**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees will continue their three-game series tonight at Oakland...is the second stop of a 10-game West coast road trip, which began with a series win at Seattle (3-games-to-1) and concludes with a three-game set at Los Angeles-AL from Friday-Sunday...is tied for the Yankees' longest road trip of the season (also 9/9-19 at Baltimore, Boston and Toronto)...are coming off a 4-4 homestand that began with series losses vs. the Mets (0-2) and Red Sox (1-2) and concluded with a sweep vs. Cleveland (3-0).

- ▶ Have won six of their last eight games and seven of their last 11 since 5/31...comes on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak...at 10 games over .500, are two shy of their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Have gone 36-23 (.610) since 4/7 after starting the season 1-4, the third-best mark in the Majors over the stretch behind only St. Louis (40-19, .678) and Pittsburgh (37-22, .627).
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 26 of 39 games on the road from 5/7-6/16, which will wrap after this trip...Monday's off day was the Yankees' first since 5/23, snapping a stretch of 17 straight days of games with no off days.

**YESTERDAY'S RECAP:** The Yankees dropped their series opener, 6-4, at Oakland...scored all four runs and collected seven of their 10H over the final two innings...LHP CC Sabathia took the loss, allowing 8H and 6ER in 6.0IP (1BB, 3K, 2HR)...now has 1,000.0IP as a Yankee...1B Mark Teixeira (2-for-5) drove in three of the Yankees' runs on two RBI singles...CF Brett Gardner (2-for-5) recorded his third straight multi-hit game...RHP Preston Claiborne (1.0IP, 1K) tossed a perfect seventh and has still not walked a batter in his Major League Career (see box at right).

**TAKE TWO:** The Yankees are 13-9 in the second game of a series this season, losing four of their last five...are 7-4 in the second game of a series on the road.

**DERBY DUTY:** On Tuesday, Major League Baseball announced 2B Robinson Cano will serve as the American League's Home Run Derby captain for the second straight season.

**NO THIEVES ALLOWED:** Yankees catchers have combined to catch 36.0% of potential base stealers this season (9-of-25), the sixth-best caught stealing pct. in the Majors, and second in the AL behind only Baltimore (46.7%)...the 16SB allowed are tied with Baltimore for the fewest for any team in 2013.

- ▶ Yankees baserunners have been caught just 11 times in 49 stolen base attempts this year (77.6% success rate, 10th-best in the Majors)...have been caught just once in their last seven attempts.

**WELCOME ABOARD:** The Yankees have agreed to terms with 3B Eric Jagielo, the club's first of three first-round picks (26th pick overall) in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Notre Dame University...the Yankees also inked SS Tyler Wade (fourth rd), RHP David Palladino (fifth), SS John Murphy (sixth), RHP Philip Walby (12th), RHP Cale Coshov (13th), LHP Caleb Smith (14th), CF Jordan Barnes (15th), 2B Derek Toadvine (22nd), RHP Sam Agnew-Wieland (24th), C Trent Garrison (28th), SS Kevin Cornelius (31) and 2B Hector Crespo (34th).

**SMALL BALL:** The Yankees are 8-15 this year when they don't hit a home run...is one more win than their total amount from all of last season in games in which they didn't homer (7-24 in 2012).

- ▶ Yankees batters have gone a season-high four straight games without a home run, their longest such stretch since 7/15-18/11 (also 4G)...is one game shy of their longest homerless stretch since 2000 (5G from 5/17-21-06).

**GREEN THUMB:** CF Brett Gardner has hit safely in 16 of his last 18 games since 5/24 batting .368 (25-for-68) over the stretch...is currently riding a season-high-tying eight-game hitting streak (also 4/13-21 and 5/24-31)...is one game shy of the Yankees' season high (Youkilis, nine straight from 4/1-12)...has scored at least one run in 17 of his last 25 starts...went 9-for-17 (.529) with 3R, 4 doubles and 1RBI in the just-completed four-game series at Seattle.

- ▶ Was named the AL "Player of the Week" on Monday, his first career weekly honor...batted .520 (13-for-25) with 5R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI in seven games.
- ▶ **LEADING OFF:** Has driven in 27 runs while leading off this season, second in the Majors to Chicago-AL's Alejandro De Aza (30)...his 23 extra-base hits from the top spot in the lineup are tied with Oakland's Coco Crisp for most in the AL and third-most in the Majors.

**IN THE NIX OF TIME:** INF Jayson Nix has hit safely in 12 of his last 14 games with an at-bat, batting .314 (16-for-51)...included was a season-high seven-game hitting streak from 5/24-6/1 (one shy of his career high)...is batting a career-high .297 (27-for-91) with 13R and 8RBI in 28 road games this season.

- ▶ Has not been caught in his last 11 stolen base attempts (since 8/15/12), the longest active streak among current Yankees (credit: Elias).

### BORN TO PITCH

**RHP Preston Claiborne** has yet to walk a batter in his Major League career (14G, 19.1IP, 15K)...since 1900, is the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk over his first 14 career Major League outings coming as a reliever only...according to Elias, the only other pitchers to begin their ML careers with a streak of at least 14 consecutive appearances without a walk are Dave Veres (14G, 1994 Astros) and Jose Arredondo (14G, 2008 Angels).

### MAKING HIS MARK

**1B Mark Teixeira** has 20 career home runs at O.co Coliseum, tied with Rafael Palmeiro for second-most by a visiting player behind Alex Rodriguez (21)...since joining the Yankees in 2009, has 8HR and 23RBI in 20 games in Oakland (credit: Elias).

Rivera is the only pitcher to make more than 1,000 appearances with one club.

**ENTER SANDMAN:** RHP Mariano Rivera is tied with Baltimore's Jim Johnson and Pittsburgh's Jason Grilli for most saves in the Majors this season (23)...converted each of his first 18 chances this season, prior to blowing his first and only save on 5/28 at the Mets...marked his second-longest streak of converted save chances to start a season behind a 28-game stretch in 2008.

- ▶ Recorded save No. 23 in Sunday's win at Seattle in team game No. 63...marks the second-fewest number of team games needed to reach 23 saves in his career behind 2004 (55th game).
- ▶ Has reached the 20 saves plateau for the 16th time in his career, breaking a tie with Trevor Hoffman for the most such seasons in Baseball history...is seeking to reach the 25-save plateau for the 16th time, further extending his all time record.
- ▶ Has converted his last 12 save chances against the A's since Marco Scutaro's "walk-off" three-run HR on 4/15/07...is 18-for-22 in save opportunities at the Oakland Coliseum, riding a streak of six straight since that April '07 blown save.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees are 18-14 (.563) on the road in 2013, the fourth-highest road win pct. in the Majors behind St. Louis (23-10, .697), Boston (19-12, .613) and Baltimore (20-15, .571)...have won 12 of their last 20 road games.

**YOUNG GUNS:** Yankees rookie pitchers (Claiborne, Marshall, Nuno and Warren) have combined for a 2.81 ERA (73.2IP, 23ER) this season.

**Wednesday, June 12, 2013 at Oakland – 10:05 p.m. ET**

**GOOOOAAAL:** On Tuesday night at Yankee Stadium, reigning World Cup champion Spain defeated Ireland, 2-0, in a soccer "friendly"...was the second soccer game in the Bronx this season after Manchester City defeated Chelsea, 5-3, on 5/25.

- ▶ On 5/21, it was announced that the New York Yankees partnered with Manchester City Football Club to acquire Major League Soccer's 20th expansion club...the new team will be named New York City Football Club (NYCFC) and expects to begin play in 2015.

**GETTING STINGY:** Yankees pitchers combined to allow just 7R in their four-game series vs. Seattle...marked their fewest combined runs surrendered in a series of at least 4G since holding Tampa Bay to 6R total in a four-game sweep from 9/7-9/09 at Yankee Stadium...did so on the road for the first time since 7/9-12/98 at Tropicana Field (6R total in a four-game sweep).

- ▶ Surrendered 1R or less in three out of their four games at Seattle...limited opponents to 1R or fewer in at least three of four straight for the first time since doing so in four of five games from 6/3-8/12.
- ▶ Tuesday's game at Oakland, in which the Yankees allowed 6R, snapped a streak of eight straight games in which their opponents scored 4R or less...was their longest such stretch since an 11-game stretch from 6/8-19/12.

**BACK IN THE DAY**  
**RHP Mariano Rivera** earned his first Major League win on 5/28/1995 at Oakland (5.1IP, 7H, 1ER, 3BB, 1K)...the Athletics' starting pitcher in that game was current Yankees Bullpen Coach Mike Harkey.

**AT FIRST:** The Yankees have scored first in 15 of their last 20 road games—including six of their last seven—scoring at least once in the first inning in eight of those contests.

**FIVE ALIVE:** The Yankees are 20-0 this season when scoring at least five runs in a game...according to *Elias*, are the only Major League team that is undefeated this season in such games.

**MAKING THEM COUNT**  
 Of the Yankees' 70HR this season, 23 have tied the game or given the Yankees a lead at any point of a game, with six of those coming in the seventh inning or later.

**NO FREEBIES:** Yankees pitchers have issued a Major League-low 157 walks this season...are averaging 2.49 BB/9.0IP, the third-lowest mark in the Majors behind St. Louis (2.47) and Atlanta (2.47) and the Yankees' lowest mark since 2003 (2.31).

**CLOSE ENCOUNTERS:** The Yankees have had 33 of their 64 games this season decided by two runs or less (51.6%), including 27 of their last 44 since 4/25...have gone an AL-best 22-11 (.667) in those contests, tied with Pittsburgh for the best such record in the Majors...have had 43 games decided by three runs or less (67.2%), going 27-16 (.628) - the second-best such winning percentage in the Majors behind Pittsburgh (30-15, .667).

- ▶ Have gone 11-6 (.647) in one-run games this season, tied with Washington for the fourth-best mark in the Majors behind Cleveland (11-5, .688), Arizona (15-8, .652) and Oakland (13-7, .650)...started 5-0 in one-run contests, becoming the last team in the Majors to lose a one-run game.

**SCHEDULING NOTES:** Beginning with this road trip, the Yankees play 11 series leading up to the All-Star break...of those 11 series, six are against teams currently under .500 - including three of four from 6/6-19 (Seattle, Los Angeles-AL and Los Angeles-NL: nine games in a 12-game stretch).

**OUT FRONT:** The Yankees are 27-4 (.871) this season when scoring first, the best such record in the Majors this season...started the season 19-0 when scoring first and became the last team to lose in 2013...according to *Elias*, became the third team in the Modern Era (since 1900) to start a season with as many consecutive wins when scoring first, joining the 1902 NL Champion Pittsburgh Pirates (19-0) and the 1990 World Series Champion Cincinnati Reds (20-0, whose bullpen coach was Larry Rothschild)...*Elias* also notes that it was the Yankees' longest such stretch at any point in the year since 2002 (19 from 5/7-6/11)...have lost just six games this season when leading at any point in the contest—the fewest such losses in the Majors in 2013.

**ON THE MEND:** RHP **Michael Pineda** began a rehab assignment with Single-A Tampa on Sunday at Lakeland (DET), holding the Flying Tigers to 1R (0ER) in 4.1IP (2H, 1BB, 4K)...is expected to make his next rehab start on Friday.

- ▶ **LHP Cesar Cabral** has pitched at Single-A Tampa and Double-A Trenton on his current rehab assignment, combining to post a 6.75 ERA (12.0IP, 9ER) with no decisions (15H, 10BB, 10K, 2HR, 3WP, 2HP) in eight relief appearances...he was acquired by the Yankees from the Royals who had chosen him in the 2011 Rule V Draft, and missed all of last season after suffering a left elbow fracture.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** The Yankees have been held to 4R or less in 16 of their last 20 games, including a stretch of nine straight from 5/25-6/2...marked their longest such stretch since 10 in-a-row 5/28-6/7/05...their 44 games of four runs or fewer are tied for fifth-most in the Majors (tied for third-most in the AL)...however, the Yankees' 17 wins in such games are the most in the Majors while their .386 winning percentage is third-best behind Pittsburgh (16-23, .410) and Baltimore (12-18, .400)...have scored more than four runs in just four of their last 17 road games.

**AT O.co COLISEUM:** The Yankees are making their lone trip to Oakland this season with this three-game series...have lost five straight at O.co Coliseum, their longest losing streak in Oakland since dropping six straight from 5/15-8/12/01...played two series last season at O.co Coliseum sweeping a three-game set and getting swept in a four-game series (all one-run losses)...had won nine straight at the Coliseum prior to the four-game sweep...are 24-14 at the A's since the start of 2004...lost the 2012 road season series, snapping a stretch of four straight winning road season series at the A's.

**KEEPIN' IT CLOSE:** The last 12 games between the Yankees and A's have been decided by two runs or less, including eight one-run contests.

**THURSDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER at OAKLAND: RHP HIROKI KURODA (6-5, 2.84)**

**RHP Hiroki Kuroda**, 38, will make his 14th start of the season on Thursday vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum...will be his fourth career start vs. Oakland and first this season...**last started** on 6/7 at Seattle and recorded the loss in the 4-1 Yankees' defeat, allowing 4ER on 8H in 6.1IP (3BB, 6K, 1WP)...dropped to 2-3 with a 3.27 ERA (33.0IP, 12ER) in five career starts vs. the Mariners...allowed 4ER or more for just the second time in 13 starts this season...signed a one-year contract with the Yankees on 11/20/12.

**KURODA vs. OAKLAND**

Has made just three career starts vs. Oakland, combining to go 1-2 with a 4.12 ERA (19.2IP, 9ER)...has allowed 5R or more in two of those three outings.

- ★ **Last started vs. Oakland** on 9/23/12 at Yankee Stadium and recorded the loss in the 5-4 Yankees' defeat, allowing 5R/4ER on 7H in 5.2IP (3BB, 5K, 1HR, 2WP)...his 2WP tied a season-high.
- ★ **Last started vs. Oakland on the road** on 5/27/12 in his only career start at O.co Coliseum and earned his only career win vs. the Athletics in the 2-0 Yankees' victory, allowing 4H in 8.0 scoreless innings (1BB, 3K).

# TONIGHT'S STARTER: RHP PHIL HUGHES (3-4, 4.80 ERA)

**RHP Phil Hughes**, 26, will make his 13th start of the season tonight vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.Co Coliseum... will be his 10th career appearance (seventh start) vs. Oakland and second this season... **last started** on 6/6 at Seattle and earned the win in the 6-1 Yankees' victory, allowing just 1R on 3H in 7.0IP (0ER, 2BB, 7K)... improved to 4-0 with a 0.82 ERA (22.0IP, 2ER) in five career appearances (three starts) at Safeco Field... was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (23rd overall) of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft... is signed through the 2013 season.

**WHEN THEY LAST SAW HIM:** Notes from Hughes' first start of the season vs. Oakland on 5/4 (W, 8.0IP, 4H, 0R, 2BB, 9K):

- Became the first Yankees right-handed starter to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings and strike out at least nine batters in a game since Mike Mussina on 9/14/04 at Kansas City (8.0IP, 3H, 0R, 11K)... was the first to do so in the Bronx since Roger Clemens on 6/18/03 vs. Tampa Bay (8.0IP, 1H, 2BB, 9K).
- Tossed a season-high 118 pitches, his second-most ever in a game behind his 123 pitches thrown in a 6/3/12 CG win at Detroit.

**JUNEBUG:** Has gone 9-3 (.750) with a 3.53 ERA (89.1IP, 35ER) in 20 career June appearances (12 starts)... his .750 winning percentage in June is his highest during any calendar month in his career.

**STOPPER:** Has gone 19-9 in his last 34 starts that immediately followed a Yankees loss dating back to May 2009.

**HOMETOWN RIP-OFF:** The California-native has lost five of his last 12 decisions vs. AL West opponents since 7/22/11, going 4-5 with a 6.31 ERA (61.1IP, 43ER) in 12 starts over the stretch... has allowed 6ER or more in five of those outings and 3.1IP or less in four of those appearances.

**ON THE ROAD:** Has gone 26-23 with a 4.04 ERA (345.0IP, 155ER) in 80 career games (55 starts) on the road... has lost seven of his last 11 decisions away from Yankee Stadium since 7/7/12, going 4-7 with a 4.22 ERA (89.2IP, 42ER) in 15 starts over the stretch, registering 5.2IP or less in six of those outings.

**ALMOST, BUT NOT QUITE:** Has allowed 11HR after getting to an 0-2 count since the start of the 2012 season, marking the most such home runs allowed in the Majors over the last two seasons (2012-13) - four more than any other pitcher.

**HOMER HAPPY:** Did not give up a homer in his last outing on 6/6 at Seattle, snapping a streak of five consecutive games, since 5/10, in which he yielded at least 1HR... had been the third-longest such stretch of his career, with seven of his 12 total HR allowed this season coming during that time span.

**GRAND SHAM:** Has given up two grand slams this season - to Raul Ibanez on 5/15 vs. Seattle and to Mike Napoli on 6/1 vs. Boston - his first career grand slams allowed... *Elias* notes that only two Yankees pitchers in franchise history have allowed three grand slams in one season: Dennis Rasmussen in 1984 and Andy Pettitte in 1998.

**GETTING THE FIRE STARTED:** With a win tonight, will have earned the victory in consecutive starts for just the second time this season (also 5/4-10)... overall in his career, has won more than two starts in-a-row only five times in 115 career starts, with his longest streak occurring over a five-game stretch from 5/28-6/19/10.

**THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER:** *Elias* notes that the Yankees are 39-2 when staking Hughes to a lead of three runs or more in any of his career starts, with Hughes winning 36 of those outings.

**AIR HUGHES:** Owns a .68 groundball/flyball ratio, the lowest such percentage in which batted balls are put into play on the ground vs. in the air among all AL starters and the second-lowest among all Major League hurlers.

**NO FREEBIES:** Has walked two or fewer batters in 76 of his 94 starts since 2009, marking the second-most such outings on the Yankees staff during the time span behind CC Sabathia (103GS)... has registered exactly 2BB in eight of his 12 starts this season.

**TOP OF THE HEAP:** *Elias* also notes that Hughes' 55 career wins are the most victories by a player the Yankees selected in the first round of the First-Year Player Draft.

**THIS ONE'S GOING TO COUNT:** Has recorded a no-decision in two of his last four starts and in five of his last 10 outings since 4/18... recorded three consecutive no-decisions this season from 4/18-28, marking the first time in his career that he went at least three starts in a row without registering a win or a loss.

- Overall, has registered a decision in 36 of his last 44 starts since the beginning of the 2012 season and in 45 of his last 58 starts since 2011.

**LOFTY ASPIRATIONS:** Became the second Yankees pitcher in franchise history to make a start against the two reigning Cy Young Award winners in one season when he faced the Blue Jays' R.A. Dickey in his start on 4/28 vs. Toronto, five days after facing the Rays' David Price on 4/23 at Tampa Bay (credit: *Elias*)... despite recording a no-decision in each outing, combined to allow just 4ER in 13.0IP with 15K and only 3BB (2.77 ERA).

**STAR-BUCKED:** Notes from Hughes' start vs. Seattle on 5/15 at Yankee Stadium (L, 0.2IP, 6H, 7ER, 2BB, 0K, 1HR):

- Marked his shortest career outing, and the shortest by a Yankees starter since Bartolo Colon on 7/14/11 at Toronto (0.2IP, 6H, 8R, 3ER).
- Was just the second time a Yankees starter didn't make it out of the first inning in a game at the current Yankee Stadium (also Joba Chamberlain on 5/21/09 vs. Baltimore, 0.2IP, 2H, 0ER).

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Made his 100th career start on 9/13/12 at Boston, becoming the fifth pitcher to reach the plateau with the Yankees after being selected by the team in the amateur draft (which began in 1965)... also Stan Bahnsen, Doc Medich, Ron Guidry and Andy Pettitte (credit: *Elias*).
- Was 23-11 prior to turning 24 on 6/24/10, marking the most wins by a Yankee under 24 since 1965, when Mel Stottlemyre (29 wins) and Al Downing (32 wins) each celebrated their 24th birthday.
- With 18 wins in 2010 and 16 wins in 2012, is one of only two Yankees righthanders over the last 40 years (since 1972) to collect multiple seasons of at least 15 wins prior to turning 27 (also Doc Medich - 19 wins in 1974 and 16 wins in 1975).

## HUGHES vs. OAKLAND

Is 3-1 with a 4.12 ERA (39.1IP, 18ER) in 9 career games (6 starts) vs. the Athletics... as a starter, is 3-1 with a 4.63 ERA (35.0IP, 18ER)... in his lone two starts at O.co Coliseum, is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (15.0IP, 3ER) with 16K, pitching into the eighth inning and allowing 2ER or less in each of those outings.

- **Last started vs. Oakland** on 5/4/13 at Yankee Stadium and earned the win in the 4-2 Yankees' victory, holding the A's to 4H in 8.0 shutout innings (2BB, 9K).
- **Last started vs. Oakland on the road** on 7/21/12 at O.co Coliseum and recorded the loss in the 2-1 Yankees defeat, allowing 2ER on 4H in 7.2IP (2BB, 6K, 2HR)... marked his first loss ever in the state of California, after going 2-0 with a 5.09 ERA in six previous combined games (four starts).
