The A's have clinched the season series, claiming the first five games vs. the Sox, including a three-game series sweep last weekend in Oakland...it was the A's first sweep vs. Chicago since Aug. 14-16, 2007...the A's are 34-29 against the White Sox since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 295-270 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 156-130 in Oakland and 139-140 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 972-1025 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 15 for 15 in save opportunities...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 33 save chances.

Josh Donaldson is batting .364 (59 for 162) with 15 doubles, seven home runs and 33 RBI over his last 44 games...his average ranks fourth highest in the majors over that span (since April 22).

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Riding a three-game winning streak, the A's have climbed into first place in the AL West for the first time since April 20...have claimed seven of the last eight, 13 of the last 15 and 18 of the last 21 games to improve to a season-high 13 games over .500 at 38-25...that is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...are 20-6 over the last 26 games, which is the best record in the majors since May 11 (STL, 18-9)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18) and 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10)...are 95-51 (.651) since July 1 of last year, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (ATL & CIN, 90-56)...are 6-0-1 over the last seven series after losing each of the previous four series...swept a three-game series from Chicago last weekend, the A's seventh series sweep this season...last year, the A's did not record their first sweep until June 12-14 at Colorado...lead Texas by one-half game in the AL West...prior to today, had spent 44 of the previous 46 days in sole possession of second place...for the season, have spent 14 days in sole possession of first, two days tied for first, 44 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.47 ERA (52 er in 189.2 ip) and .224 (156 for 697) opponents batting average over the last 21 games (since May 17)...have a 3.72 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the AL...have walked two batters or fewer in 15 of the last 18 games (30 bb in 162.2 ip, 1.66 walks per nine innings)...have issued 157 walks for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.297) and are tied for fourth in shutouts (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 10 of the last 21 games...are 13-2 with a 2.58 ERA (40 er in 139.2 ip) and .224 (115 for 513) opponents batting average over that span...are now 27-23 with a 4.17 ERA (176 er in 380.0 ip) for the season...are tied for fifth in the American League in losses and rank seventh in ERA...starters have issued one walk or fewer in 12 of the last 17 games (16 bb in 115.2 ip. 1.25 walks per nine innings).

OFFENSE: Brandon Moss hit the 12,000th home run in A's franchise history Wednesday afternoon, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning...the A's homered in all three games in Milwaukee (five total) to snap a five-game homerless streak, which was a season-high...have now hit 10 homers in the last five games....scored 10 runs Monday night on a season-high 19 hits (previous: 18, May 25 at Houston)...are now batting .272 (181 for 665) with 96 runs scored over the last 19 games (5.05 per game) after hitting .219 with 104 runs scored over the previous 27 contests (3.85 per game)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (250) and top the American League in hit by pitches (27)...are tied for second in the AL in intentional walks (15), and rank third in doubles (129) and on-base percentage (.332) and tied for third in extra base hits (201).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Yoenis Céspedes committed a fielding error Wednesday afternoon, snapping the A's five-game errorless streak...the streak matched the A's second longest of the season...had a seven-game errorless streak May 17-24, which matched their longest over the last five years (Sept. 12-18, 2009)...however, have committed 34 errors for the season, which is tied for sixth most in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 27-13 (.675) record in night games compared to 11-12 (.478) during the day...own the best night record in the American League and the fifth worst mark during the day...have a 3.29 ERA (134 er in 366.2 ip) at night compared to 4.50 (101 er in 202.0 ip) during the day...have the lowest night ERA in the AL and the fourth highest day ERA.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this seven-game road trip to Milwaukee (2-1) and Chicago (2-0)...have won 10 of the last 13 road games and are 20-15 on the road...swept a three-game series from Chicago on the last homestand and have an eight-game home winning streak...that is the A's longest home winning streak since a 10-game streak from Aug. 11-Sept. 1, 2006...are 18-10 in Oakland.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 10-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for the American League lead in last at bats wins...are 8-1 in their past nine games decided by one run and are now 13-6 (.684) in one-run games for the season...lead the AL in wins and have the second best record in one-run decisions...are 5-2 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the most wins in extra inning games in the AL and are tied for the fourth best record...have three wins when trailing after eight innings...have four "walk-off" wins.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are 5 for 60 (.083) with two homers, seven RBI, eight walks and a sacrifice hit...lead the AL in plate appearances (69), rank second in walks and tied for second in homers and RBI...have the lowest batting average...the A's also lead the AL in plate appearances (89) and grounded into double plays (7) with the bases loaded...are tied for the lead in bases loaded doubles (6), rank second in walks (7) and are second in RBI (56) ...are 14-8 when the opponent starts a left-hander.

17 GAMES IN 17 DAYS: The A's are 13-2 during this 17-day stretch without a day off that began May 24 at Houston and concludes this Sunday at Chicago...it matches their longest stretch without a day off for the season (Aug. 23-Sept. 8).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 6-1 in the month of June...are batting .290 (75 for 259) with 34 runs scored (4.86 per game) and the pitching staff has a 2.19 ERA (16 er in 65.2 ip) and .218 (52 for 238) opponents batting average...went 16-12 in May, marking just the second time in the last six years the A's finished with a winning record in the month (16-12 in 2010)...also went 16-12 in April and now have six consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June...that is the A's longest such streak since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...scored 107 runs in May (3.82 per game) after tallying a Major League leading 158 in April (5.64 per game)...were hit by a pitch an American League leading 15 times in May, which is the A's most in any month since they were hit 21 times in June, 2001...stole an AL low seven stolen bases in May after stealing an AL leading 25 bases in April...the A's pitching staff compiled a 3.50 ERA in May after posting a 4.31 mark in April...had the second lowest May ERA in the AL after posting the fourth highest April ERA.
