TODAY'S TILT... the Mariners continue a 7-game, 2-city roadtrip to the Golden State with the second of three games against the Oakland Athletics (1-0)...will also travel to Los Angeles-AL (4G)... went 5-5 on the recently completed 10-game homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1), New York-AL (1-3) and Houston (2-1)...today's game will be televised on **FOX** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...have won 3 of last 4 games...8-7 over last 15, and 10-9 over last 19 games... after going 5-0-1 in 6-series stretch from April 25-May 16, are 2-3-4 in last 9 series...are 15-18 vs. the AL West, 7-6 vs. AL East, 5-11 vs. AL Central and 3-3 in Interleague play...29 of the Mariners first 68 games have been decided by 2-or-fewer runs (14-15), and featured 8 extra-inning affairs (2-6).

- Frequent Flyer Miles Mariners will travel 52,509 miles this season, most in baseball.
- Quality Mariners are 3rd in the AL with 41 quality starts (Iwakuma 12, Felix 10).
- Secret to Success Seattle is 19-6 when scoring 4+ runs; 13-4 with 5+ runs.
- Stop Right There Mariners relievers have stranded 74 of 101 inherited runners (73.2%) to lead AL.
- **GW-Morales Kendrys Morales** is 3rd in the AL with 8 GWRBI.
- Southpaws Mariners are 12-11 in games vs. LH starters, compared to 18-27 vs. RHP.
- Endy Hits Endy Chavez has recorded a hit in 27 of his 31 starts this season.
- Age Defying Raul Ibañez is one of just 11 players in MLB history to hit 13 or more home runs in their age 41 season (computed 6/30 each season).

STARTERS ROLLING...The Mariners starting pitchers have recorded a quality starts in each of their last 7 games, including allowing 1 run or less in 6 of those starts...since June 7, the starters are 4-1 (team is 4-3) with a 1.07 ERA (6 ER, 50.1 IP), lowering their combined ERA from 4.32 to current mark of 3.93 (0.39 points)...the starting pitching staff has also recorded for 5 consecutive starts tossing at least 7.0 innings while limiting opponents to 1 earned run or less...it is the longest stretch also recording 5 straight such starts from May 18-22, 2011.

IN THE NICK OF TIME...Nick Franklin is batting .545 (6x11) with 2 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 RBI and 1 walk during current 3-game hitting streak, which is tied for the hitting longest streak in his Major League career (also: 6/3-5)...Franklin's 17 hits in his first 17 career games are the most in Mariners franchise history since Kenji Johjima had 18 hits in first 17 games.

ALL-STAR RESUMES...Hisashi Iwakuma leads the Majors with a 0.82 WHIP and ranks 2nd in the American League with a 1.79 ERA...Kuma is also listed among the AL leaders in fewest baserunners/9.0 IP (1st, 7.46), SO/BB ratio (1st, 6.21), quality starts (T1st, 12), wins (T7th, 7), winning percentage (3rd, .875) and opp avg (4th, .190)...Felix Hernandez ranks 4th in the AL in ERA (2.49), T3rd in strikeouts (102), T7th in wins (7) and 3rd in innings pitched (97.2).

HOMER BREAKDOWN... Seattle has hit 74 homers this season (in 68 games) accounting for 110 of the team's total of 240 runs this season (46%)...homered in 44 of 68 games, but just 3 in last 8 G and only 6 HR in last 12 G overall...for the year, Seattle has hit 48 solo homers; 19 2-run homers; 4 3-run homers; and 3 grand slams...the Mariners rank T7th in AL in HR (finished 11th in AL w/149 HR in 2012).

EARN IT...Hisashi lwakuma allowed an un-earned run in the 3rd inning Monday night, snapping his scoreless innings streak at 23.2 innings, the 8th-longest scoreless streak in Mariners history (5th longest by a starter)...however, he extended his streak of not allowing an EARNED run to 28.2 IP; that's tied for the 5th longest streak in Mariners history (see sidebar at left)...Kuma has not allowed an earned run since the 2nd inning of his start May 26 vs. Rangers.

SLIM MARGIN... the Mariners recorded a 3-2 win over the A's last night to improve to 3-2 at O.co Coliseum this season...was the 22nd one-run Mariners win over the A's in Oakland in franchise history, but only the 9th time since 2000 Seattle has won a one-run game vs. the A's on the road and first since April 7, 2012 at OAK (8-7 win).

GETTING COMFY ON THE ROAD...Joe Saunders recorded his first road win of the season last night vs. Oakland and first since Sept. 3, 2012 at TOR w/BAL...after allowing 30 runs in 24.0 innings over first 5 road starts in 2013, Saunders has allowed only 2 earned runs over his last 2 road starts, going 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA...overall this season he is 1-4 with a 7.58 ERA (32 ER, 38.0 IP) in 7 road starts, compared to going 4-2 with a 2.53 ERA (13 ER, 46.1 IP) in 7 starts at Safeco Field.

<u>CLOSING IT OUT</u>...Oliver Perez recorded his first career save in his 266th career appearance (71st relief appearance) last night at Oakland...Perez' 266 games ranks as the 18th-most appearances before recording a first career save MLB history and first since Jamey Wright recorded a save in 500th career appearance on July 5, 2011 at Oakland (w/SEA)...overall this season, Perez has held oppnents scoreless in 24 of 27 appearancs, inlcuding an active 7.2 scorless innings streak (5/20-current)...his 1.11 ERA (3 ER, 24.1 IP) currently is the 3rd-lowest amongest American League relievers,

AS YOU KNOW...catcher Mike Zunino recorded his first career home run in the 7th inning last night's off Oakland starter Tommy Milone in only his second career start (6th career at-bat)...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...Zunino is the 10th player in club history to hit a home run in the first or second game of a MLB career (last: Trayvon Robinson, career game #2, 8/6/11 at LAA).

ABOUT FELIX ... 27-year-old right-hander is making his 15th start of the season (tying for AL lead) & the 253rd of his MLB career today vs. the A's.

- In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young Award**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days old on 7/6/84 at MIN).
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher. Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002.
- Selected to AL squad in 2009, 2011 and 2012 All-Star Game.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 205 of 252 GS (81.3%)...pitched at least 6.0 innings in 12 of 14 starts this season, including 10 quality starts (168 career quality starts).

.EADERBOARD ... listed amongst AL leaders in several pitching categories including: ERA 4th (2.49), wins (T7th, 7), WHIP (8th, 1.04), innings pitched (3rd, 97.2), strikeouts (T3rd, 102), starts (T2nd, 14), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 5.37).

AST TIME OUT...recorded ND despite allowing just 1 run in 7.2 IP vs. NYY on 6/9 in Safeco Field...NY snapped 1-1 tie off bullpen in 9th inning and went on to 2-1 win...was 9th GS of season allowing 1 or less runs (6-0, 0.81).

8.0 INNINGS, 1 RUN...Felix has recorded 4 starts this season pitching at least 8.0 innings while allowing 1 or fewer runs: 4/17 vs. DET, 5/3 at TOR, 5/8 at PIT, 5/30 at SD...leads the AL and tied for MLB lead (with Wainwright/Kershaw) for most starts of 8.0 IP, 1 or fewer runs...since his debut season in 2005 has recorded 51 starts of 8.0 IP, 1 or fewer runs, most in the Majors (Cliff Lee & Roy Halladay both have 50).

SO, THE FIRST 250 WERE PRETTY SPECIAL...in Felix's first 250 career starts he posted a 3.17 ERA and 1,574 strikeouts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau only 6 other pitchers who debuted since the mound was lowered in 1969 recorded 1,500-or-more strikeouts and an ERA below 3.25 in their first 250 career starts: Bert Blyleven (1550 strikeouts, 2.77 ERA), Dwight Gooden (1604, 2.97), Roger Clemens (1739, 2.80), David Cone (1620, 3.09), Pedro Martinez (2028, 2.68) and Johan Santana (1634, 3.06).

JUNE BLOOM...Felix owns a career record of 21-7 with a 2.77 ERA (84 ER, 272.2 IP) in 38 career starts in the month of June...is 1-1, 3.14 ERA in 2 GS this season and was 2-1, 2.91 in 5 GS last June...winning percentage of .750 in the month of June is 4th-highest amongst active pitchers (min. 25 starts).

ALL HE NEEDS IS RUNS ... Felix is 98-25 with 2.90 in 161 career starts when the Mariners give him 2 or more runs of support...has received 1 or less runs of support in 91 of 252 career starts.

ROAD WARRIOR...has maintained a 2.67 ERA (160 ER, 539.0 IP) over his last 77 road starts dating back to the start of the 2009 season...has thrown at least 7.0 innings in 51 of his last 77 road starts...is 7-2 with a 2.02 ERA (16 ER, 59.0 IP) in 8 road starts this season (2-2, 3.53 at Safeco Field).

8.0 SHUTOUT INNINGS...recorded his 23rd career start with 8.0 or more scoreless innings pitched May 3 at Toronto...since his debut in 2005 Felix has is tied for most starts of 8.0+ innings without allowing a run (also: Cliff Lee) and ahead of CC Sabathia (22)...Felix also has 68 career starts of at least 8.0 innings while allowing 2 or fewer runs, best in the Majors since 2005 ahead of Roy Halladay (64) and CC Sabathia (63)

SINCE 2009...over the last 5 seasons (including 2013), Felix has combined to go 66-44 with a 2.78 ERA (325 ER, 1051.2 IP) in 148 starts...during this time frame Felix ranks 2nd in ERA (behind Clayton Kershaw - 2.53), 2nd in strikeouts with 996 (behind Justin Verlander - 1,078) and 2nd in games started (behind Verlander - 149).

THE CENTURY MARK...notched his 100th career victory April 22 at Houston, joining Jamie Moyer (145) and Randy Johnson (130) as the only Mariners to record 100 wins in a Mariner uniform.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...Felix became the 6th-youngest pitcher to record his 100th victory among players who began their career since divisional play began in 1969...only 5 have reached 100 wins at a younger age than Hernandez (27 years, 14 days old): Dwight Gooden (24.215), Bert Blyleven (25.076), Fernando Valenzuela (26.162), Don Gullett (26.199) and Vida Blue (26.361).

PERFECTION...Felix threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in Major League history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over the Tampa Bay Rays at Safeco Field...struck out 12 while retiring all 27 batters he faced on 113 pitches (77 strikes)...it was the 7th Perfect Game in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and first in the AL since 1984.

- Night Owl Is 5-2 with a 2.13 ERA (15 ER, 63.1 IP) in 9 starts at night...2-2, 3.15 in 5 starts during the day.
- GIDP Tied for 2nd in the Majors inducing 14 groundball double plays (Lucas Harrell, HOU, 15).
- 1500 Strikeouts recorded 1,500th career strikeout April 11, becoming the 4th-youngest pitchers (since 1900) to record 1,500 career strikeouts...only Bert Blyleven, Walter Johnson, Sam McDowell and Dwight Gooden reached the milestone K younger than Felix.
- Holding opponents to a .231 batting average (83x359), including .227 (39x172) clip vs. right-handers.
- ND in GS 5/14 @NYY, despite leaving w/3-1 lead...was 6th career GS at new Yankee Stadium (since '09); is 4-1, 1.18 (6 ER, 45.2 IP) with 2 shutouts. Went 3-2, 1.90 ERA in 6 April starts...was the 6th-lowest ERA in club history for the first month of the season (min. 4 GS)
- 8.0 ShO IP May 3 at Toronto...struck out 7 and did not walk a batter to improve to 4-2 on the season and lower his ERA to 1.60 Tossed 7.2 IP and did not allow a run for W #1 on Opening Day @OAK...is 4-0, 1.33 in 6 career OD starts

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP HISASHI IWAKUMA (7-1, 1.79)

32-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season and 31st career MLB start in tomorrow's series finale vs. the A's...ranks 2nd in the AL with a 1.79 ERA, 1st with a 0.82 WHIP and 3rd with a .190 opponent batting average...has not allowed an earned run in last 28.2 IP (3rd inning 5/26-current)...won #7 6/10 vs. HOU w/7.0 IP, 1 R (0 ER)...ND in Mariners 16-inning 5-7 loss to CWS on June 5 (8.0,3,0,0,0,5); left game after 8 innings with 0-0 tie...over last 9 starts is 5-0 with a 1.70 ERA (12 ER, 63.2 IP)...3 start winning streak May 4-15, posting a 2.14 ERA (5 ER, 21.0 IP) during the trio...was 4-1, 1.61 ERA over 7 starts 4/12-5/15 (44.2 IP, 8 ER, 45 K)...Starter -- Is 15-5, 2.22 ERA (47 ER, 190.1 IP) in 30 career starts (7/2/12-current)...vs. OAK -- is 2-2, 3.54 in 4 games, 3 GS, vs. A's in his career, but 2-0, 2.08 (13.0 IP, 3 ER) in a pair of starts this season (4/2, a 7-1 win and 5/10, 1 6-3 win).
