TONIGHT'S TILT... the Mariners begin a 7-game, 2-city roadtrip to the Golden State with the first of three games against the Oakland Athletics...will also travel to Los Angeles-AL (4G)...went 5-5 on the recently completed 10-game homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1), New York-AL (1-3) and Houston (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT Sports** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS... have won 2 of last 3 games...7-7 over last 14, and 9-9 over last 18 games...after going 5-0-1 in 6-series stretch from April 25-May 16, are 2-3-4 in last 9 series...are 14-18 vs. the AL West, 7-6 vs. AL East, 5-11 vs. AL Central and 3-3 in Interleague play...28 of the Mariners first 67 games have been decided by 2-or-fewer runs (13-15), and featured 8 extra-inning affairs (2-6).

- **Frequent Flyer Miles** – Mariners will travel 52,509 miles this season, most in baseball.
- **Quality** – Mariners are 3rd in the AL with 40 quality starts (Iwakuma - 12, Felix - 10).
- **Secret to Success** – Seattle is 19-6 when scoring 4+ runs; 13-4 with 5+ runs.
- **Stop Right There** – Mariners relievers have stranded 74 of 101 inherited runners (73.2%) to lead AL.
- **GW-Morales** – Kendrys Morales is T2nd in the AL with 8 GWRBI.
- **Walk-Offs** – Mariners are T2nd in the Majors with 6 walk-off losses.
- **Southpaws** – Mariners are 11-11 in games vs. LH starters, compared to 18-27 vs. RHP.
- **Endy Hits** – Endy Chavez has recorded a hit in 27 of his 31 starts this season.
- **Age Defying** – Raul Ibanez is one of just 11 players in MLB history to hit 13 or more home runs in their age 41 season (computed 6/30 each season).

STARTERS ROLLING... The Mariners starting pitchers have recorded a quality starts in each of their last 6 games, including allowing 1 run or less in 5 of their last 6 starts...since June 7, the starters are 3-1 with a 1.04 ERA (5 ER, 43.1 IP)...the starting pitching staff has also recorded for 4 consecutive starts tossing at least 7.0 innings while limiting opponents to 1 earned run or less...it is the longest stretch recording 5 straight such starts from May 18-22, 2011.

BAY HITTING IN THE BAY AREA... Jason Bay has reached base safely in 19 of 21 games vs. the Oakland A's in his career...he is currently batting .329 (23x70) with 20 runs scored, 4 doubles, 2 triples, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 16 walks...Bay's .466 on-base percentage is the 2nd-highest amongst active players vs. the A's (Todd Helton, .489), while his .329 average is the 8th-highest vs. OAK (min. 50 AB)...Bay is batting .364 (8x22) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 4 RBI and 4 walks in 6 games at O.co Coliseum.

ALL-STAR RESUMES... Hisashi Iwakuma leads the Majors with a 0.82 WHIP and ranks 2nd in the American League with a 1.79 ERA...Kuma is also listed among the AL leaders in fewest baserunners/9.0 IP (1st, 7.46), SO/BB ratio (1st, 6.21), quality starts (T1st, 12), wins (T7th, 7), winning percentage (3rd, .875) and opp avg (3rd, .190)...Felix Hernandez ranks 3rd in the AL in ERA (2.49) and strikeouts (102), T7th in wins (7) and 2nd in innings pitched (97.2).

RAUUUUUL... Raul Ibanez hit his team-leading 13th home run of the season on Tuesday night vs. Houston and has homered in back-to-back games for the 4th time this season...Raul is tied for 10th in the AL with his 13 home runs and ranks 3rd with 12.62 AB/HR (min. 150 PA)...he has hit 11 of his 13 HR since May 10, and is one of just 5 Major Leaguers with 10 HR over the last 30 days (Domonic Brown - 13, Miguel Cabrera - 12, Chris Davis - 11, Adam Dunn - 11, Carlos Gonzalez - 11).

HR EQUALIZER... the Mariners have not allowed a home run in a season-high 6 consecutive games...and with a home run on Tuesday by Raul Ibanez, the Mariners have pulled even with their opponents in home runs for the season (73-73).

HOMER BREAKDOWN... Seattle has hit 73 homers this season (in 67 games) accounting for 109 of the team's total of 237 runs this season (46%)...homered in 43 of 67 games, but just 2 in last 7 G and only 5 HR in last 11 G overall...for the year, Seattle has hit 47 solo homers; 19 2-run homers; 4 3-run homers; and 3 grand slams...the Mariners rank 7th in AL in HR (finished 11th in AL w/149 HR in 2012).

EARN IT... Hisashi Iwakuma allowed an un-earned run in the 3rd inning Monday night, snapping his scoreless innings streak at 23.2 innings, the 8th-longest scoreless streak in Mariners history (5th longest by a starter)...however, he extended his streak of not allowing an EARNED run to 28.2 IP; that's tied for the 5th longest streak in Mariners history (see sidebar at left)...Kuma has not allowed an earned run since the 2nd inning of his start May 26 vs. Rangers.

BATTERY MATE... Henry Blanco is the 6th catcher to appear on the Mariners roster this season, joining Brandon Bantz, Jesus Montero, Kelly Shoppach, Jesus Sucre and Mike Zunino...the 6 different catchers currently ranks tied for the third-most in franchise history (also: 1977) and only trails Mariners team record of 7 catchers appearing in a game in both the 2005 and 1992 seasons...tonight's starter Joe Saunders will throw to his 5th different battery mate this season.

AS YOU KNOW... catcher Mike Zunino made his Major League debut on Wednesday night vs. the Astros...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Zunino is the 7th Mariners player to make his MLB debut this season, which leads the American League and ranks second behind only the Cardinals (8)?...Zunino joins Brandon Bantz, Nick Franklin, Bobby LaFromboise, Brandon Maurer, Yoervis Medina and Jesus Sucre all making this MLB debuts this season, which already ranks tied for 12th-most in franchise history...of the 38 players that have appeared with the Mariners this season, 10 are in their rookie season (also: Carter Capps and Danny Farquhar).
