A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's lead the season series 4-0 after sweeping a three-game series from Chicago last weekend and winning last night...it was the A's first sweep against the White Sox since Aug. 14-16, 2007...the A's are 33-29 against the White Sox since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 294-270 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 156-130 in Oakland and 138-140 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 971-1025 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 14 for 14 in save opportunities...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 32 save chances.

Josh Donaldson is batting .367 (58 for 158) with 15 doubles, six home runs and 29 RBI over his last 43 games...his average ranks second highest in the majors over that span (since April 22).

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Buoyed by a season-high four home runs, the A's won their second straight game last night...have also claimed six of the last seven, 12 of the last 14 and 17 of the last 20 games to improve to a season-high 12 games over .500 at 37-25...that is the third best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...are 19-6 over the last 25 games, which is the best record in the majors since May 11 (CIN, 16-8)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18) and 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10)...are 94-51 (.648) since July 1 of last year, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (ATL, 90-55)...are 6-0-1 over the last seven series after losing each of the previous four series...swept a three-game series from Chicago last weekend, the A's seventh series sweep this season...last year, the A's did not record their first sweep until June 12-14 at Colorado...are in second place in the AL West, one-half game behind Texas...that is the closest the A's have been to first place since they were also one-half game back of the Rangers April 23...have spent 44 of the last 46 days in sole possession of second place...for the season, have spent 13 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 44 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.46 ERA (50 er in 180.2 ip) and .226 (151 for 668) opponents batting average over the last 20 games (since May 17)...have a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the AL...have walked two batters or fewer in 15 of the last 17 games (27 bb in 153.2 ip, 1.58 walks per nine innings)...have issued 154 walks for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.298) and are tied for fourth in shutouts (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 10 of the last 20 games...are 12-2 with a 2.58 ERA (38 er in 132.2 ip) and .224 (110 for 490) opponents batting average over that span...are now 26-23 with a 4.20 ERA (174 er in 373.0 ip) for the season...are tied for fifth in the American League in losses and rank seventh in ERA...starters have issued one walk or fewer in 12 of the last 16 games (14 bb in 108.2 ip, 1.16 walks per nine innings).

OFFENSE: Brandon Moss hit the 12,000th home run in A's franchise history Wednesday afternoon, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning...the A's homered in all three games in Milwaukee (five total) to snap a five-game homerless streak, which was a season-high...have now hit nine homers in the last four games...scored 10 runs Monday night on a season-high 19 hits (previous: 18, May 25 at Houston)...are now batting .277 (175 for 632) with 92 runs scored over the last 18 games (5.11 per game) after hitting .219 with 104 runs scored over the previous 27 contests (3.85 per game)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (248) and top the American League in hit by pitches (27)...are tied for second in the AL in intentional walks (15), and rank third in doubles (129), on-base percentage (.334) and extra base hits (200).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Yoenis Cespedes committed a fielding error Wednesday afternoon, snapping the A's five-game errorless streak...the streak matched the A's second longest of the season...had a seven-game errorless streak May 17-24, which matched their longest over the last five years (Sept. 12-18, 2009)...however, have committed 32 errors for the season, which is tied for sixth most in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 26-13 (.667) record in night games compared to 11-12 (.478) during the day...own the best night record in the American League and the fifth worst mark during the day...have a 3.32 ERA (132 er in 357.2 ip) at night compared to 4.50 (101 er in 202.0 ip) during the day...have the lowest night ERA in the AL and the fourth highest day ERA.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (2-1) and Chicago (1-0)...have won nine of the last 12 road games and are 19-15 on the road...swept a three-game series from Chicago on the last homestand and have an eight-game home winning streak...that is the A's longest home winning streak since a 10-game streak from Aug. 11-Sept. 1, 2006...are 18-10 in Oakland.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the American League lead in last at bats wins...are 7-1 in their past seven games decided by one run and are now 12-6 (.667) in one-run games for the season...lead the AL in wins and have the second best record in one-run decisions...are 5-2 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the most wins in extra inning games in the AL and are tied for the fourth best record...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...have four "walk-off" wins.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are 5 for 59 (.085) with two homers, seven RBI, eight walks and a sacrifice hit...lead the AL in plate appearances (68), rank second in walks and tied for second in homers and RBI...have the lowest batting average...the A's also lead the AL in plate appearances (88) and grounded into double plays (7) with the bases loaded...are tied for the lead in bases loaded doubles (6), rank second in walks (7) and are tied for second in RBI (52)...are 13-8 when the opponent starts a left-hander.

17 GAMES IN 17 DAYS: The A's are 12-2 during this 17-day stretch without a day off that began May 24 at Houston and concludes this Sunday at Chicago...it matches their longest stretch without a day off for the season (Aug. 23-Sept. 8).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 5-1 in the month of June...are batting .305 (69 for 226) with 30 runs scored (5.00 per game) and the pitching staff has a 2.22 ERA (14 er in 56.2 ip) and .225 (47 for 209) opponents batting average...went 16-12 in May, marking just the second time in the last six years the A's finished with a winning record in the month (16-12 in 2010)...also went 16-12 in April and now have six consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...scored 107 runs in May (3.82 per game) after tallying a Major League leading 158 in April (5.64 per game)...were hit by a pitch an American League leading 15 times in May, which is the A's most in any month since they were hit 21 times in June, 2001...stole an AL low seven stolen bases in May after stealing an AL leading 25 bases in April...the A's pitching staff compiled a 3.50 ERA in May after posting a 4.31 mark in April...had the second lowest May ERA in the AL after posting the fourth highest April ERA.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his team leading 13th start of the season...the A's are 6-6 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and 23-18 (.561) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 3-1 with a 2.41 ERA (9 er in 33.2 ip) and .175 (20 for 114) opponents batting average over his last five starts...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 5.40 ERA (24 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 4.18 ERA (13 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts on the road...has allowed eight of his 11 home runs on the road...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in fewest pitches per game (91.8), has the sixth lowest strikeout to walk ratio (1.82), is tied for sixth in losses (6) and wild pitches (5), has the sixth highest opponents on-base percentage (.349) and is tied for ninth in hit batters (4) and home runs (11)...the hit batters are a career high as he hit just three batters in 181.1 innings last year...the home runs match his high as he yielded allowed just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings in 2012, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position off him over his first five starts but they are 3 for 29 (.103) in seven starts since then...has a .226 (12 for 53) opponents average with RISP overall...has allowed a .400 (24 for 60) opponents batting average to the first two hitters in the order compared to .231 (46 for 199) against the three through nine hitters...seven of the 11 home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots as were eight of the 11 home runs he allowed last year...has a .247 (47 for 190) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .333 (23 for 69) after that.

IN APRIL: Was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

2013 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Seattle **April 2** in Oakland...allowed a three-run home run to Morse in the third inning and a RBI single to Morales in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles **April 9**...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...also walked three batters but yielded just two runs...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit **April 14** in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...lost his third consecutive decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Tampa Bay **April 20**...allowed a leadoff home run to Joyce in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in 6.1 innings...blanked the Rays on four hits and two walks over his final 4.1 innings...Helliickson, Peralta and Rodney combined to shutout the A's on three hits and a walk...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 10-2 loss to Baltimore **April 25**...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...the A's scored twice in the second inning to take a 2-0 lead but he allowed three runs in the third inning on RBI singles by McLouth and Markakis and a RBI double by Jones...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Markakis in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Davis in the sixth...left with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Resop allowed one of those runs to score...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles **April 30** in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the third inning on errors by Rosales and Donaldson...the A's scored two times in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run double to Trout in the fifth...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the fifth and four more in the sixth to take the lead for good...walked Aybar to start the seventh and was relieved by Scribner, who allowed the run to score...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Cleveland **May 6**...surrendered a career-high four home runs...had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two...all four home runs were solo shots...Kipnis and Cabrera had back-to-back home runs in the first and Cabrera and Reynolds went deep in the fifth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle **May 11**...shutout the Mariners on three walks over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Shoppach in the fifth inning...the A's increased the lead to 4-2 before he put runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Doolittle who allowed one of the runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Kansas City **May 17** in Oakland...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings...Perez double with one out in the third inning and scored one out later on a Lough RBI double...Shields shutout the A's on four hits over the first six innings before Donaldson tied the game with a solo home run in the seventh...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth and Rosales homered in the bottom of the inning for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Texas **May 22**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run home run by Murphy and a solo home run by Beltre...then shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's were held to a run on four hits by Wolf and the Rangers bullpen...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 victory over San Francisco **May 28**...tossed 7.0 innings for the third consecutive start...allowed a RBI single to Pence in the first inning but retired 12 of the next 14 batters after that...had a 5-1 lead when Scutaro doubled to lead off the sixth inning and scored after back-to-back ground outs...retired each of the final six batters.

LAST START: He combined with Blevins, Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Chicago last Sunday in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two of the hits...Ramirez singled with one out in the first and went to second on a Gillaspie walk...retired eight straight before walking Gillaspie to start the fourth...Viciedo hit into a double play and Dunn doubled before he retired each of the final eight batters he faced.

PARKER vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 12 so) in two career starts...the win came in his only start this year (see last start above)...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 5-4 A's win in 14 innings on April 25, his A's debut...shutout the White Sox on five hits and a walk over the first six innings to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 11.2 innings...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Fukudome in the seventh inning...Balfour allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (5-5, 4.04 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season ... owns a 5-2 mark with a 3.22 ERA (18 er in 50.1 ip) and six home runs allowed in eight starts at night compared to 0-3 with a 6.27 ERA (13 er in 18.2 ip) and five home runs allowed in three starts during the day... has received just four runs of support in his five losses this year (32.1 ip, 1.11 RSA)...has received just 16 runs of support in his 15 losses in two seasons with the A's (90.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an A's 9-6 win at San Francisco last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...has faced Chicago once in his career, tossing 8.0 shutout innings (3 h, 0 bb, 5 so) in a 2-0 A's win in Oakland April 24, 2012.

The A's bullpen has allowed 13 runs in its last 12 games (12 er in 33.0 ip, 3.27 ERA) after a 19.1-inning scoreless streak...now has a 2.84 ERA for the season, which leads the American League...also leads the AL in lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.286) and rank third in opponents batting average (.227)...is tied for third in wins (11) and has the fewest losses (2)...first batters faced are 31 for 164 (.189) with six walks and a hit by pitch (.218 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage against first batters are the lowest in the American League.

- Is a perfect 14 for 14 in save opportunities and is one of two American League closers without a blown save (Janssen, TOR)...that is the longest season-opening streak without a blown save by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 32 save chances...tied for fifth in the AL in saves (14).
- Has not allowed a run in 15 of his last 16 appearances (1 er in 16.1 ip, 0.55 ERA) and has a 1.42 ERA for the season, which ranks seventh among AL relievers.
- Has not yielded a run in 10 appearances on the road (9.1 ip).
- Opponents are 1 for 21 (.048) with runners in scoring position, including 0 for 13 with RISP and two outs.
- Has two saves in three games against the White Sox this year (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 so)...is 3-0 with five saves, two blown saves and a 3.72 ERA (12 er in 29.0 ip) in 31 appearances in his career.
- Has recorded 40 career saves with the A's, which is ninth most in Oakland history...Billy Koch and Keith Foulke are tied for eighth with 44.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
