TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 11, 2003: Roy Oswalt, Peter Munro, Kirk Saarloos, Brad Lidge, Octavio Dotel and Billy Wagner set a Major League record for the most pitchers to combine on a no-hitter as Houston blanks the Yankees, 8-0, at the original Yankee Stadium. It marks the first time the Yankees had been no-hit at home since 1952.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 12, 2008: Hideki Matsui became the first Yankee to hit a grand slam on his birthday, in a 4-1 win at Oakland.

MO MOMENT

June 11, 1999: RHP Mariano Rivera recorded his 100th career save at Florida, entering the game with two on and two out and inducing a Kevin Millar fielder's choice groundout.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will begin a four-game series tonight at Oakland...is the second stop of a 10-game West coast road trip, which began with a series win at Seattle (3-games-to-1) and concludes with a three-game set at Los Angeles-AL from Friday-Sunday...is tied for the Yankees' longest road trip of the season (also 9/9-19 at Baltimore, Boston and Toronto)...are coming off a 4-4 homestand that began with series losses vs. the Mets (0-2) and Red Sox (1-2) and concluded with a sweep vs. Cleveland (3-0).

- ▶ Have won six of their last seven games and seven of their last 10 since 5/31...comes on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak...at 11 games over .500, are one shy of their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Have gone 36-22 (.621) since 4/7 after starting the season 1-4, tied with Pittsburgh for the second-best mark in the Majors over the stretch behind only St. Louis (39-19, .672).
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 26 of 39 games on the road from 5/7-6/16, which will wrap after this trip...Monday's off day was the Yankees' first since 5/23, snapping a stretch of 17 straight days of games with no off days.

SUNDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees won the series finale at Seattle, 2-1...**C Chris Stewart** (2-for-4) drove in **RF Ichiro Suzuki** (0-for-3) with a two-out ninth-inning single to provide the margin of victory...**RHP David Phelps** held the Mariners to just 3H and 1ER in 6.0IP (3BB, 6K) in the start...**RHP Mariano Rivera** tossed a scoreless ninth inning for his 23rd save of the season and second in as many days...**CF Brett Gardner** (4-for-5) recorded his fourth career game of at least four hits, second this season (also 4H on 4/19 at Cleveland).

FIVE ALIVE: The Yankees are 20-0 this season when scoring at least five runs in a game...according to *Elias*, are the only Major League team that is undefeated this season in such games.

KEEP YOUR AWARDS: The Yankees, who face 2005 AL Cy Young Award winner Bartolo Colon tonight, are 6-0 vs. past Cy Young Award winners this season (including a win on 5/4 over Colon).

- ▶ **LHP CC Sabathia** will make his third such start tonight against a former Cy Young Award winner, having defeated Justin Verlander on 4/7 at Comerica Park (7.0IP, 4H, 0ER) and earning a no-decision in a Yankees win on 5/14 vs. Felix Hernandez (6.1IP, 10H, 3R, 2ER).

GETTING STINGY: Yankees pitchers combined to allow just 7R in their four-game series vs. Seattle...marked their fewest combined runs surrendered in a series of at least four games since holding Tampa Bay to 6R total in a four-game sweep from 9/7-9/09 at Yankee Stadium...did so on the road for the first time since 7/9-12/98 at Tropicana Field (6R total in a four-game sweep).

- ▶ Surrendered 1R or less in three out of their last four games (all at Seattle) for the first time since limiting opponents to 1R or fewer in four of five games from 6/3-8/12.
- ▶ Have held opponents to 4R or less in each of their last eight games, their longest such stretch since an 11-game stretch from 6/8-19/12.
- ▶ **YANKEES STARTERS:** Have held opponents to 3H or less, 1R or less and tossed at least 6.0IP in three of their last four games, included each of their last two...marks their first such back-to-back starts since 4/24-25/11 (at Baltimore and vs. Chicago-AL).

NO THIEVES ALLOWED: Yankees catchers have combined to catch 36.0% of potential base stealers this season (9-of-25), the sixth-best caught stealing pct. in the Majors, and second in the AL behind only Baltimore (46.7%)...the 16SB allowed are tied with Baltimore for the fewest for any team in 2013.

- ▶ Yankees baserunners have been caught just 11 times in 49 stolen base attempts this year (77.6% success rate, 10th-best in the Majors)...have been caught just once in their last seven attempts.

SMALL BALL: The Yankees are 8-14 this year when they don't hit a home run...is one more victory than their total amount of wins from all last season in games in which they didn't homer.

AT FIRST: The Yankees have scored first in 15 of their last 19 road games—including each of their last six—scoring at least once in the first inning in eight of the contests.

GREEN THUMB: **CF Brett Gardner** has hit safely in 15 of his last 17 games since 5/24 (including each of his last seven), batting .365 (23-for-63) over the stretch...has scored at least one run in 16 of his last 24 starts...went 9-for-17 (.529) with 3R, 4 doubles and 1RBI in the just-completed four-game series at Seattle.

- ▶ Was named the AL "Player of the Week" on Monday, his first career weekly honor...batted .520 (13-for-25) with 5R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI in seven games.
- ▶ **LEADING OFF:** Has driven in 27 runs while leading off this season, second in the Majors to Chicago-AL's Alejandro De Aza (30)...his 23 extra-base hits from the top spot in the lineup are most in the AL and third-most in the Majors.

OPENING ACT: The Yankees are 13-9 in series openers in 2013, winning eight of their last 11...are 6-5 in openers on the road, winning three of their last four.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 18-13 (.581) on the road this season, the third-highest road win pct. in the Majors in 2013 behind St. Louis (22-10, .688) and Boston (19-11, .633)...have won 12 of their last 19 road games.

ENTER SANDMAN: **RHP Mariano Rivera** is tied with Pittsburgh's Jason Grilli for most saves in the Majors this season (23)...converted each of his first 18 chances this season, prior to blowing his first and only save on 5/28 at the Mets...marked his second-longest streak of converted save chances to start a season behind a 28-game stretch in 2008.

- ▶ Recorded save No. 23 in Sunday's win at Seattle in team game No. 63...marks the second-fewest number of team games needed to reach 23 saves in his career behind 2004 (55th game).
- ▶ Has reached the 20 saves plateau for the 16th time in his career, breaking a tie with Trevor Hoffman for the most such seasons in Baseball history...is seeking to reach the 25-save plateau for the 16th time, further extending his all time record.
- ▶ Has converted his last 12 save chances against the A's since Marco Scutaro's "walk-off" three-run HR on 4/15/07...is 18-for-22 in save opportunities at the Oakland Coliseum, riding a streak of six straight since that April '07 blown save.

YOUNG GUNS: Yankees rookie pitchers (Claiborne, Marshall, Nuno and Warren) have combined for a 2.85 ERA (72.2IP, 23ER) this season.

GOOOAAAL: Tonight at Yankee Stadium, reigning World Cup champion Spain will play Ireland in a soccer “friendly”...will be the second soccer game in the Bronx this season after Manchester City defeated Chelsea, 5-3, on 5/25.

▶ On 5/21, it was announced that the New York Yankees partnered with Manchester City Football Club to acquire Major League Soccer’s 20th expansion club...the new team will be named New York City Football Club (NYCFC) and expects to begin play in 2015.

BACK IN THE DAY
RHP Mariano Rivera earned his first Major League win on 5/28/1995 at Oakland (5.1IP, 7H, 1ER, 3BB, 1K)...the Athletics’ starting pitcher in that game was current Yankees Bullpen Coach Mike Harkey.

PETTITTE’S PROWESS: **LHP Andy Pettitte** earned his 250th career win on Saturday at Seattle...became the 45th pitcher in Major League history to reach the plateau, and the 24th to reach that figure over the last 70 seasons (since 1944)...according to *Elias Sports Bureau*, only six of that latter group of the most recent pitchers to reach 250 wins did so with fewer losses than Pettitte, who was 250-145: Randy Johnson (250-130), Roger Clemens (250-136), Greg Maddux (250-140), Jim Palmer (250-142), Tom Seaver (250-142) and Mike Mussina (250-144).

IN THE NIX OF TIME: **INF Jayson Nix** has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games with an at-bat, batting .340 (16-for-47)...included was a season-high seven-game hitting streak from 5/24-6/1 (one shy of his career high)...is batting a team-high .310 (27-for-87) with 13R and 8RBI in 27 road games this season.

BORNE TO PITCH
RHP Preston Claiborne has yet to walk a batter in his Major League career (13G, 18.1IP, 14K)...since 1900, is the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk over his first 13 career Major League outings coming as a reliever only...according to *Elias*, the only pitchers to begin their ML careers with longer streaks of consecutive appearances without a walk are Dave Veres (14G, 1994 Astros) and Jose Arredondo (14G, 2008 Angels).

ON THE MEND: **RHP Michael Pineda** began a rehab assignment with Single-A Tampa on Sunday at Lakeland (DET), holding the Flying Tigers to 1R (0ER) in 4.1IP (2H, 1BB, 4K).

▶ **LHP Cesar Cabral** has pitched at Single-A Tampa and Double-A Trenton on his current rehab assignment, combining to post a 6.75 ERA (12.0IP, 9ER) with no decisions (15H, 10BB, 10K, 2HR, 3WP, 2HP) in eight relief appearances...he was acquired by the Yankees from the Royals who had chosen him in the 2011 Rule V Draft, and missed all of last season after suffering a left elbow fracture.

NO FREEBIES: **Yankees pitchers** have issued 156 walks this season, tied with Atlanta for the second-fewest in the Majors, one walk shy of the Major League lead held by St. Louis (155)...are averaging 2.51 BB/9.0IP, the second-lowest mark in the AL behind Oakland (2.48), fourth-lowest in the Majors and the Yankees’ lowest mark since 2003 (2.31).

MAKING THEM COUNT
 Of the Yankees’ 70HR this season, 23 have tied the game or given the Yankees a lead at any point of a game, with six of those coming in the seventh inning or later.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Yankees have had 32 of their 63 games this season decided by two runs or less (50.8%), including 26 of their last 43 since 4/25...have gone a Major League-best 22-10 (.688) in those contests...have had 42 games decided by three runs or less (66.7%), going 27-15 (.643) - the second-best such winning percentage in the Majors behind Pittsburgh (30-15, .667).

▶ Have gone 11-6 (.647) in one-run games this season, tied with Washington for the fourth-best mark in the Majors behind Cleveland (11-5, .688), Arizona (15-8, .652) and Oakland (13-7, .650)...started 5-0 in one-run contests, becoming the last team in the Majors to lose a one-run game.

SCHEDULING NOTES: Beginning with this road trip, the Yankees play 11 series leading up to the All-Star break...of those 11 series, six are against teams currently under .500 - including three of four from 6/6-19 (Seattle, Los Angeles-AL and Los Angeles-NL: nine games in a 12-game stretch).

OUT FRONT: The Yankees are 27-4 (.871) this season when scoring first, tied with Boston for the best such record in the Majors this season...started the season 19-0 when scoring first and became the last team to lose in 2013...according to *Elias*, became the third team in the Modern Era (since 1900) to start a season with as many consecutive wins when scoring first, joining the 1902 NL Champion Pittsburgh Pirates (19-0) and the 1990 World Series Champion Cincinnati Reds (20-0, whose bullpen coach was Larry Rothschild)...*Elias* also notes that it was the Yankees’ longest such stretch at any point in the year since 2002 (19 from 5/7-6/11)...have lost just six games this season when leading at any point in the contest—the fewest such losses in the Majors in 2013.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: The Yankees have been held to 4R or less in 13 of their last 16 games, including a stretch of nine straight from 5/25-6/2...marked their longest such stretch since 10 in-a-row 5/28-6/7/05...their 43 games of four runs or fewer are tied for sixth-most in the Majors (tied for fourth-most in the AL)...however, the Yankees’ 17 wins in such games are the most in the Majors while their .395 winning percentage is second-best behind Pittsburgh (16-23, .410)...have scored more than four runs in just two of their last 11 road games.

KEEPIN’ IT CLOSE: The last 11 games between the Yankees and A’s have been decided by two runs or less, including eight one-run contests.

WEDNESDAY’S PROBABLE STARTER at OAKLAND: RHP PHIL HUGHES (3-4, 4.80)

RHP Phil Hughes, 26, will make his 13th start of the season on Wednesday vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.Co Coliseum... will be his 10th career appearance (seventh start) vs. Seattle and second this season...**last started** on 6/6 at Seattle and earned the win in the 6-1 Yankees’ victory, allowing just 1R on 3H in 7.0IP (0ER, 2BB, 7K)...improved to 4-0 with a 0.82 ERA (22.0IP, 2ER) in five career appearances (three starts) at Safeco Field...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (23rd overall) of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft...is signed through the 2013

HUGHES vs. OAKLAND

Is 3-1 with a 4.12 ERA (39.1IP, 18ER) in nine career games (six starts) vs. the Athletics...as a starter, is 3-1 with a 4.63 ERA (35.0IP, 18ER).

★ **Last started vs. Oakland** on 5/4/13 at Yankee Stadium and earned the win in the 4-2 Yankees’ victory, holding the A’s to 4H in 8.0 shutout innings (2BB, 9K).

★ **Last started vs. Oakland on the road** on 7/21/12 at O.co Coliseum and recorded the loss in the 2-1 Yankees defeat, allowing 2ER on 4H in 7.2IP (2BB, 6K, 2HR)... marked his first loss ever in the state of California, after going 2-0 with a 5.09 ERA in six previous combined games (four starts).

TONIGHT'S STARTER: LHP CC SABATHIA (6-4, 3.74 ERA)

LHP CC Sabathia, 32, will make his 14th start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum... will be his 27th career start vs. Oakland and second this season... **last started** on 6/5 vs. Cleveland and earned the complete-game win in the 6-4 Yankees' victory, allowing 4ER on 7H in 9.0IP (1BB, 9K, 1HR)...retired his first 14 batters faced...improved to 26-11 in day game starts since 2009... is in the fifth year of an eight-year contract (with a vesting option for 2017) re-signed with the Yankees on 10/31/11.

YOU COMPLETE ME: Recorded his 36th career complete game and 28th complete-game win in his last start on 6/5 vs. Cleveland...was his 10th complete-game as a Yankee, and his first since 8/3/12 vs. Seattle...was also his first CG against the Indians - the team that drafted him in 1998.

MOVING UP THE RANKS: Owns 901K as a Yankee, eight shy of tying Bob Turley (909K) for the 15th-most strikeouts in franchise history...recorded the 892nd strikeout of his Yankees career in his start on 5/31 vs. Boston, surpassing Fritz Peterson (891) for sole possession of 16th place on the franchise's all-time list (see chart to the right).

ON THE ROAD: Is 42-20 with a 3.52 ERA (506.0IP, 198ER) in 74 starts on the road since joining the Yankees in 2009, tying for the most such victories in the Majors over that time span with Justin Verlander.
 ◦ Is 2-3 with a 4.61 ERA (52.2IP, 27ER) over his last eight starts on the road since 9/3/12, after going 7-1 with a 3.49 ERA (69.2IP, 27ER) in his 10 prior starts away from Yankee Stadium before that date (since 4/23/12).

RIGHTING THE SHIP: Is 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA (95.2IP, 28ER) in 13 starts following a Yankees loss since the start of the 2012 season...has tossed at least 7.0 innings in 12 of those starts, allowing 3ER or less in 12 of those appearances.

ON PATROL: Has walked two or fewer batters in 36 of his last 41 starts dating back to last season...has not allowed a SB over his last 16 starts since 9/21/12, one start shy of his career-high (17GS; 6/5-9/12/03).

SPECIAL K: Sabathia's 10K in his start on 5/31 vs. Boston marked the 17th time in his Yankees career that he struck out 10 or more batters in a game, tying Al Downing for third-most in franchise history...only Ron Guidry (23 games) and David Cone (21 games) own more 10K games as a Yankee.

VS. LEFTIES: Has allowed 12H over his last 44AB (.273), including two doubles and 3HR, to left-handed hitters over his last five starts since 5/14...prior to that date, had allowed just 5H in 30AB (.167) vs. lefties with 0 extra-base hits.

BUILT TO LAST: Owns a 80-33 (.708) record as a Yankee (2009-13), marking the second-most wins in the Majors over the stretch behind Justin Verlander's 86 victories...owns 82 starts of at least 7.0IP and 3ER-or-less over the same time span, marking the fourth-most starts in MLB behind Felix Hernandez (95 such games), Verlander (85 such games) and Cliff Lee (83 such games).

SHUTDOWN: Has made 18 scoreless starts since joining the Yankees prior to the 2009 season...is one of just five current AL pitchers with as many-or-more scoreless starts over the stretch, joining Jered Weaver-26, Felix Hernandez-24, Jon Lester-23 and Justin Verlander-20.

LEADING OFF: Has allowed the first run of a game in eight of his 13 starts this season and a first-inning run in four of those outings...his 2ER allowed in the first inning of his start on 4/17 vs. Arizona snapped a 13-start stretch dating back to 8/3/12 in which he held opponents scoreless in the opening frame of a game (one shy of his career-high)

BOSTON BAKED BEANS: Notes from Sabathia's outing on 5/31 vs. Boston (W, 7.1IP, 6H, 1ER, 0BB, 10K):
 ◦ Was the fifth time in his career that he recorded at least 10K without walking a batter and first time as a Yankee (also 9/7/05 at Detroit, 9/26/06 vs. Chicago-AL, 7/29/07 vs. Minnesota and 7/18/08 at San Francisco).
 ◦ Marked the seventh time in his career that he started a game with his team on a losing streak of five-or-more games...with the victory, his team has now gone 4-3 in those seven starts with Sabathia going 3-2 with a 2.84 (50.2IP, 16ER) and winning his last three.

THREE IS BETTER THAN TWO: The Yankees turned a triple play in the eighth inning of Sabathia's start on 4/12 vs. Baltimore (scored 4-6-5-6-5-3-4, the first in Major League history)...was just the team's second triple play turned since 1969 (also 4/22/10 at Oakland, 5-4-3, Rodriguez to Cano to Nick Johnson on a grounder hit by Kurt Suzuki), both coming with Sabathia on the mound.
