#### **OAKLAND NOTES**

- The Oakland Athletics have won four of their last six games, six of their last 10, and 14 of their last 20 ...went 4-2 on this six-game homestand against New York (3-0) and Seattle (1-2).
- The A's hit back-to-back home runs in the seventh inning (Donaldson and Smith)...it is the fifth time the A's have hit back-to-back home runs this season.
- Bartolo Colon is 6-0 with a 1.04 ERA (5 er in 43.0 ip) in his last six starts...the winning streak is an A's season high and is his longest since July 21-Sept 10 2005 when he won a career-high eight straight ...has tossed at least seven innings in four of his last five starts.
- Josh Donaldson (2 for 5, 2 r, 2b, hr, rbi, so) snapped his 0 for 16 streak with a double in the fourth inning.
- John Jaso (1 for 1, r, rbi, 3 bb, sf) had a career-high tying three walks (five times, last: July 25, 2012 vs. New York).
- Josh Reddick (4 for 5, 2 r, 3b, hr, 2 rbi) had a career-high tying four hits (third time, last: May 11, 2012 vs. Detroit).

### **SEATTLE NOTES**

- The Seattle Mariners are 2-1 on this seven-game road trip to Oakland (2-1) and Los Angeles (0-0).
- **Hisashi Iwakuma** allowed two runs in the fourth inning...had not allowed an earned run in his previous 31.2 innings pitched...it was the second longest streak in Mariners history without allowing an earned run (longest: 34.0, Mark Langston Sept. 14-29, 1988)...tossed 5.0 innings, which matches his shortest start of the season.
- Endy Chavez (2 for 4, 2 rbi) has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games and is batting .33 (15 for 45) over that stretch.
- Nick Franklin (1 for 3, bb) is batting .421 (8 for 19) with three doubles over his last five games.
- Brendan Ryan (0 for 3) is 0 for his last 11.
