OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics are 40-27 for the season...that is the A's best start since 1990 (43-24)...have won nine of the last 12 games, 15 of the last 19 and 20 of the last 25.
- Dan Straily won his career-high third straight game...is 3-0 with a 2.20 ERA (8 er in 32.2 ip) in his last five starts.
- Grant Balfour is a perfect 17 for 17 in save opportunities and has converted each of his last 35 save chances...is now the only American League closer without a blown save...that is the longest season-opening streak without a blown save by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992.
- John Jaso (2 for 4, 2b, 2 rbi, bb, so) extended his hitting streak to a new career-high eight games with an RBI double in the fifth inning...is 12 for 31 (.387) during the streak.
- Brandon Moss (2 for 4, 2 r, 2 hr, 3 rbi, 2 so) hit a career-high tying two home runs (three times, last: April 29 vs. Los Angeles)...each of his last five hits have been home runs.
- Seth Smith (1 for 1, 4 bb) had a career-high four walks.

- The New York Yankees are now 3-3 on this 10-game road trip to Seattle (3-1), Oakland (0-2), and Los Angeles (0-0)...have gone a seasonhigh five games without a home run...that matches their longest homerless streak since 2000.
- Phil Hughes is 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA (18 er in 29.1 ip) over his last six starts.
- Robinson Cano (1 for 4) is batting .265 (44 for 166) at night compared to .299 (26 for 87) during the day.
- Travis Hafner (0 for 4, 2 so) is five for his last 44 (.114).
- Jayson Nix (1 for 4, rbi, sb) has hit safely in 13 of his last 15 games with an at-bat...is 17 for 55 (.309) during that span.
- Mark Teixeira (0 for 3, rbi) is batting .181 (8 for 44) in 12 games since being reinstated from the 60-day disabled list.
