OAKLAND NOTES

- . The Oakland Athletics recorded their fifth "walk-off" win of the season...have swept the past five home series and have won 11 straight games at home, which is the third longest home winning streak in Oakland history and the longest since Aug. 13-Sept. 14, 2002 when they won 12 straight in Oakland...are 41-27 for the season...that is the A's best start since 1990 (43-24)...have won 10 of the last 13 games, 16 of the last 20 and 21 of the last 26.
- The A's are the first AL team with two games of 18 or more innings in one season since 1971 (Washington and Oakland)...today's game was the longest day game in Coliseum history (5:35).
- Jarrod Parker tossed a season-high eight innings...has tossed at least seven innings in five of his last six starts.
- Nate Freiman (1 for 2) entered the game in the top of the 16th inning and recorded his first "walk-off" rbi with a single in the 18th inning.
- John Jaso (2 for 7, 2 r, bb) extended his career-high hitting streak to nine games...is 14 for 38 (.368) with six RBI during the streak...has reached base safely via hit or walk in 13 consecutive games, which is a new career high.
- Derek Norris (0 for 7, rbi, so) is batting .155 (16 for 103) since May 1 after hitting .283 in April.
- Eric Sogard (1 for 3, sb, cs) is batting .322 (19 for 59) over his last 21 games after hitting .118 over his previous 14 contests.

- Brett Gardner (2 for 6, r, 2b, so, 2 bb) has hit safely in 17 of his last 20 games...is 27 for 77 (.350) over that span.

Travis Hafner (0 for 8, 3 so) is five for his last 52 (.096).

Mark Teixeira (0 for 4, 2 bb, 3 so, hbp) is batting .166 (8 for 48) in 13 games since being reinstated from the 60-day disabled list.
