying 11 games over .500 at 36-25 (also June 3)...that is the third best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...are 18-6 over the last 24 games, which is the best record in the majors since May 11 (ATL, 16-8; CIN, 16-8)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18) and 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10)...are 93-51 (.646) since July 1 of last year, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (ATL, 90-54)...are 6-0-1 over the last seven series after losing each of the previous four series...swept a three-game series from Chicago last weekend, the A's seventh series sweep this season...last year, the A's did not record their first sweep until June 12-14 at Colorado...are in second place in the AL West, 1½ games behind Texas for the third consecutive day...that is the closest the A's have been to first place since they were also 1½ back on May 3...have spent 43 of the last 45 days in sole possession of second place...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 43 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.43 ERA (46 er in 170.2 ip) and .225 (142 for 631) opponents batting average over the last 19 games (since May 17)...have a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the AL...have walked two batters or fewer in 14 of the last 16 games (25 bb in 143.2 ip, 1.57 walks per nine innings)...have issued 152 walks for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.298) and are tied for fourth in shutouts (3).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 10 of the last 19 games...are 12-2 with a 2.44 ERA (34 er in 125.2 ip) and .224 (104 for 464) opponents batting average over that span...are now 26-23 with a 4.18 ERA (170 er in 366.0 ip) for the season...are tied for fifth in the American League in losses and rank seventh in ERA...starters have issued one walk or fewer in 12 of the last 15 games (13 bb in 99.2 ip, 1.17 walks per nine innings).

**OFFENSE:** Brandon Moss hit the 12,000<sup>th</sup> home run in A's franchise history yesterday afternoon, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning...the A's homered in all three games in Milwaukee (five total) to snap a five-game homerless streak, which was a season-high...scored 10 runs Monday night on a season-high 19 hits (previous: 18, May 25 at Houston)...are now batting .279 (166 for 594) with 87 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.12 per game) after hitting .219 with 104 runs scored over the previous 27 contests (3.85 per game)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (248) and top the American League in hit by pitches (27)...are tied for second in the AL in intentional walks (15), rank third in doubles (128) and on-base percentage (.335) and fourth in extra base hits (195).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Yoenis Céspedes committed a fielding error yesterday afternoon, snapping the A's five-game errorless streak...the streak matched the A's second longest of the season...had a seven-game errorless streak May 17-24, which matched their longest over the last five years (Sept. 12-18, 2009)...however, have committed 32 errors for the season, which is tied for sixth most in the American League.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 25-13 (.658) record in night games compared to 11-12 (.478) during the day...have the second best night record in the American League and the fifth worst mark during the day...have a 3.31 ERA (128 er in 347.2 ip) at night compared to 4.50 (101 er in 202.0 ip) during the day...have the lowest night ERA in the AL and the fifth highest day ERA.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on this seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (2-1) and Chicago (four games)...have won eight of the last 11 road games and are 18-15 on the road...swept a three-game series from Chicago on the last homestand and have an eight-game home winning streak...that is the A's longest home winning streak since a 10-game streak from Aug. 11-Sept. 1, 2006...are 18-10 in Oakland.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 9-2 in games decided in the last at bat and rank second in the American League in last at bats wins...are 6-1 in their past seven games decided by one run and are now 11-6 (.647) in one-run games for the season...are tied for the AL lead in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 4-2 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the second most wins in extra inning games in the AL and are tied for the fourth best record...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...have four "walk-off" wins.

**THIS AND THAT:** A's pinch hitters are 5 for 58 (.086) with two homers, seven RBI, eight walks and a sacrifice hit...lead the AL in plate appearances (67), rank second in walks and tied for second in homers and RBI...have the lowest batting average...the A's also lead the AL in plate appearances (88) and grounded into double plays (7) with the bases loaded...are tied for the lead in bases loaded doubles (6) and rank second in RBI (52) and walks (7)...are hitting .250 (19 for 76) with the bases full...are 12-8 when the opponent starts a left-hander.

**17 GAMES IN 17 DAYS:** The A's are 11-2 during this 17-day stretch without a day off that began May 24 at Houston and concludes this Sunday at Chicago...it matches their longest stretch without a day off for the season (Aug. 23-Sept. 8).

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's are 4-1 in the month of June...are batting .319 (60 for 188) with 25 runs scored (5.00 per game) and the pitching staff has a 1.93 ERA (10 er in 46.2 ip) and .221 (38 for 172) opponents batting average...went 16-12 in May, marking just the second time in the last six years the A's finished with a winning record in the month (16-12 in 2010)...also went 16-12 in April and now have six consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...scored 107 runs in May (3.82 per game) after tallying a Major League leading 158 in April (5.64 per game)...were hit by a pitch an American League leading 15 times in May, which is the A's most in any month since they were hit 21 times in June, 2001...stole an AL low seven stolen bases in May after stealing an AL leading 25 bases in April...the A's pitching staff compiled a 3.50 ERA in May after posting a 4.31 mark in April...had the second lowest May ERA in the AL after posting the fourth highest April ERA.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 11-4 (.733) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

**TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Is 2-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip), .176 (12 for 68) opponents batting average and one walk in 19.0 innings over his last three starts...that matches the longest winning streak of his career (Aug. 16-Sept. 11, 2012)...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA, .257 opponents batting average and 12 walks in 26.0 innings over his first five starts.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (41), tied for second in wins (3) and is fourth in innings pitched (45.0) and games started (8).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-1 with a 5.14 ERA (12 er in 21.0 ip) and .256 (21 for 82) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) and .195 (17 for 87) opponents average in four starts on the road...his career numbers are 1-2 with a 5.53 ERA (25 er in 40.2 ip) in eight starts in Oakland, 4-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has allowed 10 of his 14 career home runs at home.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has not allowed a home run in his last four starts (23.1 ip) after allowing 14 home runs over the first 11 starts of his career (61.0 ip)...has issued 10 of his 13 walks to left-handed hitters...has allowed a .203 (14 for 69) batting average the first time through the lineup, .215 (14 for 65) the second time and .286 (10 for 35) the third time...opponents are 11 for 34 (.324) with runners in scoring position after going 3 for 27 (.111) with RISP last year.

**BRIEFLY:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...is 2-2 with a 4.01 ERA (15 er in 33.2 ip) in six starts since then.

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in 6.2 innings (sixth time, last: Tim Hudson, Sept. 10, 1999 at Tampa Bay)...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12<sup>th</sup> pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the sixth...allowed a leadoff double to Maxwell in the seventh and retired the next two batters before he was relieved by Neshek, who allowed Maxwell to score.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 10-8, 19-inning win over Los Angeles April 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in the 19<sup>th</sup> in a 6 hour and 32 minute game, the longest by time in Oakland history.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at New York May 5...the A's scored a run in the third, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the third on a Cano RBI single...Oakland then built a 4-1 lead before he was charged with two of the Yankees runs in a three-run sixth inning...was relieved by Blevins with one out and runners on first and second and he allowed both runs to score plus one of his own for the blown save.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Seattle May 10...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Morse and a RBI double to Smoak in the first inning...then allowed a three-run home run to Ibanez in the third and a RBI double to Morales in the fifth.

**FIFTH START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss to Texas May 15 in Oakland...tossed just 4.1 innings, matching his career low...faced the minimum over the first two innings but then allowed a bases loaded two-run single to Berkman in the third inning...was charged with three of the Rangers runs in a four-run fifth inning...allowed a RBI single to Beltre and was relieved by Chavez with runners on first and third...Chavez allowed a three-run home run to Cruz.

**SIXTH START:** He combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Texas May 21...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...did not walk a batter to become just the second visiting pitcher at Rangers Ballpark to toss seven or more innings and allow two or fewer baserunners (Erik Bedard, July 7, 2007)...retired the first seven batters before Pierzynski singled with one out in the third...then set down nine straight before Profar singled with one out in the sixth.

**SEVENTH START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over San Francisco May 27...blanked the Giants on three hits over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12.0 innings...had a 2-0 lead when he walked Blanco to start the sixth...Blanco went to third on a Scutaro single and scored on a Posey ground out.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Chicago last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored single runs in each of the first two innings and he allowed his first run in the third on a RBI single by Dunn...then retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced and was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 3-1...Doolittle allowed two runs for the blown save.

**STRAILY vs. CHICAGO:** Had a no decision in his only career start, a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings last Friday in Oakland (see last start above).

**WITH SACRAMENTO:** Went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with Sacramento...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...has a .159 opponents batting average, including .111 (3 for 27) by left-handed hitters compared to .190 (8 for 42) by right-handers...did not allow a home run in 18.2 innings.

**RHP Jarrod Parker (4-6, 4.90 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his team leading 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 3-1 with a 2.41 ERA (9 er in 33.2 ip) and .175 (20 for 114) opponents batting average over his last five starts...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...is 3-3 with a 5.40 ERA (24 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 4.18 ERA (13 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts on the road...is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 12 so) in two career starts against Chicago.

The A's bullpen has allowed 13 runs in its last 11 games (12 er in 30.0 ip, 3.60 ERA) after a 19.1-inning scoreless streak...now has a 2.89 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the second lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.286) and the third lowest batting average (.226)...is tied for fifth in wins (10) and has the fewest losses (2)...first batters faced are 29 for 161 (.180) with six walks and a hit by pitch (.211 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage against first batters are the lowest in the American League.

- Is a perfect 13 for 13 in save opportunities and is one of two American League closers without a blown save (Janssen, TOR)...that is the longest season-opening streak without a blown save by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 31 save chances...ranks fifth in the AL in saves (13).
- Has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 15 appearances (1 er in 15.1 ip, 0.59 ERA) and has a 1.48 ERA for the season, which ranks eighth among AL relievers.
- Has not yielded a run in nine appearances on the road (8.1 ip).
- Opponents are 1 for 19 (.053) with runners in scoring position, including 0 for 12 with RISP and two outs.
- Has a save in two games against the White Sox this year (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 so)...is 3-0 with four saves, two blown saves and a 3.86 ERA (12 er in 28.0 ip) in 30 appearances in his career.
- Has recorded 39 career saves with the A's, which is ninth most in Oakland history...Billy Koch and Keith Foulke are tied for eighth with 44.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10<sup>th</sup> in saves.
