TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 13, 1948: An ailing Babe Ruth makes his final appearance at Yankee Stadium as the Yankees retire his No. 3 during ceremonies commemorating the 25th anniversary of the Stadium. A little more than two months later, the 53-year-old Ruth will die from throat cancer.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 14, 1953: The Yankees sweep a doubleheader from the Indians, 6-2 and 3-0 at Cleveland Stadium. The Game 2 win marks the Yankees' 18th consecutive win and 15th straight road win, the latter mark establishing a club record that still stands today.

GRAND MEMORIES

June 12-13, 2010: Jorge Posada became the third Yankees player in history to hit a grand slam in consecutive games in two wins vs. Houston.

ENTER SANDMAN: RHP **Mariano Rivera** is tied with Baltimore's Jim Johnson and Pittsburgh's Jason Grilli for most saves in the Majors this season (23)...converted each of his first 18 chances this season, prior to blowing his first and only save on 5/28 at the Mets...marked his second-longest streak of converted save chances to start a season behind a 28-game stretch in 2008.

- ▶ Recorded save No. 23 in Sunday's win at Seattle in team game No. 63...marks the second-fewest number of team games needed to reach 23 saves in his career behind 2004 (55th game).
- ▶ Has reached the 20 saves plateau for the 16th time in his career, breaking a tie with Trevor Hoffman for the most such seasons in Baseball history...is seeking to reach the 25-save plateau for the 16th time, to extend his all time record.
- ▶ Has converted his last 12 save chances against the A's since Marco Scutaro's "walk-off" three-run HR on 4/15/07...is 18-for-22 in save opportunities at the Oakland Coliseum, riding a streak of six straight since that April '07 blown save.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the finale of their three-game series today at Oakland...wraps up the second stop of a 10-game West coast road trip, which began with a series win at Seattle (3-games-to-1) and concludes with a three-game set at Los Angeles-AL beginning tomorrow...is tied for the Yankees' longest road trip of the season (also 9/9-19 at Baltimore, Boston and Toronto)...are coming off a 4-4 homestand that began with series losses vs. the Mets (0-2) and Red Sox (1-2) and concluded with a sweep vs. Cleveland (3-0).

- ▶ Have won six of their last nine games and seven of their last 12 since 5/31...comes on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak...at 10 games over .500, are two shy of their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Have gone 36-24 (.600) since 4/7 after starting the season 1-4, the second-best mark in the AL over the stretch behind only Boston (38-24, .613) and fifth-best in the Majors.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 26 of 39 games on the road from 5/7-6/16, which will wrap after this trip...Monday's off day was the Yankees' first since 5/23, snapping a stretch of 17 straight days of games with no off days.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees lost their second straight at Oakland, falling, 5-2...were held to 4H in the game, including two by **RF Ichiro Suzuki** (2-for-4)...reached base just twice over the first five innings (1H, 1E)...**RHP Phil Hughes** started and took the loss, allowing 3ER on 4H in 4.1IP and walking a career-high-tying five batters (sixth time)...Yankees pitchers combined to walk a season-high nine batters, their most in a nine-inning game since 2010...**RHP Preston Claiborne** (0.1IP, 1BB, 1K) walked the first batter of his Major League career.

BAYSIDE BUMMER: The Yankees have lost six straight at the O.co Coliseum, their longest losing streak in Oakland since dropping six straight from 5/15-8/12/01...comes on the heels of a franchise-record nine straight wins in Oakland from 7/5/10-5/27/12...have had only one longer losing streak in Oakland since the A's relocated there in 1968, losing 10 in-a-row from 9/9/89-5/1/91.

BROOM BREAKERS: The Yankees today will look to avoid being swept for the third time this season, and first time in a series of three-or-more games...were swept in back-to-back two-game series vs. the Mets...are 2-0 this season in the third game of a series when they dropped the first two contests (win vs. Boston on 4/4 and at Detroit on 4/7).

FINALES: The Yankees are 12-10 in series finales this season...are 6-5 in finales on the road, winning four of the last seven.

NO THIEVES ALLOWED: Yankees catchers have combined to catch 33.3% of potential base stealers this season (9-of-27), the sixth-best caught stealing pct. in the Majors, and second in the AL behind only Baltimore (46.7%)...the 18SB allowed are the fourth-fewest surrendered by any team this season behind Baltimore (16), Minnesota (17) and St. Louis (17).

- ▶ In last night's loss at Oakland, Eric Sogard became the first Yankees opponent to steal multiple bases in a game this season.
- ▶ Yankees baserunners have been caught just 11 times in 50 stolen base attempts this year (78.0% success rate, 10th-best in the Majors)...have been caught just once in their last eight attempts - all in June.

SMALL BALL: The Yankees are 8-16 this year when they don't hit a home run...is one more win than their total amount from all of last season in games in which they didn't homer (7-24 in 2012).

- ▶ **Yankees batters** have gone a season-high five straight games without a HR...matches their longest homerless stretch since 1997 (also 5G from 5/17-21-06)...have not gone at least six straight games without a HR since 6/12-17/96 (6G)...have gone six straight road games without a HR just once since 1990 (6G, 5/12-23/10).

GREEN THUMB: CF **Brett Gardner** has hit safely in 16 of his last 19 games since 5/24 batting .352 (25-for-71) over the stretch...had his season-high-tying eight-game hitting streak come to an end last night...has scored at least one run in 18 of his last 26 starts...went 9-for-17 (.529) with 3R, 4 doubles and 1RBI in the four-game series at Seattle prior to this set.

- ▶ Was named the AL "Player of the Week" on Monday, his first career weekly honor...batted .520 (13-for-25) with 5R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI in seven games.
- ▶ **LEADING OFF:** Has driven in 27 runs while leading off this season, second in the Majors to Chicago-AL's Alejandro De Aza (30)...his 23 extra-base hits from the top spot in the lineup are tied with Oakland's Coco Crisp for most in the AL and third-most in the Majors.

IN THE NIX OF TIME: INF **Jayson Nix** has hit safely in 13 of his last 15 games with an at-bat, batting .309 (17-for-55)...included was a season-high seven-game hitting streak from 5/24-6/1 (one shy of his career high)...is batting a career-high .295 (28-for-95) with 13R and 9RBI in 29 road games this season.

- ▶ Has not been caught in his last 12 stolen base attempts (since 8/15/12), the longest active streak among current Yankees (credit: *Elias*)...is 9-for-9 in 2013.

BORNETO PITCH

RHP Preston Claiborne issued the first walk of his Major League career in last night's loss at Oakland (Seth Smith) in his 15th career appearance...became the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk over his first 14 career Major League outings coming as a reliever only...according to *Elias*, the only other pitchers to begin their ML careers with a streak of at least 14 consecutive appearances without a walk are Dave Veres (14G, 1994 Astros) and Jose Arredondo (14G, 2008 Angels).

MAKING HIS MARK

1B Mark Teixeira has 20 career home runs at O.co Coliseum, tied with Rafael Palmeiro for second-most by a visiting player behind Alex Rodriguez (21)...since joining the Yankees in 2009, has 8HR and 23RBI in 21 games in Oakland (credit: *Elias*).

GETTING OFFENSIVE: The Yankees have been held to 4R or less in 17 of their last 21 games, including a stretch of nine straight from 5/25-6/2...marked their longest such stretch since 10 in-a-row 5/28-6/7/05...their 45 games of four runs or fewer are tied for third-most in the Majors behind Seattle (50) and Miami (49)...however, the Yankees' 17 wins in such games are the most in the Majors while their .378 winning percentage is tied for third-best behind Pittsburgh (16-23, .410) and Baltimore (12-18, .400)...have scored more than four runs in just four of their last 18 road games.

NO FREEBIES: Yankees pitchers allowed a season-high 9BB in last night's loss at Oakland, their most since 9/28/11 at Tampa Bay (also 9BB in a 12-inning game)...marked their most walks permitted in a nine-inning game since 6/26/10 at Los Angeles-NL (10BB)...still, have issued only 166 walks this season, fifth-fewest in the Majors and second-fewest in the AL behind Minnesota (161)...are averaging 2.59 BB/9.0IP, the sixth-lowest mark in the Majors and the Yankees' lowest mark since 2003 (2.31).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 18-15 (.545) on the road in 2013, tied for the fifth-highest road win pct. in the Majors, and third in the AL behind Boston (20-12, .625) and Baltimore (20-15, .571).

YOUNG GUNS: Yankees rookie pitchers (Claiborne, Marshall, Nuno and Warren) have combined for a 2.80 ERA (74.0IP, 23ER) this season.

DERBY DUTY: On Tuesday, Major League Baseball announced **2B Robinson Cano** will serve as the American League's Home Run Derby captain for the second straight season.

AT FIRST: The Yankees have scored first in 15 of their last 21 road games—including six of their last eight—scoring at least once in the first inning in eight of those contests.

FIVE ALIVE: The Yankees are 20-0 this season when scoring at least five runs in a game...according to *Elias*, are the only Major League team that is undefeated this season in such games.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Yankees have had 33 of their 65 games this season decided by two runs or less (50.8%), including 27 of their last 45 since 4/25... have gone an AL-best 22-11 (.667) in those contests, tied with Pittsburgh (26-13, .667) for the best such winning pct. in the Majors...have had 44 games decided by three runs or less (67.7%), going 27-17 (.614) - the third-best such winning percentage in the Majors behind Pittsburgh (30-15, .667) and Baltimore (26-16, .619).

▶ Have gone 11-6 (.647) in one-run games this season, tied with Washington for the fourth-best mark in the Majors behind Cleveland (11-5, .688), Arizona (15-8, .652) and Oakland (13-7, .650)...started 5-0 in one-run contests, becoming the last team in the Majors to lose a one-run game.

WELCOME ABOARD: On Wednesday, the Yankees agreed to terms with **3B Eric Jagielo**, the club's first of three first-round picks (26th pick overall) in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Notre Dame University...the Yankees also inked 12 additional draftees: **SS Tyler Wade** (fourth rd), **RHP David Palladino** (fifth), **SS John Murphy** (sixth), **RHP Philip Walby** (12th), **RHP Cale Coshow** (13th), **LHP Caleb Smith** (14th), **CF Jordan Barnes** (15th), **2B Derek Toadvine** (22nd), **RHP Sam Agnew-Wieland** (24th), **C Trent Garrison** (28th), **SS Kevin Cornelius** (31) and **2B Hector Crespo** (34th).

ON THE MEND: RHP **Michael Pineda** began a rehab assignment with Single-A Tampa on Sunday at Lakeland (DET), holding the Flying Tigers to 1R (0ER) in 4.1IP (2H, 1BB, 4K)...is expected to continue his rehab on Friday, starting a sim game at the Yankees' minor league complex in Tampa.

BACK IN THE DAY
RHP **Mariano Rivera** earned his first Major League win on 5/28/1995 at Oakland (5.1IP, 7H, 1ER, 3BB, 1K) in a 4-1 Yankees victory...the Athletics' starting pitcher in that game was current Yankees Bullpen Coach Mike Harkey.

MAKING THEM COUNT
Of the Yankees' 70HR this season, 23 have tied the game or given the Yankees a lead at any point of a game, with six of those coming in the seventh inning or later.

OVERALL FACTS: The Yankees wrap up their three-game series at Oakland today...is the final game between the teams this year, after the Yankees dropped two of three at Yankee Stadium from 5/3-5...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost this year's season series, snapping a streak of five straight non-losing season series vs. Oakland...**CURRENT TREND:** Have lost nine of the last 12 games between the teams...however have won 33 of the last 49 games between the clubs since the start of the 2008 season, including an 19-12 mark in the last 31 matchups.

AT O.co COLISEUM: The Yankees are making their lone trip to Oakland this season with this three-game series...have lost six straight at O.co Coliseum, matching their longest losing streak in Oakland since 2000 (lost six straight from 5/15-8/12/01)...played two series last season at O.co Coliseum sweeping a three-game set and getting swept in a four-game series (all one-run losses)...had won nine straight at the Coliseum prior to the four-game sweep...are 24-15 at the A's since the start of 2004...have lost the road season series for the second straight year, after winning the previous four.

KEEPIN' IT CLOSE: The last 13 games between the Yankees and A's have been decided by 3R or less, including eight one-run contests and 12 two-run games.

NYY ALL-TIME RECORD vs. LAA: 336-283 (.543)

NYY ALL TIME at LAA: 149-164 (.476) --- **NYY ALL TIME at Angel Stadium:** 125-143 (.466)

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Angels will meet for the first time this season on Friday...went 5-4 vs. the Angels in 2012, winning their second straight season series, and recording their fourth straight non-losing season series vs. the Angels (since 2009)...came on the heels of five straight losing season series from 2004-08...their 55-62 record vs. the Angels since 2000 is their only losing mark vs. any AL team over the span...have won six of the last 10 games between the two teams and 10 of the last 17.

AT ANGEL STADIUM: The Yankees are making their lone trip to Angel Stadium this season with a three-game series starting on Friday...are 8-16 at Angel Stadium since 2008 and have lost 25 of their last 37 games at Angel Stadium since 2005...however, have gone 7-7 in their last 14 games there...have recorded eight straight non-winning season series at Angel Stadium since 2005.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER at LOS ANGELES-AL: LHP ANDY PETTITTE (5-3, 3.82)

LHP Andy Pettitte, 40, will make his 11th start of the season on Friday vs. the Los Angeles Angels at Angel Stadium...will be his 32nd career start vs. Los Angeles-AL and first this season...**last started** on 6/8 at Seattle and earned his 250th career win in the 3-1 Yankees' victory, allowing just 1ER on 3H in 7.1IP (6K)...was just the sixth win in his last 17 starts vs. Seattle dating back to 4/7/00...held his opponent to under 3ER for the third time in his last four starts.

PETTITTE vs. LOS ANGELES-AL

Is 14-11 with a 4.49 ERA (210.2IP, 105ER) and 155K in 31 career starts vs. the Angels, marking his second-most career wins vs. any non-AL East foe (15 wins vs. Kansas City)...among active Major League hurlers, is tied with Felix Hernandez for the most starts made vs. Los Angeles-AL, ranks second in wins behind Freddy Garcia (17) and second in both innings pitched and strikeouts behind Hernandez (213.2IP, 185K).

★ Has won just two of his last seven decisions vs. the Angels since 7/31/08, going 2-5 with a 5.83 ERA (54.0IP, 35ER) in nine starts over the stretch, allowing 5ER or more in four of those outings.

★ Last started vs. Los Angeles on 5/29/12 at Angel Stadium, recording the loss in the 5-1 Yankees' defeat, allowing a season-high-tying 5ER in 7.0IP (9H, 3K, 2HR).

RHP Hiroki Kuroda, 38, will make his 14th start of the season today vs. the Oakland Athletics at O.co Coliseum...will be his fourth career start vs. Oakland and first this season...**last started** on 6/7 at Seattle and recorded the loss in the 4-1 Yankees' defeat, allowing 4ER on 8H in 6.1IP (3BB, 6K, 1WP)...dropped to 2-3 with a 3.27 ERA (33.0IP, 12ER) in five career starts vs. the Mariners...allowed 4ER or more for just the second time in 13 starts this season...signed a one-year contract with the Yankees on 11/20/12.

#1,000: Has registered 998.0IP over his six Major League seasons (2008-13)...with at least 2.0IP in today's outing at Oakland, will become just the third Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history to record 1,000IP or more in his career, joining Hideo Nomo (1,976.1IP) and Tomo Ohka (1,070.0IP).

OF LATE: Over his last four starts since since 5/22, is 0-3 with a 5.23 ERA (20.2IP, 12ER), with opponents batting .311 (28-for-90) with five doubles, 4HR and 12RBI over the stretch...in his prior nine starts to begin the season, was 6-2 with a 1.99 ERA (58.2IP, 13ER), with opposing batters hitting .201 (42-for-209) 10 doubles, 3HR and 13RBI.

COMEBACK KID: Gave up 4ER in his last start on 6/7 at Seattle...has made four starts this season immediately following an outing in which he gave up at least 3ER, going 2-1 with a 1.23 ERA (29.1IP, 4ER) in those appearances.

LET THERE BE LIGHT: Is 7-2 (.778) with a 2.17 ERA (74.2IP, 18ER) in 11 daytime starts as a Yankee (2012-13), tying with Jason Hammel and C.J. Wilson for the highest such winning percentage over the stretch among AL starters and the fourth-highest among all Major League hurlers (min. 10GS).

◦ Before joining the Yankees in 2012, was 7-12 with a 3.79 ERA (147.1IP, 62ER) in 26 games (25 starts) in day games as a member of the Dodgers.

ACES: Has tossed at least 7.0 innings without allowing a run in his 10 of his 46 starts since joining the Yankees in 2012, marking the most such starts in the Majors over the last two seasons (2012-13).

OUR HIRO: Nine of his 12 starts this season have come following a Yankees loss, with Kuroda combining to go 4-4 with a 2.56 ERA (52.2IP, 15ER) in those outings...has allowed 3ER or less in eight of those appearances, holding his opponent scoreless four times.

DON'T STRAY TOO FAR: In 13 starts this season, has yielded a .204 (21-for-103) batting average with runners on base, a .156 (7-for-45) average with runners in scoring position and a .185 (5-for-27) average with runners in scoring position and two outs...conversely, opponents are hitting .250 (49-for-196) with the bases empty.

HOW LOW CAN HE GO?: Owns a 2.84 ERA (79.1IP, 25ER) through his first 13 starts this year, marking his lowest ERA and his fewest ER allowed through his first 13 starts of a season during any of his six Major League campaigns (2008-13).
